
Asia-Pacific Triennial of Contemporary Art 2002

12. Sept. 2002 bis 23. Jan. 2003, South Brisbane, Queensland, Australia

The Queensland Art Gallery's flagship contemporary art event, The Asia-Pacific Triennial of Contemporary Art, will open at the Gallery on 12 September 2002. APT 2002 will focus attention on the important contribution of artists from Asia and the Pacific within the contemporary art arena, and continue to build on the innovation, diversity and success of the previous Triennials. Work exhibited will range from the meditative and quietly engaging to the challenging and spectacular.

For the first time in Australia, APT 2002 will offer audiences works by a smaller, more select group of highly influential and innovative artists who have made an outstanding contribution to contemporary art over the last three decades. The world's clearinghouse for information on contemporary Asian affairs and policy-related issues

AccessAsia, the first clearinghouse to track the expertise and current research of specialists on policy-related issues in Asia, was established by The National Bureau of Asian Research (NBR) in 1990. German Consortium member is the Institute of Asian Affairs (in cooperation with the Association of Asian Studies). The project currently tracks over 3,000 leading academic, government, and private-sector specialists on Asia, making it the only resource of its kind. AccessAsia makes its findings available at no charge in an online searchable database (http://www.accessasia.org).

To be listed in the AccessAsia Specialist Database, an individual must be an expert on contemporary Asian affairs or policy-relevant issues and must meet one or more of the following criteria:

- Have a PhD or appropriate professional experience.
- Currently conduct research, consult on Asian affairs, or serve in a policy-level government position.
- Have published books or journal articles on policy-relevant topics relating to Asian affairs within the last ten years.
