Argentina (Sep 13)

China and Argentina signed an agreement on cultural exchanges and geographic cooperation. Chinese President Jiang Zemin and visiting Argentine President Fernando de la Rua were present at the signing ceremony. (XNA, 14 Sep 00)

Australia (Sep 14)

Beijing and Canberra have become friendship cities. So far, Beijing has established friendship-city ties with 27 cities in 24 countries. (XNA, 20 Sep 00)

Brazil (Sep 21)

Visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Tang Jiaxuan and his Brazilian counterpart, Luis Felipe Lampreia, signed a protocol in Brasilia to continue bilateral cooperation in space technology and development of new land resource satellites. China and Brazil launched successfully the first Sino-Brazilian Satellite of Land Resources (CBERS) on 14th October 1999. A second satellite of the same model is in its final assemblage stage and

will be launched next year. Owing to substantial successes achieved by the two countries in this area, both parties decided to continue to cooperate in the sense of developing a second generation of CBERS satellites, denominated CBERS 3 and 4. The investment values required by the co-operation will be, by principle, shared equally between both parties. Besides satellites of land resources, the two countries want to deepen cooperation in space technology and will determine joint development viability of a weather geostationary satellite and of telecommunications, according to the same protocol. Chinese and Brazilian diplomats agreed that bilateral cooperation in the area of utilization of outer space, the first of its kind between both developing countries, is important for promoting the social, economic and cultural development of both countries. (XNA, 23 Sep 00)

Cuba (Sep 16)

Visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Tang Jiaxuan and Cuban Foreign Minister Felipe Perez signed an accord of economic and technological co-operation and an agreement of academic cooperation between the Higher Institute of International Relations of Cuba and the Diplomatic Institute of China. (Xinhua, 17 Sep 00, in SWB, 19 Sep 00)

Guinea (Sep 14)

Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Guinean Prime Minister Lamine Sidime attended the signing ceremony of two documents, including a cooperative agreement on the economy and technology and an exchange of letter on China's assistance on building a radio and television center and small hospitals in Guinea. (XNA, 15 Sep 00)

North Korea (Sep 15)

An agreement on cooperation between the governments of the DPRK and the PRC in the fields of posts and electrical communications and information technology was signed in Pyongyang. The agreement was signed by Ri Kum-bom, Korean minister of post and telecommunications, and by Chinese Minister of Information Industry Wu Jichuan, authorized by their governments. (KCNA news

agency, Pyongyang, 15 Sep 00, in SWB, 16 Sep 00)

Mauritania (Sep 25)

Lanzhou, capital city of Gansu Province, and Nouakchott city of Mauritania established friendship ties. A signing ceremony was held in Beijing for an agreement on the official establishment of the ties. President Qi Huayuan and Vice-President Su Guang of the Chinese People's Association for Friendship with Foreign Countries, Mayor of Lanzhou Zhang Yushun, and Mayor of Nouakchott Hashi Ould Didi attended the ceremony. (XNA, 26 Sep 00)

Papua New Guinea (Sep 02?)

The Chinese government has given a grant of 10m RMBY (3.3m kina) to Papua New Guinea to help build the new Department of Foreign Affairs building, which is estimated to cost about 5m kina. An agreement to this effect was signed in China during Foreign Affairs Minister Sir John Kaputin's first bilateral visit to that country. Chinese Ambassador to PNG Zhao Zhenyu announced on 8th September that his government would provide 10m RMBY for new projects. He said the new grant was apart from the 10m US\$ (27.7m kina) which the Chinese government gave earlier this year, of which 5m US\$ was a cash grant and 5m US\$ was for projects. (*The National* website, Port Moresby, 11 Sep 00, in SWB, 13 Sep 00)

Romania (Sep 15)

The Chinese and Romanian governments signed a culture cooperation agreement for 2001-2004 in Bucharest. The accord was signed by Chinese Vice-Minister of Culture Ai Qingchun and Mihai Razvan Unguleanu, state secretary of the Romanian Foreign Ministry, on behalf of their respective governments. (XNA, 16 Sep 00; RMRB, 18 Sep 00)

Venezuela (Sep 25)

The Chinese and Venezuelan governments signed an agreement on economic and technological cooperation in Caracas. The agreement was signed by the Venezuelan Minister of Industry and Commerce Luisa Romeiro and Chinese Vice-Minister of Foreign

Trade and Economic Cooperation Sun Zhenyu. (RMRB, 27 Sep 00)

International Agreement

The Chinese government and the International Monetary Fund (IMF) on 23rd September signed a memorandum of understanding on the establishment of a sub-office in Hong Kong. The memorandum was signed by Dai Xianglong, governor of the People's Bank of China, and IMF Managing Director Horst Kohler during an annual meeting of the IMF and the World Bank in Prague. According to the memorandum, the sub-office will be subordinate to the fund's resident representative office in China, with the responsibilities of assisting in information gathering, research and analysis of the economic and financial market activities in Hong Kong. It will also carry out research in the impact on Hong Kong of the economic and financial developments in Asia and other regions. The sub-office's contacts with the government of the Hong Kong SAR shall be limited to such technical work as economic research, information sharing and administrative arrangements concerning the sub-office's staff. Commenting on the opening of the sub-office, Kohler said that as a major financial center, Hong Kong plays a key role in intermediating capital flow in the region. The sub-office will greatly enhance IMF's surveillance on the financial and economic developments in Hong Kong and the region, he added. (XNA, 25 Sep 00)

Macau SAR Agreement with South Africa (Sep 27)

South Africa has granted visa-free access to Macau SAR passport holders, a press release issued on 27th September by the Macau SAR government said. For the purposes of traveling, business activities and passthrough, holders of the Macau SAR passport can stay in South Africa for up to 30 days each time with visa-free treatment. In return, the Macau SAR government has given visa-free treatment to South African passport holders who can stay in Macau for up to 30 days. (XNA, 28 Sep 00)

