Li, state councillor, member of the CCP CC Politburo, chairman of the State Council's Commission for Restructuring Economy, head of the Leading Group for the Reform of the Housing System and of the State Leading Group for Disaster Relief and Disease Control, deputy head of the National Leading Group for Anti-Disaster and Relief Work, and head of the Guiding Group for the Compilation of Local Annals, was appointed deputy director of the newly founded Central Guidance Committee on Ethical and Cultural Construction (Building of Spiritual Civilization). **Liu Hong (2)**

(RMRB, 15 May 97) Wan resigned from his post as governor of Zhejiang Province and deputy secretary of CCP Zhejiang Provincial Committee in April 1997. See C.a., 1993/1, p.75/11; 1993/12, p.1216/12; 1997/4, p.375/13. Wan was born in January 1941 in Huangzhou City, Hubei Province, and joined the CCP in 1961. In 1964 he graduated from the Ship and Power Department of Shanghai Jiaotong University. He served as deputy secretary of CYL Shanghai Jiaotong University Committee, as Standing Committee member and deputy secretary of CYL Shanghai Municipal Committee, as deputy director and director of the General Office, and as deputy secretary-general and secretary-general of Shanghai Municipal People's Government. In January 1993 he was elected governor of Zhejiang Province, and in December 1993 deputy secretary of CCP Zhejiang Provincial Committee. Wan was a delegate to the 8th NPC in 1993.

(*Hu'nán Ribao*, 7 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.181) He had served as Standing Committee member and secretary-general of CCP Hu'nán Provincial Committee since 1993. He once served as secretary of CCP Huaihua Prefectural Committee. Hu was a delegate of Hu'nán Province to the 7th NPC in 1988.

**Huang Yuezhong (5)**

By-elected vice-governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government at the 5th session of the 8th Provincial People's Congress on February 23, 1997. (*Anhui Ribao*, 24 Feb 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.183) He had served as assistant governor since September 1995 and as chairman of the Provincial Planning Commission since October 1993.

**Shi Baoyuan (6)**

Lieutenant General Shi still serves as deputy commander of Shenyang Military Region (post held since August 1985). (XNA, 31 May 97) See C.a., 1995/12, p.1141/13. Shi was born in April 1937 in Beijing, and joined the CCP in 1955. In 1954 he entered the PLA 1st Tank School. He became deputy chief of operations and training division of armoured corps (1969), commander of tank regiment (1976), chief of staff of mechanized division (1978), deputy commander and commander of tank division (1981), and deputy corps commander (1984) of Shenyang Military Region. Shi was granted rank of major general in 1988 and of lieutenant general in 1993.

**Tan Dongsheng (7)**

Identified as deputy commander of Guangzhou Military Region. (*Nanfang Ribao*, 27 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.185) He had served as director of the Mobilization Department of the PLA General Staff since October 1990. Tan was a PLA delegate to the 8th NPC in 1993.

**Wang Houhong (8)**

Elected vice-governor of Hainan Provincial People's Government at the 28th session of the Standing Committee of the Provincial People's Congress on March 28, 1997. (Zhongxinshe news agency, 29 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.183) He had served as Standing Committee member (since June 1991) and as secretary-general of CCP Hainan Provincial Committee. Wang was born in Ningguo County, Anhui Province.

He formerly served as secretary of CYL Anhui Provincial Committee, director of the Provincial Economic Research Centre and as vice-governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government.

**Wang Liangwang (9)**

Identified as deputy commander of the PLA Air Force. (*Jiefangjun Bao* [Liberation Army Daily], Beijing, 6 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.184) He had served as deputy chief of staff of the Air Force since April 1995.

**Xu Zhongmin (10)**

Identified as vice-mayor of Chongqing City. Xu had served as assistant governor of Sichuan Provincial People's Government since November 1993.

**Zhang Dingfa (11)**

Identified as commander of the PLA Navy's North China Sea Fleet and as deputy commander of Ji'nan Military Region. (*Jiefangjun Bao*, 6 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.184)

**Zhou Jianwei (12)**

Identified as vice-governor of Hubei Provincial People's Government. (*Hubei Ribao*, 6 Mar 97, in ZGYJ, 1997/4, p.183) He had served as secretary-general of Hubei Provincial People's Government since November 1992. Zhou formerly served as head of the Provincial Department of Machine-Building Industry, and as vice-chairman of the Commission for Protection of Party Secrets under CCP Hubei Provincial Committee.

