While addressing representatives from over 40 famous multinational corporations at the 19th annual conference of the International Network of Private Business Organizations held in Haikou on 2 November 2005, Hainan Province, Zhang said that China set up the National Working Group on IP Protection in August 2004, with vice-premier Wu Yi as its head, which comprised 12 government departments. Various local governments across China have also established IP protection and supervision departments to strengthen the efforts. China has launched a nationwide IP protection campaign since September 2004 to highlight rectification in the protection of trademark rights, copyrights and patents, and tightened control in the "key linkages" such as imports and exports, exhibitions, wholesale markets, printing and duplication business, according to Zhang. The campaign has made fruitful achievement, he said, adding that over 50,000 infringement cases had been handled by September 2005 with fines up to 376m RMBY (46.36m US\$). And over 50m illegal audio-visual products were seized and 19,000 illegal businesses were closed down, in addition to handling of 3,176 cases of counterfeit patents, he added. To step up legal protection of intellectual property rights, the Supreme People's Court and the Supreme People's Procuratorate jointly issued the interpretations on concrete application of laws in dealing with intellectual property infringement cases. Meanwhile, China has stepped up exchanges and cooperation with a large number of relevant international organizations and

countries in this respect, including WIPO (World Intellectual Property Organization), the European Union, the United States, Japan, the Republic of Korea, Brazil and Mexico, he said. (XNA, 2 Nov 05)

Hong Kong

Hong Kong Chief Executive Donald Tsang said on 20 October that new **Secretary for Justice Wong Yan-lung** (Huang Renlong) will be competent for his post. Tsang made the remark at a press conference that the State Council appointed Wong Yan-lung as the new Secretary for Justice with effect from 20 October. Tsang believed that Wong, with his patriotism, gentle and upright disposition as well as professional expertise and reputation, would competently fulfill the role of Secretary for Justice. The Chief Executive said, "I am very much impressed by his commitment to the rule of law, to the legal profession and to Hong Kong." "The rule of law is one of the pillars of Hong Kong's prosperity. It is imperative for us to protect this value. I look forward to working with Wong to uphold the rule of law during my term of office." Wong said that he was greatly honored to assume office as the Secretary for Justice. As head of the department, he would make every possible effort to lead his staff members to fairly and effectively implement the department's duties. He said he would strengthen contacts with the Chinese mainland departments concerned so as to better understand each other for the implementation of the principle of "One Country, Two Systems." Wong Yan-lung is 41 years old. Before his present appointment as the Secretary for Justice, he was a lawyer in private practice. He became Deputy High Court Judge of the Court of First Instance in 2003 and Chairman of the Special Committee on Legal Education of the Hong Kong Bar Association from 2003 to 2005. Hong Kong Chief Executive Donald Tsang on 20 October highly praised Elise Leung Oi-Sie for her contribution to Hong Kong while announcing an approval of her resignation as the Secretary for Justice by the central government. ... Leung has accepted the Chief Executive's invitation to stay on as a member of the Constitutional

Development Task Force in her personal capacity until Dec. 31, 2005. Tsang praised Leung's dedication to work and her intense commitment to the country, to Hong Kong and to the rule of law. ... Leung said at the press conference that the past eight years were the most precious period of her 66 years of life time. She said she appreciated Wong for his personality and aspiration, and believed that he will be competent for the post. (XNA, 20 Oct 05)

Thomas Chan Chun-yuen (Chen Zhenyuan), Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation, will become the new Permanent Secretary for Housing, Planning and Lands (Housing) on 3 January 2006. He will replace **Leung Chin-man** (Liang Zhanwen), who is going to retire on 28 November 2005. Director of Government Supplies **Stella Hung Kwok Wai-ching** (Kong Guo Huiqing) will become Director of Agriculture, Fisheries and Conservation on 3 January 2006. (RMRB, 16 Nov 05)

Director of Fire Services **Lam chun-man** (Lin Zhenmin) is retiring after more than 37 years of service and will be succeeded by Deputy Director of Fire Services **Kwok Jing-keung** (Guo Jingqiang), who takes over on 7 December. (SCMP, 4 Dec 05)

Deaths

Ba Jin, one of China's leading writers in modern China, died in Shanghai on 17 October after a six-year battle with malignant mesothelium cell tumor and other diseases. He was 101. Ba died at a local hospital after suffering six years of diseases caused by high fever rendered by a heavy influ. Ba, a native of Chengdu city, southwest China's Sichuan Province, was recognized widely as one of greatest Chinese cultural masters of modern China and an outstanding publisher and editor. Ba went to study France in 1926 and completed there his first novel "Destruction". After that, he had written numerous books, including novels, short stories, proses and essays, with a total of six million words. Ba's main works, including "Family", "Spring", "Autumn", "The Trilogy of Love", "A Dream of Sea", "Autumn in Spring", were viewed as a landmark of modern Chinese culture. Ba's true name is Li

Fugan. He chose the pen name "Ba Jin" in memory of Baranpo, one of his schoolmates in France who committed suicide because he detested the world and its ways, whereas the word "Jin" was proposed by his Russian schoolmate studying philosophy. Ba was elected a deputy to the 1st through the 5th NPC and a member of the Standing Committee of the 5th NPC and vice-chairman of the 6th through the 10th CPPCC National Committees. One of the asteroids found by Chinese scientists was named after Ba, who was also chairman of the Chinese Writers' Association. In 2003, the State Council awarded him the title of "People's Writer". State and Communist Party leaders have mourned the death of **Ding Renlin**, vice-minister of state security, who died of illness on 11 October at the age of 61. ... According to an official obituary notice, Ding joined the CCP in March 1966, and began his "revolutionary job" in September 1968. In December 1985, Ding began to serve as vice-minister of state security. He was a deputy to the 14th and 15th CCP national congresses, and a leading figure of the National Committee of the CPPCC. Ding had been faithful to the party and a masterful professional during his 37 years of work, the obituary said. (XNA, 24 Oct 05; RMRB, 6 Nov 05)

Former Chinese Vice-President **Rong Yiren** died of disease in Beijing on 26 October. He was 89. The remains of Rong Yiren was cremated at the Babaoshan Revolutionary Cemetery in Beijing on 3 November. Hu Jintao, Chinese president and general secretary of the CCP CC, bade farewell to the remains of Rong Yiren, who was also officially praised as an "outstanding representative of the national industrial and commercial circle in modern China", a "superb state leader", and a "great fighter for patriotism and communism". Rong is survived by his son, Larry Yung Chi-kin, and four daughters.

