Newly Appointed Leaders

Chu Bo,
vice-governor and acting governor of Hu'nan Province since last October, was elected governor of Hu'nan Provincial People's Government at the 2nd session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 1st February. (RMRB, XNA, 2 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP Hu'nan Provincial Committee (since February 1994). Chu is an alternate member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/10, p.1170/14. See also 1994/4, p.429/11.

He Yong
Identified as head of the office of the Central Leading Group on Cessation of Involvement of the Army, the Armed Police Force, and the Political and Judicial Organs in Business and Commercial Activities. (RMRB, 11 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of the Central Commission for Inspecting Discipline, as minister of supervision, and as director of the Office for Checking Unhealthy Tendencies in Business Activities. He Yong is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1997/9, p.927/25. See also 1998/3, p.352/20, and 1998/5, p.562/30.

Hong Hu,

vice-governor and acting governor of Jilin Province since last September, was elected governor of Jilin Provincial People's Government at the 2nd plenary session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 10th February. (RMRB, 11 Feb 99) He was also appointed deputy secretary of CCP Jilin Provincial Committee last September. (SCMP, 11 Feb 99) A native of Anhui Province, Hong Hu, 59 years old and a chemical engineer, had served as vice-chairman of the State Commission for Restructuring Economy until last September. He is considered a protege of Premier Zhu Rongji, and has little experience in local government administration after spending virtually his entire career in the central government bureaucracy. (SCMP, 11 Feb 99) Hong is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/4, p.449/15. See also 1998/9, p.964/14.

Ji Yunshi,

vice-governor since June 1989 and acting governor of Jiangsu Province since last September, was elected governor of Jiangsu Provincial People's Government at the 2nd session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 7th February. (RMRB, XNA, 8 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP Jiangsu Provincial Committee (since September 1998). Ji is an alternate member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/9, p.964/14.

Li Junru (1)

Appointed deputy director of the CCP CC Party History Research Office. The Hong Kong newspaper *Ming Bao* made the following report on his appointment: „Li Junru, deputy director of the Theoretical Bureau of the Central Propaganda Department [since June 1995], who was attacked by the leftists within the CCP for raising the 'third ideological emancipation movement', recently has been promoted by two grades to the office of deputy director of the CCP Party History Research Office (vice-ministerial level). Beijing's ideological circles are surprised at this news. Li Junru formerly served the Shanghai Academy of Social Sciences and was appreciated by Jiang Zemin for commenting on Deng Xiaoping Theory. Following the '4th June' incident in 1989, he was transferred to Beijing to assume the office of deputy director of the Theoretical

Bureau of the Central Propaganda Department. On the eve of the 15th CCP Congress in 1997, Li Junru took the initiative to propose the formulation of the 'third ideological emancipation movement' during an interview given to *Zhongguo Jingji Shibao* [China Economic Times].

Later, *Renmin Ribao*'s [*People's Daily*] Ma Licheng and Ling Zhijun wrote a book *Crossed Swords - records of the three ideological emancipation movements in contemporary China* on the topic which evoked strong repercussions at home and abroad and also discontent from the leftists within the CCP. Insiders disclosed that the Central Propaganda Department had intended to ban and criticize the book, which was rejected by Li Junru at a routine meeting. Li believed that the main theme of *Crossed Swords* was good. Banning the book would be tantamount to giving the signal to not allow anyone to criticize the mistake of the leftist tendencies. Li Junru's proposal was backed by deputy executive head Liu Yunshan and deputy head Bai Keming, which eventually led to an agreement: No criticism of the book *Crossed Swords* and also no further printings.

The leftists within the CCP were very discontented with Li Junru's behaviour. Yuan Mu [former spokesman of the State Council] said: Li Junru should be held responsible for the confusion in China's theoretical and ideological circles over the past year. Deng Liqun [deputy head of the CCP CC Leading Group for Party History Work] also said: From Li Junru's comments on *Crossed Swords*, there is a high tide of bourgeois liberalization once more. It is necessary to oppose it with a clear-cut stand.

Top CCP levels have stepped up control over ideology. In such a political atmosphere, it was thought that Li Junru's situation would bode ill rather than well. Unexpectedly, the Central Organization Department announced the transfer of Li Junru to the office of deputy director of the Central Party History Research Office. Insiders believe that Li's promotion by two grades in the current political atmosphere indicates that he has strong backing.

