Sichuan: China successfully launched a Hong Kong telecommunications satellite;
- 09 Beijing: national forum on export trade work opened;
- 10 Beijing: World Bank will lend China up to 9bn US\$ in the next three fiscal years starting this July;  
US Export-Import Bank approved the financing of 321m US\$ worth sales of US equipment and services for China's two power projects;

The decision was approved by the 22nd meeting of the Standing Committee of the 8th Gansu Provincial People's Congress, which closed on July 31, 1996. (XNA, 2 Aug 96) Sun was born in November 1936 in Baodi County, Tianjin Municipality, and joined the CCP in 1956. In 1958, he graduated from the History Department of Shanxi Teachers College and served as deputy secretary of CYL Shanxi University Committee. He later served as director of the Political Department of Taiyuan Engineering Institute, deputy secretary of CYL Shanxi Provincial Committee, and as vice-chairman of Shanxi Provincial Science and Technology Association (1978); as Standing Committee member of CCP Shanxi Provincial Committee, and as deputy secretary and secretary of CCP Taiyuan City Committee (1985). The 22nd meeting of the 8th Guizhou Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee decided recently to appoint Wu Yixia as Guizhou vice-governor and acting governor. (Xinhua, 15 July 96, in SWB, 19 July 96) Wu was born in March 1943 in Jilin City, Jilin Province. He joined the CCP in December 1965 and began to work in August 1967. He holds a bachelor's degree in soil agrochemistry from Jilin Agricultural University and is a senior economist. After his graduation in 1968, he worked on the farm of the PLA's Unit 3016 (until 1970). **Belgium** (July 12)

The Chinese and Belgium governments signed in Beijing an agreement on Belgium providing a loan of 200m Belgium francs (about 6.6m US\$) to China. The loan is expected to cover part of the cost of the equipment and other products imported by China from Belgium. Since 1980, Belgium has provided more than 100m US\$ in loans to China, which were directed to over 20 projects in the sectors of energy, telecommunications, medicine and the chemical industry. (XNA, 13 July 96; RMRB, 14 July 96)

**Cambodia** (July 19)

A trade agreement and an agreement on the promotion and protection of investment between the governments of China and Cambodia were signed in Beijing. Chinese Premier Li Peng and Second Prime Minister of Cambodia, Hun Sen, attended the signing ceremony. (XNA, 20 July 96)

**Canada** (July 12)

China and Canada have signed a project award agreement for the cooperation for the Qinshan phase III Candu nuclear power project. The agreement was signed in Beijing by the China National Nuclear Corporation and the Atomic Energy of Canada Limited. (XNA, 15 July 96)

**Canada** (July 26)

A sports exchange agreement between China and Canada was signed in Atlanta by Wu Shaozu, president of the Chinese Olympic Committee, and Bill Warren, president of the Canadian Olympic Association. (XNA, 28 July 96)

**Cote d'Ivoire** (July 09?)

China's Premier Li Peng and visiting Prime Minister of Cote d'Ivoire, Daniel Duncan, attended a signing ceremony for a government trade agreement, an agreement on the establishment of a trade center, and an agreement on mining and metallurgy, between the Ministry of Mine and Oil Resources of Cote d'Ivoire and the Ministry of Metallurgical Industry of China. (XNA, 10 July 96)

**Cuba** (July 30)

An agreement on establishing sister relations between Shanghai Municipality and Santiago de Cuba Province was signed in Santiago. (RMRB, 1 Aug 96)

**Ethiopia** (July 19)

A protocol concerning the dispatch of the ninth Chinese medical team to work in Ethiopia was signed in Addis Ababa between the governments of China and Ethiopia. (XNA, 20 July 96; RMRB, 23 July 96)

**Fiji** (July 19)

Visiting Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and his Fijian counterpart Filipe Bole signed an exchange of notes on China providing assistance to Fiji. On the same day, Qian Qichen and Ieremia Tabai, secretary-general of the South Pacific Forum (SPF), signed an exchange of notes on China providing assistance to the SPF secretariat. (RMRB, XNA, 20 July 96)

