

9th IAHA-Conference in Manila

The 9th Conference of the International Association of Historians of Asia (IAHA) will be held on 21-25 November 1983 in Manila. It is jointly hosted by the IAHA, the IAHA-Philippines and the University of the Philippines.

The panel discussions will be guided according to the following sections and topics:

The State of Historical Research and Teaching in the Philippines; 9. Religious Cults and Social Movements in Philippine History; 10. Contemporary Philippine History; 11. Philippine Nationalism

Section Two: Major Themes of Study in Asian History

1. History and Asian Society; 2. Nationalism and Revolution in Asia; 3. The Historical Phenomenon of Minorities in Asia; 4. Impact of Modernization on Traditional Societies in Asia: Tradition and Innovation; 5. Colonialism and its Expansion in Asia; 6. Migration and Movement of Peoples and Ideas in Asia; 7. Peasant Unrest in Asia; 8. Asia and Colonial Latin America; 9. The Colonial Administration in Asia

Section Three: Problems of Methodology in the Study of Asian History

1. Value Reference and Value Judgement in Historiography in the Asian Context; 2. The Asian Historian and his Quest for Documentation: Exchange of Information; 3. The State of Historical Teaching and Research in Asia; 4. International and Interdisciplinary Collaboration in Asian Historical Research: Rationale, Problems and Prospects; 5. The Place of Local History in Asian Historiography; 6. The Application of Quantification in the Study of Asian History; 7. The Place of Oral History in the Study of Asian History; 8. Folklore and Translations in Asian Historical Research; 9. The Problem of Periodization in Asia

Section Four: Special Topics in Asian History

1. Asian Archeology and Prehistory; 2. Maritime History of Asia; 3. Demographic History of Asia; 4. Asian Political and

Diplomatic History; 5. Economic and Business History of Asia; 6. Religious, Cultural and Social History of Asia; 7. History of Land Tenure and Agriculture in Asia; 8. History of Science and Technology in Asia; 9. History of Law and Jurisprudence in Asia; 10. History of Education in Asia: Public and Private; 11. Role of Women in Asian History; 12. History of the International Relations of Southeast Asia.

Papers focussing on any of the above themes and topics are welcome from scholars and persons interested in the study of Asian History. A one-page abstract of each paper must reach the Program Committee not later than January 31, 1983. Deadline for submission of papers is July 31, 1983 (8 1/2 x 11" size paper). Papers must be not more than twenty typewritten pages, double spaced, including footnotes. English will serve as the official language of the Conference. Paper presentation during the conference will be limited to twenty minutes per speaker.

Registration fee for the conference is US\$ 150.00 per participant. This covers attendance in the sessions and some social events, copies of conference papers, conference kit, and a copy of the printed proceedings to be mailed to each participant after the conference. Accompanying persons will be charged a fee of US\$ 75.00 per person. This fee entitles them to participate in the conference activities.
