The People's Bank of China is replacing its provincial offices with nine regional branches before mid-December as follows: Shanghai, Guangzhou, Tianjin, Shenyang, Nanjing, Jinan, Wuhan, Chengdu, and Xi'an. (XNA, 16/19/27 Nov 98)

The China Insurance Regulatory Commission (CIRC) was officially established on November 18, 1998 as another effort of the government to further promote financial reform and develop the insurance industry. Ma Yongwei, president of the People's Insurance Company of China (Group), was appointed to the position of chairman. A CIRC spokesman said the new organization operates directly under the State Council and is in charge of administering the nation's commercial insurance industry. (XNA, 19 Nov 98)

#### Bayinqolu

(RMRB, 29 Nov 98) He had served as the Federation's (executive) vice-president since December 1993. Bayinqolu concurrently serves as (executive) secretary of the CYL (since May 1993). #### Cao Gangchuan

General Cao Gangchuan, director of the PLA General Armament Department and secretary of its Party Committee since April 1998, was appointed a member of the PRC Central Military Commission at the 5th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on November 4, 1998. (RMRB, 5 Nov 98) He is also a member of the CCP CC Military Commission. Cao, 63, a native of Wuyang County, He'nan Province, joined the PLA in 1954 and the CCP in July 1956. Since 1956, he has successively been a teacher at military schools, and worked at the Armament Department of the PLA General Logistics Department, the Armament Department of the PLA General Staff, and the Commission of Sci-

ence, Technology and Industry for National Defence. (XNA, 5 Nov 98) Cao was granted rank of general in March 1998. He is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1996/12, p.1203/11.

#### Chen Jiagui (1)

Appointed vice-president of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences (CASS). (RMRB, 24 Nov 98) Chen had served as director of the Industrial Economics Institute under CASS since June 1996.

#### Duan Zhengkun (2)

Appointed vice-minister of justice. (RMRB, 24 Nov 98)

#### Hu Chunhua

#### Huang Danhua (f)

By-elected vice-president of the National Youth Federation at the 5th Standing Committee (enlarged) meeting of the Federation's 8th Committee on November 27, 1998. (RMRB, 29 Nov 98) She concurrently serves as secretary of the CYL (since December 1997). See C.a., 1997/12, p.1247/13.

#### Jiang Chaoliang (4)

Jiang Chaoliang, head of the central bank in Shenzhen, was appointed governor of the People's Bank of China (PBOC) Guangzhou Regional Branch. (XNA, 27 Nov 98) The PBOC Guangzhou Branch will replace the former offices of the central bank in the Guangxi Zhuang Autonomous Region, and Guangdong and Hainan provinces, which will continue their

duty until the end of this year. The total GDP of Guangdong, Hainan and Guangxi accounts for 13 percent of the country's total, and their export volume is 42.4 percent of the country's total. Their overall bank deposits are estimated at 13.8 percent of China's total, with bank savings in foreign currency accounting for one-fifth of the country's total.

The second PBOC regional branch was opened in Guangzhou on 26th November. The first regional branch opened in Shanghai several days ago. See entry „Wu Xiaoling”. Dai Xianglong, governor of the PBOC, said that the other seven PBOC regional branches will open on 20th December. (XNA, 27 Nov 98) He said that nine regional branches of the PBOC will be formed to govern local banking as follows: Tianjin, covering Tianjin Municipality, Hebei and Shanxi provinces, and Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region; Shenyang, covering Liaoning, Jilin, and Heilongjiang provinces; Shanghai, covering Shanghai Municipality, and Zhejiang and Fujian provinces; Nanjing, covering Jiangsu and Anhui provinces; Jinan, covering Shandong and He'nan provinces; Wuhan, covering Jiangxi, Hubei and Hu'nan provinces; Guangzhou; Chengdu, covering Sichuan, Guizhou, and Yunnan provinces, and Tibet Autonomous Region; and Xi'an, covering Shaanxi, Gansu, and Qinghai provinces, and Ningxia and Xinjiang autonomous regions. The Beijing and Chongqing branches have been abolished and their business will be put under the direct control of the Business Department of the central bank. By the end of October, banks had reported 9.3 trillion RMBY in deposits, 8.3 trillion RMBY in outstanding loans, 143.7 billion US\$ in foreign exchange reserves. These are 82 times, 45 times, and 845 times of the 1978 figures, respectively. Individual bank deposits stood at 5.2 trillion RMBY, or 250 times the 1978 figure. (RMRB, XNA, 16 Nov 98)

