- 03 Europe: President Jiang Zemin attended the summit meeting of the Conference on Interaction and Confidence Building Measures in Asia held in Almaty and the Shanghai Cooperation Organization Summit held in St. Petersburg and paid state visits to Latvia, Estonia, Lithuania and Iceland (-18);
- 06 ASEAN: first China-ASEAN Seminar on Trade, Investment and Development Cooperation held in Kunming City (-07);
- 09 Korea: three defectors entered the South Korean embassy in Beijing to seek asylum;
- 10 FAO: Vice-Premier Wen Jiabao attended the World Food Summit in Rome (-13);
- 13 Korea: Chinese security authorities dragged a North Korean asylum-seeker out of the South Korean consulate office in Beijing;
- 18 Asia: Foreign Minister Tang Jiaxuan attended the first informal gathering of foreign ministers of the Asia Cooperation Dialogue held in Thailand (-19);

- 23 Kazakhstan: Deputy Prime Minister Karim Masimov paid a working visit (-27);
- 23 Mexico: Secretary of Foreign Relations Jorge Castaneda paid an official visit (-25);
- 24 Bosnia and Hercegovina: Minister of Foreign Affairs Zlatko Lagumdzija paid an official visit (-27);
- 25 Romania: Prime Minister Adrian Nastase paid a working visit (-29);
- 28 Pakistan: Minister of State for Foreign Affairs Inamul Haq paid a visit (-30).

- 05 Xinjiang: five miners saved and three miners missed after coal mine explosion in Wensu County;
- 16 Beijing: a fire in a cyber cafe left 24 people dead;
- 19 Beijing: national conference for directors of organizational restructuring departments;
- 19 Beijing: 60th meeting of the State Council Standing Conference approved, in principle, draft law of administration permission and amendment of safety regulations on China's inland river transport;
- 20 Heilongjiang: 115 miners confirmed dead in a gas explosion in a coal mine in Jixi City;
- 22 Hunan: two people killed and nine others missing when a huge amount of water broke through a coal mine in Shaodong County;
- 22 Shanxi: 36 miners confirmed dead in an explosion at a gold mine;

The five non-official members are Leung Chun-ying, James Tien Peichun, Tsang Yok-sing, Cheng Yiu-tong and Andrew Liao Cheung-sing. Tung Chee-hwa welcomed the five non-official members for joining his team of principal officials in the Executive Council, which is the highest policy-making body in the HKSAR government. He paid tribute to the outgoing Executive Council members, Yang Ti-liang, Nellie Fong Wong Kut-man, Rosanna Wong Yick-ming, Tam Yiu-chung, Raymond Ch'ien Kuo-fung,

Charles Lee Yeh-kwong and Chung Shui-ming, for their invaluable advice and notable contribution to the running of Hong Kong over the last five years. The 19 members of the Executive Council of the Hong Kong SAR were sworn in on 1 July. (HKSAR government web site, 24 June 02, in BBC PF, 25 June 02; XNA, 2 July 02)

The HKSAR government on 24 June announced the appointments of the director of the Chief Executive's Office and the head of the Central Policy Unit to complement the introduction of the accountability system on 1 July 2002. Lam Woon-kwong is appointed director of the Chief Executive's Office. He will oversee the running of the Chief Executive's Office and the Executive Council Secretariat, as well as coordinating the formulation of public relations and media strategies for government policies. Prof. Lau Siu-kai is appointed head of the Central Policy Unit, which is tasked with advising the chief executive on policy issues and conducting research in different fields. (HKSAR government web site, 24 June 02, in BBC PF, 25 June 02)

The Central People's Government has, on the nomination and recommendation of the Chief Executive Tung Chee Hwa, approved the appointments of principal officials under the accountability system. Also appointed are five principal officials heading the disciplined services, the Independent Commission Against Corruption and the Audit Commission for the second term of the HKSAR government: Commissioner of Police, Tsang Yam-pui; Commissioner, Independent Commission Against Corruption, Ambrose Lee Siu-kwong; Director of Audit, Dominic Chan Yin-tat; Commissioner of Customs and Excise, Raymond Wong Hung-chiu; Director of Immigration, Mr Lai Tung-kwok. The government of the HKSAR announced on 24 June permanent secretary postings. Upon the implementation of the Accountability System with effect from 1 July 2002, the existing civil service posts at Point 8 of the Directorate Pay Scale in the bureaus will be retitled as permanent secretaries. Denise Yue Chung-ye, Secretary for the Treasury, will take up

