### Armenia (May 05)

Agreements on Sino-Armenian cooperation in the fields of taxation, civil air transportation and culture were signed in Beijing. Chinese President Jiang Zemin and visiting Armenian President Levon Ter-Petrosyan attended the signing ceremony. (XNA, 6 May 96)

### Bulgaria (May 20)

Cooperation agreements on public security, education, science, patents and other fields were signed in Beijing. Premier Li Peng and visiting Bulgarian Prime Minister Zhan Videnov attended the signing ceremony. (XNA, 21 May 96)

### Canada (May 07)

China and Canada produced two memoranda in Beijing on higher-education cooperation and collaboration between the two countries' schools. The two agreements were signed by Sun Zhenyu, China's vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Raymond Chan, secretary of state for Asia-Pacific of Canada. According to the two agreements, Canada will provide two amounts, one of 8m US\$, the other of 7.7m US\$, from 1995 to 1999, for academic exchanges, teaching, and research cooperation. Since having signed a general agreement in 1983, the two countries have cooperated in 75 programmes in agriculture, forestry, energy, and other areas. In 54 programmes covered by memoranda, Canada has provided a total of 270m US\$. (XNA, RMRB, 8 May 96)

### Egypt (May 14)

Egypt and China signed agreements covering several areas including labor and culture. A technical cooperation protocol signed in Cairo by the Egyptian Ministry of Manpower and Migration and the Chinese Ministry of Labor covered vocational training, health and safety, and employment. The two countries also signed an agreement, under which China would grant Egypt 6m US\$ for the implementation of technological and economic cooperation projects. The two countries also signed a cooperation agreement involving universities, scholarships and exchange visits, as well as the exchange of films and exhibitions and tours by artists. (MENA news agency, Cairo, 14 May 96, in SWB, 21 May 96; RMRB, 15 May 96)

### Ethiopia (May 13)

China and Ethiopia signed two agreements on promoting trade, economic and technological cooperation between the two countries. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and his Ethiopian counterpart Negasso Gidada were present at the signing ceremony in Addis Ababa. According to the first agreement, the Chinese government shall provide an assistance gratis to the Ethiopian government within a period of five years from 1st June 1996 to 31st May 2001. This grant shall be used for implementing projects to be agreed upon through consultations between the two sides. The second agreement stipulates that both contracting parties agree to do their utmost, in conformity with the laws and regulations in force in their respective countries, to develop trade and economic relations between the two countries. The agreement also encourages corporations, enterprises and other economic organizations of the two countries to cooperate in trade, economy, investment and technology. (XNA, RMRB, 14 May 96)

### Germany (May 07)

China and Germany have signed an agreement to jointly undertake a massive tree-planting project on the upper reaches of Baiyangdian (Hebei Province), the largest lake in North China. Under the agreement, the KFW Bank of Germany will provide 13m Deutsche marks (about 78m RMBY) in gratis aid to the project, which is set for completion within five years at a total cost of 120m RMBY. Following the completion of the scheme forest cover in the project-covered area will soar to 69% from 7.8%. (XNA, 8 May 96)

### Greece (May 31)

Chinese Vice-Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and Greek Ambassador to China Spyridon Dokianos exchanged the instruments of ratification of an agreement on judicial assistance of civilian and criminal affairs between the People's Republic of China and the Hellenic Republic. This agreement will go into effect on June 29, 1996. (XNA, 1 June 96; RMRB, 2 June 96)

### Iran (May 15?)

A memorandum of understanding on cooperation in the field of railways between the governments of China and Iran was signed in Tehran by visiting Chinese Minister of Railways Han Zhubin and his Iranian counterpart. (RMRB, 17 May 96)

### Jordan (May 09)

An agreement on economic and technical cooperation between China and Jordan was signed in Amman during the visit of Chinese Vice-Premier Wu Bangguo. (XNA, 11 May 96)

### Jordan (May 16)

Jordan and Chinese officials signed an executive programme for cultural and scientific cooperation for the next two years. The programme covers the areas of tourism, health, social development, culture and education. (Jordanian TV, Amman, 16 May 96, in SWB, 21 May 96; RMRB, 20 May 96)

### Kenya (May 09)

China and Kenya concluded an agreement on economic and technological cooperation in Nairobi under which Beijing will provide 10m RMBY in aid to Kenya. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and Kenyan President Daniel Arap Moi witnessed the signing of the agreement by Wu Yi, Chinese minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Musalia Mudavadi, Kenyan Minister of Finance. An agreement of understanding on the provision of a 150m-RMBY Chinese government preferential loan to finance a sheet glass project in Kenya was also signed. (XNA, RMRB, 10 May 96)

### Kenya (May 28)

Chinese Ambassador to Kenya Chen Pingchu handed over computer equipment worth 1m RMBY (about 120,000 US\$) to the Kenyan government. (XNA, 29 May 96)

**North Korea (May 22)**

China and the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) signed an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the two governments and an exchange of notes on China's providing 20,000 tons of grain for the DPRK. (XNA, 23 May 96) The agreement was signed in Beijing by Chinese Vice-Premier Li Lanqing and visiting DPRK Vice-Premier Hong Song-nam.

