From 1959 to 1965, he studied at Qinghua University majoring in hydraulic engineering, and in 1964 he became a political instructor at the university (until the outbreak of the „Cultural Revolution“). From 1965 to 1968, he did scientific research work at the Hydraulic Engineering Department of Qinghua University. From 1968 to 1982, he worked in a housing construction team of Liujiaxia Engineering Administration of the Ministry of Water Resources and Electric Power. Later he served as a technician, office secretary, and deputy secretary of the general Party branch of the 813 sub-bureau of the 4th Engineering Bureau of the ministry. Then he worked as a secretary of the Gansu Provincial Construction Commission, deputy head of the project design management division of the construction commission, deputy director of the commission, and secretary of the CYL Gansu Provincial Committee. From 1982 to 1992, he became a member of the Secretariat of the CYL CC, chairman of the All-China Youth Federation, and the first secretary of the Secretariat of the CYL CC, secretary of the CCP Guizhou Provincial Committee and first secretary of the Party Committee of Guizhou Military District, and secretary of CCP Tibet Autonomous Regional Committee and first secretary of the Party Committee of Tibet Military District. Han Zhubin, procurator-general of the Supreme People's Procuratorate (SPP), and Park Soon-Yong, visiting public procurator-general of the ROK, signed a cooperative agreement between China's SPP and ROK's Supreme Public Procurator's Office. (RMRB, XNA, 7 Sep 99)

Netherlands (Sep 23)

China's Suzhou City and the Netherlands' Nijmegen have become sister cities, following the signing of an agreement in Suzhou. Nijmegen thus becomes the 11th sister of the east Chinese city in Jiangsu Province. The mayor of Nijmegen, E.M. d'Hondt, and his Chinese counterpart, Chen Deming, officially signed the agreement. (XNA, 24 Sep 99)

Thailand, Vietnam, Micronesia (Sep 25)

East China's Zhejiang Province established friendly relations with Phitsanulok Province of Thailand, Thien Hua Province of Vietnam and the State of Pohnpel of Micronesia. Cities of Zhejiang Province have already established 43 pairs of sister-city relationship and 34 pairs of friendly relations with cities of 23 countries. In the past 20 years, more than 1,200 Zhejiang delegations have visited sister cities, and the province has also received over 3,600 delegations from friendly cities. (XNA, 26 Sep 99)

HKSAR Agreement with Ecuador (Sep 03)

The Hong Kong SAR and the Republic of Ecuador signed a visa abolition agreement in Hong Kong. „The agreement gives visa-free access for a period up to 90 days to HKSAR passport holders visiting Ecuador“, a HKSAR government spokesman said. According to the spokesman, the agreement will take effect on October 3, 1999. Nationals of Ecuador will likewise enjoy 90 days' visa-free access to Hong Kong. Ecuador is the 61st country (territory) granting visa-free access to HKSAR passport holders. (XNA, 4 Sep 99)

HKSAR Agreement with Sri Lanka (Sep 03)

The Hong Kong SAR and Sri Lanka signed an agreement for the surrender of fugitive offenders. The agreement was signed by Hong Kong Secretary for Security Regina Ip and Sri Lankan Ambassador to China R C A Vandergert. The Agreement for the Surrender of Fugitive Offenders with Sri Lanka is

the 12th of its kind concluded by Hong Kong. (XNA, 4 Sep 99)

HKSAR Agreement with Vietnam (Sep 10)

The Hong Kong SAR and the Vietnamese Government signed an aviation transport agreement in Hanoi. The agreement was signed by Secretary for Economic Services Stephen Ip and Director of the Civil Aviation Administration of Vietnam Nguyen Tien Sam. China and Vietnam resumed air links in 1992 following a 14-year break. (XNA, 12 Sep 99)
