Foreign Affairs

- 14 Romania: Prime Minister Adrian Nastase paid an official visit (-15);
- 18 Middle East: Wang Shijie, Chinese special envoy on the Middle East issue, visited Israel and Palestine (-22);
- 19 WHA: Vice-Premier and Health Minister Wu Yi attended the 56th World Health Assembly in Geneva;
- 21 Afghanistan: Vice-President Shahrani paid a visit (-26); aid contract signed (China will provide 1m US\$ aid to the Afghanistan reconstruction trust fund);
- 23 Switzerland: Micheline Calmy-Ray, federal councillor and head of the Federal Department of Foreign Affairs, arrived in Beijing for a visit;
- 23 WHO: World Health Organization removed its recommendation that people should postpone all but essential travel to Hong Kong SAR and Guangdong Province;
- 26 Russia, Kazakhstan and Mongolia: President Hu Jintao paid state visits (- June 05), attended the 3rd meeting of the heads of state of the member states of the Shanghai Cooperation Organization in Moscow,

and the North-South Leaders' informal dialogue meeting in Evian, France.

Domestic Affairs

- 02 Beijing: an accident of a conventional-powered submarine left the 70 officers and men on the submarine dead;
- 02 Liaoning: four people died in a blast at a molybdenum mine in Huludao City;
- 07 Liaoning: a mine accident claimed four lives in Huludao City;
- 07 Beijing: middle and elementary schools in Beijing will remain closed for another two weeks after the first two-week holiday ended on 7 May;
- 07 Beijing: 7th executive meeting of the State Council studied measures for dealing with the impact of SARS and accomplishing the current economic work well, and examined the "regulations (draft) on emergency public health cases";
- 12 Shanxi: an accident of carbon monoxide poisoning at a coal mine in Changzhi City left six mining workers dead;
- 13 Beijing: 8th executive meeting of the State Council reviewed and in principle approved the Provisional Regulations on Supervision and Management of State-Owned Assets (draft) and the Regulations on Implementation of the PRC Cultural Relics Protection Law (draft);
- 13 Anhui: a gas explosion in a coal mine left 86 people dead;
- 15 Guangdong: floods, torrential rains and rainstorms claimed at least 25 lives (-17);
- 17 Beijing: China's National Science Week 2003 opened as scheduled with the theme "Defeating severe acute respiratory syndrome (SARS) with science";
- 17 Liaoning: a fierce gas explosion at a private mine in Liaoyang City left seven people dead;
- 18 Hunan: mountain floods triggered by continuous torrential rain killed 25 people;
- 19 Shanxi: all 33 trapped miners rescued from a flooded coal mine in Jinzhong City's Shouyang County;
- 20 Shanxi: all 25 miners confirmed dead after a fierce gas explosion rocked an unlicensed coal mine in Linfen City's Anze County;
- 21 Hebei: six people died in an explosion and fire at a chemical plant in Shijiazhuang City;
- 21 Yunnan: 24 miners dead after a gas explosion ripped through a colliery in Huaping County;

- 24 Henan: a water leakage in a mine in Anyang City left 15 miners dead;
- 26 Beijing: State Council Information Office issued a white paper on the history and development of Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region;
- 26 Liaoning: two people killed in an explosion in a small chemical plant in Dalian City;
- 28 Beijing: State Council executive meeting studied and mapped out plans for employment of graduates of schools of higher learning in 2003, as well as deliberated and passed, in principle, the "(draft) regulations on property management";
- 29 Beijing: death toll from SARS reached 332.

Economic Affairs

- 14 Beijing: forum on "SARS and Asia's Economy - Impacts and Policy Recommendations", jointly sponsored by the Boao Forum for Asia and the Asian Development Bank;
- 20 Anhui Province obtained a 250m US\$ loan from the World Bank for the Tonglin-Huangshan expressway project;
- 25 Sichuan: China successfully put its 3rd Beidou navigation and positioning satellite into orbit;
- 26 Beijing: Asian Development Bank approved a programme to donate 2m US\$ to help combat SARS in China's western regions.