Rong Yiren (nickname "Red Capitalist"), was born to a prestigious family in the country's industrial and commercial circle in Wuxi City, Jiangsu Province, on 1 May 1916. The family moved to Shanghai dur-

ing the 1930s and became the pioneers of the country's industry and commerce, owning dozens of textile, machinery, printing and dyeing works and flour mills across the country. Rong Yiren began helping his father Rong Desheng manage flour and textile mills and banking companies in 1937. He earned a history degree from the elite, church-founded St John's University in Shanghai. He chose to stay on in China following the communist takeover in 1949, though the majority of his family members had gone overseas, and turned over his family's empire of food and textile factories to the state in 1956. Since 1950, Rong had worked on a series of important positions including Shanghai's vice-mayor and vice-minister of textile industry, until the catastrophic Cultural Revolution (1966-76), during which he suffered a lot. He was later rehabilitated when Deng Xiaoping invited him to help launch economic reforms. He founded the China International Trust and Investment Company (CITIC) under Deng's instructions and became president and general manager of this business flag-carrier of the country. Among the prestigious positions Rong held since 1979 were chairman of the All-China Federation of Industry and Commerce (a non-communist organisation representing entrepreneurs), honorary chairman of the Association of the Relations across the Taiwan Strait, and chairman of the China Association for Peaceful Promotion of the Reunification. He was vice-chairman of the Standing Committee of the 6th and 7th NPCs, and vice-chairman of the 5th CPPCC National Committee. On 1 July 1985, Rong was admitted into the CCP. Rong Yiren was appointed as vice-president of the PRC in 1993. He retired in 1998. During the 1989 pro-democracy demonstrations, Rong expressed guarded support for the liberal wing of the party led by ousted party chief Zhao Ziyang. In 2000, the US business magazine *Forbes* ranked him as China's richest businessman, with a fortune estimated at 1,9b US\$ in CITIC shares. Today CITIC controls an empire ranging from telecommunications to infrastructure, banking and real estate. State-owned CITIC, directly controlled by the State Council, has been chaired by Wang Jun, son of late vice-president Wang Zhen,

since Rong Yiren stepped down in 1993. There have been persistent rumors that one of former president and party chief Jiang Zemin's sons could take over CITIC from Wang Jun. Last summer, a retrospective exhibition was held in Shanghai to commemorate the 130th birthday of Rong Yiren's father, Rong Desheng, one of the pioneers in China's national capitalism and one of the first entrepreneurs in modern Chinese history. Rong's son, Larry Yung, also known as Rong Zhijian, is chairman of CITIC's Hong Kong arm, Citic Pacific (he is owner of an 18 per cent stake). Citic Pacific is overseeing key investments in Cathay Pacific Airways and Hong Kong Telecom. It took over trading house DCH. According to *Forbes* magazine's annual ranking of China's wealthiest people, Rong Zhijian, 63, maintained his perch atop the magazine's list of the country's richest. The 2005 list, released Nov 3, shows Rong and his family with assets of 1,64b US\$, 150m US\$ more than last year. Botswana (Nov 20)

... The meeting between Botswana's President Festus Mogae and Chinese Vice-Premier Huang Ju in Gaborone was followed by the signing ceremony for three agreements of economic and technological cooperation. (XNA, 20 Nov 05)

Canada (Oct 12)

Canada and China signed an agreement to promote cooperation and exchanges in the agricultural sector between the two countries. Dr Yvon Martel, acting assistant deputy minister of research at Agriculture and Agri-Food Canada (AAFC) and Dr Li Bing, assistant director-general the State Administration for Foreign Expert Affairs of China, signed the Memorandum of Understanding on Personnel Exchanges during the 2005 Canada-China Science Management Forum in Ottawa. The agreement establishes a mechanism for enhancing cooperation and exchanges involving research scientists and graduate students working in areas of agricultural research that are priorities for both countries. ... Chile (Nov 18)

Chinese President Hu Jintao met with his Chilean counterpart, Ricardo Lagos, in Pusan, South Korea, and both attended the signing ceremony of a free trade agreement between their two countries. The meeting took place on the sidelines of the APEC Economic Leaders' Meeting ... Both China and Chile are members of the APEC forum. Hu said the establishment of a free trade zone between China and Chile, the first between China and a Latin American country, will not only help deepen bilateral political, economic and trade ties, but also set a good example for South-South cooperation. ... The free trade agreement was signed by Chinese Commerce Minister Bo Xilai and Chilean Foreign Minister Ignacio Walker. Under the agreement, the two countries will fully launch on 1 July 2006, the tariff reduction process of cargo goods trade. The free trade negotiations were launched by the Chinese and Chilean presidents on 18 November 2004, when Hu paid a state

visit to the Latin American country. It is the second free trade agreement that China has signed. The last one was with the ASEAN. ... (XNA, 18 Nov 05)

Cuba (Nov 11)

Cuba and China signed a memorandum of understanding in Havana to enhance their exchanges and cooperation in environmental protection. Xie Zhenhua, director of the State Environmental Protection Administration of China, and Fernando Gonzalez Bermudez, head of Cuba's Ministry of Science, Technology and Environment (CITMA) signed the document at CITMA's office. The document, which focuses on the marine ecosystem and the conservation of biodiversity, includes plans to improve environmental protection standards and promote environmental education. China and Cuba will also expand their cooperation in environmental information, ecosystem protection, personnel training, pollution control and exchanges of scientific experts, according to the document. ... Equatorial Guinea (Oct 21?)

