Appointed chairman of the State Commission of Science, Technology and Industry for National Defence. (Decree No.81 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on December 30, 1996) (RMRB, XNA, 31 Dec 96) He succeeds Ding Henggao. Cao served as deputy chief of the PLA General Staff since November 1992. Cao was born in December 1935 in Wugang, He'nan Province, and joined the CCP in 1956. He studied at the 3rd Artillery Ordnance Technical School in 1954 and at the Russian-Language School (1956-1957). In 1957 he was sent to the former Soviet Union to further his studies at the Military Engineering College of the Soviet Artillery Corps, and in 1963 he graduated from the Advanced Military Engineering School of this Artillery Corps (he majored in missile design). After returning to China, he continuously served with the General Staff Headquarters and the General Logistics Department. Cao served as teacher at the 1st Artillery Ordnance Technical School, assistant at the Ordnance Department and Military Equipment Department of the PLA General Logistics Department (1963-1975), staff officer, deputy division chief and deputy director of the Military Equipment Department of the PLA General Staff Headquarters, director of the Military Affairs Department of the General Staff Headquarters (1979-1990), and as director of the Mil-

itary Trade Office under the Central Military Commission (1990-1992). He was a representative to the 14th National Congress of the CCP in 1992. Cao was granted rank of major general in 1988 and of lieutenant general in 1993.

Chen Yunlin

Succeeded Wang Zhaoguo as director of the State Council Taiwan Affairs Office. (*Pingguo Ribao* [Apple's Daily], Hong Kong, 3 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Dec 96) He served as (exec.) deputy director of this office since February 1994. Chen is an alternate member of the 14th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1994/2, p.216/10.

Cheng Siwei

Cheng Siwei, vice-minister of chemical industry, was elected as the new chairman of the China Democratic National Construction Association at the 5th plenary session of the Association's 6th CC on December 13, 1996. (RMRB, XNA, 14 Dec 96) Cheng served as vice-chairman since December 1995. See C.a., 1994/5, p.528/10, and 1995/12, p.1139/11.

Du Tiehuan

Appointed political commissar of Beijing Military Region. (*Ming Bao*, Hong Kong, 6 Dec 96, in SWB, 11 Dec 96) He served as political commissar of Ji'nan Military Region since 1994. Du was born in August 1938 in Anshan, Liaoning Province, and joined the PLA in 1955 and the CCP in 1959. In 1958 he graduated from the PLA Shenyang Artillery School. Du served as platoon leader, teacher in general knowledge at a regiment propaganda subsection, assistant of a division organization section, assistant of a corps cadre division, and as deputy division political commissar. In 1984 he graduated from the PLA Political Academy. Du then served as division political commissar, as deputy army corps political commissar, and as army corps political commissar. In 1992 he became assistant director of the PLA General Political Department. In January 1994 he was identified as deputy director of the PLA General Political Department. In 1994, he was transferred to the Ji'nan Military Region, and promoted to be lieutenant general. See C.a., 1994/4, p.429/11, and 1994/11, p.1158/12.

Du Yijin (2)

Du Yijin, vice-governor of Anhui Province, was elected vice-chairman of the China Zhi Gong Dang (Party for Public Interests) at the 5th plenary session of the 10th CC. (XNA, 20 Dec 96;

RMRB, 21 Dec 96) Du was born in February 1936 in Guang'an County, Sichuan Province. After graduating from a postgraduate course in the Department of Physics of Beijing Normal University in 1958, he served as lecturer at Wannan (South Anhui) University (until 1978), as professor, chief of the Theoretical Physics Office and president of Anhui Teachers University (until 1987), as professor and president of Anhui University (1987-1988), and as chairman of Anhui Provincial Education Commission.

Han Zhizhong (3)

Appointed vice-governor of Hainan Provincial People's Government at the 26th meeting of the 1st Hainan Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee on December 25, 1996. (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, 25 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Jan 97) Han Zhizhong, born in 1941, is a Han Chinese and native of Wenchang County, Hainan Province. As a graduate of a polytechnic school, he joined the Party's work in 1962 and has served as deputy director of the Rural Department of Hainan Region and Party secretary of Qionghai County. He had been Party secretary and mayor of Qionghai City, Hainan Province, since November 1992 until he was transferred to the Hainan Provincial People's Government as assistant to the governor in July 1996.