Relations to Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan

- 08 Hong Kong: State Councillor Tang Jiaxuan presented the first consignment of medical supplies to Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa at a ceremony held in Shenzhen City;
- 18 Taiwan: 2003 Cross-Straits Scientific and Technological Achievements Fair and Conference on Economy and Trade opened in Fuzhou City, Fujian Province, as scheduled amid fears of SARS;
- 27 Macau: SARS donation from the Chinese central government presented to the SARM during a ceremony held in Zhuhai City;
- 29 Hong Kong, Macau: first meeting of the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macau Expert Group on Prevention and Treatment of SARS held in Hong Kong (-30);
- 29 Taiwan reported latest SARS death toll at 81;
- 31 Hong Kong: 278 people have now died from SARS.

Russia (May 27)

Chinese President Hu Jintao and Russian President Putin signed a "Joint Statement of the People's Republic of China and the Russian Federation" in Moscow, in which both sides indicated that they will continue to go all-out to strengthen the strategic, cooperative partner relationship between the two countries, and make contributions to the interests of the people of both countries and to the peace and stability of the region. The persons in charge of the government departments concerned in the two countries also signed an Agreement Between the Government of the People's Republic of China and the Government of the Russian Federation Regarding Cooperation in Maritime Areas, and a General Agreement Between the China Construction Bank and Russia's Foreign Trade Bank on Credit for Exporters. (Xinhua, 27 May 03, in BBC PF, 28 May 03)

Russia's Yukos oil company and China National Petroleum Corporation (CNPC) signed a general agreement on 28 May on the main principles and understandings for a long-

term contract to supply oil to China via a Russia-China oil pipeline. The agreement was signed by Yukos CEO Mikhail Khodorkovsky and CNPC President Ma Fucai, who is accompanying Chinese President Hu Jintao. Ma Fucai said the supplies would begin in 2005 and volumes would be 20m tons annually during the first five years and 30m tons annually from 2010 on. The total period covered by the agreement is 25 years. Mikhail Khodorkovsky said the deal would be worth 150b US\$ over the 25 years and the Russian budget stood to receive about 60b US\$. The Russian government has decided to build a key oil pipeline from Angarsk in Western Siberia to Nakhogka in the Pacific coast on the Sea of Japan, with a 2,400-kilometer separate branch going to the northern Chinese city of Daqing. Russia and China signed an intergovernmental agreement on the oil pipeline three years ago, and China has spent several million dollars to carry out a feasibility study on the project. The two companies also signed a contract on the supply of 6m tons of oil from Russia to China in 2003-2006 via rail worth of 1.1b US\$. (XNA, 30 May 03)

International Agreements

The United Nations Environment Program (UNEP) and the People's Republic of China on 29 May signed an agreement in Nairobi, the headquarters of the UNEP, on the establishment of a UNEP office in Beijing. Chinese Permanent Representative to UNEP and Chinese Ambassador to Kenya Guo Chongli and UNEP Executive Director Klaus Topfer, jointly signed the agreement, which marks the operation of the Beijing Office. The establishment of the office is a concrete measure taken by the UNEP secretariat to further implement the World Summit on Sustainable Development's outcomes and relevant UNEP Governing Council's decisions on strengthening regionalization, UNEP's role in the Global Environmental Facility and its role in capacity delivery at both of country and subregional level, according to the agreement. ... Setting up in 1973, the UNEP is aimed at encouraging and co-

ordinating sound environmental practices, raising environmental awareness as well as promoting major environmental treaties in the world. So far, the UN body has only established its offices in two countries, Russia and China. (XNA, 31 May 03)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Regulations Governing On-the-Job Injury Insurance, adopted at the 5th executive meeting of the State Council on 16 April 2003. The regulations will take effect on 1 January 2004. (Decree No 375 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao)

The "Regulations" consist of eight chapters with 64 articles, including general principles, on-the-job injury insurance funds, on-the-job injury determination, work capability evaluation, coverage for on-the-job injuries, supervisory administration, legal responsibility, and an appendix. The purpose of the regulations is to ensure that workers who get hurt or contract occupational diseases on the job can get medical treatment and financial compensation. In addition, the regulations promote the prevention of the on-the-job injuries, help workers recover from occupational diseases, and disperse the risks of on-the-job injuries in the employing units. According to the regulations, all enterprises, industrial and commercial employing units run by individuals should obtain the on-the-job injury insurance according to the regulations and pay on-the-job injury insurance fees for their staff members or other employees. The staff members of various enterprises and the employees of the industrial and commercial units run by individuals have the right to medical coverage for on-the-job injuries according to the regulations. The specific procedures and implementing measures for the industrial and commercial employing units to obtain the on-the-job injury insurance will be left to the people's governments of each province, autonomous region, and municipality. The regulations specify that the Ministry of Labour and Social Security

