China took a big step further to streamline its government institutions on 19th February when it cut down nine state administrations. The administrations formerly oversaw the sectors of coal, textiles, internal trade, metallurgical, petrochemical, building materials, non-ferrous metal, machinery and light industry. After the reshuffle, the administrative functions were handed over to the State Economic and Trade Commission (SETC). These nine administrations were originally state ministries in charge of related industrial sectors. It was in 1998, that they were demoted to administrations under the SETC. The State Tobacco Monopoly Administration will be maintained. The State Administration for Supervising Production Safety/ State Bureau for Supervising Coalmine Safety (one organ with two labels) will be established. (RMRB, 20/26/27 Feb 01; XNA, 20 Feb 01)

(XNA, 20 Feb 01; RMRB, 21 Feb 01) He replaced Lu Zhonghe, who was retiring. Li, in his mid-40s, is widely regarded as a rising political star. Born in Northern Shandong Province, he worked as secretary to Li Tieying, one of the 22 members of the Politburo who is now president of the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences - a top Beijing think-tank. In 1990, Li was assigned to work in Huizhou as a deputy mayor, and worked his way up the ladder to become Party chief - the city's No 1 leader. He was hailed for restructuring state-owned enterprises in Huizhou, and has a reputation as an honest, pragmatic and clean official. Li, who studied at Harvard University in the United States in the 1980s, speaks flu-

ent English. He is being tipped to oversee state sector reforms in Guangdong to cope with challenges brought about by the mainland's imminent entry into the World Trade Organization. (Hong Kong iMail web site, 12 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 13 Feb 01)

Li Ronggen (7)

Elected vice-governor of Guangdong Province at the 4th meeting of the 9th Provincial People's Congress which closed on 19th February. (XNA, 20 Feb 01; RMRB, 21 Feb 01)

Li Rongrong

Appointed chairman of the State Economic and Trade Commission (SETC) at the 20th session of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 28th February. (Xinhua, 28 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 1 Mar 01; RMRB, XNA, 1 Mar 01) He had served as the SETC's vice-chairman and deputy secretary of its Leading Party Group since May 2000. He concurrently serves as vice-chairman of the Capital Design and Construction Committee. Li Rongrong, a native of Suzhou in Jiangsu Province, was born in 1944 and joined the CCP in December 1983. Laura Cha Shih May-lung (Shi Meilun) (f) (11)

Appointed vice-chairperson of the China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC). (Xinhua, 12 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 14 Feb 01; RMRB, 13 Feb 01; XNA, 15/22 Feb 01) Cha, who is scheduled to leave for Beijing in mid-March to take the office, is the first top market regulator outside the Chinese mainland appointed to participate in securities management in the mainland. The appointment is regarded as

part of the government's efforts to strengthen supervision and regulation of the stock market in the mainland. Cha joined the Securities and Futures Commission (SFC) of Hong Kong in 1991 and became the executive director in 1994 and the vice-chairperson in 1998. Each year, the CSRC would send personnel to the SFC and the SFC also sent staff members to work in the CSRC since 1993, Cha told Xinhua. "We have training programs for securities professionals and we have also a fund to support the training programs", she added. Recalling her career in securities market, she said there were two significant events that impressed her very much - the listing of China's H-shares in the Hong Kong Stock Exchange and the merger of the Hong Kong Stock Exchange, the Futures Exchange and their associated clearing houses. The first listing of China's state-owned enterprise (SOE) in Hong Kong in 1993 marks a milestone for the Hong Kong stock market, she said, and it opened a channel to raise funds for China's SOEs Overseas.

Uyunqing (f),

vice-chairwoman and acting chairwoman of the people's government of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region since last August, was appointed as chairwoman on 23rd February at the 4th session of the 9th Autonomous Regional People's Congress. (XNA, 24 Feb 01) She concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP Inner Mongolia Autonomous Regional Committee (since December 1994). Uyunqing is of Mongolian nationality. Tsang, a 34-year veteran of the civil service, will succeed outgoing Anson Chan Fang On-sang, who is to retire in April this year. Investment banker Antony Leung Kam-chung will fill the vacancy left by Tsang.

