**Conference on "The China Enterprise", Manchester (England), 1-2 June, 1987.**

A conference on "The China Enterprise" was held at Manchester University on June 1-2, 1987. Jointly initiated by the Europe-China Association for Management Development and the Manchester Business School and coordinated by Nigel Campbell of the China Unit of Manchester Business School, the organizers intended to bring together academics whose recent research has focused on the China enterprise.

About 70 persons from Europe, the USA and Canada, China, Hongkong and Singapore, India and Saudi Arabia attended the conference. In parallel sessions nearly 30 papers were read which dealt with a wide range of topics that can broadly be divided into the following sections:

- The Progress of Economic Reform
- The Workings of the Chinese Enterprise
- Chinese Culture and Management

- The Conditions for Foreign Business
- Industrial Restructuring
- Joint Venture Strategy and Negotiations
- Joint Venture Operations.

Most participants were academics of management or business administration schools who either had done research on China's economy for a long time or got involved into the field only recently while in China as consultants or visiting teachers. Thus, persons of rather different backgrounds could exchange their experiences and views. The participation of researchers from the PRC in a conference on China's economy was a novelty in Europe. It expressed the increasing cooperation of China with other countries in the field of economics. Manchester Business School and its staff provided for a most promotive environment for the conference. The conference proceedings will be published by JAI Press, U.S.A, edited by Nigel Campbell, John Child, John Henley and Martin Lockett. With regard to the future, it is hoped to organize a second conference at the China-Europe Centre of the University of Louvain in Belgium and another conference later on in Beijing.

#### **Non-Alignment and World Peace, Delhi, 7.-9.August, 1987**

To mark the 40th anniversary of India's independence and the 26th anniversary of Non-Aligned Movement, an International Seminar auspices of the Indian Institute for Non-Aligned Studies, in cooperation with other national and international organizations, at Vigyan Bhavan, New Delhi from August 7 to 9, 1987. Academicians, scholars, writers, public figures, diplomats and representatives of national and international organizations from all over the world will be invited to participate and grace the occasion. The seminar will have four commissions and the proposed themes for the papers and deliberations at the seminar are as follows:

- Commission I: Non-Alignment: Its Philosophy and Role  
 Commission II: Peace, Security and Disarmament: Six-Nation Peace Initiatives, other important peace proposals including those of Security Coexistence and Non-Violence in International Relations, General and Complete Disarmament.  
 Commission III: Cooperation and Development: Africa Fund, SAARC, Regional Co-operation, New International Economic Order, and New International Information and communication Order