is responsible for national on-the-job injury insurance. The labour and social security departments of various local people's governments at county level or above are responsible for on-the-job injury insurance work in their administrative areas. The social security organizations set up by the labour and social security departments according to the relevant regulations of the State Council will be in charge of on-the-job injury insurance affairs. The regulations say the labour and social security departments should solicit opinions from the labour unions and the representatives of the employing units before they draw up policies and standards for the on-the-job injury insurance. According to the regulations, "workers and staff members" means employees who have existing labour relations with employing units (including actual working relations) via various forms of employment and periods of employment. According to the regulations, anyone hired by state organizations, enterprises, or social groups governed according to the state's public service system will be have his/her expenses covered by his/her unit if he/she suffers on-the-job injuries or occupational diseases. The specific measures will be stipulated by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security, Ministry of Personnel, and Ministry of Finance. Other on-the-job injury insurance measures for other enterprises, social groups, and various non-enterprise units owned by individuals will be drawn up by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security, Ministry of Personnel, Ministry of Civil Affairs, and Ministry of Finance according to the regulations and then put into effect after the State Council's approval. Coverage for workers and staff members who had on-the-job injuries or occupational diseases but had not yet been examined for such before the implementation of the regulations are also included in the regulations. (Xinhua, 4 May 03, in BBC PF, 13 May 03)

Regulations on Emergency Public Health Cases, adopted at the 7th executive meeting of the State Council on 7 May 2003. The regulations come into force with publication. (Decree No 376 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 9 May

2003) (Full text: RMRB, 13 May 03; full translation: Xinhua, 12 May 03, in BBC PF, 15 May 03)

The regulations were made up of six chapters and 54 articles, including general rules, prevention and emergency preparations, reporting and information broadcasting, emergency procedures, legal responsibility and supplementary articles. According to the regulations, the State Council shall set up an emergency headquarters to deal with any public health emergencies. The regulations also prescribe reporting systems in public health emergencies. Public health emergencies refer to serious epidemics, widespread unidentified diseases, food and industrial poisoning, and other serious cases detrimental to public health. (XNA, 13 May 03)

The promulgation and implementation of the Emergency Regulations on Sudden Outbreaks of Public Health Incidents is of great importance to the smooth progress of the work of fighting atypical pneumonia, the protection of public health and personal safety and the maintenance of social stability. The sudden onslaught of atypical pneumonia is a major disaster. Winning this tough battle against atypical pneumonia requires not only reliance on science but also reliance on legislation. Since atypical pneumonia is a new and highly contagious disease, and given that fact that China has a large population with great mobility, it is only by strictly exercising management and preventing the epidemic in accordance with law that we can ensure that epidemic prevention and control as a whole proceeds in an intense and orderly manner. Only thus can we thoroughly cut off the channels of transmission and proliferation, effectively control the spread of the epidemic, and maintain normal order in production and daily life. ... The Law of the PRC on the Prevention and Control of Infectious Diseases, as the principal legal basis for epidemic prevention in accordance with law, must be strictly implemented. In order to give concrete embodiment to the basic legal systems laid down in the law on the prevention and control of infectious diseases and make them more workable, the State Council has, bearing in mind new circumstances emerging under the new situation, especially