... According to the communique, the two countries signed four cooperative documents during President Teodoro Obiang Nguema Mbasogo's visit to China covering the fields of investment, economic and technological cooperation, finance and diplomacy. ... (XNA, 21 Oct 05)

France (Dec 05)

China and France signed in Paris 16 cooperation agreements concerning various sectors on the sidelines of Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao's ongoing visit to France. Both Wen and his French counterpart Dominique de Villepin were present at the signing ceremony. The biggest deal was a framework agreement on the Chinese purchase of 150 aircraft from Airbus's A320 family of single-aisle planes, signed by the European aircraft maker Airbus' chief executive Gustav Humbert and the president of the China Aviation Supplies Import and Export Group, Li Hai. A financial protocol was signed by Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and French Finance Minister Thierry Breton on the funding of SHITAI railway linking Shijiazhuang and Taiyuan

Belarus (Dec 05)

China and Belarus signed a memorandum of understanding in Beijing, recognizing each other as a country with full market economy. Chinese President Hu Jintao and Belarusian President Alexander Grigorievich Lukashenko, who is on a three-day state visit to China, witnessed the signing ceremony after nearly one hour of talks in the Great Hall of the People. As part of a total of 12 documents signed here, the two countries also signed a protocol on Belarus' accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO). China and Belarus forged diplomatic ties in 1992. ... (XNA, 5 Dec 05)

China and Belarus signed an agreement on journalism and publication cooperation in Beijing. Cai Wu, head of China's State Council Information Office (SCIO), and Vladimir Rusakevich, information minister of Belarus, signed the agreement. According to the agreement, the two departments will exchange news on the two countries' politics, economy and culture through news agencies, publications, broadcasts and other mass media. The two departments will promote the cooperation of journalistic departments, news websites and news

in central China. An administrative agreement of bilateral cooperation was signed by French Labour Minister Jean-Louis Borloo and Chinese Labour Minister Tian Chengping. Another administrative agreement was signed by Vice-Chairman of the National Development and Reform Commission of China Zhang Xiaoli and French Minister for Small and Medium-Sized Enterprises, Trade, Small-Scale Industry, the Professions Renaud Dutreil. Chinese Transport Minister Zhang Chunxian and French Minister Delegate for Tourism Leon Bertrand signed a cooperation agreement in the fields of sea protection and maritime assistance and another cooperation agreement on highway. Chinese Vice Minister of Commerce Yu Guangzhou and French junior Minister for Foreign Trade Christine Lagarde signed an administrative agreement on access of French small and medium-sized enterprises to Chinese market. Chinese Ambassador to France Zhao Jinjun signed a cooperation agreement with Francois Guinot, president of the National Academy of Technologies of France. An agreement of strategic partnership was signed between France Telecom mobile phone operator and Chinese telecommunications equipment provider ZTE Corporation, which also signed an entry agreement with the general council of the French province of Vienne. Chinese Agriculture University and French Academy of Agriculture signed an agreement on establishment of a Sino-French R and D centre. Other documents are: contract on 6-7 ton helicopter between China Aviation Industry Corporation (AVIC II), Harbin Aviation and Eurocopter; contract for the supply of a telecommunication satellite Chinasat 6B signed between a Chinasat company and French group Alcatel; agreement between Sinochem, one of the four Chinese national oil companies, and French oil giant Total on the establishment of a service station network in the region of Shanghai; framework document signed by AVIC II and French international high-technology Group SAFRAN concerning helicopter motors and framework cooperation agreement between China National Aviation Holding Company and SAFRAN regarding aircraft motor maintenance. (XNA, 5 Dec 05)

China and Airbus signed a memorandum of understanding in Toulouse on 4 December on further boosting cooperation between the Chinese civil aviation industry and the European manufacturer. Visiting Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao was present at the signing ceremony at the headquarters of Airbus, the world's largest commercial aircraft maker. Zhang Xiaoli, vice-chairman of China's National Development and Reform Commission, and Airbus President and CEO Gustav Humbert signed the document, which sets the framework for a further upgrade of the cooperation between the two sides. ... Airbus' industrial cooperation with China dates back to 1985 when it signed the first agreement with Xi'an Aircraft Company to produce and assemble access doors for Airbus A300/A310 wide-body aircraft in China. Now, five Chinese companies are involved in producing parts for Airbus aircraft. Airbus inaugurated the Airbus (Beijing) Engineering Centre last July and has so far recruited 54 Chinese engineers. Airbus has also offered the Chinese aviation industry participation in the A350 programme of up to 5 per cent of the airframe. Such participation will include both design and manufacturing. (XNA, 4 Dec 05)

Germany (Nov 10)

... At the beginning of the state visit by Chinese President Hu Jintao in Berlin, several economic agreements in the value of over 1bn euros were signed. In addition to the delivery of 60 high-speed trains by Siemens, the agreements also include a telephone accord with Arcor as well as a framework agreement on solar modules. The FDP [Free Democratic Party] and human rights groups demanded that, notwithstanding German economic interests, observance of human rights in China must also be demanded. President Horst Koehler, who greeted his Chinese guest at Charlottenburg Palace with military honours, called for stronger democratization in China. Although every country must find its "own way", human rights are universally valid. At the same time, Koehler expressed himself satisfied with bilateral relations. Meanwhile, Economics Minister Wolfgang Clement (SPD) [Social Democratic Party of Germany] advocated even closer rela-