The Chief Executive expressed full confidence in the two officers. "Mr

Donald Tsang's distinguished career as a civil servant spans over more than three decades. He has served Hong Kong with dedication, commitment and distinction in many different capacities. Since the Handover, in his capacity as financial secretary, he has led his team of colleagues to overcome the Asian financial crisis. I am absolutely confident that Donald will bring with him the same commitment, professionalism and leadership in fulfilling the role of the Chief Secretary for Administration. I am delighted to have Donald as the chief secretary to help me lead the team of principal officials in realizing our vision. "Likewise, I am delighted to have Mr Antony Leung to serve as financial secretary at the critical moment when Hong Kong is facing the twin challenges of globalisation and developing the new economy. Antony will bring with him to the financial portfolio the wealth of experience which he has acquired in international banking over a quarter of a century. In the increasingly fast moving world of financial markets, Internet stock trading and e-commerce, Antony's professionalism and expertise will be a pillar of strength in the HKSAR Administration. Antony's experience in masterminding our education reforms and his service as a member of the Executive Council provide him with an excellent foundation to serve as a senior member of the government." (www.info.gov.hk, Press Release, 15 Feb 01; RTHK Radio 3 audio web site, Hong Kong, 15 Feb 01, in BBC, PF 16 Feb 01)

Donald Tsang described his appointment as chief secretary as an immense honour, and pledged to do his utmost to serve Hong Kong. He said his foremost responsibility was to maintain a civil service of the highest integrity, impartiality and sense of service. But Mr Tsang said another vital task would be to assist the chief executive in the implementation of one country, two systems. "Hong Kong's success has been built on the rule of law, a level playing field for business, the free and unfettered flow of news and information and civil liberties. These are an inseparable part of

our success. We have to show clearly in the mainland of China and the rest of the world that a one country, two systems [policy] has been working successfully in Hong Kong. We must let people know that Hong Kong is not a test case, but a showcase for this unique concept."

Antony Leung said he was honoured by his appointment, and he pledged to endeavour to retain Hong Kong's healthy financial position. "Economic and financial policies touch the lives of all of us. As Hong Kong continues to recover from the Asian financial crisis, I look forward to working closely with my civil service colleagues to consolidate the achievements made so far. We will also continue to push forward our economic development in a way that benefits all sectors of the community. My aim is to provide economic opportunities for the many, not just the few. As the financial secretary, I will maintain a sound monetary system and Hong Kong's business-friendly environment." (RTHK Radio 3 audio web site, Hong Kong, 15 Feb 01, in BBC PF 16 Feb 01)

After over a month of speculation and uncertainty, Hong Kong finally has a new chief secretary of administration and a new financial secretary. Donald Tsang Yam-kuen will take over as chief secretary when Anson Chan Fang On-sang formally leaves office at the end of April. His current position as financial secretary will be taken by banker Antony Leung Kam-chung. With Mrs Chan's departure and these new appointments, Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa is starting to build his own team with individuals hand-picked for positions rather than inheriting them from the previous administration. He has reassured the civil service by appointing a man with 34 years' experience to the top job, but he has also brought in Mr Leung from the private sector as financial secretary. The civil service is believed to have reservations about this so it remains to be seen how it will work. The appointments will be a test for Mr Tung, for Beijing and for the team that Mr Tsang and Mr Leung lead. If Mr Leung's appointment proves successful, it will open the door for more appointments of private-sector individuals to key government posts. It is, therefore, a key test of Mr Tung's strat-

