He later served as deputy director of the Branch's Banking Research Office (1980-1982), director of the Branch's Chaoyang District Office (1982-1983), vice-president (1983-1984) and president of the Beijing Branch (1984-1986), and as vice-governor of the People's Bank of China (January 1987 - September 1995). Zhou became deputy head of the State Council's Leading Group for Clearing Up the "Debt Defaults" in March 1990, deputy head of the State Council's Leading Group for Assessing Investment in Fixed Assets in March 1991, and Party group secretary of the People's Bank of China in September 1993. Zhou is a delegate to the 8th NPC.

Australia (Sep 26)

China and Australia signed a treaty that will allow Australia to keep its consulate general in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Australian Foreign Minister Alexander Downer signed the treaty in the Chinese Mission to the United Nations. (XNA, RMRB, 28 Sep 96)

Austria (Sep 26)

"Provisional Measures for the Management of an Information Network for Enterprise Property Rights Markets" and "The Guiding Opinions on the Establishment of a Supervisory System for Enterprise Property Rights Markets" have been issued by the State Administration of State Property. (XNA, 6 Sep 96)

The Regulation on Police Enrolment and the Regulation on Police Dismissal, jointly issued by the Ministry of Public Security and the Ministry of Personnel, go into effect beginning on September 27, 1996. (XNA, 28 Sep 96)

"Provisional regulations on establishing Sino-overseas foreign trade joint ventures in selected areas" were approved by the State Council on September 2, 1996.