### Algeria (May 21)

China and Algeria signed an agreement to beef up their cooperation in the field of nuclear energy. The agreement was signed in Algiers by Cao Yicheng, director of Chinese Engineering Company for Nuclear Energy, and Abu Bakr Bin Buzeid, Algerian minister of higher education and scientific research. (XNA, 23 May 97)

### Australia (May 15)

The Chinese and Australian governments signed a memorandum of understanding in Beijing for a new project aimed at improving China's ability to diagnose hepatitis. The Australian government will contribute about 1.3m Australian \$ (about 1m US\$) to finance the project. About 1.1m RMBY (about 132,000 US\$) will be provided by the Chinese government. (XNA, 16 May 97)

### Bahamas (May 23)

The governments of China and the Bahamas signed a joint communiqué in New York on the establishment of diplomatic relations between the two countries. Earlier this month, the Bahamas government severed diplomatic ties with Taiwan. (RMRB, 24 May 97; XNA, 25 May 97)

### Cameroon (May 10)

Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and his Cameroonian counterpart Mafany Musonge Peter oversaw the signing of two agreements between the two countries, namely, the agreement on mutual protection of investment and the agreement on Sino-Cameroonian economic and technological cooperation. (RMRB, 11 May 97; XNA, 12 May 97)

### Cameroon (May 28)

The Chinese government signed an agreement with Cameroon in Yaounde to renew its support for a six-year microbiological development project in the University of Yaounde One. The agreement, the fourth of its kind and to expire in 1999, was signed by Wei Yu, visiting Chinese vice-chairman of the State Education Commission, and Peter Tabi, the minister of Cameroon's Higher Education Ministry. The project was initiated in July 1991 when the first agreement of this kind was signed between the two countries. (XNA, 30 May 97)

### Cote d'Ivoire (May 04)

Chinese President Jiang Zemin and visiting President of Cote d'Ivoire Henri Konan Bedie attended a signing ceremony of four documents on China providing loans to Cote d'Ivoire, on economic and technical cooperation between the two governments, on loans from the Chinese government to Cote d'Ivoire government, and on earthquake information in the coastal area of Cote d'Ivoire. (XNA, 5 May 97)

### Cote d'Ivoire (May 16)

Visiting Chinese State Councillor and Chairman of the State Science and Technology Commission, Song Jian, and Saliou Toure, Cote d'Ivoire's minister of higher education, scientific research and technological innovation, signed an agreement in Abidjan, which stipulated that the Chinese government would give the Cote d'Ivoire government a number of microcomputers, including accessories. (Xinhua, 17 May 97, in SWB, 22 May 97)

### Cuba (May 13)

A government credit agreement for more than 6m \$ to be used in the Cuban educational sector was signed during the visit of Chinese Vice-Premier Li Lanqing. (Radio Havana external service, 14 May 97, in SWB, 16 May 97)

### Ethiopia (May 20)

China and Ethiopia signed the implementation program for the cultural agreement between the two governments from 1997 to 2000. Visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Culture Li Yuanchao and Ethiopian Vice-Minister of Information and Culture Bisrat Gashawtena signed the program in Addis Ababa on behalf of their respective governments. (XNA, 22 May 97; RMRB, 28 May 97)

### France (May 15)

A package of agreements and an exchange of notes were signed in Beijing between the Chinese and French governments. Chinese President Jiang Zemin and visiting French President Jacques Chirac were present at the signing ceremony. They included an exchange of notes on retaining the French consultate general in Hong Kong, an agreement on cooperation for environmental protection, an agreement on cooperation for developing the peaceful use of nuclear power, a cooperation accord on health care and medical science, an agreement on cooperation in research and the peaceful use of outer space, and an agreement on the quarantine and hygiene of frozen semen of cows, fowls and eggs for breeding purposes, pigs and horses imported from France by China. Other documents signed included a framework agreement on an order by the China Aviation Suppliers' Import and Export Corporation for 30 Airbuses, and a cooperation accord on the joint manufacture of the 100-seater civil-use jet planes. In the afternoon, economic representatives of the two countries signed six economic and trading contracts and agreements, including a contract for Xinjiang Airlines' purchase of 10 ATR-72 planes, an accord of cooperation on the manufacture of 5.5-ton helicopter wings, a letter of intent on a Sino-French venture for fasteners for use in aircraft, an agreement on a joint venture for plant protection, and an agreement on cooperation on aviation propulsion facilities. (RMRB, XNA, 16 May 97)

### Gabon (May 09)

China and Gabon signed five cooperation agreements during the visit of Chinese Premier Li Peng, including the agreement on protecting investment in each other's countries and agreements on China offering loans to Gabon and China providing aid to Gabon. (RMRB, 10 May 97; XNA, 11 May 97)

### Kiribati (May 19)

China and Kiribati signed an agreement in Tarawa on the continued existence of an honorary consulate of Kiribati in Hong Kong after China resumes its exercise of sovereignty over the territory. (RMRB, 20 May 97)