tions with China. In view of trade dynamics, there is the justified hope of reaching the goal of a goods exchange in the amount of 100bn euros by 2010, he said, regarding the volume of 53.2bn euros already achieved. However, the minister deplored an imbalance in trade, since German imports of Chinese goods continue to grow strongly, while exports of German goods had dropped by 4.7 per cent in the first eight months [of 2005]. Clement solicited more Chinese direct investment in Germany and simultaneously warned of widespread product piracy by Chinese firms. According to estimates, the share of fake products is 5 to 9 per cent, which corresponds to an approximate trade volume of 250bn euros. The largest part allegedly comes from China. The Federation of German Industry and Chambers of Commerce [DIHK] pointed out that the piracy of products and trademarks, such as medicines or safety-relevant spare parts, endanger health and lives and, not least of all, undermine the reputation of the patent holders. Described as "not acceptable" were the procedures of state authorities in China who, as a precondition for granting permits and placing public orders, demand the gratis transfer of technology and know-how. Clement also fears an outflow of know-how to China. ... (ddp news agency, Berlin, 10 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 12 Nov 05) Following the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and German President Horst Koehler, the two heads of state attended the signing ceremony for an agreement on cultural cooperation between the two governments and for documents on Sino-German cooperation in the fields of transportation, healthcare, and telecommunications. ... (Xinhua, 10 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 12 Nov 05)

Guinea (Nov 18)

Visiting Chinese Vice-Premier Huang Ju said in Conakry that China is ready to expand cooperation and exchanges with Guinea, its long-time friend in West Africa with 46 years of diplomatic ties, in both political and economic fields. "As developing countries, China and Guinea have solid political foundations to improve bilateral relations and great potentials to expand economic cooperation," Huang said in a meeting with Guinean Prime

Minister Cellou Dalein Diallo. The meeting was followed by the inking of six bilateral agreements on economic and technical cooperation, mutual promotion and protection of investments by the governments of both countries. Guinea is the first sub-Saharan African country that forged diplomatic relations with China, and it became one of the first destinations of Chinese top leader's maiden tour to Africa 41 years ago by Premier Zhou Enlai. ... (XNA, 18 Nov 05)

South Korea (Nov 15)

South Korea signed an agreement in Seoul with China to exchange information on money laundering in a bid to stem the rising tide of incidents, the South Korean Finance Ministry said. Ryu Jae-han, chief of the Korea Financial Intelligence Unit (FIU) under the ministry, signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with his counterpart at the China Anti-Money Laundering Monitoring and Analysis Centre (CAMLMAC) in Beijing. The MOU with China is the 29th of its kind for South Korea. (Yonhap news agency, Seoul, 15 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 16 Nov 05)

Mongolia (Nov 28)

... After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Mongolian President Nambaryn Enkhbayar, the two heads of state jointly attended the ceremony for signing ten cooperative documents that included the Protocol on the Second Joint Inspection of the China-Mongolia Boundary and an agreement on economic and technological cooperation between the two governments. ... (Xinhua, 28 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 30 Nov 05; XNA, 28 Nov 05)

Namibia (Nov 17)

Namibia and the People's Republic of China signed Agreements on Reciprocal Promotion and Protection of Investments; a Government Concessional Loan for Railway Equipment Purchases; as well as a Joint Economic and Trade Commission in Windhoek. Finance Minister Saara Kuugongelwa-Amadhila, Trade and Industry Minister Immanuel Ngatjizeko and Minister of Youth, National Service, Sport and Culture John Mutorwa signed the agreements. At the same event, the Chinese donated 250m yuan (about 187.5m Namibian dollars) as well as

equipment amongst others a television, laptops and printers to the Youth Ministry. A high level delegation headed by Li Changchun is visiting the country to foster ties between the government and the SWAPO party. ... (Nampa news agency website, Windhoek, 17 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 19 Nov 05)

Namibia (Nov 18)

Namibia and China signed yet another cooperation agreement on economy and trade, mainly focusing on the vocational training of young Namibians in their areas of technology. The agreement also focuses on strengthening cooperation in the areas of mining exploration, agriculture, especially irrigation, and the processing of agricultural products such as grapes, and human resource training. It was concluded at the National Planning Commission. ... On 17 November, China signed an agreement to provide a 206m Namibian dollar concessional loan for the rehabilitation of railway lines across the country. (Namibian Broadcasting Corporation TV, Windhoek, 18 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 21 Nov 05)

Nigeria (Oct 14)

The Chinese government has signed an agreement with Nigeria for the (?funding) of 598 water projects valued at about 700m naira [approximately 5,430,566 US\$] in 15 states of the federation, including the Federal Capital Territory. The agreement was sealed by the Chinese ambassador to Nigeria, Mr Wang Yongqiu, and the minister of water resources, Alhaji Muktar Shehu Shagari. Alhaji Shagari thanked the Chinese government for its support and said the federal government was on course in its project for providing water for the people as a way of reducing poverty. (Radio Nigeria-Abuja, 14 Oct 05, in BBC PF, 15 Oct 05; XNA, 14 Oct 05)

Peru (Nov 29)

The Peruvian government signed several deals with China and Japan on cooperation in the fields of mining, geology and energy ... Peru's official Institute of Geology, Mining and Metallurgy (IGMMP) signed a memorandum of understanding on exchanging scientists and cooperating with China's geological service in the fields

of mining and geology. (XNA, 30 Nov 05)

Philippines (Nov 14)

The Chinese capital city of Beijing and the Philippine capital city of Manila signed an agreement to establish friendly relations between the two cities. Visiting Beijing Mayor Wang Qishan and Manila Mayor Lito Atienza signed the agreement which calls for more exchanges and cooperation between the two cities in the fields of economy, culture, education, city construction, sports and health and sanitation. ... The two mayors also congratulated the opening of Beijing-Manila direct flights by the Philippine Airlines. (XNA, 14 Nov 05)

Romania (Nov 14)

... After their one-hour talks, Chinese State Councillor Zhou Yongkang, also minister of public security, and Vasile Blaga, Romanian minister of internal affairs, signed an agreement on preventing drug production and abuse. (XNA, 14 Nov 05)

Russia (Nov 03)

Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Fradkov and PRC Premier Wen Jiabao signed a joint communique after the 10th regular meeting of the heads of government of the two countries. According to a RIA-Novosti correspondent, Russian Deputy Minister of Education and Science Andrey Svinnarenko and Chinese Education Minister Zhou Ji signed an intergovernmental agreement on studying the Russian language in the PRC and the Chinese language in Russia. The Federal Agency for Health and Social Development and the PRC Ministry of Health signed a memorandum on mutual understanding on the rehabilitation treatment of Russian children affected by the Beslan terrorist act. The document was signed by the leader of the Federal Agency For Health and Social Development Vyacheslav Prokhorov, and Deputy Health Minister of China Jiang Zujun. The Federal Antimonopoly Service of Russia and the PRC state administrative department for trade and industry [State General Administration of Industry and Commerce] signed a memorandum on mutual understanding on implementing the intergovernmental agreement on cooperation in preventing unfair competition

and implementing the antimonopoly policy for 2006 and 2007. The Central Bank of Russia and the commission supervising the banking activities in China [China Banking Regulatory and Management Commission] also signed a memorandum on cooperation in the sphere of regulating banking activities. A credit agreement between Vneshekonombank [Foreign Economic Bank of Russia] and the State Development Bank of China, and an agreement between Vneshtorgbank [Foreign Trade Bank of Russia] and the Bank of China on opening a credit line of 200m dollars for Vneshtorgbank were also signed, as well as an agreement on cooperation between Vneshtorgbank and the Chinese processing company of banks that issue China Union Pay plastic cards. (RIA news agency, Moscow, 3 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 4 Nov 05)

... After the meeting, Wen Jiabao and Fradkov signed the "Joint Communiqué on the 12th Regular Meeting of the Chinese and Russian Premiers" and also attended the signing ceremony for eight documents on cooperation in the areas of economy and trade, education, health, banking, and others. ... (ZXS, 3 Nov 05)

Senegal (Oct 25)

China and Senegal resumed diplomatic ties at the ambassadorial level as of 25 October 2005, the Chinese Foreign Ministry announced in Beijing. Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and Senegalese State Minister of Foreign Affairs Cheikh Tidiane Gadio signed a joint communiqué on the resumption of diplomatic relations between the People's Republic of China and the Republic of Senegal on behalf of their respective governments. According to the joint communiqué, the resumption of diplomatic ties between the two countries is in accordance with the "interests and aspiration of the two peoples". The two countries have agreed to resend ambassadors to each other's countries and provide convenience for the work of each other's embassies on an equal footing, the communiqué says. The Chinese government supports the efforts made by the Senegalese government to safeguard state sovereignty and develop economy, the communiqué says. The Senegalese government recognizes

that there is only one China in the world and the government of the People's Republic of China is the sole legitimate government representing the whole China. Taiwan is an inseparable part of the Chinese territory, the communiqué says. The Chinese government expresses appreciation of the above stance adopted by the Senegalese government, it says. After the signing ceremony, Li and Gadio held official talks, during which they had an in-depth exchange of views on bilateral ties and issues of common interest and reached broad consensus. Sources with the Chinese Foreign Ministry said that Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and State Councillor Tang Jiaxuan also met with Gadio, respectively. (XNA, 25 Oct 05)

Singapore (Nov 30)

Singapore's airlines can look forward to an unlimited number of flights to all Chinese cities under a pact signed by the two countries, the Republic's Transport Minister Yeo Cheow Tong said in Beijing. Mr Yeo and China's Civil Aviation Minister Yang Yuanyuan inked the landmark agreement lifting restrictions on direct air services between China and Singapore. Airlines on both sides currently operate more than 170 weekly passenger and all-cargo services between Singapore and 18 Chinese cities -more than twice the number five years ago. The new pact fully opens up the fast-growing China aviation market to Singapore Airlines, although spokesman Stephen Forshaw said the carrier had no plans yet to increase its number of flights to China. The national carrier and its sister airline, SilkAir, currently operate 81 weekly passenger flights to nine cities in China, while its subsidiary SIA Cargo flies to five Chinese cities. The agreement also allows low-cost carriers Tiger Airways and the merged entity of Valuair and Jetstar Asia to fly to Guangzhou and other cities in China. A Transport Ministry spokesman told *The Straits Times* that Beijing and Shanghai would remain closed to the two budget airlines, but that the agreement opens up the other lucrative route of Guangzhou to them. The expanded air services pact is a rare one and comes amid increasing high-level contacts between the two countries. ... Air passenger traffic in China is likely to grow 7.3

per cent annually until 2023, faster than the global average of 5.2 per cent in the same period, according to a June estimate by Boeing, the world's second-largest commercial aircraft maker. The fact that businessmen can travel more easily between the two countries could boost trade and investments for both economies, Mr Yeo told *The Straits Times*. 'Increased cargo flights means it will be easier for manufacturers in Singapore to supply their components and products to China,' he added. With Chinese tourist arrivals to the republic hitting double-digit growth in recent years, 'there is a clear demand for flights to Singapore and tourism exchange can only be enhanced', said Singapore Tourism Board's regional director for greater China, Mr Edmund Chua. A Jetstar official said it was keen to explore the opportunities, while Tiger Airways said it had received the go-ahead from Singapore authorities to fly to three mainland cities. Tiger, which currently does not operate flights to China, is waiting for approval from the Chinese authorities. (ST, 2 Dec 05)

Spain (Nov 14)

Chinese President Hu Jintao and Spanish Prime Minister Jose Luis Rodriguez Zapatero announced the establishment of a comprehensive strategic partnership between the two countries during their talks in Madrid. ... After their talks, Hu and Zapatero attended the signing ceremony of 16 bilateral agreements on such areas as extradition, cooperation in peaceful use of nuclear energy, the opening of cultural centres, tourism, wind power, telecommunication and civil aviation. (XNA, 14, 15 Nov 05)

United States (Oct 19)

