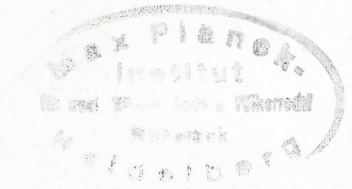

The editors welcome contributions on contemporary China including Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan that are concerned with the fields of international relations, politics, economics, society, education, environment or law. Articles should be theoretically grounded, empirically sound and reflect the state of the art in contemporary Chinese studies.

All manuscripts will be peer-reviewed for acceptance. The editors respond within three months.

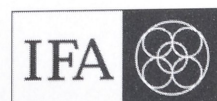

Newly Appointed Leaders

Cai Wu

Appointed director of the State Council Information Office. (XNA, 25 Aug 05)

Cai Wu, former deputy director of the CCP CC International Liaison Department (see C.a., 1997/11, p.1146/22), was recently appointed director of the International Communication Office of the CCP CC and director of the Information Office of the State Council, and appeared formally today to assume his new post. The former director, 65-year-old Zhao Qizheng, has reached the age limit for leaders at minister level, and was transferred early this year to become vice-chairman of the Foreign Affairs Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference (CPPCC) National Committee. ... It is learned that Cai Wu today took part in this morning's internal meeting of the State Council Information Office in his new capacity ... Since the State Council Information Office and the Central International Communication Office are "two outfits manned by the same group of people", Cai Wu has therefore at the same

time become director of the Central International Communication Office. While serving as deputy director of the Central Liaison Department, Cai Wu was involved in party diplomacy on behalf of the CCP for many years, and has travelled to every corner of the world. Analysts here pointed out that this arrangement by the central authorities is aimed at exerting the advantage of Cai Wu's 20-year experience in diplomacy and at "explaining China to the world". At the same time, Cai Wu has rich experience in propaganda work, and has been interviewed many times by Chinese and foreign media to introduce the functions and to unmask the secret veil of the Central Liaison Department. The International Conference of Asian Political Parties was held in Beijing for the first time last year, and Cai Wu's performance as spokesman has left a rather deep impression on the people. ... Cai Wu is the same age as New China, and was born in October 1949. He comes from the north-western province of Gansu. After the Cultural Revolution ended, the university entrance examination was restored, and he was admitted to the International Politics Department of Beijing University after scoring outstanding results, staying on to teach after graduation. In July 1983, he began his 12-year working career at the CYL [Communist Youth League] Central Committee and served as director of the International Liaison Department of the CYL Central Committee as well as Standing Committee member of the CYL Central Committee. In 1995, Cai Wu was transferred to become head of the Research Office of the Central Liaison Department, and two years later, he was promoted to deputy director of the department. He was only 48 years old that year. Cai Wu is regarded as a typical scholarly type of senior official of the CCP, and has a doctor of law degree from Beijing University. At present, he is concurrently a supervisor of doctoral students at the School of International Studies in the Renmin University of China, and his main field of research includes political party diplomacy and political parties of the world. (*Wen Wei Po website*, Hong Kong, 17 Aug 05, in BBC PF, 18 Aug 05)

Cai Wu, born in October 1949, is a native of Wudu County, Gansu

Province. In January 1973, he joined the CCP. He worked in a production team in Gaotai County, Gansu Province (November 1968), in the Shandan Coal Mine in Gansu (February 1971), studied at the Department of International Politics at Beijing University and later became a teacher. After July 1983, he served as director of the CYL Central International Liaison Department, member and Standing Committee member of the CYL CC, member, Standing Committee member and deputy secretary-general of the All-China Youth Federation. In March 1995, he became director of the Research Office of the Central Liaison Department, in July 1995 deputy secretary-general of the Central Liaison Department (concurrently director of its Research Office), and in July 1997 deputy director of the Central Liaison Department. (www.xinhuanet.com, 25 Aug 05, visited on 29 Aug 05) Cai is a member of the 10th CPPCC National Committee.

Chen Guoling (1)

Identified as deputy political commissar of Guangzhou Military Region (MR). (*Hubei Ribao*, 22 July 05, in ZGYJ, 2005/8, p.173) He had served as political commissar of the 39th Group Army (Shenyang MR) since March 2003.