**Kuwait (May 27)**

China and Kuwait signed a loan agreement for the project of Huizhou Port in South China's Guangdong province. According to the agreement, Kuwait will provide a loan of 14m US\$ to China for the port project. The document was signed by Shi Guangsheng, vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Bader Al-Humaidhi, president of the Kuwaiti Fund for Arab Economic Development. (XNA, 28 May 96)

**Mali (May 17)**

The Chinese and Malian governments signed an agreement on economic and technical cooperation in Bamako. According to the agreement, China is to provide 10m RMBY (about 1.2m US\$) to Mali as assistance. The money will be used either in the joint ventures of the two countries or to buy Chinese goods. At the signing ceremony, representatives of the two countries also inked an agreement on an interest-free loan of 80m RMBY (about 9.6m US\$) from China to Mali to fund some Sino-Malian cooperative projects. The two sides also signed a memorandum on the establishment of a Chinese investment and development centre in Bamako, capital of Mali. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and Malian President Alpha Oumar Konare witnessed the signing of these documents. Wu Yi, minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Dioncounda Traore, Malian minister of state for foreign affairs, Malians abroad and African integration, signed the documents. (XNA, RMRB, 19 May 96)

**Namibia (May 19)**

The Chinese and Namibian governments inked an agreement on economic and technical cooperation. According to the pact signed in Windhoek, China will provide an assistance of 10m RMBY (about 1.2m US\$) to Namibia, to be used in the implementation of projects agreed upon or in the acquisition of general goods. Visiting Chinese

President Jiang Zemin and Namibian President Sam Nujoma witnessed signing of the accord, which was inked by Wu Yi, Chinese minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Saara Kuugongelwa, director general of Namibia's Planning Commission. (XNA, RMRB, 20 May 96)

**Netherlands (May 23)**

China and the Netherlands signed a civil aviation agreement in Beijing. (XNA, RMRB, 24 May 96)

**New Zealand (May 20)**

China and New Zealand signed four documents on the cooperation in animal husbandry. The documents include a memorandum of understanding on NZ's exportation of animals and animal genetic materials and China's importation of NZ's sheep sperm. They were signed in Wellington by the visiting Chinese Agriculture Minister Liu Jiang and his NZ counterpart Lockwood Smith. (XNA, 21 May 96)

**Yemen (May 16)**

China and Yemen signed a memorandum of understanding in Sanaa on the development of cooperation in the fields of oil prospection, production, marketing and refining. The document was signed by Xu Penghang, vice-chairman of the Economic and Trade Commission from China, and Yemen's Deputy Minister of Oil and Mineral Wealth. (XNA, 17 May 96)

**Yemen (May 26)**

China and Yemen signed in Sanaa a cooperation agreement on extending sports exchanges between the two countries. (XNA, 27 May 96)

**Zimbabwe (May 21)**

China and Zimbabwe signed eight documents on economic and technological cooperation. The eight documents include an agreement on trade, economic and technological cooperation, an agreement on the encouragement and reciprocal protection of investment, an aviation agreement and a general loan agreement. Under two of these documents, China will provide a grant of 10m RMBY (about 1.2m US\$) and a loan of 10m US\$ to the southern African country. (XNA, RMRB, 22 May 96)

**International Agreements****European Union (May 07)**

China and the European Union will strengthen cooperation in Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) protection, according to an agreement signed in

Beijing. The agreement specified that Sino-EU cooperation in IPR will include IPR training programme and technology transfer. The accord is among four agreements reached between the two sides, and signed by Sun Zhenyu, Chinese vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Sir Leon Brittan, vice-president of the EU. The other three agreements are on bilateral cooperation concerning higher education and universities, technology and commerce in the dairy sector, and water buffalo development. The EU will invest almost 57m US\$ for the projects which will be completed within three to five years. (XNA, RMRB, 8 May 96)

**IATA (May 02)**

China Southwest Airlines has become a member of the International Air Transport Association, the fourth Chinese carrier to join the organization. The other three Chinese IATA members are Air China, China Eastern Airlines, and China Southern Airlines, the country's three leading air carriers. Founded in 1987, China Southwest Airlines ranks fourth in terms of transport capacity in the nation, with a passenger flow of 5.49 million in 1995. (XNA, 3 May 96)

**United Nations (May 15)**

The NPC Standing Committee decided at its 19th session to abide by the UN's Maritime Convention. In doing so it will increase the sea area under its jurisdiction to about three million sq km, from 370,000 sq km, and have its rights to territorial waters and continental shelves recognized under international law. The convention took effect in 1994 as the most comprehensive international law of the sea. China is the 87th country to adopt it. (XNA, RMRB, 16 May 96)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on the Application of Scientific and Technological Findings", adopted at the 19th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on May 15, 1996. (Decree No.68 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on May 15, 1996) (Full text of the law: RMRB, 23 May 96; Xinhua, 16 May 96, in SWB, 8 June 96)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Vocational Education", adopted at the 19th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on May 15, 1996. This law will go into effect on September 1,

1996. (Decree No.69 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on May 15, 1996) (Full text of the law: RMRB, 23 May 96; Xinhua, 16 May 96, in SWB, 8 June 96)

China has uplifted the ceilings on the amount of foreign exchange allowed for private use, according to new rules issued by the State Administration of Exchange Control (SAEC). Individuals who plan to visit their relatives in Macau and Hong Kong can exchange RMBY for up to 500 US\$, up from a mere 20 US\$ for private visits to Macau and 40 US\$ for Hong Kong trips. The standard for those visiting their relatives in other regions and countries has been set at a maximum 1,000 US\$, as against mere 60 US\$ in the past. The old rules and regulations on the subject issued by the SAEC in 1994 will be defunct when the new rules become effective July 1, 1996. (XNA, 18 May 96)

China has issued a set of regulations to protect the state's monopoly on the production, transportation and marketing of salt. The regulations are aimed at guaranteeing effective implementation of iodizing salt and the citizens' health. According to the regulations, the price of salt is fixed by the government and no salt producers and sellers should alter the price at will. These regulations will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Order No.197 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on May 27, 1996) (XNA, 31 May 96; full text: RMRB, 4 June 96)
