Scandinavian Conference on South-East Asia; 2.-4.October 1987, Pindstrup, Denmark.

On 2-4 October 1987, the Nordic Association for Southeast Asian Social Studies (NASEASS) arranged a conference at Pindstrup near Arhus in Denmark. The conference gathered about 40 participants from the Scandinavian countries, including Finland. Eighteen papers on anthropological, historical and political topics in Thailand, Vietnam, the Philippines, Malaysia or Indonesia were presented.

NASEASS which was formed in Denmark in 1983, has earlier organized conferences in 1984, 1985, and 1986. The papers of the conference in 1984 have now been published under the title: "Rural transformation in Southeast Asia" (ed. by Christer Gunnarson, Mason C.