(RMRB, XNA, 19 Nov 98) „A CIRC spokesman said the new organization operates directly under the State Council and is in charge of administering the nation's commercial insurance industry. The CIRC will supervise and manage the insurance market in accordance with related laws and regulations. ... China's insurance industry has enjoyed rapid development over the past 20 years since the introduction of the reform and opening policies. The country had 13 insurance companies by the end of 1997, including nine foreign-funded insurance groups. A total of 189 representative offices had also been established by overseas insurance companies throughout the nation. After graduating from the Department of Politics of Shandong University in 1973, she served as secretary of the Party Committee of Gaoya and Chengguan People's Communes in Changle County (1974-1978), Standing Committee member and deputy secretary of CCP Changle County Committee (1975-1978), and vice-chairwoman of Changle County Revolutionary Committee (1975-1978), secretary of CYL Changwei Prefectural Committee (1978-1982), deputy secretary of CYL Shandong Provincial Committee and chairwoman of Shandong Provincial Youth Federation (1982-1989), vice-chairwoman and chairwoman of Shandong Provincial Women's Federation (1989-1993), president of the Shanghai Branch of the China College of Women Management Cadres (1992-1993), and as vice-governor of Shandong Province (April 1993 - April 1998). In August 1998, she was identified as head of the Leading Group on Stopping Business Activities of Political and Judicial Organs. Wu is an alternate member of the 15th CCP CC.

**Wu Xiaoling (f)**

Appointed governor of the People's Bank of China (PBOC) Shanghai Regional Branch. (RMRB, XNA, 19 Nov 98) She takes over from Mao Yingliang. Wu had served as director of the State Administration of Foreign Exchange since April 1998. See C.a., 1998/4, p.452/18. The PBOC Shanghai Branch is the first of nine such regional branches and will oversee Shanghai Municipality and the coastal provinces of Zhejiang and Fujian. The other eight central bank branches will also be opened before mid-December

this year. Shanghai along with Zhejiang and Fujian provinces are considered to have the most developed financial sector in China, and bank savings in these areas account for one seventh of the country's total. The PBOC Shanghai Branch will start exercising power on January 1, 1999. The current PBOC branches in Shanghai, Zhejiang and Fujian will continue their duties until December 31, 1998. In particular, State Council Vice-Premier Wen Jiabao, who personally inspected flooded areas and reported to Beijing's Ninth National People's Congress on the disaster, keenly felt the need to penalize the Ministry of Water Resources, which had done nothing noteworthy over the years. The Ministry of Water Resources is primarily responsible for planning the development of water conservancy and for water and soil conservation work nationwide. It is also in charge of the comprehensive management and development of major rivers and lakes. In normal times, it also has to manage anti-flood and drought work. During Niu Maosheng's five-year term of office, the mainland was hit almost every year by floods not seen for decades, and this year's flood was 'the biggest in a century'. Thus, Niu, as a leading official in charge of anti-flood work, has to take the blame for 'being slack in flood control.' (Tung Fang Jih Pao [Dongfang Ribao, Oriental Daily], Hong Kong, 29 Oct 98, in SWB, 30 Oct 98) Niu Maosheng was appointed deputy secretary of CCP Hebei Provincial Committee and acting governor of Hebei. See entry above.

