The State Power Corporation was officially inaugurated on January 16, 1997. (RMRB, XNA, 19 Jan 97) This corporation is a state-owned business entitled to manage the nation-wide power network and inter-regional power transmission. Its establishment is expected to lead to the abolition of the current Ministry of Power Industry after a period of operation.

China National Star Petroleum Corporation, China's third national-level state-owned petroleum company, following the China National Petroleum Corporation (China Oil and Natural Gas Corporation) and China National Offshore Oil Corporation, has been set up. Unlike the other two oil companies, the company will develop both onshore and offshore oil and gas resources. Moreover, it will focus on the development of gas resources. The company, with a registered capital of 3.1b RMBY (about 373m US\$), is formed by eight oil bureaus and 10 research institutes attached to the Ministry of Geology and Mineral Resources. In 1937 he graduated from the Shanghai Postal Affairs Correspondence School. He worked in Shanghai for the Zhonghua Bookstore from 1932 to 1937, and for the Wankang Brewery from 1938 to 1956. In 1950 Ye joined the China Democratic National Construction Association (CDNCA). After 1950 he served as manager of Shanghai Wan-kang Brewery (until 1956). ### Equatorial Guinea (Jan 14)

China and Equatorial Guinea signed an agreement on economic and technological cooperation in Malabo. The agreement was signed by visiting Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Equatorial Guinean Minister of State of Foreign Affairs and Cooperation Miguel Oyono Ndong Mifumu. **Georgia (Jan 29)**

China and Georgia signed an accord in Tbilisi on providing humanitarian aid to the former Soviet republic. Under the accord, China will donate humanitarian materials worth 1m RMBY (about 120,000 US\$) to Georgia. (XNA, 31 Jan 97; RMRB, 1 Feb 97)

**Kazakhstan (Jan 24)**

The Chinese government donated shoes, computers and other humanitarian goods worth 1m RMBY to a children foundation. (RMRB, 26 Jan 97)

Tian Zengpei, visiting Chinese vice-minister of foreign affairs, and Amir, Libyan assistant secretary for foreign liaison, signed in Tripoli an agreement on regular consultations between the two countries' foreign ministries. (Xinhua, 4 Jan 97, in SWB, 10 Jan 97)

**Mauritania (Jan 16)**

An agreement on economic and technological cooperation between China and Mauritania and an exchange of notes on China's donation of 1,000 tons of wheat to the southwest African country were signed in Nouakchott during the visit of China's Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen. (RMRB, 18 Jan 97; XNA, 18/19 Jan 97)

**Mongolia (Jan 14)**

China has agreed to give Mongolia 360,000 US\$ worth military aid. The fund will be used to buy medical equipment and train two Chinese language personnel. Chinese Ambassador Qi Zhijia and Mongolian Defence Minister Danbyn Dorligjav signed the agreements in Ulan Bator. (XNA, 15 Jan 97)

**Mongolia (Jan 27)**

Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and visiting Mongolian Minister for External Relations Shukher Altangerel signed an agreement between the two governments on the placement of the Mongolian honorary consulate in the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the PRC. (XNA, 28 Jan 97)

**Mongolia (Jan 28)**

Wu Yi, Chinese minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and visiting Mongolian Minister for External Relations Shukher Altangerel signed an exchange of notes on trade and economic cooperation between the two countries. (XNA, 29 Jan 97)

**Niger (Jan 13)**

An intergovernmental agreement on economic and technological cooperation between China and Niger was signed in Niamey by visiting Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and Foreign Minister of Niger Ibrahim Assane Mayake. (RMRB, XNA, 15 Jan 97)

**Sao Tome and Principe (Jan 15)**

The People's Insurance Company of China, the country's leading insurer, has been granted membership in the Berne Union, an international organization for insurers. Berne Union, formally known as Berne Union of International Credit and Investment Insurers, was established in 1934 to standardize member countries' rules and operations in export credit insurance business. It also works to create international cooperation that can foster a favorable investment climate. The union now has 43 formal members and three observer institutes from 37 countries and regions as well as a multilateral institution. (XNA, 11 Jan 97; RMRB, 21 Jan 97)

"Decision of the State Council on revising the 'Regulations of the PRC on Foreign Exchange Control'". This decision will take effect on the day of promulgation. (Order No. 211 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on January 14, 1997) (XNA, 21 Jan 97; full text of the revisions: RMRB, 21 Jan 97; Xinhua, 20 Jan 97, in SWB, 30 Jan 97)

A new set of regulations on the management of foreign copyright agencies operating in China were issued by the State Copyright Administration and the State Administration for Industry and Commerce. It explains that holders of foreign copyrights and foreign agencies must be recognized by the administration before they can submit applications for opening permanent offices in Beijing. (XNA, 11 Jan 97; RMRB, 13 Jan 97)

The State Securities Regulatory Commission drew up new rules on how companies are listed on the stock exchange, putting stricter controls on their financial disclosures, new stock pricing and underwriting of shares. (XNA, 21 Jan 97)

"Some provisions on forbidding paid news" have been issued by the CCP Propaganda Department, the Ministry of Radio, Film and Television, the State Press and Publications Administration and the All-China Journalists Association. (Full text: Xinhua, 23 Jan 97, in SWB, 27 Jan 97; RMRB, 24 Jan 97)
