Australia (Aug 22)

China and Australia initialled an agreement in Beijing on the maintenance of Australia's Consulate-General in Hong Kong after 1st July 1997. (RMRB, XNA, 23 Aug 96)

Germany (Aug 14)

China and Germany signed an agreement in Beijing to cooperate in continental scientific drilling activities in east China's Anhui and Shandong provinces. The Dabie Mountain Areas in central Anhui Province, as well as the southern part of Shandong Province are proved to have great mineral resources. According to the agreement, Germany will provide to China technologies for deep-well drilling, well logging, surveying, and drill sampling. Germany will help China train up to seven drilling experts every year in the coming five years. (XNA, 15 Aug 96)

Iraq (Aug 04)

A protocol on economic and trade cooperation between China and Iraq was signed in Baghdad. (XNA, 6 Aug 96)

Japan (Aug 14)

An agreement on Sasakawa Medical Scholarship for another ten years between China and Japan was signed in Beijing. According to the agreement, the Chinese side will send 100 medical and health students to Japan each year in the ten years starting from April of 1998. Chinese Vice-Minister of Public Health Yin Dakui, President of the Sa-

sakawa Memorial Health Foundation of Japan Hinohara Shigeaki, and President of the Japan-China Medical Association Inc. Okamoto Michio signed the agreement. Chinese State Councillor Peng Peiyun and Minister of Public Health Chen Minzhang attended the signing ceremony. It is learned that the first agreement of its kind was signed on August 14, 1986. Starting from September 1987, China has been sending 100 medical students to Japan annually, and a total of 800 who have finished their studies in Japan have come back. (XNA, 15 Aug 96)

Kenya (Aug 15)

A cultural protocol covering the next two years was signed in Nairobi between the Chinese and Kenyan governments. (XNA, 17 Aug 96; RMRB, 19 Aug 96)

Niger (Aug 19)

The People's Republic of China and the Republic of Niger have resumed diplomatic ties at the ambassadorial level. Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and visiting Niger Minister of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation André Salifou signed a joint communiqué to this effect on behalf of their respective governments in Beidaihe. Thailand (Aug 08)

A memorandum of understanding on cultural cooperation was signed in Pattaya by visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Culture Xu Wenbo and Thai Minister of Education Sukhawit Rangsitphon. (RMRB, 12 Aug 96)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Mineral Resources", adopted at the 15th session of the 6th NPC Standing Committee on 19th March 1986 and amended in accordance with the "Deci-

sion on Amending the 'Law of the People's Republic of China on Mineral Resources'", adopted at the 21st session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on August 29, 1996. (Full text of the revised law: RMRB, 9 Sep 96)

"Provisional Procedures for Position Rotation of State Civil Service Personnel". These procedures shall come into force as of the date of promulgation. (Xinhua, 7 Aug 96, in SWB, 19 Aug 96; full text: RMRB, 9 Aug 96)

"Measures for managing the shipping business across the Taiwan Straits". These measures will take effect as of August 20, 1996. (Decree No.6 of the Ministry of Communications of the PRC, signed by Minister Huang Zhen-dong on August 19, 1996) (Full text: RMRB, 21 Aug 96)

"Measures for managing cargo transport agents across the Taiwan Straits", issued by the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation on August 21, 1996. These measures will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Full text: RMRB, 22 Aug 96)

"Administrative Methods on the Market of Imported Cameras", issued by the State Administration Bureau for Industry and Commerce. (XNA, 23 Aug 96)

"Provisions Concerning Better Management of Acceptance For Carriage of Imported Waste Materials", which have been revised and formulated recently by the Ministry of Communications, were put into force beginning August 20, 1996. (Xinhua, 21 Aug 96, in SWB, 27 Aug 96)

Addenda