Chen Qiufa (2)

Appointed as vice-chairman of the Commission of Science, Technology and Industry for National Defence. (XNA, 19 Aug 05)

Chen Zhangyuan (3)

Identified as deputy political commissar of Jinan Military Region. (*Henan Ribao*, 27 June 05, in ZGYJ, 2005/8, p.172) Chen, born in January 1946, is a native of Jiangyin, Jiangsu Province. He formerly served as director of the Organization Department and vice-president of the National Defence University. Chen is a PLA delegate to the 10th NPC.

Cui Yi (4)

Identified as chief of staff of Tibet Military District. (*Xizang Ribao*, 1 July 05, in ZGYJ, 2005/8, p.173) He had served as its deputy chief of staff before. Cui once served as director of the Organization Department of the PLA General Political Department.

Du Ying (5)

Appointed as vice-chairman of the State Development and Reform Commission. (XNA, 19 Aug 05) Graduated from the Economy Department of the Chinese People's University, Du Ying has studied the theory and policy of agriculture and rural economy for a long time, worked in a number of decision-making institutions or think tanks, such as the Institute of Agricultural Economy under the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences, the Rural Development Research Centre of the State Council, and the Rural Economy Research Centre of the Ministry of Agriculture, and won state-level science and technology achievement awards on many occasions. Since 1997, he has successively served as director of the Agriculture Ministry's Department of Policy and Structural Reform Statutes and director of its Department of Industrial Policy and Statutes. In November 2001, he was transferred to the State Development and Reform Commission to serve as director of its Rural Economy Department. (DGB website, 18 Aug 05, in BBC PF, 23 Aug 05)

Feng Jianzhong (6)

Appointed as deputy director of the State General Administration of Sports. (www.xinhuanet.com, 25 Aug 05, visited on 29 Aug 05; XNA, 25 Aug 05) He had served as assistant director since December 2003.

Gou Tianlin (7)

Appointed editor-in-chief of *Guangming Daily* in June. In 1970, he was a worker-peasant-soldier student at the Philosophy Department of Beijing University. He came from the navy to study and returned to the navy. He was later transferred to the Hua Xia Publishing House and to the journal *Dangjian* (Party Building). (DX, 2005/7, p.22) Gou had served as a Standing Committee member of CCP Tibet Regional Committee (since September 2001) and director of its Publicity Department (since August 2001).

He Minxu (8)

Appointed vice-governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government at the 17th session of the 10th PPC on 17 June. (*Anhui Ribao*, 18 June 05, in ZGYJ, 2005/7, p.160) He Minrong, born in 1955, is a native of Shaowu,

Fujian Province. He had served as secretary of CCP Chizhou Prefectural Committee (Anhui) and chairman of the Standing Committee of Chizhou Prefectural People's Congress before.

Hu Xiaolian (f),

director of the State Administration of Foreign Exchange (SAFE), was appointed vice-governor of the People's Bank of China. (XNA, 19 Aug 05) In August 2004, she became assistant governor of the People's Bank of China. Hu was born in August 1958. See C.a., 2002/3, p.326/26, and 2005/2, p.25.

Jiang Fan (9)

After the talks, State President Hu Jintao, who was paying a state visit here, and Canadian Prime Minister Paul Martin jointly attended a signing ceremony at which a number of documents on bilateral cooperation were signed, including the "Agreement on Air Transport between the PRC [People's Republic of China] Government and the Canadian Government," "Memorandum of Understanding on Matters Concerning Railway Cooperation between the PRC Ministry of Railway and the Canadian Ministry of Transport," and "Memorandum of Understanding on Food Security and Sanitation of Animals and Plants between the PRC State Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine and the Canadian Food Inspection Agency." ... Congo (Sep 26)

... After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Republic of the Congo President Denis Sassou-Nguesso, the heads of the state of the two countries attended a ceremony for signing an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the Chinese government

Nepal (Aug 15)