Bosnia-Herzegovina (June 26)

Chinese Minister of Culture Sun Jiazheng and Bosnia-Herzegovina's Foreign Minister Zlatko Lagumdžija signed in Beijing a cultural convention, aiming to promote cultural cooperation between the two countries. According to the convention, China and Bosnia-Herzegovina, based on principles of equality and mutual benefit, will encourage and support exchanges and cooperation in the fields of culture, education, social sciences, sport, publishing, broadcasting, film and television. They will exchange cultural delegations, artistic troupes, exhibitions and experts. The convention also makes specific plans for educational cooperation, including the exchange of teachers, scholars and experts as well as students, and establishment of direct contacts between educational institutions of both countries. Moreover, the two countries drew up a cultural cooperation working plan for the years 2002-2004. (XNA, 27 June 02)

Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Greek Prime Minister Simitis jointly attended the signing ceremony for three cooperation agreements, including the "Agreement Between the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the Republic of Greece for the Avoidance of Double Taxation on Income and Prevention of Tax Evasion". (Xinhua, 3 June 02, in BBC PF, 5 June 02)

Romania (June 27)

Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Romanian Prime Minister Adrian Nastase attended a signing ceremony, at which the relevant departments of the two countries signed five documents, including an agreement on educational cooperation. (Xinhua, 27 June 02, in BBC PF, 29 June 02; XNA, 28 June 02)

Ukraine (June 18)

The Chinese Ministry of Education and the Ukrainian Ministry of Science and Education reached an agreement for cooperation on education and science. The two countries will exchange text books, syllabuses and examination papers on various levels, promote the study of the two countries' histories and culture, and exchange students and researchers. The agreement was signed by visiting Chinese Vice-Minister of Education, Zhao Qinping, and Andrei Gurzhi [name as received], first deputy state secretary of the Ukrainian Ministry of Science and Education. (XNA, 20 June 02)

International Agreements

China's return to the council of the International Labour Office (ILO) will give it a big say in international labour issues. Zhang Junjiu, vice-chairman of the All-China Federation of Trade Unions (ACFTU), said that since the recent election of Xu Xicheng, vice-chairman of ACFTU, as deputy member of the governing body of the ILO at the 90th International Labour Conference, China has resumed its role in the council of the ILO after a 12-year

break. Zhang said that the ACFTU will continue to perform its duty for the protection of the rights of workers and the building of the ILO, which will also contribute to China's reform and opening-up and to the country's diplomacy. Founded in 1919, the ILO is a specialized agency dealing with social and labour issues associated with the United Nations. It is the only UN organization that is composed of representatives from the "three parties" - governments, workers and employers. (XNA, 25 June 02)

The presidents of the six member nations of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO) signed on 7 June an agreement on setting up a permanent regional anti-terrorism agency and strengthening cooperation among the member countries in the field of security. The SCO member countries realize that terrorism, separatism and extremism are posing threat to world peace and security, to the development of friendly relations among countries, and to the basic rights and freedom of people. Therefore, the SCO members said in the agreement that they are convinced that concerted actions must be taken, including heightened collaboration to crack down upon terrorism, separatism and extremism, so as to guarantee territorial integrity, security and stability. Chinese President Jiang Zemin, Russian President Vladimir Putin, Kazakh President Nursultan Nazarbayev, Kyrgyz President Askar Akayev, Tajiki President Emomali Rakhmonov and Uzbekistan President Islam Karimov signed the agreement. They agreed that the regional anti-terrorism agency of the SCO will base its headquarters in Bishkek of Kyrgyzstan, and the main function of the agency is to coordinate the member nation actions against terrorism, separatism, and extremism. (XNA, 8 June 02)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Taiwan (June 29)