Kang Dehua

Identified as vice-president of the Supreme People's Court. (XNA, 13 Dec 96)

Li Bingcai (4)

Appointed deputy director of the State Council Taiwan Affairs Office. (*Pingguo Ribao* [Apple's Daily], Hong Kong, 3 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Dec 96) He served as director of the Foreign Affairs Office of Jiangsu Provincial People's Government (since May 1986) and as secretary of the CCP Yangzhou City Committee in Jiangsu Province (since October 1991) before.

Lin Wenyi (f) (5)

Appointed vice-mayor of Beijing Municipality at the 34th session of the 10th Municipal People's Congress Standing Committee on December 30, 1996. She took over the position of former Beijing Vice-Mayor He Luli. (RMRB, 1 Jan 97) Lin, 52, holds a Ph.D. and serves as a professor and tutor in Qinghua University, together with some other academic and administrative titles in the university and the municipal government. Prior to the appointment, Lin held the post of assistant mayor.

Liu Dengyun

Identified as deputy commander of Gansu Military District. (*Gansu Ribao*, 22 Dec 96, in SWB, 14 Jan 97) He concurrently serves as executive vice-chairman of the provincial National Defence Mobilization Committee. Liu served as deputy commander of Qinghai Military District before (identified in this post in June 1994). See C.a., 1994/7, p.748/12.

Luo Gan

Luo Gan, state councillor and secretary-general of the State Council, was identified as vice-chairman of the CCP CC Commission for Protection of Party Secrets. (RMRB, 14 Dec 96) He is a member of the 14th CCP CC. See C.a., 1996/11, p.1105/15.

Qian Guoliang (6)

Appointed commander of Ji'nan Military Region. Qian, 57, is from Wujiang City, Jiangsu Province, and graduated from the basic department of a military academy. He was engaged in PLA civilian work for a long time. In 1985 he was an army commander. In 1994, he was promoted to lieutenant general and became chief of staff of Ji'nan Military Region Headquarters. Early this year, he was promoted to deputy military region commander. Qian is an alternate member of the 14th CCP CC. (*Ming Bao*, Hong Kong, 6 Dec 96, in SWB, 11 Dec 96)

Wang Gang

Identified as vice-chairman of the CCP CC Commission for Protection of Party Secrets. (RMRB, 14 Dec 96) Wang concurrently serves as deputy director of the CCP CC General Office (since October 1994) and as curator of the State Council Institute of Archives (since December 1993). In September 1996 he was elected chairman of the International Council on Archives. See C.a., 1994/10, p.1077/11.

Wang Min (7)

Appointed vice-governor of Jiangsu Provincial People's Government. (*Xinhua Ribao*, Nanjing, 14 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Jan 97) Wang served as assistant governor since February 1995.

Wang Yonghai (8)

Wang, former secretary to Wen Jiabao (alternate member of the CCP CC Politburo and member of the CCP CC Secretariat), was appointed deputy director of the State Council Taiwan Affairs Office. (*Pingguo Ribao* [Apple's Daily], Hong Kong, 3 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Dec

96) Wang served as director of the Propaganda Bureau of this office since March 1993.

Wu Changyuan (9)

Appointed vice-governor of Hainan Provincial People's Government at the 26th meeting of the 1st Hainan Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee on December 25, 1996. (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, 25 Dec 96, in SWB, 4 Jan 97) Wu, 50, is a Han Chinese and native of Jiashan County, Zhejiang Province. He graduated from the Department of Transport Economics of Beijing Railway College in July 1969 and has held leading posts in Zhengzhou, Inner Mongolia and Xinjiang railway bureaus. He was director of the Ministry of Railways General Office from December 1993 to January 1996. Last January, he was transferred to Hainan Province as assistant to the governor and a member of the Party organization under the provincial government in charge of industry, transportation, construction, posts and telecommunications, land management, cartography and others.

Yuan Shoufang (10)

Identified as deputy director of the PLA General Political Department. (XNA, 17 Dec 96) Major General Yuan served as the department's assistant director before. He concurrently serves as member of the CCP CC Commission for Inspecting Discipline.