### Madagascar (May 28)

The Chinese and Malagasy governments signed an agreement in Antananarivo under which Madagascar will retain its honorary consulate in China's Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. (Xinhua, 28 May 97, in SWB, 3 June 97)

**Malaysia (May 14)**

Chinese Vice-Premier and Foreign Minister Qian Qichen and visiting Malaysian Foreign Minister Abdullah Badawi exchanged notes on China's approval of the retention of the Malaysian consulate in Hong Kong. (XNA, 15 May 97)

**Maldives (May 04)**

China and the Maldives signed an agreement in Male on mutual exemption of visa requirements between the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the PRC and the Republic of Maldives. (RMRB, XNA, 5 May 97)

**Mexico (May 16)**

The scientific and technological cooperation programme for 1997-1998 between the governments of China and Mexico was signed in Mexico City. (RMRB, 18 May 97)

**Moldova (May 13)**

Beijing will conduct cooperation with Chisinau, the capital of Moldova, in the fields of city construction, economy and trade, agriculture, health care, science and education, according to a memorandum signed in Beijing by Jia Qinglin, mayor of Beijing, and his Chisinau counterpart Serafim Urecheanu. (XNA, 14 May 97)

**Mozambique (May 07)**

Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and Mozambican President Joaquim Chissano witnessed the signing of three documents between the two governments, namely, the agreement on economic and technical cooperation, the document on China offering aid to Mozambique and the document on maintenance of well drilling and water supply system. (XNA, 9 May 97)

**Myanmar (May 29)**

China and Myanmar signed an agreement under which the two sides will establish a joint working committee on trade, economic and technical cooperation. Visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Li Guohua and Myanmar Minister of National Planning and Economic Development Brigadier-General Abel signed the agreement in Yangon on behalf of their respective governments. (RMRB, XNA, 30 May 97)

**Niger (May 26)**

The Chinese and Niger governments signed an accord in Beijing on economic and technological cooperation, and an agreement on mutual exemption of visas between the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and Niger. (XNA, 28 May 97)

**Nigeria (May 12)**

China and Nigeria signed four documents of bilateral economic and trade cooperation in Abuja. Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and Nigerian Head of State General Sani Abacha jointly presided over the signing ceremony. The four documents included an agreement on investment protection, a protocol on cooperation in a steel project, a protocol on cooperation in power engineering construction and an agreement on petroleum cooperation. (RMRB, 13 May 97; XNA, 14 May 97)

**Spain (May 20)**

China and Spain signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on bilateral financial cooperation. The Spanish government pledged to offer China governmental credit totalling 600m US\$ between 1997 and 1998. The MOU was jointly signed in Beijing by Chen Xinhua, vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Manuel Fernandez, secretary of state of trade, tourism, and small and medium businesses of the Ministry of Economy and Finance. (RMRB, XNA, 21 May 97)

**Sri Lanka (May 23)**

China and Sri Lanka signed an accord in Colombo for mutual exemption of visa requirements between the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region of the PRC and the Democratic Socialist Republic of Sri Lanka. (XNA, 24 May 97; RMRB, 26 May 97)

**Sudan (May 30)**

Chinese Vice-Premier Wu Bangguo and visiting Sudanese First Vice-President El-Zobair Mohamed Saleh attended a signing ceremony of the summary for the fourth session of the mixed committee of economy, trade, and technology between the governments of China and Sudan, agreement for economic and technical cooperation, agreement for encouraging and mutual protection of investment, and other agreements. (XNA, 31 May 97)

**Tanzania (May 13)**

Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and Tanzanian President Benjamin Mkapa oversaw the signing of three agreements between the two countries, namely, the Agreement on Sino-Tanzanian Economic and Technological Cooperation, the Agreement on China Providing Exclusive Loans to the Tanzanian and Zambian Governments for Tanzania-Zambia Railway, and the Documents on China Providing Aid to the Zanzibar Government. (RMRB, XNA, 14 May 97)

**Vanuatu (May 14?)**

Vanuatu and China have signed an agreement to further strengthen their bilateral relations. The signing has taken place in Port Vila between Vanuatu's Foreign Minister Willie Jimmy and China's Vice-Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Liu Shanzai. The agreement is for the conversion of a 3m \$ loan to a grant from the Chinese government for work to resume on the construction of a Chinese-funded hydropower project on Malakula Island. China has also agreed to donate four vehicles to the Vanuatu government. (Radio Australia external service, Melbourne, 14 May 97, in SWB, 16 May 97)

**Western Samoa (May 30?)**

Visiting Chinese Vice-Premier Zhu Rongji and Western Samoan Minister of Finance Sailele Tuila'epa attended a signing ceremony for an agreement on the Chinese government's uncompensated aid to the Western Samoan government. (Xinhua, 31 May 97, in SWB, 3 June 97)

