In 1984 Huang became general-secretary of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee, vice-chairman of the Leading Group for Enterprise Rectification and vice-chairman of the Leading Group for Restructuring Economy of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee. In 1985 he was elected deputy secretary of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee (reelected in 1986) and made president of the Shanghai 1st Secretarial Association. In 1986 Huang was elected vice-mayor of Shanghai People's Government (reelected in 1988). 1987 he was appointed head of the Shanghai Production Safety Work Committee, in 1988 first deputy head of the Shanghai Foreign Investment Work Committee, in 1988 vice-chairman of the Shanghai Current Construction Arrangement Leading Group and vice-chairman of the Leading Group of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee for Restructuring the Political System, in 1989 head of the Shanghai Labor and Wages Committee, and in 1990 chairman of the Leading Group for the Development and Planning of Pudong. Huang was an alternate member of the 13th CCP CC and is a member of the 14th CCP CC. He is also a delegate of Shanghai Municipality to the 8th NPC.

Jiang Chunyun (3)

Appointed member of the CCP CC Secretariat, according to a decision of the 4th plenary session of the 14th CCP CC. (RMRB, XNA, 29 Sep 94) Jiang concurrently serves as member of the CCP CC Politburo (since October 1992), secretary of CCP Shandong Provincial Committee (since December 1988), president of Shandong Provincial Party School (since September 1989) and as First Secretary of CCP Shandong Military District Committee. Jiang was born in 1930 into a carpenter family in Laixi County, Shandong Province, and joined the CCP in 1947. He finished higher primary school. From 1954 to 1956 he served as director of the General Office of CCP Laixi County Committee, from 1957 to 1960 as deputy section chief in the Qingdao branch of the China Export Corporation for Local Products and in the Foreign Trade Bureau of Qingdao City, and from 1960 to 1966 as instructor and inspector of the Propaganda Department of CCP Shandong Provincial Committee and as deputy director of the department's General Office. In the "Cultural Revolution" Jiang was

sent to a village in Huimin County to do manual work, and in 1969 to a cadre school in Qihe County. After 1970 he worked under the Revolutionary Committee of Shandong Province. From 1975 to 1977 he served as deputy director of the General Office of CCP Shandong Provincial Committee, and from 1977 to 1983 as deputy secretary-general and secretary-general of CCP Shandong Provincial Committee. In March 1983 he was elected deputy secretary of CCP Shandong Provincial Committee, in 1984 he became secretary of CCP Jinan Municipal Committee (until 1987), in July 1987 he was appointed acting governor of Shandong Province, and in February 1988 elected governor (until March 1989). Jiang was a member of the 13th CCP CC and is a member of the 14th CCP CC. He is also a delegate of Shandong Province to the 8th NPC.

Li Zhibin (4)

Identified as vice-governor of He'nan Province. (RMRB, 11 Sep 94) Li has served as director of the Public Security Department of He'nan Provincial People's Government since April 1992.

Lou Jiwei (5)

Appointed vice-minister of finance. (Ming Bao, Hong Kong, 26 Sep 94, in SWB, 28 Sep 94) Lou - he is in his early forties - has served as director of the Macro-Control System Department of the State Commission for Restructuring Economy since April 1992. He is said to belong to Zhu Rongji's brain trust.

Peng Cuifeng (6)

Appointed commander of Inner Mongolia Military District. (RMRB, 2 Sep 94)

Wu Bangguo (7)

Appointed member of the CCP CC Secretariat, according to a decision of the 4th plenary session of the 14th CCP CC. (RMRB, XNA, 29 Sep 94) Wu concurrently serves as member of the CCP CC Politburo (since October 1992). According to a decision of the CCP CC, he will no longer serve as secretary of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee (post held since April 1991) and will also quit his former posts of a Standing Committee member and a member of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee. (RMRB, XNA, 30 Sep 94) Wu was born in 1941 in Feidong County, Anhui Province, and

joined the CCP in 1964. He grew up in Beijing. From 1960 to 1967 he studied in the Radio and Electronics Department of Qinghua University. After majoring as vacuum appliances engineer in 1967, Wu served successively as worker, technician and section head of the Shanghai No.3 Electronic Tube Factory. From 1976 to 1978 he served as deputy Party secretary, vice-chairman of the Revolutionary Committee, deputy director and director of this factory. He then served as deputy manager of the Shanghai Electronic Industrial Company (until 1979), deputy manager of the Shanghai Vacuum Apparatus Industrial Company (until 1981), and as deputy Party secretary of the Shanghai Telecommunications Industrial Bureau (until 1983). In 1983 Wu became a Standing Committee member of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee and Party secretary of the Scientific and Technical Commission, in 1985 deputy secretary of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee (reelected in 1986), and in 1988 head of the Leading Group for Restructuring the Political System. In 1991 he succeeded Zhu Rongji as secretary of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee. Wu was an alternate member of the 12th and 13th CCP CC and is a member of the 14th CCP CC.