It is generally acknowledged that the backstage bosses are Zheng Bijian, executive deputy director of the Central Party School, and Gong Yuzhi, direc-

tor of the Central Party History Research Office. They were, respectively, deputy heads of the Central Propaganda Department and superior of Li Junru in the past.“ (*Ming Pao*, Hong Kong, 10 Feb 99, in SWB, 16 Feb 99)

Li Keqiang, vice-governor and acting governor of He'nan Province since last July, was elected governor of He'nan Provincial People's Government at the 2nd session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 6th February. (RMRB, XNA, 7 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP He'nan Provincial Committee (since June 1998). Li is a member of the 15th CCP CC. See C.a., 1993/5, p.517/11, 1998/7, p.765/13, and 1999/1, p.77/17.

Liu Gongchen

Identified as deputy director of the China Maritime Safety Administration. This administration established in November 1998, will take action to improve marine safety and curb pollution caused by ships, *China Daily* (27 Feb) quoted Deputy Director-General Liu Gongchen as saying. Speaking at the first national conference held by the administration on 26th February, Liu said a highly efficient maritime management system will be introduced in the country's marine areas, at ports and along inland rivers to ensure „safer shipping and cleaner waters“. Liu also called for increased inspection cruises in expanded offshore areas in 1999 to timely detect and deal with marine accidents and illegal effluent-discharges, and to guarantee safe waterways. Last year, the administration set up an inspection fleet of 150 vessels, which traveled 45,990 total nautical miles to supervise maritime law enforcement and to handle emergency accidents. It also conducted more than 530 marine search and rescue operations, helping 3,856 people escape danger in the past year. The administration will cooperate with the PLA and foreign countries to achieve better results in marine search and rescue operations this year, Liu said. According to him, the inspection ratio of foreign ships will be increased in 1999, while management of medium- and small-sized shipping companies will be enhanced this year. His administration will also check the sea-worthiness of vessels, imported old ships and those owned by townships, and

step up creation of a quick-response mechanism to curb oil-spill pollution in marine waters and deal with related accidents in time. (XNA, 28 Feb 99)

Liu Qi,

(executive) vice-mayor of Beijing Municipality since April 1998, was elected mayor of Beijing Municipal People's Government at the 2nd session of the 11th Municipal People's Congress on 10th February. (RMRB, XNA, 11 Feb 99) Liu succeeded Jia Qinglin. In April 1998, he was also appointed deputy secretary of CCP Beijing Municipal Committee. (ZGYJ, 1998/5, p.125) Last December he became deputy head of the newly established Leading Group for Urban Administration of Beijing Municipality. Liu is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/4, p.450/16. See also 1993/3, p.280/14, and 1998/10, p.1171/15.

Niu Maosheng,

vice-governor and acting governor of Hebei Province since last November, was elected governor of Hebei Provincial People's Government at the 2nd session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 2nd February. (RMRB, XNA, 3 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP Hebei Provincial Committee (since November 1998) and as deputy head of the State Flood-Control and Drought Relief Headquarters (since June 1998). Niu is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1993/3, p. 282/16. See also 1998/11, p.1258/16.

Qiao Qingchen,

deputy commander of the PLA Air Force since 1997, has been named new political commissar of the PLA Air Force. Lieutenant-General Qiao replaces General Ding Wenchang, who stepped down on reaching the mandatory retirement age of 65. Military analysts said that General Qiao's appointment was made at the enlarged meeting of the Central Military Commission in December. The new commissar, in his 50s, belonged to a younger generation of PLA officers groomed to take the airforce into the next century, analysts said. His meteoric rise from a regional air force commander three years ago to a top leader was noteworthy, one source said. The analysts pointed to his career as a military man, rather than that of professional commissar like his predecessor.

General Qiao's appointment might be „a very significant signal by moving away from ideology to operational matters“, a military source said. By appointing a political commissar from the operational arm, the air force was expected to quicken its modernisation drive in conjunction with the emphasis on the army building through science and technology, he said. (SCMP, 9 Feb 99) Qiao became deputy commander of Beijing Military Region, as well as its air force commander, in 1996. See C.a., 1998/9, p.964/14.

Wang Taihua,

vice-governor and acting governor of Anhui Province since last October, was elected governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government at the 2nd session of the 9th Provincial People's Congress on 10th February. (RMRB, XNA, 11 Feb 99) He concurrently serves as deputy secretary of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee (since October 1992). Wang is an alternate member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/10, p.1171/15.

Wang Yunkun,

secretary of CCP Jilin Provincial Committee since last September, was elected chairman of the Standing Committee of Jilin Provincial People's Congress at the 2nd plenary session of the 9th PPC on 10th February. (RMRB, 11 Feb 99) Wang is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1995/6, p.521/11. See also 1996/2, p.208/12, and 1998/9, p.965/15.