Leaders Removed from Office

Ding Henggao

Chairman of the State Commission of Science, Technology and Industry for National Defence. He was removed from his post because he had reached the retirement age limit. (Decree No.81 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on December 30, 1996) (RMRB, XNA, 31 Dec 96)

Gan Yuping

On 20th December 1996, the 24th meeting of the 8th Sichuan Provincial People's Congress Standing Committee approved a decision to remove Gan Yuping from the post of vice-governor of Sichuan Province. (Sichuan Ribao, 22 Dec 96, in SWB, 14 Jan 97)

Gu Shanqing

Retires as political commissar of Beijing Military Region. (Ming Bao, Hong Kong, 6 Dec 96, in SWB, 11 Dec 96)

He Luli (f)

Identified as vice-governor of Sichuan Provincial People's Government. (RMRB, 20 Oct 96)

Nie Quanlin (18)

Identified as deputy political commissar of Fujian Military District (MD). (Fujian Ribao, 15 Oct 96, in ZGYJ, 1996/11, p.195) Nie served as deputy political commissar of Zhejiang MD since November 1990. He once served as director of the Political Department of Fujian MD.

Wang Shouting (19)

Identified as deputy secretary of CCP Guizhou Provincial Committee. (Guizhou Broadcasting Station, 15 Oct 96, in ZGYJ, 1996/11, p.191)

Xu Qiliang (20)

Identified as chief of staff of the PLA Air Force Headquarters. Xu served as deputy chief of staff before. He formerly served as commander of the PLA Air Force Units in Fujian (December 1990). Xu is an alternate member of the 14th CCP CC.

Yuan Qitong (21)

Elected acting chairman of Fujian Provincial People's Congress at the 26th session of the 8th PPC Standing Committee on October 28, 1996. (Fujian Broadcasting Station, 30 Oct 96, in ZGYJ, 1996/11, p.192)

Zhang Ping (22)

Elected vice-governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government by the 8th PPC Standing Committee on September 21, 1996. (Anhui Broadcasting Station, 22 Sep 96, in ZDY, 1996/11, p.77)

Zhang's previous posts include: chairman of the Provincial Planning Commission, secretary of CCP Wuhu City Committee (since August 1993) and mayor of Wuhu City (since July 1993), assistant governor and secretary-general of Anhui Provincial People's Government.

Angola (Dec 13)

The Chinese government granted articles, including daily necessities and farm tools, of about 600,000 US\$ to Angola for its reconstruction. (XNA, 14 Dec 96)

Belarus (Dec 04)

A bilateral agreement between China and Belarus on ensuring the quality of imports and exports has been signed in Beijing as well as a protocol on cooperation for 1997-2000 between the Ministry of Education and Science of Belarus and the State Education Commission of the PRC. Chinese Premier Li Peng and Acting Prime Minister of Belarus Syargey Stepanovich Ling attended the signing ceremony. (XNA, RMRB, 5 Dec 96; Belapan news agency, Minsk, 6 Dec 96, in SWB, 9 Dec 96)

Comoros (Dec 17)

An agreement on bilateral economic and technological cooperation between China and Comoros was signed in Beijing. China's President Jiang Zemin and visiting Comoros President Mohamed Taki Abdoulkarim attended the signing ceremony. (RMRB, XNA, 18 Dec 96)

Cuba (Dec 26)

A 1997-1999 cultural protocol between China and Cuba was signed in Havana

by visiting Vice-Minister of Culture Li Yuanchao and Cuba's Vice Foreign Minister Isabel Allende. (XNA, 28 Dec 96)

Hungary (Dec 16)

China's Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and visiting Hungarian Foreign Minister Kovacs Laszlo signed a protocol on cooperation between the two ministries. (XNA, 17 Dec 96)

Japan (Dec 24)

China and Japan signed in Beijing an exchange of notes on the fourth batch of Japanese loan in Japanese ¥ to China for the year 1996. According to the notes, the Japanese government is to provide a loan totalled 170.511b ¥ to the Chinese government, on 22 projects covering the fields of transportation, energy, environmental protection, agriculture, telecommunications and urban infrastructure, with a duration of 30 years (including a 10-year grace) and a 2.3% annual interest rate for average projects, a 2.1% rate for environment projects. Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs Tang Jiaxuan and Japan's Ambassador to China Yoshiyasu Sato signed the exchange of notes on behalf of their respective governments. By the end of 1995, Japan has provided China with three batches of loans in Japanese ¥, amounting to 1,610b ¥. 1996 is the first year to implement the fourth batch of loan in the period of 1996 to 2000. Japan has promised in December 1994 to offer 580b ¥ for the first three years on 40 projects. (RMRB, XNA, 25 Dec 96)

North Korea (Dec 30)

A 1997 protocol on sports exchange was signed in Pyongyang by Yi Tong-ho, vice-chairman of the Physical Culture and Sports Commission of the DPRK, and Zhang Faqiang, vice-chairman of the Physical Culture and Sports Commission of the PRC. (KCNA news agency, Pyongyang, 31 Dec 96, in SWB, 1 Jan 97)

South Korea (Dec 10)

China and the Republic of Korea signed a General Contract on Commodity Trade to provide exemplary forms of contracts to companies of both countries involved in Sino-ROK trade. (XNA, 11 Dec 96)

Liberia (Dec 18?)

