Barbados (May 15)

Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Prime Minister of Barbados Owen Arthur witnessed the signing of an agreement on avoidance of double taxation and prevention of fiscal evasion with respect to taxes on income. (RMRB, XNA, 16 May 00)

Denmark (May 11)

China and Denmark signed four agreements worth about 100m US\$. Under the agreements, Denmark will provide loans and equipment for China's waste water treatment and community heating projects and purchase four product oil tankers from China. Chinese Vice-Premier Wu Bangguo and visiting Danish Prime Minister Poul Nyrup Rasmussen attended the signing ceremonies. (RMRB, XNA, 12 May 00)

Indonesia (May 08)

Prior to the talks between Chinese Foreign Minister Tang Jiaxuan and visiting Indonesian Foreign Minister Alwi Shihab, the two sides signed a joint statement on future bilateral cooperation and a memorandum of understanding on the establishment of

the joint commission for developing bilateral relations. (RMRB, XNA, 9 May 00)

Japan (May 25)

China and Japan signed an agreement on training Chinese personnel in the area of water resources. Under the five-year accord, Japan will transfer advanced technical know-how and experience on water resources management, water and soil maintenance as well as training management to China. The training program will be implemented by China's Ministry of Water Resources and the Japan International Cooperation Agency. (XNA, 26 May 00)

Myanmar (May 03)

China and Myanmar signed an agreement in Yangon on China's assistance to an agricultural machinery factory project in Myanmar. Representing their respective governments, Shi Guangsheng, the Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation, and Brigadier-General Abel, the Myanmar Minister at the Office of the Chairman of the State Peace and Development Council, signed the agreement. According to the agreement, the factory, to be built on an area of 25,000 square meters, will produce annually 10,000 sets of 16 horsepower (HP) power tiller and 5,000 sets of 3.5 HP reaper. The Chinese side will be responsible for design, supervision on civil engineering, supply and installation and testing of equipment and technical training, the agreement said, adding that the expenses will be borne under the interest-free loans specified under the Agreement on Economic and Technical Cooperation signed on December 26, 1989 and August 23, 1991 and June 7, 1999 respectively between the two governments.

The agreement also stated that the Myanmar government will be responsible for the civil engineering of the project in conformity with drawings submitted by the Chinese side and bear the expenses incurred thereupon. The agreement added that the Myanmar government will exempt from duties and taxes the equipment, materials provided by the Chinese side. (RMRB, XNA, 4 May 00)

Philippines (May 16)

Representatives of China and the Philippines signed five documents, in-

cluding a joint statement on the framework for cooperation between the governments of China and the Philippines in the 21st century, a protocol on the 12th session of the joint commission of scientific and technological cooperation, a program for cultural cooperation from 2000 to 2001, an exchange of notes on the building of a Chinese agriculture center in the Philippines, and a memo on cooperation in irrigation and other agricultural areas. President Jiang Zemin and President Joseph Ejercito Estrada attended the signing ceremony. (RMRB, XNA, 17 May 00)

Rwanda (May 19)

Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Shi Guangsheng and visiting Rwanda Minister of Foreign Affairs and Regional Cooperation Andre Bumaya signed an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the two countries and the summary of the Fourth Session of the China-Rwanda Joint Committee on Trade and Economic Cooperation. (XNA, 20 May 00)

South Africa (May 25)

Guangzhou, capital of South China's Guangdong Province, has forged friendly ties with the city of Durban in South Africa. Durban is the 12th foreign city Guangzhou has established friendly relations with since 1979 when Guangzhou built friendly ties with Fukuoka City in Japan. Cultural and trade exchanges have been expanding between Guangzhou and South Africa since January 1, 1998 when China and South Africa established diplomatic relations. (XNA, 26 May 00)

Sweden (May 11)

Visiting Swedish Deputy Prime Minister Lena Hjelm-Wallen attended a signing ceremony for the establishment of friendly relations between Northeast China's Heilongjiang Province and Vasterbotten Province of Sweden. (XNA, 12 May 00)

Thailand (May 25)

The Executive Program of the Memorandum of Understanding for Cultural Cooperation for 2000 and 2001 was signed by Pan Zhenzhou, visiting Chinese vice-minister of culture, and Somsak Prisasanathanakul, Thai education minister. The first execu-

tive program of the memorandum was signed in 1997. (XNA, 26 May 00)

United Arab Emirates (May 30)

Shanghai and Dubai of the UAE signed an agreement in Shanghai to establish sister-city relations. Shanghai Mayor Xu Kuangdi and chief executive officer of Dubai Qasem Sultan signed the agreement on behalf of the two cities. Shanghai has so far established sister-city relations with 47 cities in foreign countries. (XNA, 31 May 00)

United States (May 02)

The Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region and the US state of California have decided to establish sister-ties to further promote their friendship, according to officials of the autonomous regional government. An agreement to finalize deal will be signed in California, the officials said. The two sides will also sign a series of cooperation agreements involving cashmere garments and products made from the element thulium. Inner Mongolia and California have similar conditions in the areas of agriculture, power and tourism, and the new sisterly-relationship will help expand trade, business, cultural, and educational connections between the two sides. (XNA, 3 May 00; RMRB, 19 May 00)