China and the United States signed an agreement in Washington with an aim to help improve China's air training and safety. The agreement was signed by the General Administration of Civil Aviation of China (CAAC) and the US Trade and Development Agency (USTDA). Under it, the US government will provide a grant of 1.26m US\$ to China to help it improve its air training and safety. The agreement between the USTDA and CAAC will promote trade relations between the two countries and strengthen cooperation on aviation standards and

safety. Under the agreement, officials from the US-China Aviation Cooperation Programme, which was set up last year, and the US Federal Aviation Administration will help China establish new aircraft certification procedures. Cooperation also includes technical and managerial training for Chinese air traffic workers and other aviation officials. The signing ceremony was attended by Chinese ambassador to the United States Zhou Wenzhong and US lawmakers as well as government officials. (XNA, 19 Oct 05; RMRB, 21 Oct 05)

United States (Nov 08)

China and the United States signed a memorandum on trade in textile and apparel in London. The memorandum, signed by China's Minister of Commerce Bo Xilai and US trade representative Rob Portman, covers 21 of China's textile products exported to the United States. The memorandum will be effective from 1 January 2006 to the end of 2008. (XNA, 8 Nov 05)

A press spokesman for the Ministry of Commerce said on 8 November that the settlement of the Sino-US textile issue conforms to the common interests of enterprises of the two countries and is conducive to promoting stable development of bilateral economic and trade relations. On 8 November, China and the United States reached an agreement on the textile issue. On this, the spokesman of the Chinese Ministry of Commerce fielded questions from reporters. The spokesman said: The China-US textile agreement will become effective on 1 January 2006 and end on 31 December 2008. China and the United States have agreed that during the period of agreement, quotas will be imposed on cotton trousers and 20 other types of Chinese textile products imported to the United States, including 11 types of apparel products and 10 types of textile products. Of the 21 types, 16 belong to the integrated products of 2005; and five, to the integrated products before 2002. The base figure of negotiated products for 2006 is basically the actual number of relevant products imported from China to the United States in 2005; and the base figures for 2007 and 2008 are the same as the negotiated numbers of the preceding year. The number of products negotiated will increase annually by

10 to 15 per cent in 2006; by 12.5 to 16 per cent in 2007; and by 15 to 17 per cent in 2008. According to the agreement, the US side will refrain from applying Section 242 to Chinese textile products not covered by the agreement. The United States will immediately grant customs clearance to all Chinese textile products currently blocked at the US due to the obstacle set up by Section 242. These cargoes will be excluded from calculating the number for negotiations. The spokesman said: Since the integration, the US side had frequently imposed restrictions on Chinese textile products under Section 242 of the "Report of the Working Group on China's Accession to the WTO", thereby destabilizing the textile trade between the two countries to the maximum and adversely affecting the normal, orderly development of bilateral trade. The Chinese and US industrial circles strongly demanded that the governments of the two countries reach an agreement through negotiations to create a stable and predictable trade environment for the textile industry of both countries and to safeguard bilateral economic and trade relations and the overall situation of development. In view of the common concerns of the two sides, the Chinese and US governments, after seven rounds of negotiations, finally reached an agreement based on equality and mutual benefit. The settlement of the textile issue is in line with the common interests of Chinese and US enterprises. (Xinhua, 8 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 9 Nov 05)

United States (Nov 19)

China and the United States signed in Beijing a MOU [memorandum of understanding] on preventing illegal trafficking of nuclear and other radioactive materials, according to sources with China's Foreign Ministry. Representatives from China's General Administration of Customs and General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine and the US Department of Energy signed the MOU, aiming at further promoting the cooperation in the fields of anti-terrorism and nonproliferation between the two nations. (XNA, 19 Nov 05; RMRB, 21 Nov 05)

Vietnam (Oct 31)

... After the talks between Hu Jintao, general secretary of the CCP CC

and president of China, and Nor Duc Manh, general secretary of the CPV CC, and President of Vietnam Tran Duc Luong, the leaders of the two countries attended a signing ceremony for bilateral cooperation documents, including a bilateral economic and technical cooperation agreement. (XNA, 31 Oct 05)

International Agreements

Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao left Moscow for home after attending the fourth heads of government meeting of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO). At the meeting on 2 October ..., the leaders signed agreements on mutual aid in disaster relief and banking cooperation among member states. The SCO groups China, Russia and four Central Asian states: Kazakhstan, Uzbekistan, Kyrgyzstan and Tajikistan. Mongolia joined as an observer in 2004. Iran, Pakistan and India were granted observer status in July. During his two-day stay in the Russian capital, Wen met with Russian President Vladimir Putin to discuss bilateral relations and major international issues on the sidelines of the SCO meeting. He also met government leaders of some SCO member states and observer states on bilateral cooperation. (XNA, 27 Oct 05)

Representatives from eight Asia-Pacific nations signed a convention on space organization cooperation in Beijing on 28 October, marking a milestone for the final establishment of the organization. The Asia-Pacific Space Cooperation Organization (APSCO), an international governmental organization with its headquarters in Beijing, aims to promote multilateral cooperation in space technology and its application in the region. The eight states are Bangladesh, China, Indonesia, Iran, Mongolia, Pakistan, Peru and Thailand. Representatives from Argentina, Malaysia, the Philippines, Russia, Ukraine also attended the signing ceremony of the APSCO Convention. The APSCO will be officially set up in Beijing after China receives final approval from at least five participating countries. While meeting with the representatives, Chinese Vice-Premier Huang Ju said China will work closely with

related countries to contribute to the peaceful use of outer space. China has always regarded space development as an important part of national strategy. Earlier this month China successfully launched the Shenzhou-5 spacecraft, which marked major progress in China's space exploration, said Huang. China attaches great importance to carrying out extensive and close multilateral cooperation in the Asia-Pacific region, and has done a lot to promote the establishment of the APSCO, said Huang. Huang said the formation of the APSCO will be beneficial to further exchanges and cooperation in space technology and its application and promoting economic and social development, and common prosperity in the region. Huang welcomed more Asia-Pacific nations to join the organization, but hinted that other countries beyond the region could also participate in activities organized by the APSCO. Huang hoped the countries could take the APSCO as a platform to carry out space cooperation to make people benefit from space technology and its application. China, Thailand and Pakistan proposed to set up the APSCO in 1992. (XNA, 28 Oct 05)