**International Agreements**

China, Russia, the Democratic People's Republic of Korea [DPRK] signed an agreement to clarify their territorial waters on the Tumen River. The agreement was signed in Pyongyang on November 3, 1998 by Chinese ambassador to the DPRK Wan Yongxiang, the DPRK Deputy Foreign Minister Choe Su Hon and Russian ambassador to the DPRK Valerij

Denisov. To determine the juncture of their border lines, officials of the three neighboring nations have carried out six rounds of talks in the past five years since October 1993. (RMRB, XNA, 4 Nov 98)

Pakistan, China, Kazakhstan and Kyrgyzstan signed an agreement on „traffic in transit” along roads linking the four countries. It will help open up Central Asian Muslim states to warm water seaports of Karachi and Gwadar by using the Silk Route. The agreement, which will be applicable from May 1, 1999, was signed in Islamabad on 24th November by Communication Ministry Secretary of Pakistan Muhammad Ahram Sheikh, Vice-Minister of Communication of China Li Juchang, Deputy Minister of Communication of Kyrgyzstan Kurmanbayev Erkinbek Kurmanovich and Vice-Minister of Transport and Communication of Kazakhstan Karibjanov Kariat Salimovich. An official from the Communication Ministry of Pakistan said under the agreement „traffic in transit” will originate from Almaty and pass through Bishkek to Kashgar (China) and then enter into Khunjera Pass (Pakistan). The distance by road between Almaty, capital of Kazakhstan, and Karachi seaport is 3,726 km, and it will take about ten days to reach Karachi from Almaty. Under the agreement, the official said containers will be used only for traffic in transit trade and any „container” carrying goods from one country to another will not be allowed to stay in any city of these four countries for day for business purpose. (XNA, 25 Nov 98; Pakistan TV, Islamabad, 24 Nov 98, in SWB, 26 Nov 98)

The European Union and China reached a new textile agreement on 20th November after five-day talks in Brussels. The 6th Sino-EU bilateral textile agreement was reached by the Chinese textile negotiation delegation and the EU delegation. The 5th textile agreement, which has a three-year term between 1995 and 1998, will expire on 31st December this year. According to the one-year term new agreement, the EU raised the gross quota for 12 categories of Chinese textiles, which among others includes T-shirt, underwear, shirt, skirt and socks. **PRC Laws and Regulations**

„Organic Law of the People's Republic of China on Villagers' Committees”, passed by the 5th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on November 4, 1998. This law will be put into force from the day of its promulgation, and the „Organic Law of the PRC on Villagers' Committees (Trial)” will be abolished at the same time. (Decree No.9 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on November 4, 1998) (Full text and translation: RMRB, 5 Nov 98; Xinhua, 4 Nov 98, in SWB, 19 Nov 98)

„Embracing 30 articles, this organic law on villagers' committees has made revisions and supplements in personnel election, discussion of affairs, and supervision; has perfected the regulations and procedures on democratic election, democratic policy-making, democratic management, and democratic supervision; has defined Party organizations' position and role in building democracy at the grass-roots level in rural areas; and has further perfected the system of villagers' autonomy.” (Xinhua, 4 Nov 98, in SWB, 10 Nov 98)

„At the recently concluded 5th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee, the 'PRC Organization Law for Villagers' Committees (revised draft)' eventually became an official law after the third examination. This is a matter of primary importance in the political life of millions upon millions of peasants in our county ...

Over the past 10 years since the nationwide trial implementation of the Organization Law for Villagers' Committees, the building of grass-roots democracy in Chinese rural areas has made unprecedented progress. Peasants' awareness of democracy and the legal system has been constantly enhanced. In the meantime, under the leadership of the Party, the masses have become more creative. This has laid a solid mass foundation for perfecting this law and for making it more suitable to reality in Chinese rural areas today ...