Zhang Xuezhong (8)

Appointed vice-minister of personnel. (RMRB, 9 Sep 94) There is a Zhang Xuezhong (written with the same Chinese characters) who serves as president of the CCP Tibet Regional Party School (since May 1991).

Zhang Zhen

Political Commissar of Inner Mongolia Military District. (RMRB, 2 Sep 94) Zhang has served as political commissar of Shanxi Military District since April 1993. (See C.a., 1993/5, p.523/17)

Zheng Silin

Appointed acting governor of Jiangsu Province at the 9th meeting of the 8th Jiangsu Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee. (RMRB, 5 Sep 94) Zheng has been appointed vice-governor at the 2nd plenary session of the 9th meeting of the Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee on September 1, 1994. (Xinhua Ribao, 2 Sep 94, in SWB, 21 Sep 94) He was also appointed deputy secretary of CCP Jiangsu Provincial Committee in Au-

Canada, Germany, Israel (Sep 30)

Tianjin Municipality recently signed agreements on setting up friendly cooperative relations with three state and cities from Canada, Germany and Israel. The state and cities are Mississauga from Canada, Saarland State from Germany and Rishon Lezion from Israel. To date, the city has set up friendly relations with 17 cities from 15 countries. (XNA, 1 Oct 94)

France (Sep 10)

China and France signed two contracts and two protocols on trade and economic cooperation worth 13.3 billion Francs (about 2.5 billion US\$). The contracts and protocols involve petrochemicals, grain, and telecommunications. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin congratulated the representatives of both sides after the signing ceremony. Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen, Chairman of the State Planning Commission Chen Jinhua, Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Wu Yi and French Foreign Trade Minister Gerard Longuet attended the signing ceremony. On September 7, 1994 China and France signed 12 contracts and protocols totaling 2.66 billion Francs. (XNA, 11 Sep 94)

Germany (Sep 26)

An agreement on environmental cooperation was signed in Bonn by the Chinese State Bureau of Environmental Protection and the German Federal Ministry of the Environment. Chinese Ambassador to Germany Mei Zhao-rong and German Minister for the Environment Klaus Toepfer signed the agreement on behalf of their governments. (XNA, 28 Sep 94)

Guinea (Sep 09?)

The Red Cross Society of China has recently donated medicine worth 40,000 US\$ to the Guinean government. (RMRB, 11 Sep 94)

Japan (Sep 09?)

An agreement has been signed between China and Japan on establishing an advanced studies center in Tianjin City for teachers engaged in vocational training. This is the largest cooperation so far between the Chinese Ministry of Labor and its Japanese counterpart. The Japanese Ministry of Labor will provide 1.8 billion RMBY gratis for the center to buy advanced teaching, scientific and research equipment, in addition to 100m ¥ in the form of technical transfer. China will be responsible for the construction of the center, which is expected to be completed next year. According to the agreement, the cooperation is to start this November and will last for five years. (XNA, 11 Sep 94)

South Korea (Sep 10)

An agreement on news exchange and cooperation was signed in Beijing by the major news agencies of China and the Republic of Korea. Guo Chaoren, president of Xinhua News Agency, and Hyon Sowhan, president and publisher of Yonhap News Agency, signed the agreement on behalf of their respective agencies. (XNA, 11 Sep 94)

Madagascar (Sep 09?)

The Chinese government donates 200 tons of rice as disaster relief to the Madagascan government. (RMRB, 11 Sep 94)

Pakistan (Sep 08)

China donated 350 tons of wheat and 14 tons of medicine to the Afghan refugees living in Pakistan. (XNA, 9 Sep 94)

Poland (Sep 22)

A signing ceremony for documents covering cooperation between China and Poland in the fields of plant quarantine, construction and the chemical industry, a letter of intent on the import by China of two 300,000-kW power generating boilers and a programme for cultural and scientific contacts was attended in Beijing by Premier Li Peng and his Polish counterpart Waldemar Pawlak. (Xinhua, 22 Sep 94, in SWB, 24 Sep 94; XNA, 23 Sep 94)

Poland (Sep 23?)