Chinese and European Union officials signed an agreement on cooperation in government procurement in Beijing on 2 November, under which the two sides will establish a regular dialogue on government procurement. Under the agreement, Chinese finance officials and their European counterparts will meet once every year for a dialogue on matters concerning government procurement, including legislation, implementation of government procurement rules, practice and cooperation between governments and private businesses. The agreement was signed by Zhang Hongli, assistant minister of finance of China, and Alexander Schaub, director-general of the European Internal Market and Services of the European Commission. Zhang Hongli said government procurement was introduced only late last century and China can learn quite a lot from Europe on ways to regulate and promote government procurement. In a statement, the Chinese Ministry of Finance described the agreement as the first concrete measure taken by the two sides follow-

ing the first finance dialogue between China and European Union held last February in Brussels. The second Sino-EU Finance Dialogue is scheduled to be held next March in Beijing. (XNA, 2 Nov 05)

China and the European Union (EU) signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) in Brussels on 11 November to set up a consultation and cooperation mechanism on product safety. Both sides have agreed to exchange information and establish a series of joint initiatives to help safeguard consumers' health and safety. "The MOU is a voluntary agreement between legislators on food and non-food product safety, which aims to promote common interests and enhance the safety of products traded between the regions," said a press release of the European Commission. The agreement will also help in reaching solutions to any trade problems and in forging a common view on safety standards, it added. China is the EU's second largest trading partner, accounting for 8.8 per cent of the EU's total trade in 2004. Food products and consumer goods such as electrical appliances, toys, household items and clothing, make up a large proportion of the EU's imports from China. In the area of non-food consumer goods, the agreement focuses on developing and improving communication channels between the EU and China authorities in order to raise the overall level of product safety. In 2004, the EU imported over 2b euros (about 2.4b US\$) worth of Chinese agricultural goods and food, while exporting over 1b euros (about 1.2b US\$) worth of such products to China. (XNA, 11 Nov 05)

The Chinese government and the European Space Agency signed cooperation agreement in Beijing on 18 November on space cooperation for peaceful purposes. Chinese State Councillor Chen Zhili met Jean-Jacques Dordain, director-general of the European Space Agency (ESA), and attended the signing ceremony. Chen said space cooperation between China and the ESA is of great significance, and the two sides have carried out quite a number of cooperation programmes for peaceful purposes. "The signing of the Cooperation Agreement between the Government of the Peo-

ple's Republic of China and the European Space Agency Concerning Space Cooperation for Peaceful Purposes would raise the bilateral space cooperation to a new level," Chen noted. For 30 years, the ESA has worked for promoting space cooperation for peaceful purposes between European countries. The agreement would provide effective cooperation mechanism for China and the ESA to expand space cooperation, sources with the China National Space Administration said. (XNA, 18 Nov 05)

Beijing Olympic organizers and the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) signed a memorandum of understanding in Beijing on 18 November to promote environmental protection in staging the 2008 Beijing Olympics. Under the agreement, the UNEP will provide the Beijing Organizing Committee for the 2008 Olympics (BOCOG) with data and technical resources on environmental issues. Klaus Toepfer, executive director of the UNEP, said that the memorandum of understanding is aimed at helping Beijing with its proposals in areas ranging from air, water and noise pollution up to transport, landscaping and the disposal of solid wastes. "Big sports events always run the risk of burdens on the environment," said Toepfer at the signing ceremony. "Let's all join hands and work for a safe and wonderful environment," he added. Green Olympics, High-tech Olympics and People's Olympics are the three concepts that Beijing uses to promote the 2008 Games. In line with the Green Olympics concept, the Chinese capital has been making great efforts to improve its environment. The UNEP started cooperating with the International Olympic Committee a decade ago to make the Olympic Games more environmentally friendly. (XNA, 18 Nov 05)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Mainland (Oct 18)

The Chinese mainland and the HK-SAR signed the legal text of the third phase of the Mainland & Hong Kong Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement, known as CEPA III. Under the new arrangement, the mainland has agreed to give all products of Hong Kong origin tariff-free

status from 1 January, 2006, upon applications by local manufacturers and upon the CEPA rules of origin being agreed and met. Also, there are 23 liberalization measures spreading across 10 areas under CEPA III, namely legal, accounting, audiovisual, construction, distribution, banking, securities, tourism, transport and individually owned stores. Textiles and clothing products under Hong Kong's Outward Processing Arrangement have already been exempted from the mainland's regime of export duty. Financial Secretary of the HKSAR government Henry Tang and Vice-Minister of Commerce Liao Xiaoqi signed the legal text after the High Level Meeting of the Joint Steering Committee under CEPA. Tang said the move will offer new business opportunities in the mainland for Hong Kong and enhance its attractiveness to overseas investors. It will also help sustain Hong Kong's broad-based economic recovery and spawn new jobs. According to Tang, 29,000 new jobs have been created since implementation of CEPA I. Tang said the scheme is an open and developing platform, and he is anticipating its continued development. Liao said mainland authorities attach great importance to Hong Kong's economic development, adding all measures which can help the special administrative region maintain its prosperity and stability will be carefully considered. (XNA, 18 Oct 05)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Mainland (Nov 09)

The Ministry of Culture and Hong Kong Home Affairs Bureau signed the Chinese Mainland/Hong Kong Closer Cultural Partnership Arrangement (CCPA) agreement in Hong Kong. Ding Wei, assistant to the minister of culture, and Patrick Ho, secretary for home affairs of the HKSAR, signed the agreement. Under the agreement, the two sides will encourage cultural organizations under the Ministry of Culture and Home Affairs Bureau, non-governmental organizations and individuals to enhance the cultural exchanges and cooperation on the basis of "One Country, Two Systems," in efforts for pushing ahead with the promotion and development of the Chinese culture. ... (XNA, 9 Nov 05; RMRB, 10 Nov 05)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Brazil (Oct 20)