Xu Youfang,

secretary of CCP Heilongjiang Provincial Committee since July 1997, was elected chairman of the Standing Committee of Heilongjiang Provincial People's Congress at the 2nd session of the 9th PPC on 6th February. (RMRB, 7 Feb 99) The post was vacant because the former chairman Wang Jiangong died last November. Xu is a member of the 15th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1993/3, p.287/21. Yang Yongliang,

deputy secretary of CCP Hubei Provincial Committee since 1994, was elected chairman of CPPCC Hubei Provincial Committee at the 2nd session of the 8th CPPCC Provincial Committee on 1st February. (RMRB, 2 Feb 99) Yang succeeded Qian Yunlu

who was elected governor of Guizhou Province last month. Yang, a native of Changfeng County, Anhui Province, was born in January 1944, and joined the CCP in 1970. He served as deputy chief of the Political Division of the Datong Coal Mine in Huainan (Anhui), deputy secretary of CCP Datong Coal Mine Committee (1970-1978), secretary of CYL Anhui Provincial Committee (1978-1980), deputy secretary of CCP Hefei City Committee, vice-mayor of Hefei (1980-1984), Standing Committee member of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee (1984-1988), secretary of CCP Hefei City Committee, deputy secretary of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee (1988) and president of the Provincial Party School (1994), deputy secretary of CCP Hubei Provincial Committee (1994), and as chairman of Hubei Provincial Commission for Comprehensive Management of Social Security (1996). Famous writer Bing Xin, honorary chairwoman of the China Association for Promoting Democracy and honorary chairwoman of the 5th National Committee of the Chinese Writers' Association, died in Beijing on 28th February at the age of 99. (RMRB, 1 Mar 99)

Yu Qiuli

Former Vice-Premier Yu Qiuli died of illness in Beijing on 3rd February at the age of 85. Yu „was a pioneer in New China's petroleum industry and an outstanding leader in economic work. He was a member of the Politburo and a member of the Secretariat

of the 11th and 12th Central Committees of the CCP. He was a Standing Committee member of the former CCP Central Advisory Commission. He also served as a former member and deputy secretary-general of the Central Military Commission and former director of the General Political Department of the Chinese People's Liberation Army." (RMRB, XNA, 4 Feb 99)

Zou Jingmeng

Zou Jingmeng, Standing Committee member of the 9th CPPCC National Committee, was killed in a robbery in Beijing on 22nd February. Zou, born in 1929, was director of the State Meteorological Bureau (now the China Meteorological Administration - CMA) between 1982 and 1996 and honorary director of the CMA since October 1996. He was an alternate member of the 12, 13th and 14th CCP CC between 1982 and 1992. Zou also was president of the World Meteorological Organization between 1987 and June 1995. (RMRB, XNA, 25 Feb 99; RMRB, 6 Mar 99) *Huasheng Daily*, a local newspaper, said on 26th February, the killing of Zou may have been a contract murder. Zou died from four stab wounds inflicted by three people „about 27 to 28 years old, with strong Hebei accents“, the paper said. He was killed as he approached his car parked in a Beijing hotel, it added. The suspects immediately fled in a red car, registered in Hebei Province, which surrounds Beijing, without taking anything from the victim. (SCMP, 27 Feb 99) *People's Daily* reported on 11th March that the suspects have been caught and that the case is under trial. Zou Jingmeng is the younger brother of Zou Jiahua, vice-chairman of the NPC Standing Committee and former vice-premier of the State Council.

Cambodia (Feb 09)

Chinese and Cambodian governments signed five agreements in Beijing. The agreements are an extradition treaty between China and Cambodia, and three inter-government agreements on cooperation in cultural, tourism and economic and technological areas, as well as a frame pact on Chinese government's interest-discount preferential loans to Cambodia. Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen attended the signing ceremony following their talks. (RMRB, XNA, 10 Feb 99)

North Korea (Feb 27)

A 1999-2000 plan for cultural exchange between the DPRK [Democratic People's Republic of Korea] and Chinese governments was signed in Beijing by Mun Chae-sol, acting chairman of the Korean Committee for Cultural Relations with Foreign Countries, and Sun Jiazheng, minister of culture of China. (KCNA news agency, Pyongyang, 4 Mar 99, in SWB, 6 Mar 99)

Russia (Feb 25)

Russia and China signed 11 agreements in Moscow on cooperation in economic and trade, science and technology, transportation and other fields. The documents, including an

agreement on bilateral economic and trade cooperation in 1999 and four accords on oil, natural gas and electricity, were inked at the end of the 4th regular meeting between the premiers of the two countries. Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and Russian Prime Minister Yevgeny Primakov were present at the signing ceremony. (XNA, 27 Feb 99)

South Africa (Feb 02)

During the visit of Chinese Vice-President Hu Jintao, the two countries signed agreements on economic, trade and technological cooperation (signed by Sun Guangxiang, vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, and Vice-Foreign Minister A. Pahad), the establishment of a joint economic and trade commission, and civil air transport (signed by Liu Jianfeng, director of CAAC, and S. Maharaj, minister of transport). Vice-Minister of Foreign Affairs Ji Peiding and A. Pahad signed a letter of intent on building a consultation mechanism between the two foreign ministries. St. Lucia (Feb 01)

