He later served as deputy director of the Shanghai Pengpu Machinery Factory (1983-1984), deputy secretary of the Party committee of Shanghai Metallurgy and Mining Machinery Corporation, secretary of the Party committee at Shanghai Electric Appliances Corporation (1984-1985), head of the Retired Cadre Bureau of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee (1985-1987), deputy secretary of CCP Shanghai Huangpu District Committee, head of Shanghai Huangpu District (1987-1992), and as deputy secretary-general of CCP Shanghai Municipal Committee.

**Chen Mingyi**