PRC Laws and Regulations

China's Central Military Commission (CMC) has published "Methods on the Adoption of the 'Law of the People's Republic of China on Medical Practitioners' for the Chinese PLA". The CMC decree No. 290 to this effect was signed by Premier Zhu Rongji and CMC Chairman Jiang Zemin on 14th September. The document, comprising 23 articles, defines the management, qualification, registration, duties and disciplines of medical practitioners in the army. Unlike other medical practitioners, those serving in the army are not allowed to provide medical services for their personal profits, must participate in wartime rescues and help civilians in natural disasters. The law was adopted by the NPC Standing Committee on 26th June 1998 and came into force on 1st May 1999. (XNA, 27 Sep 00; full text: RMRB, 27 Sep 00)

China on 30th September released its regulation on telecommunications passed by the State Council on 20th September. The general principles of the regulation are to regulate the telecommunications market, safeguard the legitimate rights and interests of users of telecommunications and proprietors of telecommunications business, ensure the safety of telecommunications network and information, and promote healthy development of the telecommunications industry. All those who engage in telecommunications business and related activities in the PRC must abide by the regulation. The department in charge of information industry under the State Council is responsible for enforcing supervision and administration over the national telecommunications industry according to the regulation. The supervision and administration of telecommunications industry stipulates that gov-

ernment wants to clearly separate the functions and duties from enterprises, break monopolies, encourage competition, facilitate development, openness, fairness and justice. According to the regulation, China implements licensing system in telecommunications industry in line with different categories of the business. And all the operators must apply to the central or provincial IT administration for the license before starting businesses. It divides the telecommunications business into basic telecommunications business and value-added businesses. Operators of basic telecommunications business must apply to the State Council's IT administrative department for business permits. For value-added business, the operators must apply to the State Council's IT administrative department for permits if their business covers two or more provincial areas, autonomous regions or municipalities under direct administration of the central government. They could apply to the provincial IT administration for permits if their business covers only one provincial area. The regulation also states that state-owned shares must have over 51 percent in those that are engaged in basic business. (XNA, 1 Oct 00)

The State General Administration of Sports (SGAS) recently issued "The Provisional Administrative Methods on Qigong", in a bid to ensure the healthy development of the traditional Chinese sport. Qigong, or the Deep-Breath Meditation, is a traditional sport and a component of the Chinese culture, but in recent years, some people have been making illegal profits, spreading superstitious ideas under the name of practicing Qigong, according to the SGAS. These problems have severely affected the normal practice of Qigong and been detrimental to the interests of the people, it said, stressing that the authorities are determined to crack down these harmful activities and encourage healthy Qigong. The new rules have been stipulated by revising and improving an existing document entitled "Administrative Methods on Qigong" issued by the former State Physical Culture and Sports Commission (SPCSC) in 1998. The new document comprises a general principle and eight chapters to govern various aspects concerning the

practice of Qigong. Local government departments in charge of physical culture and sports are responsible for administering and organizing Qigong activities, according to the document, which also have specific regulations on the setting-up of Qigong-practicing stations and demands that all Qigong coaches must meet the qualification after strict training and examination. It makes it clear that the official sports departments are the authoritative administration of non-government groups engaged in Qigong, while these groups should act as a bridge between the official sports departments and Qigong practitioners. "The Administrative Methods on Qigong" and "The Methods on the Appraisal of Technical Grades of Physical-Training Qigong (Trial)", which were issued by the former SPCSC in February 1998, were abolished upon the issuance of the new methods. (RMRB, XNA, 20 Sep 00)

The State Administration of Religious Affairs on 26th September issued "Rules for the Implementation of the Provisions on the Administration of Religious Activities of Aliens [Foreigners] within the Territory of the PRC". The new rules reinforced and improved the Provisions on the Administration of Religious Activities of Aliens within the Territory of the PRC adopted in 1994, according to Ye Xiaowen, director of the administration, who signed the decree issuing the rules. The detailed rules stipulated that the Chinese government respects the freedom of belief of aliens within Chinese territory, and protects and administrates the religious activities of aliens within Chinese territory in accordance with law. The rules said that aliens may participate in religious activities at Buddhist monasteries, Taoist temples, mosques, churches lawfully registered within Chinese territory according to their own religious belief. Consented by Chinese religious bodies, aliens within Chinese territory may invite Chinese religious personnel to conduct such religious ceremonies as baptism, wedding, funeral, Taoist or Buddhist rites according to each religious customs, according to the rules. The rules added that aliens entering Chinese territory may carry religious articles used in religious cultural and academic exchanges in accordance with relevant programs and

agreements of religious cultural and academic exchanges. The rules stipulated that aliens visiting China as religious personnel may preach and expound the scripture at lawfully registered sites for religious activities. They may also come to China for teaching at Chinese religious institutions. Chinese national religious bodies may select religious personnel for study abroad and aliens may also study at Chinese religious institutions according to the provisions concerned. The rules said that the collective religious activities of aliens within Chinese territory shall be conducted at Buddhist monasteries, Taoist temples, mosques, churches recognized by the departments of religious affairs of the people's government at or above the country level, or at the temporary sites appointed by the departments of religious affairs of the people's governments of provinces, autonomous regions or municipalities. Aliens performing religious activities within Chinese territory are required to abide by Chinese laws and regulations concerned and are not allowed to interfere in Chinese religious affairs. The rules have definite and detailed terms in this regard. The rules which consist of 22 articles shall enter into force as of the date of promulgation. (RMRB, XNA, 27 Sep 00; full translation of the rules: XNA, 27 Sep 00)