China has agreed to give Nepal cargo transportation facility via roads in Tibet and cattle pasture facilities. It has agreed to give Nepal a grant assistance of 880m rupees [12.7m US\$]. Bilateral agreements were signed between visiting Minister for Foreign Minister Ramesh Nath Pandey and his Chinese counterpart Li Zhaoxing in Beijing. According to an agreement, the families of the diplomatic and government passport holders will be allowed to visit without a visa. Traders will be issued multiple entry visas that remain valid for two years. This arrangement has been made in order to expand Chinese investment in Nepal and to facilitate the travel of Nepalese traders in China. The foreign ministers of the two countries signed this agreement after the Nepalese foreign minister met with Chinese President Hu Jintao. China has been giving Nepal annual assistance of 800m rupees to construct different projects. China has said that the royal move of 1 February is an internal affair of Nepal. According to a source at the Ministry

of Finance, Nepal has asked China for budgetary assistance of 3bn rupees. According to Foreign Secretary Madhuraman Acharya, in the five-year pasture agreement, China will open its grassland for Nepalese livestock for seasonal grazing. Protocols have also been signed to transport cargo to remote areas of Nepal by using the highway in Tibet [passage omitted]. This accord will remain effective for three years. (Kantipur, Kathmandu, 16 Aug 05, in BBC PF, 17 Aug 05; XNA, 17 Aug 05)

Saudi Arabia (Sep 13)

Chinese Vice-Premier Hui Liangyu hailed a Sino-Saudi Arabian agricultural cooperation agreement while meeting Saudi Arabian Agriculture Minister Fahd Balghunaim and his party, saying there is a great potential for bilateral cooperation in agriculture. Chinese Agriculture Minister Du Qinglin and his Saudi Arabian counterpart Fahd [Bin-Abd-al-Rahman Bin-Sulayman] Balghunaym just signed an agricultural cooperation agreement in Beijing. ... (XNA, 13 Sep 05)

United Kingdom (Sep 06)

A Chinese investment company and the Standard & Chartered banking group signed an agreement in Beijing to promote the establishment of a new bank, the China Bohai Bank Co. Ltd. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and British Prime Minister Tony Blair witnessed the signing ceremony. Details of the agreement are not available yet. The China Southern Airlines also signed an agreement with Airbus. The Chinese company will buy 10 A330 aircraft according to the agreement. The other two documents inked at the signing ceremony include one on Sino-British cultural exchange and a memorandum of understanding between the National Museum of China and the British Museum. Uruguay (Aug 18)

... Uruguayan President Tabare Vazquez said in Montevideo the agreement signed by the presidency and Xinhua will strengthen cultural ties between the two countries. ... The Xinhua News Agency, which transmits news to the world around-the-clock in several languages and also introduces social and economic achieve-

ments made by Latin American countries to the rest of the world, has strengthened Latin America's international position through spreading information about the region, Tian Congming, president of Xinhua News Agency said. ... Uruguay is the last leg of Tian's Latin American tour, which also took him to Mexico, Chile and Cuba. (XNA, 19 Aug 05)

International Agreements

China's top legislature ratified the **WHO Framework Convention on Tobacco Control** on 28 August, making the treaty a nation-wide regulation for banning tobacco vending machines. (RMRB, 29 Aug 05) The Standing Committee of the 10th NPC approved the appeal for passing the treaty the Chinese government signed in 2003. The NPC Standing Committee supported the treaty by announcing that China will ban tobacco vending machines of any kind on the territorial area of the PRC, including Hong Kong and Macao SARs. According to the treaty, the world's first legal instrument designed to reduce tobacco-related deaths and diseases, all tobacco vendors should place a clear and prominent indicator inside their points of sale about the prohibition of tobacco sales to minors, in case of doubt, request buyer to provide appropriate evidence of full legal age. Similar regulations were enacted in China in 1999 to prohibit tobacco sales to minors. ... The treaty also ban tobacco advertising, promotion and sponsorship on radio, television, print media and internet within five years and prohibit tobacco sponsorship of international events and activities. A recent random survey conducted by State Tobacco Monopoly Administration among 220,000 people in 183 cities shows that there are more than 300 million smokers in China, 5 million among them are minors. According to the Chinese Association on Smoking Control, about 1.2 million people die of tobacco-related diseases each year in China, one fourth of the total figure of the world. China sold 1797.95bn cigarettes in 2003, making it the world's largest cigarette market. (XNA, 28 Aug 05)