egy for government. It cannot have been easy for Mr Tung to convince Beijing of Mr Tsang's credibility for the job. Despite his excellent reputation in handling the economy, in Beijing's eyes, Mr Tsang is overly friendly with the democratic groups. He is also Catholic, a religion that, for instance, recognizes Taipei diplomatically. Mr Tsang said yesterday that he sees the implementation of "one country, two systems" as an important aspect of his new job. ... But his vow to "continue to make my position well known to our many fellow nationals in the mainland" has the potential to turn the matter into very much a test case for Beijing. Yet Mr Tsang has the capacity to please his masters as well, and so perhaps he will find a way of winning their trust by his good performance while also speaking out for Hong Kong's interests. His successor as financial secretary promises to build on the work already done to promote the further development of Hong Kong "into a global economic centre", and he aims to provide "economic opportunities for the many, not just the few". Those are welcome attitudes. The appointments are bold moves for Beijing, and evidence of Mr Tung's powers of persuasion. The news should be welcomed and Beijing should be given some credit for agreeing to appoint someone it may not yet fully trust. The success of the experiment remains to be seen, and Mr Tsang's determination to defend Hong Kong's freedoms may be tested. But Beijing's assent to the experiment is a sign that the principle of "Hong Kong people running Hong Kong" has, as Mr Tsang said on 15th February, "taken root in Hong Kong". Biographic notes of Donald Tsang and Antony Leung are as follows:

Donald Tsang Yam-kuen (Zeng Yinquan) was born in Hong Kong in 1944 and locally educated. He obtained his Master's degree in Public Administration from Harvard University. Both the Chinese University of Hong Kong and the Hong Kong Polytechnic University have conferred upon him honorary doctorate degrees. He first joined the civil service in 1967 and was appointed an Administrative Officer in 1971. During the early years of his career, he held a variety of posts

in the administration dealing with finance, trade and policies relating to the future of Hong Kong. As Deputy Secretary of General Duties Branch between 1985 and 1989, he was responsible for the implementation of the Sino-British Joint Declaration. Mr Tsang became the Director-General of Trade (and Chief Trade Negotiator) between 1991 and 1993, and was responsible for all facets of trade negotiation and administration affecting Hong Kong. In May 1993, he was promoted to Secretary for the Treasury to take charge of the overall resource allocation of the Hong Kong Government, the taxation systems, and cost-effectiveness in the development and implementation of Government policies and programmes. Mr Tsang was appointed the Financial Secretary of Hong Kong in September 1995, the third-most-senior person in the Hong Kong SAR Government, making him the first Chinese to assume the principal post. In the previous 153 years, all incumbents of the position were British. He became the first Financial Secretary of the HKSAR government on July 1, 1997. His portfolio includes economic services, trade and industry, monetary affairs, finance, public works, information technology and broadcasting. He concurrently served as chairman of the Task Force on Employment. He is an ex-officio member of the Executive Council. He is also chairman of a number of committees and organisations, including the Economic Advisory Committee, the Exchange Fund Advisory Committee and the Banking Advisory Committee. Mr Tsang is married with two sons. His hobbies include hiking, swimming and bird-watching.

Antony Leung Kam-chung (Liang Jinsong), aged 49, is the chairman for Asia-Pacific of J.P. Morgan Chase & Co. He joined Chase Manhattan Bank (which merged with J.P. Morgan in 2000) in 1996. Prior to that, he had worked for Citicorp for 23 years in management positions in investment banking, corporate and private banking in Hong Kong, New York, Singapore and Manila. Mr Leung is very active in community services. Currently he is a member of the Executive Council, the chairman of the Education Commission and a member of the Exchange Fund Advisory Com-

mittee. He was member (1990-1993) and chairman (1993-1998) of the University Grants Committee, member of the board of the Airport Authority and the Provisional Airport Authority (1990-1998), and director of the Hong Kong Futures Exchange (1987-1990). A graduate of the University of Hong Kong in 1973, majoring in Economics and Statistics, Mr Leung completed the Harvard Business School's Program for Management Development in 1982 and the Advanced Management Program in 1999.