A five-year aviation agreement between Hong Kong and Taiwan was signed in Taipei. Under the agreement, which will come into force on 1 July, the China Airlines, EVA Airways, and Mandarin Airlines of Taiwan and the Hong Kong airlines, Air Hong Kong Ltd., and Dragon Airlines

of Hong Kong will fly the lucrative route. The agreement will replace the original one, which will expire on 30 June. (CNAT, 29 June 02, in BBC PF, 30 June 02)

Cathay Pacific Airways announced on 29 June that a new agreement on Taiwan air services was reached with the Taipei Airlines Association. Under the new agreement, effective 1 July, Cathay Pacific will be able to increase its passenger and cargo capacity to Taiwan. Air Hong Kong, Cathay Pacific's wholly owned subsidiary, will also have the right to operate cargo flights to Taiwan. The agreement was concluded after discussions between Cathay Pacific Airways, Dragonair, Air Hong Kong and the Taipei Airlines Association. (XNA, 30 June 02)

Macau SAR Agreement with Tanzania (June 19)

Holders of the Macau Special Administrative Region (SAR) passports have been granted visa-free access to Tanzania for a stay of no more than 90 days as of June 19, the Information Bureau of the SAR government said on 18 June. Tanzanian nationals have already enjoyed the exemption of visa requirements in the Macau SAR. Both sides hope the move will further promote bilateral ties on business, trade and tourism. The bureau said a total of 38 countries have, so far, given visa-free treatment to those who hold the Macau passports. (Macau Government Information Bureau web site, www.gcs.gov.mo, 24 June 02; XNA, 26 June 02)

Macau SAR Agreement with Thailand (June 14?)

Macau passport holders will be granted visa-free access to Thailand as of July 1, *Macau Daily News* (14 June) quoted authorities from the Thai Consulate in Hong Kong as saying. The move of the Thai government is to facilitate holders of the Macau SAR passports making even more tours to Thailand, the authorities said. A total of 50,000 Macao residents, out of a total population of roughly 440,000, traveled to Thailand last year, thanks to daily air flights between the two places. (XNA, 15 June 02)

PRC Laws and Regulations

The **Government Procurement Law of the People's Republic of China**, passed on 29 June 2002 by the 28th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee. The law will take effect as of 1 January 2003. (Decree No. 68 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 29 June 2002) (Full text: RMRB, 10 July 02)

China took a decisive step in adopting transparent and indiscriminative practices in government procurement under the WTO rules as the country's legislature passed the "Government Procurement Law". The law consists of 9 chapters with 88 articles. According to the law, government procurement should be in line with the principles of openness, transparency, fair play, justice and integrity. The law stipulates the scope, means and procedure of government procurement. It serves as a core for other relevant regulations to be adopted later. Zhang Tong, a Ministry of Finance official in charge of policy-making on government procurement, said the adoption of the law was crucial for making the sector more transparent and closer to international practice. China has yet to join the government procurement protocol of the WTO. However, it is committed to carrying out all governmental entities' procurement in a transparent and indiscriminative manner. The new law stipulates that the person who makes the procurement must not adopt irrational conditions to give different or discriminative treatment to suppliers, and no organizations or persons should use any means to obstruct or restrict suppliers from freely entering the government procurement market in a region or an industry. China began its first trial of government procurement in 1996, but developed the sector very fast. In

2001, regional agents or centres of government procurement emerged all over the country, with the total procurement volume reaching 65.3bn RMBY (7.9bn US\$), more than doubling the previous year. The scope of government procurement expanded from goods to construction projects and services. Governments at both central and local levels promulgated relevant regulations. However, the volume of government procurement accounted for merely 3.7 per cent of China's GDP and two per cent of government expenditure, a far cry from the ratio of the developed market economies. Ministry of Finance officials said the lack of universal standards and poor law enforcement also crippled the development of government procurement in China. To address these problems, the "Government Procurement Law" standardizes the practice in terms of ways, procedures, contracts, appeals and complaints, supervision and legal liabilities. Minister of Finance Xiang Huaicheng said that according to the transparency principle, China would set up completely separate organs for the administration and execution of government procurement in 2003. In order to enhance the capacity of administrators and executives of government procurement, the ministry will train 10,000 professional personnel every year for the next two to three years. Analysts here say that the adoption of the "Government Procurement Law" and other regulations would level the ground for foreign suppliers to enter the government procurement market in the future. The government hopes the expansion of government procurement will help lift the old fiscal system to international standards, and more importantly, curb the rising evil of corruption. The Ministry of Finance forecasts that the total volume of government procurement will exceed 100bn RMBY (12bn US\$) this year, including the 20bn RMBY (2.4bn US\$) to be spent by the central government. Law of the People's Republic of China on Medium-Sized and Small Enterprise Promotion, passed on 29 June 2002 by the 28th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee. The law will become effective