UN High Commissioner for Human Rights Louise Arbour and Chinese Assistant Foreign Minister Shen Guofang signed an agreement in Beijing on 31 August. The purpose of the agreement is to assist China implement the suggestions on the economic, social, and cultural rights, as well as to push for China's ratification of the "International Convention on Civic and Political Rights." According to the agreement, the projects of cooperation between the office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights and the Chinese government include: assistance to China to replace incarceration with other punishment measure; assistance to revise the Criminal Procedural Law, the Lawyers Law, and other relevant laws and regulations; and assistance to enhance citizens' ability to improve society. The agreement also includes incorporation of the education on human rights into the curricula of primary and middle schools and schools of higher learning, as well as the education for civil servants. Meanwhile, the agreement also provides assistance to the government to build a national human rights research institute. In 1998, the office of the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights began dialogue and exchange with the Chinese government. A "Memorandum of Cooperation" was signed in that year. In September 2000, the Chinese government and High Commissioner for Human Rights Mary Robinson signed a memorandum of understanding for promoting the projects of cooperation. ... China and the European Union (EU) signed a series of agreements on 5 September during the 8th China-EU summit in a bid to facilitate their all-round strategic partnership. At the annual China-EU summit, Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao met with British Prime Minister Tony Blair, President of the EU Commission Manuel Barroso, and EU Council Secretary-General Javier Solana. Following the meeting, China and the EU signed the agreements on such fields as transportation, environmental protection, space development and construction of the Beijing capital airport. Besides, the two sides jointly issued a joint statement of the China-EU sum-

mit and Joint Declaration on Climate Change. The two sides exchanged views on China-EU relations and major international affairs of mutual concern, and reached extensive consensus. Both sides agreed that to enhance all-round strategic partnership between China and the EU is in the interests of the two sides and conducive to peace, stability and development of the world. China and the EU pledged to further the strategic partnership and deepen cooperation in politics, economy, transport, environmental protection, technology, culture and international and regional affair. (XNA, 5 Sep 05; RMRB, 6 Sep 05)

The China-EU textile talks ended on 5 September. Minister of Commerce Bo Xilai signed the agreement on behalf of China and EU Trade Commissioner Peter Mandelson signed the agreement on behalf of the EU. At the signing ceremony, Bo Xilai said that through serious talks on an equal basis, "another important agreement has been reached". This shows China and the EU "need each other and are lovers at heart [Chinese: qing you suo zhong]" in the textile trade. Besides, this also shows China and the EU have the capability and mechanisms to solve problems. Peter Mandelson said that through the concerted efforts of both sides, the two sides have jointly reached an agreement satisfactory to both of them. "This agreement is about solving the problem of the overshoots in some of the textile quotas." Peter Mandelson said that this agreement will be discussed in Brussels today and tomorrow. The final result will be announced a few days later. This also means all the 80 million items of Chinese textile products held up at ports are hopeful to enter the EU market several days later. Bo Xilai then gave an explanation on handling the textiles held up at ports. He said that the textiles held up by the customs will enter the EU market by using in advance the quotas for next year and adjusting the quotas for several categories of textiles. Regarding those for which neither side has issued a permit, Bo Xilai said that a completely fair sharing method will be used: "China and the EU will undertake their respective due responsibility on a fifty-fifty basis." Regarding the China-EU agree-

ment reached in Shanghai in June, Bo Xilai said that it is "comprehensive and scientific and is a win-win or win-win-win agreement." He held that the reason why the problem occurred was because there was "an import and export neutral-gear period" from 11 June to 20 July. During this period, EU and Chinese importers and exporters reached a large number of agreements that far exceeded expectation. However, the enterprises of neither sides should be blamed for this. After the news briefing, Bo Xilai again emphasized that both the principles and details of the talks are fair and equitable. China-EU trade and economic relations are full of vigour and they supplement each other to a great extent. "We need each other and can achieve win-win results." (ZXS, 5 Sep 05, in BBC PF, 6 Sep 05; RMRB, 6 Sep 05)

Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing on 14 September joined world leaders in signing an international treaty under which defines as a crime the possession of radioactive material with the intention of committing a terrorist act. The **Convention for the Suppression of Acts of Nuclear Terrorism** was the 13th anti-terrorism international treaty and the first completed since the 11 September terrorist attacks on the United States. The accord, adopted by the UN General Assembly in April, will enter into force after 22 states ratify it. Under the treaty, it is illegal to possess radioactive material or a nuclear device for the purpose of causing death or substantial damage to property or environment. It is also punishable to threaten to use radioactive material or attempt to obtain such lethal material. After Li signed the treaty at a desk in a makeshift hall on the sidelines of the UN summit, Chinese UN Ambassador Wang Guangya told reporters that China's signing of the treaty indicates the country's determination to combat terrorism and its support for the UN's leading role in the global fight against terrorism. Other leaders who signed the document Wednesday included Russian President Vladimir Putin, US President George W. Bush, French Prime Minister Dominique de Villepin and Canadian Prime Minister Paul Martin. (XNA, 15 Sep 05; RMRB 16 Sep 05)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Hungary (Sep 10)

... The Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) on Cultural Cooperation between the Ministry of National Cultural Heritage of the Republic of Hungary and the Home Affairs Bureau of the government of the HKSAR was signed by the minister of national cultural heritage of the Republic of Hungary, Mr Andras Bozoki, and the secretary for home affairs of the HKSAR, Dr Patrick Ho, in Hong Kong. The prime minister of the Republic of Hungary, HE Mr Ferenc Gyurcsany, who was on an official visit to Hong Kong, following his visit to the mainland, also attended the signing ceremony. The MoU signifies an important step taken by both governments in strengthening the cultural cooperation in both places. It provides a formal framework for further cultural exchanges and opens up new initiatives for cooperation in the field of culture and the arts. ... Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Netherlands (Sep 08)

The secretary for home affairs, Dr Patrick Ho, and the vice-minister of education, culture and science of the Netherlands, Ms Medy C van der Laan, signed a MoU on Cultural Cooperation between Hong Kong and the Netherlands. ... (HKSAR government website, 8 Sep 05, in BBC PF, 10 Sep 05)

Macau SAR Agreement with the Commonwealth of Dominica (Sep 26)

Macau and Dominica signed an Agreement on Mutual Abolition of Visa Requirements at the Yellow Hall of the Macau Government Headquarters. Chief Executive Ho Hau Wah, Prime Minister Roosevelt Skerrit represented the Governments of Macau and Dominica respectively to sign the agreement. Holders of Macau passport and travel permit will be able to enter Dominica without a visa for a stay not exceeding ninety days. Until now, there are 66 countries or territories that agree to grant the visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to the holders of Macau passport, seven countries that agree to grant the visa-free access to the

Macau SAR Agreement with Israel (Sep 15)

China's Macao SAR and Israel have signed an Air Service Agreement on opening air services in the near future. A press release issued by Macao's Information Bureau said representatives of the Civil Aviation Authority of Macao and the Civil Aviation Authority of Israel clinched the deal at the conclusion of a two-day meeting ... Regulation on Narcotic and Psychotropic Drugs, adopted at the 100th State Council's executive meeting on 26 July 2005. The Regulation will take effect on 1 November, 2005. (Decree No. 442 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 3 August 2005) The Regulation consist of nine chapters with 89 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 27 Aug 05)