**Germany** (July 12)

An agreement has been signed between China and Germany to establish a printing technology training center in Hefei City, Anhui Province, to update the Chinese printing industry using German techniques and equipment. The eight-year project is expected to start in September. Germany is expected to invest 4.5m Deutschmarks to install equipment, and to send experts to train Chinese teachers who will work in the center. (XNA, 13 July 96)

**Kazakhstan** (July 5)

China will provide Kazakhstan with an aid of 3m RMBY (about 370,000 US\$) in commodities according to an agreement signed in Alma Ata by visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and his Kazakh counterpart Nursultan Nazarbayev. The two presidents also signed other agreements on extradition, cooperation between Chinese and Kazakh banks, as well as on the quality ratification of imports and exports between the two countries. (XNA, RMRB, 6 July 96)

**North Korea (July 30)**

The Chinese government is to provide 100,000 tons of grain to the government of the Democratic People's Republic of Korea, according to an exchange of notes signed in Beijing recently. (XNA, 31 July 96)

**Kuwait (July 11)**

A draft agreement on a loan of 33.3m US\$ for the construction of a large irrigation project in Ningxia Autonomous Region was signed in Yinchuan City. This is the largest sum of investment provided by the government of Kuwait to China. The loan will be used to build waterworks, a power supply system, and telecommunications facilities, and for the resettlement of local residents. (XNA, 13 July 96)

**Kyrgyzstan (July 04)**

China and Kyrgyzstan have signed an agreement on the demarcation of their joint border. China and Kyrgyzstan have more than 1,000 km of common borders. (XNA, RMRB, 5 July 96)

**Kyrgyzstan (July 04)**

China and Kyrgyzstan signed a series of cooperation agreements in Bishkek. The documents include five agreements on bilateral cooperation in civil and legal affairs, air transport, customs, meteorological technology and banking. China also agreed to give Kyrgyzstan 3m RMBY worth of aid in the form of goods. (XNA, RMRB, 5 July 96)

**Malaysia (July 18)**

China agreed in principle to barter wheat for palm oil from Malaysia. This agreement was signed at a meeting in Kuala Lumpur by Malaysian Minister of Domestic Trade and Consumer Affairs Abu Hassan Omar and visiting Chinese Minister of Internal Trade Luo Zhiling. (XNA, 19 July 1996)

**Mali (July 27)**

An agreement on agricultural cooperation between the governments of China and Mali was signed in Bamako. (RMRB, 30 July 96)

**Mongolia (July 17)**

China and Mongolia have signed an arbitration agreement aimed at solving economic and trade disputes between the two countries. The agreement was signed in Ulaanbaatar by the China Arbitration Council for International Trade and Economy and the Mongolia Arbitration House for the Association of Industry and Commerce. (XNA, 18 July 96)

**Netherlands (July 01)**

China and the Netherlands signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) for Joint Research in the Yangzi River Basin Intermodal Transport Project. Chen Jinhua, chairman of the State Planning Commission, and Dutch Minister of Transport Annemarie Jorritsma signed the MOU. (XNA, RMRB, 2 July 96)

**Pakistan (July 17)**

Pakistan and China signed an agreement in Bhurban for bilateral cooperation in the aeronautical sector. The agreement came at the conclusion of the first round of talks between aeronautical delegations from China and Pakistan. (Pakistan TV, Islamabad, 17 July 96, in SWB, 19 July 96)

**Papua New Guinea (July 16)**

China and Papua New Guinea (PNG) signed a number of agreements that provide for economic and technological cooperation between the two countries. The documents, signed in Port Moresby by visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and his Papua New Guinean counterpart Kilroy Genia, included two on economic and technological cooperation and one on cooperation in fishery. There was also a trade accord and an agreement on PNG's retention of its honorary consul in the Special Administrative Region of Hong Kong. (XNA, 17 July 96)