tive as of 1 January 2003. (Decree No. 69 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 29 June 2002) This law consists of 7 chapters with 45 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 1 July 02)

Law of the People's Republic of China on Production Safety, passed on 29 June 2002 by the 28th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee. The law will take effect as of 1 November 2002. (Decree No. 70 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 29 June 2002) This law consists of 7 chapters with 97 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 2 July 02)

Law of the People's Republic of China on Publicizing Science and Technology, passed on 29 June 2002 by the 28th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee. The law will take effect upon promulgation. (Decree No. 71 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 29 June 2002) This law consists of 6 chapters with 34 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 4 July 02)

Law of the People's Republic of China on Promoting Clean Production, passed on 29 June 2002 by the 28th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee. The law will take effect as of 1 January 2003. (Decree No. 72 of the President of the PRC, signed by President Jiang Zemin on 29 June 2002) This law consists of 6 chapters with 42 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 5 July 02)

Regulations of the Chinese PLA on the Maintenance of Equipment. The order has been recently signed by Jiang Zemin, chairman of the Central Military Commission. The regulations consist of 13 chapters with 76 articles. (RMRB, 26 June 02)

The People's Bank of China (PBOC) on 27 June promulgated **procedures for administering representative offices of overseas financial institutions**. A spokesman for the PBOC said that the new procedures have been designed to cater to the demands arising from China's opening to the outside world and its economic development, and to step up the administration of representative offices of overseas financial institutions in China. The new procedures provide

detailed regulations for the application, establishment, supervision, management, closing down and other aspects of representative offices of overseas financial institutions. The procedures will go into effect as of 18 July. (RMRB, XNA, 28 June 02)

Regulation on Intermediary Organs Specializing in Overseas Employment.

Chinese citizens planning to work abroad must sign labour contracts with their overseas employers before leaving the country, according to a new law. The "Regulation on Intermediary Organs Specializing in Overseas Employment" is designed to bring Chinese working abroad under the protection of labour laws and labour departments in their destination country. China's traditional practice has been let labourers sign contracts with domestic intermediary organs and economic contracts with overseas employers. However, in industrial disputes, Chinese working abroad were neither protected by the law nor could they ask labour departments to negotiate with their overseas counterparts. This legal loophole has encouraged a number of intermediary bodies to illegally obtain huge profits from labourers working abroad. To rectify the intermediary market, the regulation jointly issued by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security, the Ministry of Public Security and the State Administration for Industry and Commerce has for the first time defined "Overseas Employment" and required a disbursement fund of at least 500,000 RMBY (60,241 US\$). According to the regulation, only after Chinese citizens sign work contracts with their overseas employers and receive remuneration for their work done abroad can the employment be called "Overseas Employment." The disbursement fund will be mainly used as a reserve to pay fines when intermediary bodies violate the regulation or to compensate for clients' losses caused by misconduct. Meanwhile, the regulation, which comes into effect on July 1, also requires contracts between clients and intermediary organs and the work contracts between Chinese working abroad and their overseas employers to be filed in China's provincial labour and social security departments. An annual inspection system is to be es-

tablished under which all licensed intermediary organs must hand in operation reports to provincial labour and social departments to receive an annual evaluation of business operations and legal matters. To date, there are more than 50 intermediary bodies with business licenses issued by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security. Since 1992, over 100,000 Chinese have left the country to work abroad. Most of them are in Japan, the Republic of Korea, Southeast Asia, the Middle East, Africa, Europe, America and some island countries in the Pacific Ocean. The industries they work in include textiles, machine manufacturing, construction, aquaculture, catering, nursing, medical treatment and sanitation. (XNA, 30 June 02)