Polish Agriculture Minister Andzrej Smietanko and his Chinese counterpart Liu Jiang signed an agreement on cooperation in agriculture, while Industry and Trade Minister Marek Pol signed an aviation cooperation agreement. The Polish Agricultural Bank signed a letter of intent on cooperation with the Bank of China. (PAP news agency, Warsaw, 23 Sep 94, in SWB, 27 Sep 94)

Russia (Sep 02)

A protocol on Russian-Chinese trade and economic cooperation for 1994 was signed in Moscow. (ITAR-TASS news agency [World Service], 2 Sep 94, in SWB, 5 Sep 94)

Russia (Sep 03)

Visiting PRC President Jiang Zemin and Russian President Boris Yeltsin signed a Sino-Russian joint statement in Moscow aimed at the further development of long-term, stable, good-neighbourly, friendly and mutually beneficial relations between the two countries. (Xinhua, 3 Sep 94, in SWB, 5 Sep 94; RMRB, XNA, 4 Sep 94) China and Russia have agreed to stop targeting each other with their strategic nuclear weapons, according to a joint declaration signed by President Jiang Zemin and President Boris Yeltsin. (RMRB, XNA, 4 Sep 94) An agreement on the Western part of the Russian-Chinese state border was signed in Moscow by visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and his Russian counterpart Andrey Kozyrev.

An agreement on the Eastern part of the border was signed between the former USSR and China in 1991. (ITAR-TASS news agency [World Service], 3 Sep 94, in SWB, 5 Sep 94; XNA, 4 Sep 94)

Rwanda (Sep 12)

China has contributed relief goods worth 305,800 US\$ to Rwandan refugees for the purpose of providing humanitarian assistance. (XNA, 13 Sep 94)

Uganda (Sep 18, 19)

China has granted a batch of goods worth about 121,000 US\$ to Uganda to express friendly feelings of Chinese people towards Ugandan people. Visiting Chinese Assistant Minister of Foreign Affairs Wang Changyi and Ugandan Minister of State of Foreign Affairs Ali Kirunda Kivejinja signed the exchange of notes on handing over and receiving the goods in Kampala. (XNA, 20 Sep 94)

Ukraine (Sep 06)

Visiting PRC President Jiang Zemin and Ukrainian President Leonid Kuchma signed a "joint statement of the People's Republic of China and Ukraine" in Kiev with a view to further developing long-term and stable relations of friendship and cooperation based on mutual benefit between the two countries. (Xinhua, 7 Sep 94, in SWB, 10 Sep 94; RMRB, XNA, 8 Sep 94) The two sides also signed agreements on cooperation in the areas of post and telecommunications, shipping and public security. In addition, the two foreign ministers inked a protocol on information cooperation. (RMRB, XNA, 8 Sep 94)

International Agreements

China and 37 other nations signed the convention on nuclear safety at the 38th conference of the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) in Vienna on September 20, 1994. (XNA, 22 Sep 94; RMRB, 23 Sep 94)

PRC Laws and Regulations

According to the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation, the state recently implemented new measures on import and export price control. (Zhongguo tongxunshe news agency, Hong Kong, 8 Sep 94, in SWB, 15 Sep 94)

New regulations for import-export trade in foreign-funded enterprises have been recently formulated by the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation. (Zhongguo tongxunshe news agency, Hong Kong, 10 Sep 94, in SWB, 15 Sep 94)

Detailed regulations on dealing with enterprises manufacturing products without permits have been recently made public by the State Bureau of Technological Supervision and the Ministry of Finance. (Zhongguo xinwenshe news agency, Beijing, 13 Sep 94, in SWB, 22 Sep 94)

"Regulations governing the protection of nuclear materials in kind during international transportation" have been recently promulgated by state organs in charge of nuclear energy. The regulations will become effective on September 15, 1994. (Xinhua, 14 Sep 94, in SWB, 16 Sep 94; RMRB, 18 Sep 94) China joined the international "Convention of protecting nuclear materials in kind" in 1989.

A regulation, worked out by the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation, covering the training of personnel sent abroad to perform labor service contracts is scheduled to go into force from October 1, 1994. (XNA, 24 Sep 94)

Addenda

"Regulations on the management of audiovisual products." These regulations shall take effect on October 1, 1994. (Order No.165 of the State Council signed by Premier Li Peng on August 25, 1994) (Full text: Xinhua, 9 Sep 94, in SWB, 29 Sep 94; RMRB, 11 Sep 94)

A regulation on the management of films coproduced by Chinese and foreign producers has been recently issued by the Ministry of Radio, Film and Television. Films coproduced by Chinese and overseas partners now account for about 25% of China's annual film output. Last year China made 160 feature films, 42 of which were joint productions. (XNA, 29 Aug 94)