**Zambia (May 05)**

Visiting Chinese Premier Li Peng and Zambian President Frederick Chiluba oversaw the signing of an agreement between the Chinese and the Zambian governments on economic and technical cooperation and an agreement on China providing special-purpose loans to the Zambian and the Tanzanian governments for the Tanzania-Zambia Railway. (RMRB, 6 May 97) The Chinese government has decided to provide a 50m RMBY (about 6m US\$) interest-free loan to the Tanzania-Zambia Railway project in addition to a donation of 30m RMBY (about 3.6m US\$). (XNA, 7 May 97)

**Zambia (May 30)**

China has given Zambia a military aid grant worth 2m dollars. The agreement was signed by Zambian Minister of Defence's Permanent Secretary Finiase Masukwa and visiting Chinese Deputy Chief of the PLA General Staff Lieutenant General Xiong Guangkai. (ZNBC radio, Lusaka, 30 May 97, in SWB, 2 June 97)

**International Agreements**

The 25th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee has decided on May 9, 1997, that the PRC accedes to the "Vienna Convention on the Law of Treaties". (Xinhua, 9 May 97, in SWB, 12 May 97)

China was unanimously voted into the International Federation of Accountants on May 15, 1997. This is another achievement made by the Chinese Institute of Certified Public Accountants after it became a council member of the Confederation of Asian-Pacific Accountants at the end of April this year. China resumed its certified public accountants (CPA) system in the early 1980s. Statistics show that there are a total of 124,000 CPAs in China, with 58,000 of them working with agencies. (XNA, 17 May 97)

The board of governors of the Caribbean Development Bank (CDB) accepted China's application to join the organization as a non-regional, non-borrowing member country at its 27th annual meeting in Toronto on May 21, 1997. China submitted its application on September 16, 1993. China will do its best to speed the necessary procedures for entering the CDB. (XNA, 23, 24 May 97)

## PRC Laws and Regulations

"Administrative Supervision Law of the PRC", adopted at the closing meeting of the 25th session of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on May 9, 1997. The law has 48 articles in seven chapters and came into force on the day of promulgation. The "Regulations on the Administrative Supervision Law of the PRC", promulgated by the State Council on February 9, 1990, shall be annulled on the same day. (Decree No.85 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on May 9, 1997) (Full text and translation: RMRB, 10 May 97; Xinhua, 9 May 97, in SWB, 14 May 97)

"Regulations on Governing Pesticides". These regulations shall come into force on the day of promulgation. (Order No.216 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on May 8, 1997) (Full text: RMRB, 16 May 97)

"Regulations on Protecting Traditional Arts and Handicrafts". These regulations shall come into force on the day of promulgation. (Order No.217 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on May 20, 1997) (Full text and translation: RMRB, 31 May 97; Xinhua, 30 May 97, in SWB, 4 June 97)

Revised provisional regulations governing the management of Chinese

computer information networks hooked up to international networks have been promulgated. The regulations were originally promulgated on 1st February 1996 by State Council Decree No.195 and revised in accordance with the 20th May 1997 "Decision of the State Council on Revising the 'Provisional Regulations of the PRC Governing the Management of Computer Information Networks Hooked Up To International Networks'". (Order No.218 of the State Council, signed by Premier Li Peng on May 20, 1997) These regulations shall take effect on the day of promulgation. (XNA, 31 May 97; full text and translation of the decision and the regulations: RMRB, 31 May 97; Xinhua, 30 May 97, in SWB, 4 June 97)

The State Administration of Taxation has recently issued new regulations relating to the income tax rate applicable to foreign-funded enterprises operating in China. (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, Beijing, 8 May 97, in SWB, 13 May 97)

A regulation that bans state-owned enterprises and listed companies from stock speculation was jointly issued by the State Council's Securities Committee, the People's Bank of China, and the State Economic and Trade Commission. (XNA, 22 May 97)

## Addenda

To administer and effectively utilize foreign capital, the State Planning Commission has, together with the State Administration of Foreign Exchange, devised the "Provisional Regulations on Offshore Capital Financing Campaigns" which have already been announced and put into effect. (Zhongguo xinwen she news agency, Beijing, 24 Apr 97, in WER, 30 Apr 97)

Chief of General Staff Fu Quanyou, General Political Department Director Yu Yongbo, and General Logistics Department Director Wang Ke jointly signed an order for the promulgation and implementation of the "Chinese People's Liberation Army Equipment Audit Regulations" in the whole army. Formulated in line with the "Chinese PLA Audit Regulations" signed and promulgated by Central Military Commission Chairman Jiang Zemin, the "Regulations" is the first equipment audit ordinance in the history of the Chinese army. (*Jiefangjun Bao* [Liberation Army Daily], Beijing, 11 Apr 97, in SWB, 22 May 97)