The Organization Law for Villagers' Committees provides an important legal guarantee for the development of socialist democracy and the self-governance of villagers. However, there is still an arduous path to take in truly

enforcing this law. Some local cadres, and some grass-roots cadres in particular, are effected by traditional concepts, and weak in their awareness of democracy and legal system. These will become obstacles on the road of advance. It is an extremely important task in the current rural work to extensively propagate the Organization Law for Villagers' Committees. We should make it known to every household and let peasants know how to exercise their democratic rights and defend their legitimate rights and interests according to law. We must encourage leaders and cadres at all levels to study and master the Organization Law for Villagers' Committees and urge them to truly respect the masses' democratic rights in their practical work ..." (RMRB, 5 Nov 98)

„Adoption Law of the People's Republic of China”, passed by the 23rd meeting of the 7th NPC Standing Committee on December 29, 1991 and revised according to the „Decision to amend the 'Adoption Law' of the PRC”, made by the 5th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on November 4, 1998. This law which consists of six chapters with 34 articles, will go into effect on April 1, 1999. (Decree No.10 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on November 4, 1998) (Full text of the law and the decision: RMRB, 6 Nov 98)

The law „contains stricter regulations to protect the rights of children. Foreigners who want to adopt Chinese children must provide notarized information from authorities in their respective countries on their background, age, marital status, occupation, property, health and police record. They also have to sign an agreement with individuals or institutions that put the children up for adoption, and register at civil affairs departments. To provide more orphans with a home life, the law allows Chinese, regardless of whether they have children or not, to adopt more than one orphan. The age of prospective Chinese parents has also been changed from above 35 years to 30 years. And, people who abandon or sell their children will be subject to fines or other punishment under the new law.” (XNA, 5 Nov 98)

## Addenda

„The State Council, China's cabinet, recently adopted and issued three regulations to improve government management of nongovernmental organizations and social institutions, according to council's Legislative Affairs Office.

The State Council approved the three regulations - Regulations on the Registration and Management of Mass Organizations, Provisional Regulations on the Registration and Management of Nonenterprise Units With Nongovernmental Funding, and Provisional Regulations on the Registration and Management of Social Institutions - on 25th October. [See C.a., 1998/10, p.1174/18.]

China has over 200,000 registered mass organizations, including over 1,800 national and more than 19,000 provincial organizations. Related organizations have mushroomed over the past two decades of reform and opening up, with an especially large number emerging in the early 1990s. In addition, the number of nonenterprise units with nongovernmental funding such as privately funded schools, hospitals, research centers, survey institutions and welfare centers, has jumped to well over 700,000. An official with the Ministry of Civil Affairs, the government department responsible for registering and managing the nation's mass organizations, said the Regulations on the Registration and Management of Mass Organizations is a revised version of the regulations promulgated in October 1989. He added that the ministry has acted in accordance with a 1996 central government order and basically completed reviews of the qualifications and performance of all registered mass organizations in China. 'The new regulations stipulate that all existing mass organizations must register with civil affairs departments upon passing our reexamination', according to the official. Gu Jiaqi, deputy director of the Office under the Committee for Central Organizational Structure, said that establishing a special system for the registration and management of institutions is a requirement of China's effort to establish a socialist market economy. 'Institutions operating under the planned economy were all affiliated with government and Communist Party departments at various levels and were not required to shoulder any civil liabilities', said

Gu. 'Now, however, they are forced to go directly to the market and society, and thus must be granted status as independent legal entities.' Song Dahan, deputy director of the State Council Legislative Affairs Office, said that certain social organizations and institutions have been involved in inappropriate and in some cases illegal activities due to lax government control. 'Certain organizations have engaged in illegal activities which have disrupted China's political and social stability, while others have exceeded their original business scope and conducted illicit operations which have disrupted the normal order of market competition', said Gu. The new regulations explicitly define the nature, function and liabilities of three major types of social organizations and establish a strict supervisory and management system governing related activities, said Gu. He added that the regulations will help resolve the aforementioned problems and ensure a brighter future for China's social organizations." (XNA, 6 Nov 98)
