A Russo-Chinese agreement on cooperation between the two sides in border guard issues was signed in Beijing. (ITAR-TASS news agency [World Service], Moscow, 24 Aug 95, in SWB, 28 Aug 95)

### Uzbekistan (Aug 28)

The Chinese government donates medicine and medical equipment worth 1.5m RMBY to the government of Uzbekistan. (RMRB, 29 Aug 95)

### Zambia (Aug 03)

China and Zambia signed a special loan agreement in Lusaka to boost operations of the China-aided Tanzania-Zambia Railway. Zambian Minister of Finance Ronald Penza and Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Liu Shanzai signed the agreement on behalf of their respective governments. The signing ceremony was witnessed by Zambian Vice-President Godfrey Miyanda and visiting Chinese Vice-Premier Zhu Rongji. Under the agreement, the Chinese government will provide an interest free loan of 200m RMBY (about 24.1m US\$) to the Zambian government and the Tanzanian government in five years. The Tanzanian government, which will get half of the loan, already signed the tripartite agreement on 20th July in Dar es Salaam. (XNA, 4 Aug 95)

## International Agreements

China, Japan, the Republic of Korea and Russia have agreed on setting up a centre in Dalian, a coastal city in Liaoning Province, to improve their cooperation in environmental protection.