An agreement on bilateral economic and technological cooperation between China and Liberia was signed in Beijing by China's Vice-Premier and Foreign Min-

ister Qian Qichen and visiting Vice-Chairman of Liberia's Council of State Alhaji Kromah. (XNA, 20 Dec 96)

Morocco (Dec 25)

Visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs Tian Zengpei and Moroccan Secretary of state for Foreign Affairs and Cooperation Tayeb Al Fasi, signed three agreements in Rabat on cooperation in various fields. The first agreement aims at setting up a framework for political consultations between the two Foreign Ministries. The second agreement will grant Morocco 3m RMBY, the equivalent of 3m dirhams. The third will allow Morocco to keep its consulate in Hong Kong. (RTM TV, Rabat, 25 Dec 96, in SWB, 8 Jan 97)

Namibia (Dec 18)

China agreed to provide Namibia with 15m US\$ for funding several agricultural projects. An agreement between the two governments was signed in Windhoek by Chinese Ambassador to Namibia, Lian Zhengbao, and Namibian Finance Minister, Nangolo Mbumba. (RMRB, XNA, 20 Dec 96)

Nepal (Dec 04)

China and Nepal signed an agreement in Kathmandu on economic and technical cooperation under which the Chinese government will provide a grant assistance to Nepal. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and King of Nepal Birendra witnessed the signing ceremony for the agreement. The agreement was signed by Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Wu Yi and Nepali Commerce Minister Fattey Singh Tharu on behalf of their respective governments. (RMRB, XNA, 5 Dec 96)

Nigeria (Dec 03)

China and Nigeria signed an agreement in Lagos to strengthen cooperation in the field of higher education. (XNA, 5 Dec 96)

Pakistan (Dec 01)

China and Pakistan signed seven agreements in Islamabad for closer cooperation in various fields between the two countries. Visiting Chinese President Jiang Zemin and his Pakistani counterpart Farooq Leghari were present on the occasion. Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Pakistani Foreign Minister Sahibzada Yaqub Khan signed three agreements on behalf of their respective governments. According to the agreement on the mutual establishment of consu-

lates general, the two countries will establish consulates in Shanghai and Karachi respectively. The Chinese government also agreed that the Pakistani consulate in Hong Kong will remain open and operative after July 1, 1997 when Hong Kong returns to China. The agreement on environmental protection cooperation between the two countries said the two countries will cooperate in the fields of environmental policies and legislation, sustainable energy sources, urban environment protection, environmental impact assessment, coordination of positions on global environmental issues, etc. Qian and Pakistani Interior Minister Umar Afridi also signed an agreement on control of narcotic trafficking. Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Wu Yi and Pakistani Prime Minister's adviser on economic and financial affairs Shahid Burki signed an agreement on economic and technical cooperation, according to which China will give a 50m RMBY (6m US\$) grant to Pakistan. Chief of the China Council for the Promotion of International Trade Guo Dongpo and Chairman of the Federation of Pakistan Chambers of Commerce and Industry Illyas Bilour signed a memorandum of cooperation between the two organizations. A 250m-US\$ contract was signed between the Chinese Dongfang Electronic Group and the Pakistani Water and Power Development Authority, according to which Dongfang Group will construct a hydro-power station for Pakistan, which will be financed by the World Bank, Asian Development Bank and other financial organizations. (RMRB, XNA, 2 Dec 96)

Russia (Dec 11)

Vice-Chairman of the Central Military Commission Liu Huqing and visiting Russian Deputy Prime Minister Aleksey Bolshakov signed a memorandum on military-technical cooperation between the two countries. (ITAR-TASS news agency [World Service], Moscow, 11 Dec 96, in SWB, 12 Dec 96)

Russia (Dec 27)

Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and Russian Prime Minister Chernomyrdin attended the ceremony in Moscow for signing the "Agreement on the Principles of a Framework Contract for Building Lianyungang Nuclear Power Plant" [in northern Jiangsu Province] and the "Agreement on the Cooperation between People's Bank of China and Russian Federal Central Bank". (Xinhua, 27 Dec 96, in SWB, 30 Dec 96; RMRB, XNA, 28 Dec 96)

Togo (Dec 19)

China's Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and visiting Togolese Foreign Minister Koffi Panou attended a ceremony of exchanging notes of governments on retaining the honorable consulate of Togo in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region after July 1, 1997. (XNA, 20 Dec 96)

A cooperation and exchange agreement between the justice ministries of China and Russia were signed in Beijing by Chinese Minister of Justice Xiao Yang and visiting Russian Justice Minister Valentin Alekseyevich Kovalev. (Xinhua, 28 Nov 96, in SWB, 10 Dec 96)

International Agreements

An agreement on the fourth UNDP-China Education Program, aimed at promoting nine-year compulsory education in China's poor areas, with special focus on girls, was signed in Beijing on December 2, 1996. Under the new program, the United Nations Development Program is set to aid the provinces of Gansu, Qinghai, Sichuan and Yunnan and Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region in their efforts to realize nine-year compulsory education. The agreement involving 3m US\$ was signed by Long Yongtu, assistant minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Arthur Holcombe, UNDP representative to China. (XNA, 3, 4 Dec 96)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Stationing Troops in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region", adopted at the 23rd session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on December 30, 1996. This law contains 30 articles in six chapters and comes into force on July 1, 1997. (Decree No.80 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on December 30, 1996) (Full text: RMRB, 31 Dec 96; Xinhua, 30 Dec 96, in SWB, 9 Jan 97)

"Regulations of the PRC on Implementing the Law on Quarantining Border-crossing Animals and Plants". These regulations will take effect on January 1, 1997. (Order No. 206 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on December 2, 1996) (XNA, 9 Dec 96; full text: RMRB, 16 Dec 96)

"Regulations on Blood Products Management", adopted at the 52nd meeting of the State Council Standing Conference on December 6, 1997 and promulgated on January 5, 1997. These regulations, which comprise 48 articles in six chapters, come into effect as of the date of promulgation. (Order No. 208 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on December 30, 1996) (Full text: RMRB, 7 Jan 97; Xinhua, 4 Jan 97, in SWB, 17 Jan 97)

Regulations concerning news coverage by Taiwan journalists on the mainland areas have been issued by the Taiwan Affairs Office of the State Council. These regulations will go into effect on January 1, 1997. (XNA, 2 Dec 96; full text: RMRB, 2 Dec 96)

The "Regulations for Institutions' Financial Affairs" were recently promulgated by the Ministry of Finance. These regulations will go into effect on January 1, 1997. (Xinhua, 3 Dec 96, in SWB, 9 Dec 96)

The ministries of public security and civil affairs have issued a new regulation on compensation for the families of policemen who are killed in the line of duty. It is China's first specific compensation regulation for policemen since the founding of the PRC in 1949. Last year alone, 395 policemen were killed and over 8,500 were wounded in the line of duty. (XNA, 12 Dec 96)

The "Provisions for Improving Basic and Grassroots Work of Comprehensive Management of Social Security" were recently released by the CCP CC Commission for Comprehensive Management of Social Security. (XNA, 16 Dec 96)

A temporal regulation on the management of personal profiles of transient personnel was jointly issued by the Ministry of Personnel and the CCP CC Organization Department on December 18, 1996. According to the 22-article regulation, transient personnel mainly include resigned, dismissed, or jobless people, students studying abroad at their own expense, and employees in non-state enterprises. Before these people can find a place in state enterprises or institutions, their personal profiles have to be kept and managed by local employment offices for talented personnel. (XNA, 20 Dec 96; full text: RMRB, 19 Dec 96)

"Provisional Measures for Governing of Fee Collecting by Compulsory Education Schools" were recently promulgated by the State Education Commission, the State Planning Commission and the Ministry of Finance. (RMRB, 31 Dec 96)

Addenda

The Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation recently promulgated "Administrative Methods for Conducting Labor Service Cooperation in Hong Kong Region". Comprising six chapters in 28 articles, the "Methods" provide detailed stipulations on principles, contract-signing, charges, selection of workers, fulfilling of contracts and penalties in exporting labor service from the interior to Hong Kong. (Full text: *Wen Hui Bao* [*Wen Wei Po*], Hong Kong, 9 Nov 96, in SWB, 20 Dec 96)