Austria (Feb 22)

Austria and China renewed in Vienna a memorandum of understanding on agricultural cooperation, which was first signed in 1994, to further develop their cooperation and exchanges in farming techniques. The validity period of the memo, signed by visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Agriculture Wan Baorui and an Austrian senior official [secretary-general] of the Agriculture and Forestry Ministry, Werner Wutscher, will last for five years. Under the agreement, the two countries will conduct cooperative research and exchanges in farming techniques by swapping technological information, documentary materials, trade journals, scientific payoffs and experts. An annex of the memo listed the areas of cooperation, covering animal breeding, vaccination and quarantine, early prognostication of plant diseases and insect pests, and fruit and vegetable plantation and marketing. China will send professionals to Austria to receive training. Before the signing ceremony, Austrian Minister of Agriculture and Forestry Wilhelm Molterer met Wan, exchanging notes on jointly establishing an experimental farm. (XNA, 24 Feb 01)

Canada (Feb 11)

Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and Canadian Prime Minister Jean Chretien attended the ceremony for the signing of three documents, namely, "Memorandum of Understanding on Cooperation in the Field of Energy Sources Between the People's Republic of China [PRC] State Development and Planning Commission and the Canadian Ministry of Resources", "Letter of Intent Between the PRC Government and the Canadian Government on Launching Cooperation Projects in the Fields of Studying Environmental and Climate Changes, Judicial Reforms, Great Development of China's Western Part, and National Strength Building for Being a Member of the World Trade Organization", and "Scholar Exchange Projects Between China and Canada". (Xinhua, 11 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 13 Feb 01; RMRB, 12 Feb 01)

United States (Feb 22)

Dongguan, the economic spearhead in South China's Guangdong Province, forged a sister-city relationship with Hartford, capital of the US State of Connecticut. Dongguan Mayor Dong Xing and Hartford Mayor Michael Peters signed the sister-city agreement in Dongguan. (XNA, 23 Feb 01)

Vanuatu (Feb 27)

Vanuatu and China have signed the establishment of Vanuatu's first agricultural college. The agreement was signed this morning between the minister for agriculture, Albert Ravutia, and the Chinese assistant minister for foreign trade, He Xiaowei, in Port Vila. The director-general of the Ministry of Agriculture, Abel Nako, says the signing includes the exchange of notes between the two governments for approval. (Radio Vanuatu, Port Vila, 27 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 1 Mar 01)

International Agreement

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) signed a memorandum of understanding with China Charity Federation (CCF) on 23rd February, as a basis for close collaboration on poverty alleviation and disaster control. According to the memorandum, CCF and UNDP will join hands in improving poor people's living condition, education and health care as well as fighting against AIDS

and disasters. "To have the CCF, a non-governmental organization, as one of our close partners, will enhance the outreach and impact of UNDP's assistance projects in China, particularly those at the grassroots level that needs help," said Kerstin Leitner, UNDP resident representative in China. The UNDP has cooperated closely with the Chinese government in poverty alleviation, advancement of women, environment protection and energy projects since 1979, she added. The CCF's president, Yan Mingfu, said that the CCF has joined hands with UNDP in many anti-disaster projects and the cooperation between the two is expected to improve with this document. The CCF, a nationwide non-governmental charity organization, was founded in 1994 and now has an extensive nationwide network to deliver assistance and services to the poor and disaster victims. It has engaged in many disaster relief programmes in China. Yan said that about 30m RMBY has been collected to aid the blizzard-hit Xinjiang and Inner Mongolia so far. (XNA, 24 Feb 01)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Canada (Feb 16)