The regulation aims to beef up control over narcotic and psychotropic drugs, ensure the legal, safe and appropriate usage of narcotic and psychotropic drugs and curb them from illegal distribution channels. ... the regulation covers planting, laboratory research, production, distribution, usage, storage, transportation, registration and supervision of narcotic and psychotropic drugs, and legal penalties of violation. According to the regulation, the state bans any social unit or individual from planting, laboratory research, production, distribution, usage, storage and transportation of narcotic and psychotropic drugs. The State Administration on Drug Supervision will set annual production plans of narcotic and psychotropic drugs, and the state agricultural administration will set annual planting plans in compliance with the production plans. Those enterprises allowed to produce and plant narcotic and psychotropic drugs must report to the relevant local and state departments on a regular basis. The State Administration on Drug Supervision will set the number and allocation of production enterprises of narcotic and psychotropic drugs in accordance with demands and make adjustment every year. Meanwhile, the new regulation still, as always, prohibits retail sales of narcotic drugs

and psychotropic drugs listed in Class 1, and retail sales of psychotropic drugs listed in Class 2 to minors. The regulation also stipulates that clinical experiment of narcotic drugs and psychotropic drugs listed in Class 1 cannot be done on healthy people, and sending narcotic and psychotropic drugs by post requires permits from local drug supervision departments. (XNA, 26 Aug 05)

Law on Public Order Management and Penalties of the People's Republic of China, adopted at the 17th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August. This law will take effect as of 1 March 2006. (Presidential Decree No. 38, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 28 August 2005) (RMRB, 29 Aug 05) This law consist of 119 articles.

The NPC Standing Committee passed a law on penalties for offences against public order on 28 August, which cover streetwalkers, pimps and football hooligans for the first time. The law is to replace a set of regulations of the same nature promulgated 25 years ago. "The phenomenon of streetwalkers or pimps soliciting customers for prostitution in public places, especially the streets, has become a serious problem. Relevant people deserve to be punished as the phenomenon has gravely eroded social values and affected public order," said Yang Jingyu, chairman of the Law Committee of the NPC Standing Committee. There was no provision on this specific issue in the previous regulations. According to the law, a person will be detained for a period less than five days or fined a sum below 500 RMBY (approximately 61.65 US\$) if he or she is found of finding customers for prostitution in public places. The 119-article law, a guide on issuing penalties on offences against public order, also contains provisions on penalizing football hooligans and other offences. Meanwhile, it has removed the clause of forbidding "begging activities of vagrants" that disrupt public order and infringe upon the right of the person and a few others in the previous regulations to conform with spirits of modern public administration, says a law expert. Legislation on penalties for offences against public order is considered to be closely linked with interests of the people. In 2003 alone, Chinese

police handled 5 million cases in this field, involving more than 10 million people. (XNA, 28 Aug 05) According to the law, the penalty of detention does not apply to an offender under age 18 for the first offence against public order. (XNA, 28 Aug 05)

Notarization Law of the People's Republic of China, adopted at the 17th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August. This law will take effect as of 1 March 2006. (Presidential Decree No. 39, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 28 August 2005) (Full text: RMRB, 7 Sep 05) This law consists of 7 chapters with 47 articles.

Decision of the NPC Standing Committee with respect to amendments to the "Law for Protection of Women's Rights and Interests of the People's Republic of China", adopted at the 17th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August. This decision will take effect as of 1 December 2005. (Presidential Decree No. 40, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 28 August 2005) (RMRB, 29 Aug 05) (Full text of the decision: RMRB, 29 Aug 05)

Prohibition of sexual harassment was for the first time included in China's law. And gender equality was designated as one of the country's basic national policies, according to the amended law. (XNA, 28 Aug 05)

China's legislature on 28 August passed amendments to the law on women's rights protection, which "prohibits sexual harassment of women" and empowers women to "lodge complaints" to relevant organizations. "This is the first time the issue of sexual harassment has been written into Chinese law," said Wu Changzhen, professor at the China University of Political Science and Law. "It provides the legal basis for handling such issues." For a long time, "sexual harassment" has been regarded as a moral issue rather than a legal one in China. Of the nearly 10 sexual harassment cases that entered legal proceedings since 2001, only one plaintiff wins. In a survey of more than 8,000 Chinese people, jointly conducted by two major media organizations Sina and Fortnight, 78 per cent of the men said they had never experienced sexual harass-

ment while the ratio was 21 per cent for women. A survey conducted by the Chinese Academy of Social Sciences shows nearly 40 per cent of women in private businesses and foreign-funded businesses has experienced sexual harassment. Chinese law experts call the new clause an improvement in China's legal system, noting the system now strives to provide all-round protection to people, both physically and psychologically. According to the amendments, the State Council will work out China Development Programme for Women and local government across the country will map out development planning for women. The state should also work to gradually improve the ratio of women in the seats of the NPC and people's congresses at various levels. New stipulations on women's issues in the amendments include political rights, employment, birth insurance and domestic violence. (XNA, 28 Aug 05)

