Australia (July 17)

China and Australia signed four cooperative agreements in Beijing involving around 20m US\$. Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Gu Yongjiang and visiting Australian Minister for Development Cooperation and Pacific Island Affairs, Gordon Bilney, signed an agreement on urban environment in South China's Guangxi Province with 1.025m Australian dollars' worth of Australian funds. They also attended the signing ceremony for three other projects using Australian loans for 17.59m Australian dollars, which include a water-supply project in Shandong Province, a boiler project in Shanxi Province, and a power project in Gansu Province. There are a total of 55 projects thus far in China involving Australian government loans amounting to nearly 490m US\$ in telecommunications, urban construction, agriculture, forestry, and electromechanical instruments. (XNA, 18 July 95)

Australia (July 23)

The Chinese and the Australian governments signed last week an agreement in Yinchuan City to cooperate on a family planning and maternal and infantile health project in Ningxia Autonomous Region. According to the agreement, the whole project will last for three years and cost 10.09m Australian dollars. The Australian government will provide 5.56m Australian dollars for the project. (XNA, 24 July 95)

Australia (July 31)

Visiting Australian Minister for Employment, Education and Training Simon Crean signed a memorandum of understanding with Chinese Minister of Labor Li Boyong and some agreements on provision of educational and training packages with Wei Yu, vice-chairman of the State Education Commission. (XNA, 1 Aug 95)

Bolivia (July 25)

Lhasa, capital of Tibet Autonomous Region, has established a sister-city relationship with Potosi, a city in Bolivia in South America. A Tibetan goodwill mission headed by a deputy major of Lhasa visited Potosi last month, when a formal agreement on friendly ties was signed by both parties. (XNA, 26 July 95)

Botswana (July 29?)

The Botswana government and China have signed a preferential credit agreement of approximately 58m pula to be used mainly for the rehabilitation of the Serule Mahalapye railway line. Visiting Chinese Vice-Premier Zhu Rongji signed on behalf of his country, while the Vice-President Festus Mogae signed on behalf of Botswana. (Radio Botswana, Gaborone, 31 July 95, in SWB, 2 Aug 95)

Brazil (July 25)

A memorandum of understanding on agricultural technology cooperation between China and Brazil was signed in Beijing by China's Minister of Agriculture Liu Jiang and visiting Brazilian Agriculture Minister Jose E. Andrade Vieira. (XNA, 27 July 95)

Cambodia (July 03)

China will provide Cambodia with a loan totalling 8.6m US\$. (RMRB, 4 July 95)

Cambodia (July 10)

China signed an agreement with Cambodia in Phnom Penh to provide mine-sweeping equipment to the war-torn country. (RMRB, XNA, 11 July 95)

Finland (July 07)

Wu Yi, China's visiting minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Finland's European Affairs Minister Ole Norrback attended the signing ceremony of six economic agreements and contracts valued at nearly 93m US\$ in Helsinki. (XNA, 8 July 95) During President Jiang Ze-

min's four-day visit, China and Finland also signed an "Exchange of Notes on the Mutual Establishment of Consular Posts in China and Finland" (Finland is to establish a consulate-general in Shanghai) and a "Memorandum of Understanding Between China and Finland on Cooperation in Environmental Protection". (Xinhua, 8 July 95, in SWB, 11 July 95; RMRB, XNA 7 July 95)

Germany (July 13-15)

The Chinese and German governments signed in Bonn two agreements concerning the establishment of additional consulates general and financial cooperation, and eight documents on credit and economic and technological cooperation involving a total of 3.1bn US\$. Qian Qichen, vice-premier and foreign minister, and Klaus Kinkel, vice-chancellor and foreign minister, signed the "Sino-German Agreement on the Establishment of Additional Consulates General" on behalf of their respective governments. According to the agreement, China and Germany will set up consulates general in Munich and Guangzhou. Wu Yi, minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Klaus Kinkel signed the "Agreement on Sino-German Financial Cooperation" on behalf of their respective governments. According to the agreement, the German government will provide 180m German marks (about 130m US\$) in financial aid to China this fiscal year.

The Bank of China and the Dresden Bank of Germany signed a general agreement on credit under which the Dresden Bank will provide over 710m US\$ credit to the Bank of China. In addition, China's Nanfang Automobile Company and Daimler-Benz signed the "Agreement in Principle on the Feasibility Study of the Joint Venture Project to Produce Multipurpose Vehicles". This project involves more than 1bn US\$. (Xinhua, 13 July 95, in SWB, 15 July 95; XNA, 14 July 95) Audi signed a principle agreement on the feasibility research for joining the joint venture between Volkswagen and China's First Automobile Group Company. The agreement volume was 230m US\$.

Siemens signed two agreements of a combined 470m US\$ worth on power equipments with two Chinese companies. These three agreements have raised the total number of documents signed between China and Germany during Jiang's visit to this country to 14. (XNA, 16 July 95)

Hungary (July 10)

An agreement on mutual assistance and cooperation in customs affairs between China and Hungary was signed in Budapest by Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Hungarian Foreign Minister Kovacs Laszlo. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and Hungarian President Goncz Arpad witnessed the signing of the agreement. (RMRB, XNA, 11 July 95)

India (July 17)

China and India are to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on combating cross border-crimes and narcotics related crimes. A note of the MOU was exchanged between the two countries in Beijing during a meeting between the visiting Home Minister, S.B. Chavan, and his Chinese counterpart, Minister of Public Security Tao Siju. (All-India Radio, New Delhi, 17 July 95, in SWB, 19 July 95)

South Korea (July 19)

South Korea and China concluded a bilateral agreement on 1995-1997 educational exchanges and cooperation. The agreement was signed in Beijing by visiting Education Minister Pak Yong-sik and his Chinese counterpart, chairman of the State Education Commission Zhu Kaixuan. (Yonhap news agency, Seoul, 19 July 95, in SWB, 22 July 95)

Mexico (July 06)

The Mexican Foreign Ministry has announced that Mexico and China have signed a document that comprises 62 technical cooperation and scientific programmes to be implemented during the 1995-1996 period. The document was signed within the framework of the 3rd Mexican-PRC Joint Technical and Scientific Cooperation Committee, held during the visit to China of a delegation headed by ministry undersecretary Trevino Cantu. (Notimex news agency, Mexico City, 6 July 95, in SWB, 10 July 95)

Namibia (July 31)

China and Namibia signed three agreements in Windhoek to further expand bilateral economic and technical cooperation. Namibian Minister of Trade and Industry Hidipo Hamutenya and Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Liu Shanzai signed the agreements on behalf of their respective governments. (XNA, 1 Aug 95)

Romania (July 04)

China's Premier Li Peng and visiting Romanian Premier Nicolae Vacaroiu attended the signing ceremony of a package of agreements and protocols on education, hygiene and medical science, and economic and trade cooperation. (XNA, 5 July 95)

Tanzania (July 19)

An agreement was signed in Dar es Salaam between the governments of Tanzania, Zambia and China on a special loan from China to the Tanzania-Zambia railway. (RMRB, XNA, 21 July 95)

Zimbabwe (July 26)

Chinese Vice-Premier Zhu Rongji witnessed the signing of two trade agreements between China and Zimbabwe in Harare. (XNA, 27 July 95)