The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) and Canada signed an agreement in Hong Kong concerning mutual legal assistance in criminal matters. The agreement, signed by Hong Kong's secretary for security, Regina Ip, and Canada's secretary of state for Asia Pacific, Rey Pagtakhan, is the ninth of its kind that the HKSAR has signed on international cooperation against crime. The major kinds of assistance covered by the agreement are serving documents; taking evidence; executing requests for search and seizure; transferring persons to appear as witnesses; and tracing, restraining, forfeiting and confiscating proceeds and instrumentalities of criminal activities. The Mutual Legal Assistance [MLA] in Criminal Matters Ordinance, which provides the necessary legislative backing for the implementation of the agreement, is already in place. The MLA Agreement will enter into force on the first day of the second month after the date on which the parties have notified each other that their respective requirements for the entry into force

of the agreement have been complied with. (XNA, 17 Feb 01)

The HKSAR and Canada signed a new Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Film and Television Co-production with the aim of enabling Hong Kong and Canadian producers to pool resources to co-produce quality films and television programmes. The signing ceremony, held at the Government House, was presided by Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa and visiting Canadian Prime Minister Jean Chretien. The MOU enables Hong Kong and Canadian film and television programme producers to pool together their creative, technical and budgetary resources to co-produce quality films and television programmes. "Co-productions under this MOU will be accorded the status of national productions and will be entitled to unrestricted market access to Canada, and the MOU also helps to foster economic and cultural exchanges between Hong Kong and Canada," said a spokesman for the Information Technology and Broadcasting Bureau. The MOU sets out specific requirements that co-production projects have to fulfil in areas such as financial and technical contribution of co-producers, location where the production takes place and nationality of the production personnel. According to the spokesman, the new MOU signed on 16th February will replace a MOU signed in 1991 to update some of the clauses and to build in more flexibility for an application to qualify as Hong Kong-Canada co-productions. Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Philippines (Feb 23)

The HKSAR and the Republic of the Philippines signed an agreement in Hong Kong on mutual legal assistance in criminal matters. The agreement was signed by Secretary for Security Regina Ip, on behalf of the HKSAR government and Secretary of Justice Hernando B. Perez, on behalf of the government of the Philippines. The Agreement Concerning Mutual Legal Assistance in Criminal Matters (MLA Agreement) with the Government of the Republic of the Philippines is the tenth of its kind that the HKSAR has signed on international cooperation against crime. PRC Laws and Regulations

Decision of the NPC Standing Committee on Amending the "Law of the People's Republic of China on Regional National Autonomy", adopted at the 20th session of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 28th February 2001. (Decree No. 46 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 28th February 2001) The decision will become effective on the day of promulgation. (Full text of the decision: RMRB, 2 Mar 01)

"Law of the People's Republic of China on Regional National Autonomy", adopted at the 2nd meeting of the 6th NPC Standing Committee on 31st May 1984, and amended according to the "Decision on Amending the 'Law of the PRC on Regional National Autonomy'" at the 20th session of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 28th February 2001. (Full text of the revised law: RMRB, 2 Mar 01)

The law consists of seven chapters with 74 articles, instead of 67 as in the previous version. In the preambular part, the revised law of regional national autonomy changes the previous definition of regional national autonomy as "an important political system of the state" to "a basic political system of the state", which fully embodies the ethnic policy of the party and the state. Because of natural conditions and social, historical, and other reasons, there is still a wide gap between localities under ethnic autonomy and coastal areas in terms of development. Other amendments to this law focus on the economic system and the support and help that state organs at higher levels offer to localities under ethnic autonomy, with a view to solving some practical problems in the economic and social development in localities under ethnic autonomy,

so as to accelerate the economic and social development in ethnic regions and promote nationality solidarity. In order to intensify the fiscal support for localities under ethnic autonomy, the law stipulates that localities under ethnic autonomy are entitled to special treatment from fiscal authorities at higher levels through the standardized system of fiscal transfer payments put in place by the state under the nationally unified fiscal system. As the national economy develops and fiscal revenue increases, the fiscal authorities at higher levels shall gradually intensify the fiscal transfer payments for localities under ethnic autonomy. It is necessary to increase the capital input in localities under ethnic autonomy through general fiscal transfer payment, special-purpose fiscal transfer payment, fiscal transfer payment as part of the preferential policy for ethnic minorities, and other methods specified by the state, so as to accelerate economic development and social progress in localities under ethnic autonomy and gradually narrow the gap between these localities and developed areas.