weaknesses in the emergency handling of sudden outbreaks of public health incidents that have been revealed in the prevention and control of atypical pneumonia, formulated the "Emergency Regulations" in accordance with relevant provisions in the law on the prevention and control of infectious diseases. A unified, efficient and authoritative emergency handling mechanism for sudden outbreaks of public health incidents is established in a special effort to solve problems such as information blocks, inaccurate information and statistics, slow response and lack of preparation that are present in the emergency handling of sudden outbreaks of public health incidents. This not only helps solve actual problems in the current prevention and control of atypical pneumonia, but also establishes a legal system with "smooth flow of information, rapid response, effective command and clear-cut responsibility" in the prompt and effective handling of sudden outbreaks of public health incidents in future. The Regulations are applicable to emergencies such as sudden outbreaks of major infectious diseases that have caused or may cause serious harm to public health, unknown diseases of a mass nature, major food and vocational poisoning and other sudden outbreaks of incidents with a serious impact on public health. ... The Regulations stipulate that following a sudden outbreak of incident, the State Council and the people's government of the province, autonomous region or municipality concerned must set up an emergency handling command to take charge of the unified leadership and command of the emergency handling of this outbreak. The administrative department for public health and other departments must do a good job of the emergency handling of the incidents within their respective jurisdictions. In view of the fact that some departments and localities lack the ability to give early warning to sudden outbreaks of incidents and have monitoring systems that are insensitive in response, the Regulations have clearly provided for a monitoring and early warning system for sudden outbreaks of public health incidents and established a multi-channel and rapid information reporting system with coordination in vertical and horizontal ways. In partic-

ular, the Regulations have reinforced the information reporting responsibility of provincial-level people's governments, requiring provincial-level people's governments to report to the State Council's administrative department for public health within one hour of receiving reports on epidemics and other sudden incidents. They also specify the time limits that governments and health departments at various levels must make such reports. At the same time, they clearly stipulate that all units and individuals have the power to report sudden incidents to the government or government departments, as well as the power to report on a government or government department that fails to discharge its duties or does not discharge its duties in accordance with law. In view of the problem of the lack of emergency supplies reflected in the present prevention and control of atypical pneumonia, the Regulations have made specific provisions for the formulation and implementation of emergency budgets for sudden outbreaks of public health incidents. It is stipulated that governments at and above the county level must organize and unfold scientific studies on the prevention and control of sudden outbreaks of incidents and set up reserves for emergency supplies, equipment, facilities, technologies and human resources for such incidents, the necessary funds for which are to be incorporated into the fiscal budgets of the local government. In order to promptly and effectively treat patients, prevent buck passing and cross-infection and cut off the source of infection, the Regulations have laid down the standards for the acceptance of patients for treatment, the transfer of patients and other actions on the part of medical and health institutions. Medical and health institutions are required to adopt measures of quarantine and medical observation towards people with close contact with infected cases and take internal health protection measures. It is also stipulated that when medical institutions accept patients of infectious diseases for treatment, they must report to the local centre for disease prevention and control in accordance with law. Upon receiving such reports, the centre for disease prevention and control must immediately conduct investigation into people susceptible to danger

and take the necessary control measures. They also stipulate that people's governments at and above the county level must provide the necessary funds to ensure that patients who became ill as a result of such sudden outbreaks of incident receive timely and effective treatment. The Regulations have also laid down strict legal responsibilities for governments and government departments that conceal, put off reporting or lie about sudden outbreaks of incidents, refuse to give their cooperation in investigations by higher-level departments or obstruct and interfere such investigations, as well as for actions such as refusal to discharge one's duties, dereliction of duty, negligence and malfeasance. ... Violations of law in the course of the prevention and control of atypical pneumonia must be strictly dealt with in accordance with law, and cases that constitute crimes must be criminally prosecuted in accordance with law. ... (Xinhua, 12 May 03, in BBC PF, 13 May 03)

Provisional Regulations on Supervision and Management of State-Owned Assets, adopted at the 8th executive meeting of the State Council on 13 May 2003. The regulations will come into force on the date of promulgation. (Decree No 378 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 27 May 2003) (Xinhua, 4 June 03, in BBC PF, 5 June 03) The regulations have eight chapters with 47 articles, dealing with general principles, supervision and management organization of state-owned assets, management of enterprise leaders, management of major events of enterprises, management of state-owned assets, supervision of state-owned assets, legal liability and supplementary articles. (XNA, 4 June 03) The provisional regulations mainly cover the supervision of state-owned assets in non-financial enterprises, according to *China Daily* [5 June]. It sets out guidelines for the ongoing reform of the state assets management system and provides a sound legal basis for the reform, said a spokesperson with the Legislative Affairs Office of the State Council. China launched the State Assets Management Commission in April. It acts on behalf of the state to directly supervise the 196 central state-owned enterprises that

had 6.9 trillion RMBY (833.3b US\$) of state assets at the end of 2002. Local state assets management offices are also being established to supervise local enterprises, according to the newspaper. (XNA, 5 June 03)