The HKSAR government signed an agreement with the Brazilian government on abolition of visa requirements. Director of Immigration, Lai Tung-kwok, on behalf of the HKSAR government, signed the agreement with Manoel Gomes Pereira, head of Department of Brazilian Overseas Communities, Ministry of External Relations of Brazil in Brasilia. "The agreement provides visa-free access to HKSAR passport holders visiting Brazil for a stay of up to 90 days, and Brazilian nationals will enjoy 90 days' visa-free access to Hong Kong," a spokesman for the Hong Kong Immigration Department said. The agreement will enter into force after completion of the internal procedures required. ... The availability of visa-free access to Brazil has brought the total number of countries/territories granting visa-free access to HKSAR passport holders to 135. (XNA, 20 Oct 05)

Macau SAR Agreement with Switzerland (Oct 28)

Macau SAR and Switzerland signed an agreement in Macau to grant each other visa-free access for a stay not exceeding 90 days. A press release issued by Macao's Information Bureau said the arrangement will be effective from 1 December 2005. There are currently 68 countries and territories granting the visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to the holders of MSAR travel documents, said the release. (XNA, 28 Oct 05)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Company Law of the People's Republic of China, revised at the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October. This law will come into force on 1 January 2006. (Presidential Decree No. 42, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 October 2005) (Full text: RMRB, 2 Nov 05) This law consists of 13 chapters with 219 articles.

Company Law of the PRC was adopted at the 5th meeting of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December 1993, amended according to the decision of the 13th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 25 December 1999, amended a second time according to the decision of the 11th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August 2004, and revised at the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October 2005.

Securities Law of the People's Republic of China, revised at the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October. This law will come into force on 1 January 2006. (Presidential Decree No. 43, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 October 2005) (Full text: RMRB, 5 Nov 05) This law consists of 12 chapters with 240 articles.

Securities Law of the PRC was adopted at the 6th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 29 December 1998, amended according to the decision of the 11th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 28 August 2004, and revised according to the decision of the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October 2005.

The Decision on Amending the "Personal Income Tax of the People's Republic of China", was

adopted at the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October, and will come into force on 1 January 2006. (Presidential Decree No. 44, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 October 2005) (Full text: RMRB, 28 Oct 05) It consists of 15 articles.

Personal Income Tax of the PRC was adopted at the 3rd session of the 5th NPC on 10 October 1980, revised according to the decision of the 4th meeting of the 8th NPC Standing Committee on 31 October 1993, revised a second time according to the decision of the 11th meeting of the 9th NPC Standing Committee on 30 August 1999, and revised a third time according to the decision of the 18th meeting of the 10th NPC Standing Committee on 27 October 2005.

Regulations on the control of precursor chemicals, adopted at the 102nd executive meeting of the State Council on 17 August. These regulations will come into force on 1 November 2005. (Decree No. 445 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 26 August 2005) The Regulations consist of eight chapters with 45 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 3 Oct 05)

Enforcement Regulations on the Law of the People's Republic of China Governing the Inspection of Imports and Exports, adopted at the 101st executive meeting of the State Council on 10 August. These regulations will come into force on 1 December 2005. (Decree No. 447 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 31 August 2005) The Regulations consist of six chapters with 63 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 4 Oct 05)

Safety and Protection Regulations for Radioisotopic and Radiological Installations, adopted at the 104th executive meeting of the State Council on 31 August. These regulations will come into force on 1 December 2005. (Decree No. 449 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 14 September 2005) The Regulations consist of seven chapters with 69 articles. (Full text: RMRB, 24 Oct 05)

Contingency Regulations for Major Animal Epidemics, adopted at

the 113th executive meeting of the State Council on 16 November 2005. The Regulations will go into effect on the day of promulgation. (Decree No. 450 of the PRC State Council, signed by Wen Jiabao, Premier of the State Council, on 18 November 2005) (Full text and translation: RMRB, 21 Nov 05; Xinhua, 20 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 22 Nov 05)

Provincial governments should report major animal epidemic cases to the State Council, China's highest governing body, within four hours after they learned them, according to a new State Council regulation. The regulation, which was released on 20 November, also requires county or city governments to report such cases to provincial authorities within a matter of just two hours. It was issued when China reported an increasing number of avian flu outbreaks; on 20 November, the Ministry of Agriculture confirmed another two outbreaks of the deadly H5N1 subtype avian flu cases in north China's Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region and central Hubei Province. The regulation is aimed at "controlling and stamping out major animal epidemic cases as soon as possible, ensuring the safety of breeding industry, protecting people's health and lives and safeguarding the normal social order." The animal epidemic includes avian flu and other animal diseases with a high incidence or fatality, it noted. The regulation said that local government officials who neglect the performance of their duties will be removed from their official posts and even be prosecuted. Those who take the chance to embezzle emergency funds or drive up goods prices and cheat consumers will also be penalized. It lists detailed preparations and emergency measures to cope with animal epidemic cases. Armymen and police across China should support the efforts made by local governments to control animal epidemic, the State Council regulation said. (XNA, 20 Nov 05)

A few days ago, the State Council and the Central Military Commission promulgated and implemented **Regulations on Military Industry Product Design Work**. This is an important measure taken by the State Council and the CMC to improve weapons and equipment quality and standard-

ize military industry product design finalization work. The "Regulations" consist of 48 articles in six sections, including: General Principles; Structure, Duties and Responsibility for Finalizing Designs; Design Finalization; Production Design Finalization; Management and Supervision; and Appendices. These regulations are based on the "Chinese People's Liberation Army Equipment Regulations" and other laws and regulations. The basic standard used in these regulations is improvement in unit combat capabilities. ... (Xinhua, 7 Nov 05, in BBC PF, 8 Nov 05)