The law also provides for higher levels of support for ethnic regions in such areas as policies, infrastructural development, and finance. The law stipulates that the state shall formulate preferential policies to guide and encourage domestic and foreign capital to gravitate towards localities under ethnic autonomy; the state shall prioritize rational resource exploitation projects and infrastructural projects in localities under ethnic autonomy in accordance with unified plans and market demand; the state shall appropriately increase the proportion of its investment and the proportion of bank loans of a policy nature in major infrastructural investment projects; if the infrastructural development arranged by the state in localities under ethnic autonomy requires those localities to provide supporting funding, the state shall grant a reduction or exemption of such funding in view of different circumstances; the state shall make an integrated use of the money market and capital market in light of the characteristics and needs of the economic development of localities under ethnic autonomy, to intensify its financial support for these localities.

Besides, the law also stipulates that the state shall adopt measures to give a certain level of financial compensation to those localities under ethnic autonomy that supply natural resources and that the state shall give a certain level of financial compensation to those localities under ethnic autonomy that have made contributions to the country's ecological equilibrium and environmental protection.

In order to help minority nationalities develop education and bring up talent of their own nationalities, the law stipulates that the organs of autonomy in localities under ethnic autonomy shall set up state-run nationality primary schools and nationality middle schools, mainly as boarding schools offering grant-in-aid, in pastoral areas inhabited by minority nationalities and mountainous areas inhabited by minority nationalities that are in economic difficulty and where habitations are scattered. The aim is to ensure that the pupils attending such schools can complete their schooling for the period of compulsory education. The funding for running such schools and the grant-in-aid shall be sourced by local fiscal authorities and if local fiscal authorities are in difficulty, the fiscal authorities at higher levels shall provide subsidies. When institutions of higher learning and technical secondary schools recruit new students, the criteria and conditions for enrolment of candidates from minority nationalities should be relaxed to an appropriate extent and special treatment should be granted to candidates from minority nationalities that have unusually small populations. “Rules for Yangtze River Three Gorges Project Resettlement“, adopted at the 35th meeting of the State Council Standing Conference on 15th February 2001. These rules, comprised of seven chapters and 64 articles, will become effective as of 1st March 2001. The “Rules for Yangtze River Three Gorges Project Resettlement“ which the State Council promulgated on 19th August 1993, will be null and void at the same time. (Order No.299 of the State Council, signed by Premier Zhu Rongji on 21st February 2001) (Full text: RMRB, 26 Feb 01)
The council recognized that application of the State Council's 1993

“Rules for Yangtze River Three Gorges Project Resettlement“ has played a major role in insuring that the Three Gorges project first phase water level resettlement work has gone smoothly. But as Three Gorges project resettlement and socio-economic development have gone forward, new situations and new problems have begun to appear during the process of resettlement. So revision of the “Rules for Yangtze River Three Gorges Project Resettlement“ is essential in order to improve the resettlement work, uphold the legal rights and interests of those being resettled, safeguard the Three Gorges project and promote economic and social development in the Three Gorges region. (Xinhua, 15 Feb 01, in BBC PF, 16 Feb 01)

The CCP CC, the State Council and the Central Military Commission recently issued **interim provisions governing the relocation of demobilized officers**. The move is aimed at better relocating demobilized officers and helping them find suitable jobs. Starting from now on, the relocation of demobilized officers will be carried out in a combined way of planning and personal job-hunting. The 11-part provisions, in 70 clauses, give detailed stipulations on the training, relocation places, social status, social security, and employment of the ex-military officers. According to the measure, ex-officers under the level of battalion commanders and having served less than 20 years will continue to enjoy the ration allocation carried out by local governments.