The total volume of China's state-owned assets topped 11 trillion RMBY (about 1.33 trillion US\$) in 2002, an increase of 8.2 percent over the previous year. Statistics from the Ministry of Finance showed that by the end of 2002, the commercial sector claimed 7.69 trillion RMBY (about 926.5b US\$), a rise of 5.2 percent or 65 percent of the total. Non-profitable assets increased by 14.4 percent over 2001 and accounted for 35 percent of the total. (XNA, 4 June 03)

Regulations on Enhancing Intellectual Property Protection on National Scientific Programs. The Chinese Ministry of Science and Technology has issued regulations urging research institutes and technological firms to set up a sound system for intellectual property rights, *China Daily* reported on 12 May. The regulations aim to encourage and safeguard technological innovations and accelerate the commercialization of new technology, the newspaper said. Research institutes and technological firms should have special departments, staff and funds for intellectual property protection when undertaking scientific projects, according to the regulations. The regulations require research institutes and technological firms to investigate domestic and overseas technological projects to avoid duplication. They should stop or readjust their research plans if their projects have been patented by any domestic or overseas institutes. In the past, some academic institutes carried out projects that duplicated work elsewhere due to their ignorance of intellectual property protection, the newspaper quoted sources with the ministry as saying. The newspaper said that research institutes undertaking large scientific projects of international importance will receive government subsidies when applying for patents in foreign countries. Researchers are also required to take part in training courses on intellectual property rights before they begin technological projects, according to the regulations. China implemented the Patent Law in 1985, and the State

Intellectual Property Office has received over 1.62 million patent applications since then, 83 percent of which are domestic ones, the newspaper said. (XNA, 13 May 03)

China has issued **Provisions on the Surveillance of Prices** and will put them into effect on 1 June. The regulations are another move by China to optimize government management of the economy according to its commitment under the World Trade Organization, said the State Development and Reform Commission (SDRC) in a press release on 14 May. The new rules require the government to investigate and study the changes in prices, costs, supply and demand of important goods and services and tracing and collecting information about the effect of major government policies on market prices. They also require relevant authorities to report their findings in price supervision and offer forecast, warning and policy consultation to government decision makers. The SDRC said the rules will help the government to conduct macroeconomic control in a scientific and efficient way and to set proper policies on supervising market prices. (RMRB, 15 May 03; XNA, 16 May 03)

Interim Regulations for Internet Cultural Management will be effective on 1 July 2003. Internet entertainment is a new force that has suddenly appeared and become the hot new amusement. Online sales of audio and video products have become popular, and network programme requests are not restricted. Online artwork auctions have gradually become a trend. A brand new online cultural market is forming. The Ministry of Culture promulgated the interim regulations that will incorporate this new cultural lifestyle into the realm of regulated management as well as implement an operating license system to regulate the cyberspace cultural market. The regulations will manage Internet cultural products that are produced, disseminated, and circulated through the Internet such as audio and visual products, game products, lecture programmes, art objects, and animations, as well as Internet cultural units engaging in Internet cultural product services. Included in these cyberspace cultural activities are the manufacture, reproduction, import, wholesale,

retail, lease, and transmission of Internet cultural products; online dissemination of user activities such as browsing, reading, enjoyment, usage or downloading of cultural products published on the Internet or sent through the Internet to such user terminals as computers, fixed phone lines, mobile phone lines, radios, televisions, and video game players; and exhibition and contests of Internet cultural products. These interim regulations clearly define the conditions for an Internet cultural unit applying for establishment as well as procedures for its evaluation. They implement a licensing system for operational Internet cultural units with profit seeking as their objective, and implement a file system for non-operational Internet cultural units not seeking profits. The interim regulations are directed at the current situation of Internet cultural activities and units in China and have not placed any restrictions on the conditions for establishing responsible departments or systems of ownership. Only management and technical personnel, capital, equipment, and sites need to turn in an application. This measure will help destroy industry barriers, department break-ups, and regional limitations, and it will encourage various enterprises to take part in Internet cultural activities and actively develop superior Internet cultural products with advanced technology and their own intellectual property rights so as to nurture a large market and large industry for Internet entertainment. (Xinhua, 3 June 03, in BBC PF, 14 June 03)