**Russia (July 17?)**

Three protocols have been signed between the Russian Border Troops and their counterparts in the Ministry of State Security of the PRC: on the exchange of experience on border controls, on the procedure for maintaining contacts and on the exchange of information. (Radio Russia, Moscow, 17 July 96, in SWB, 20 July 96)

**West Samoa (July 19)**

Visiting Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Western Samoan Prime Minister and Foreign Minister Tofilau Eti signed four documents - the agreement on the retention of Western Samoa's consulate-general in the Special Administration Region of Hong Kong, the agreement on mutual exemption of visas, and two exchanges of notes on China providing assistance to Western Samoa. (XNA, 21 July 96)

**International Agreements****United Nations (July 17)**

China signed the 1995 International Natural Rubber Treaty, a treaty that is designed to stabilize the international market price of natural rubber through the practise of buffer storage. The 1995 International Natural Rubber Treaty is the third of its kind since the 1970s. The first one was born in 1979, and the second in 1987. The second treaty, which expired on December 28, 1995, had 27 member countries. (XNA, RMRB, 19 July 96)

China, Pakistan, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan signed a protocol in Islamabad on July 6, 1996 on a set of rules and regulations on transit trade among them. Under the quadrilateral agreement, customs officials will follow a common set of documents at the entry and exit border posts of the four countries. The four countries signed an agreement on transit trade among them in March last year and the first caravan of vehicles with transit goods is scheduled to move across the borders by October this year. (XNA, 7 July 96)

China has signed memoranda with five Southeast Asian countries for construction of an 8,000-kilometer optical fibre linking China with Viet Nam, Laos, Thailand, Malaysia, and Singapore. The optical fibre is another international cable project, similar to those that connect China with Japan, the Republic of Korea, Europe, and other parts of the world. When the cable opens to traffic in early 1998, it will link China with Europe and the rest of the world by Euro-Asia optical fibre and the Indian Ocean's international marine cable via Singapore. (XNA, 5 July 96)

"Archives Law of the People's Republic of China", adopted at the 22nd session of the 6th NPC Standing Committee on 5th September 1987 and amended in accordance with the "Decision of the NPC Standing Committee on Amending the 'Archives Law of the People's Republic of China'", adopted at the 20th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on July 5, 1996. (Full text of the revised law: RMRB, 7 July 96)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Firearms Control", adopted at the 20th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on July 5, 1996. This law, consisting of 50 articles in eight chapters, will be put into effect on October 1, 1996. (Decree No.72 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on July 5, 1996) (Full text and translation: RMRB, 15 July 96; Xinhua, 6 July 96, in SWB, 1 Aug 96)

"Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Safeguarding Civil Aviation Safety". These regulations will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Order No.201 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on July 6, 1996) (XNA, 11 July 96; full text and translation: RMRB, 11 July 96; Xinhua, 10 July 96, in SWB, 24 July 96)

"Regulations on Administering Special Brands". These regulations will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Order No.202 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on July 13, 1996) (Full text: RMRB, 20 July 96)

Provisional Rules on the Representative Offices of Overseas Accounting Firms, Provisional Rules on Sino-Foreign Joint Venture Accounting Firms, and the Notice of Allowing International Accounting Firms to Identify Multiple Member Firms in China were released on July 4, 1996. (XNA, 5 July 96)

"Interim Procedures on cultivating public servants" have been recently issued by the Ministry of Personnel. These procedures will take effect on the date of promulgation. (Full text: RMRB, 6 July 96)

A new set of regulations on the recruitment of overseas professionals to work in mainland schools and universities has been jointly issued by the State Education Commission and State Bureau of Foreign Experts Affairs on July 11, 1996. (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, Beijing, 11 July 96, in SWB, 15 July 96)

The State Education Commission has released a set of interim provisions to guide Sino-foreign cooperation with regard to educational examinations. According to the new provisions, foreign organizations must work in cooperation with Chinese educational examination bodies that are at least on the provincial level, and the exams must meet China's requirements. The foreign organizations should obtain legal authorization before giving the exams, according to the provisions. (XNA, 1 Aug 96)