International Agreement

China and European Union signed the bilateral agreement on China's accession into the World Trade Organization (WTO) in Beijing on 19th May. Chinese Minister of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation Shi Guangsheng and EU Trade Commissioner Pascal Lamy signed the agreement on behalf of the respective sides. Lamy noted that the signing of the agreement coincides with the 25th anniversary of the establishment of diplomatic ties between China and EU. So far, China has completed talks on its WTO entry with more than 30 members of the global trade organs. EU was China's third largest trading partner last year. Two-way trade volume hit 55.7b US\$ in 1999, up 14 percent from a year ago. China was the fourth largest trading partner of EU. (RMRB, XNA, 20 May 00)

HKSAR Agreement with Mongolia (May 24)

The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) signed an air services agreement with Mongolia. Secretary for Economic Services Stephen Ip signed the agreement on behalf of the HKSAR government while Mongolian Minister of Infrastructure Development G. Batkhuu signed on behalf of the government of Mongolia. The HKSAR/Mongolia Air Services Agreement is the 43rd air services agreement signed by the HKSAR government. (XNA, 25 May 00)

of health care services. According to a rule newly-published by ministries of public health and foreign trade and economic cooperation, overseas hospitals and firms can launch joint ventures in China after they get permission from the two ministries. Solely overseas-funded hospitals are still not allowed in China. A JV hospital should be internationally advanced in equipment, technology and management, and should be able to provide service that local hospitals can not give, stipulated the rule which goes into effect on 1st July. Investment in a JV hospital should not be less than 20m RMBY (about 2.4m US\$), stock shares of the Chinese side should not be less than 30 percent, and the term of JV hospitals should not exceed 20 years. However, exceptions may be made for hospitals opening in China's central and western regions, as well as remote and poor areas. Investors from Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan will have to obey this rule when launching JV hospitals in the mainland. China is reforming its hospitals by dividing them into not-for-profit and for-profit categories, and will exercise different fee-charging and taxation policies. Most JV hospitals are expected to fall into the for-profit classification. Statistics show that there are about 200 JV hospitals and clinics in 19 Chinese provinces; however, only 18 hospitals and some 60 clinics have official permits. (XNA, 24 May 00)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Provisional Methods on Compensation in Floodwater-Storing Areas, adopted by the 28th meeting of the State Council Standing Conference on 23rd May. These methods will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Order No.286 of the State Council, signed by Premier Zhu Rongji on 27th May 2000) (Full text: RMRB, 2 June 00) The methods, composed of five chapters and 26 articles, are applicable for state-level floodwater-storing areas to compensate financial losses of local residents so as to ensure their basic necessities and restore normal production. The compensations must be paid in accordance with the financial capability of the state, it says. According to official figures, there are now 97 state-level floodwater-storing zones across the country, including 40 in the Yangtze River area, five in the Yellow River area, 26 in the Haihe River area, and 26 in the Huaihe River area. (XNA, 2 June 00)

China has renewed administrative measures governing Sino-overseas joint-venture (JV) hospitals and clinics, hoping the sector's sound development can provide people a wide range

Passport applications will take less time for ordinary Chinese from 1st June, according to new regulations promulgated by the Ministry of Public Security. Public security organs in charge of approving and issuing passports will finish all necessary procedures within 15 days immediately after an application has been lodged. Under urgent circumstances such procedure can be shortened to five days. Traveling abroad will also become easier. All a traveler needs to do to get a passport is an invoice issued by a travel agency eligible for operating international tourism service. Passports valid for only one trip abroad a year will become obsolete. Renewed passports will be valid for five years. (XNA, 27 May 00)

China has adopted two regulations in an attempt to reinforce the ability to ward off possible computer virus

attacks in the future. These regulations come in the wake of the "Love Bug" virus which swept the world several weeks ago. According to the new rules, confirmation of a virus and the effectiveness of anti-virus software should be carried out by organizations designated by the Ministry of Public Security, rather than individuals or any software producer. The Ministry of Public Security, which formulated the regulations, successfully fought the "PING-PANG", the first computer virus to appear in China, with its free virus-killing software "Kill" in 1989. The promulgation of these two rules will help improve the legal framework for virus fighting efforts in China, and put an end to unfair competition among virus-killing software makers. Software producers, because of commercial considerations, usually boasted of the omnipotence of their virus-killing software, or exaggerated the destructive potential of a virus. (XNA, 27 May 00)

The Industry and Commerce Administration of Beijing recently issued three regulations on registering on-line business activities, on-line advertising, and the commercial use of e-mail. According to the regulations, those wishing to advertise on the Internet must first obtain a permit, and those already engaging in this activity must apply for a permit within half a year. The regulations also stress that on-line business must abide by related laws, and all forms of fraud are forbidden. According to the latest figures, Beijing now has 1.9 million Internet users. (XNA, 25 May 00)

Internet stock brokers separate their online trading system from other systems. Since 1997, more than 20 securities companies in China have opened online stock trading. According to CSRC chairman Zhou Xiaochuan, online trading now accounts for one percent of the total stock trading volume in China. (XNA, 21 Apr 00)

Addenda

China's securities regulators recently issued provisional regulations for on-line stock trading, thereby legalizing a business that has been growing in China but without the blessing of the regulators. The regulations issued by the China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC) ban non-securities companies such as Internet portals from engaging in any kind of online brokerage. Even securities companies which have licences for stock trading must apply for qualification for Internet brokerage, according to the regulations. The CSRC demands