Law for Protection of Women's Rights and Interests of the People's Republic of China, adopted at the 5th session of the 7th NPC on 3 April 1992 and amended according to the "Decision of the NPC Standing Committee on revising the 'Law for Protection of Women's Rights and Interests of the PRC'" at the 17th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August 2005. (Full text of the law: RMRB, 14 Sep 05) The law consists of 9 chapters with 61 articles.

Special Provisions of the State Council on Preventing Production Safety Accidents at Coal Mines, adopted at the State Council's 104th executive meeting on 31 August 2005. The Provisions will go into effect on the day of promulgation.

County and town chiefs will be degraded or removed from their posts if illegal coal mines are found in regions under their jurisdiction, according to new State Council regulations. The regulations, which have been subscribed by Premier Wen Jiabao, said lower-level officials must be held to account if they break the law. Staff of government departments and state-owned enterprises are forbidden to buy shares of mines, the regulations said. Offenders will also face punishments. The regulations clarify 15 "big, lurking dangers" at coal mines, including production exceeding a mine's

capacity or with the concentration of methane exceeding its upper-limit level. Mines should be ordered to stop production once such dangers come to light, said the regulations, which were put into effect on 3 September. (XNA, 5 Sep 05)

Regulations on the Management of Direct Sales, adopted at the State Council's 101st executive meeting on 10 August 2005. The Regulations will go into effect as of 1 December 2005. (Decree No. 443 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 23 August 2005) The regulations consist of eight chapters with 55 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 20 Sep 05)

Regulations Banning Pyramid Schemes, adopted at the State Council's 101st executive meeting on 10 August 2005. The Regulations will go into effect as of 1 November 2005. (Decree No. 444 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 23 August 2005) The regulations consist of five chapters with 30 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 20 Sep 05)

Special Provisions of the State Council on Preventing Production Safety Accidents at Coal Mines, adopted at the State Council's 104th executive meeting on 31 August 2005. The Provisions will go into effect on the day of promulgation. (Decree No. 446 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 3 September 2005) The provisions consist of 28 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 6 Sep 05)

China has issued a set of **regulations on the safety of radioactive isotope and radiation devices**, which require immediate and accurate report of any radiation-related accidents. The people who are responsible for the accidents will face administrative punishment or be brought to court, according to the regulations, which take effect on 1 December this year. According to the rules, a radiation-related accident shall be identified when a radioactive source is lost, stolen or out of control, or people sustain abnormal irradiation by accident when a radioactive isotope and radiation device goes out of control. When such an accident takes place, all the units engaged in

the production, sales and use of radioactive isotope and radiation devices shall take immediate measures according to their emergency plan and report the accident to the local environmental protection, public security and health departments without delay. These departments, upon receiving the report, shall immediately send people to the scene for on-the-spot investigations and measures to control the effect of the accident, while at the same time reporting it to the local government and their immediate higher authorities. Major accident of this kind shall be reported to the State Council within four hours, according to the regulations. Any people who are found to act slowly in making the report, hide the truth, make false report or fail to report shall also be given administrative punishment or be punished by law. (XNA, 4 Oct 05)

Hu Jintao, chairman of the Central Military Commission, signed an order the other day to promulgate the newly revised **Regulations on the Handling of Official Documents of People's Liberation Army Organs**, which is to enter into force Army-wide as from 1 January 2006. The new regulations are set to lend a positive impetus to the handling of official documents of our army organs and to the enhancement of the regularization of the organs at all levels up and down the army. The new regulations are in nine chapters, containing 48 articles. The nine chapters are: General Provisions, Types of Official Documents, Formats of Official Documents, Stylistic Guidelines, Handling of Outgoing Documents, Handling of Incoming Documents, Filing and Archiving of Official Documents, Management of Official Documents, and Supplementary Provisions. ...