China and St. Lucia signed two agreements on bilateral economic and technological cooperation. Chinese Premier Zhu Rongji and visiting Saint Lucia's Prime Minister Kenny Anthony attended the signing ceremony. (RMRB, XNA, 2 Feb 99)

United States (Feb 08)

Beijing and the city of Houston have agreed to establish a high-tech relationship and explore new channels for the promotion of bilateral cooperation in this area, according to an agreement signed in Beijing by Beijing Vice-Mayor Liu Qi [mayor since 10th February] and Houston Mayor Leep Brown. The agreement announces that the two cities will engage in extensive commercial and trade relations. (XNA, 9 Feb 99)

Vietnam (Feb 25)

Chinese President Jiang Zemin and Le Kha Phieu, general secretary of the Communist Party of Vietnam, attended the signing ceremony for an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the two countries. Guangxiang, Chinese vice-minister of foreign trade and economic cooperation, signed the agreement on behalf of their respective governments. Under the agreement, China will provide Vietnam with non-refundable aid worth 20m RMBY (about 2.4m US\$). HKSAR Agreement with Qatar (Feb 05)

The Hong Kong Special Administrative Region (HKSAR) signed an air services agreement with Qatar. Secretary for Economic Services Stephen Ip and Qatar's Minister of Communication and Transport Sheikh Ahmed Bin Nasser Al Thani inked the agreement on behalf of their respective governments. The HKSAR-Qatar agreement is the 36th air services agreement signed by Hong Kong. (XNA, 6 Feb 99)

In accordance with the procedures, financial institutions are forbidden to deal in securities, futures or any other derivative financial tools, and should not provide credit funds or guarantee for such business. Trust and investment companies should not accept public deposits or extend loans in the name of trust business. The procedures also provide strict stipulations on the penalty of employees and senior managers of financial institutions who are involved in illegal financial practices. (XNA, 1 Mar 99)

New regulations issued by the Ministry of Labor and Social Security will involve some 140 million more people on China's unemployment insurance system, up significantly on the 79.6 million people previously enjoying such coverage. The unemployment insurance coverage will be expanded from state-owned enterprises to include non-state, foreign-funded and private enterprises in line with the new regulation recently added to the Unemployment Insurance Regulations, according to the *Guangming Daily*. Employees of city and township enterprises will be required to contribute one percent or two percent of total salaries to the unemployment insurance fund which will be supplemented with national subsidies. Experts note that the revenue will provide a solid foundation for the unemployment insurance fund. Individuals who lose their jobs after paying unemployment insurance fees for one year, as well as registered unemployed workers seeking new occupations will be eligible for subsidies from the fund, according to the regulations. The term of eligibility will depend on how long individuals have contributed to the unemployment insurance fund. (XNA, 28 Feb 99)

The China Insurance Regulatory Commission (CIRC) on 25th February issued a temporary regulation on the qualifications of senior management personnel of insurance companies. The first of its kind in China, the document is believed to be helpful to the standardization and upgrading of the insurance industry. Previously, the insurance sector had to refer to a People's Bank of China (PBC) regulation in setting the qualifications of its senior management personnel.

Compared with the PBC's document, the new regulation lays more stress on the professional experience, is stricter and more comprehensive in regulating the qualifications of senior foreign staff, *China Daily* (26 Feb) quoted a CIRC official as saying. The regulation stipulates that senior management personnel in the insurance sector must have professional knowledge and possess a strong managerial ability. They must also have a spotless work record. Senior management staff at the headquarters of insurance institutions must possess an advanced professional qualification and, as a minimum, have a bachelor's degree in economics, finance or related majors. Moreover, the document has specific stipulations on the period of work experience for senior managerial personnel. (XNA, 27 Feb 99)

„Procedures for Punishing Illegal Financial Practices“, adopted at the 13th meeting of the State Council Standing Conference on January 14, 1999. These procedures will become effective on the date of their promulgation. (Order No.260 of the State Council, signed by Premier Zhu Rongji on 22nd February 1999) (Full text: RMFB, 1 Mar 99) The State Council has promulgated these procedures in a bid to protect the financial order and prevent financial risks. The 32-article procedures provide provisions on the operation of financial institutions, including banks, credit cooperatives, finance companies, trust and investment companies and financial leasing companies, and mete out penalties for various illegal financial practices. The procedures mainly cover financial institutions, business scopes of such institutions, the authenticity of their various reports and certifications, deposit and loan business, cash and credit card management, asset-liability management, foreign exchange
