With the approval of the State Council and with the permission of China Insurance Regulatory Commission, the People's Insurance Company of China (PICC) changed its name into People's Insurance Holding Company of China (*Zhongguo renbao konggu gongsi*) and formed the People's Property Insurance Corporation of China (*Zhongguo renmin caichan baoxian gufen youxian gongsi*) and the People's Insurance Asset Management Company of China, Ltd. Li Jincheng (9),

Standing Committee member of CCP Qinghai Provincial Committee since March 2001, was appointed vice-governor of Qinghai Provincial People's Government at the 3rd meeting of the 10th PPC Standing Committee which closed on 19 June. (*Qinghai Ribao*, 20 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.119)

Li Xianghua (10)

Identified as deputy commander of the East China Sea Fleet and political commissar of its Air Force. (*Zhejiang Ribao*, 14 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.120) Rear Admiral Li had served as deputy chief of staff of the East China Sea Fleet since August 2001.

Liu Yahong

Identified as deputy commander of Chengdu Military Region (MR). (*Guizhou Ribao*, 6 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.120) Major General Liu had

served as chief of staff of Chengdu MR since February 2002. See C.a., 2002/3, p.327/27. Liu, born in February 1946, is a native of Pingding, Shanxi Province. He once served as division commander of a certain Group Army and as commander of a Group Army.

Lü Dengming

Identified as chief of staff of Chengdu Military Region. (*Guizhou Ribao*, 6 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.120) Lü had served as commander of a certain Group Army, chief of staff of Chengdu Military Region, deputy commander of Tibet Military District (see C.a., 1993/5, p.521/15), and as director of the Operation Department of the PLA General Staff and as director of the State People's Air Defence Office under the National Defence Mobilization Committee (both posts since 2001).

Qin Guoguang (11)

Identified as deputy political commissar of Hainan Military District. (*Hainan Ribao*, 8 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.120) Qin once served as deputy political commissar of a certain Group Army.

Qiu Xiaoxiong (12)

Appointed deputy director of the State Council Research Office. (RMRB, 27 June 03)

Ren Haishen (13),

Standing Committee member of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee since July 2001, was appointed vice-governor of Anhui Provincial People's Government at the 3rd meeting of the 10th PPC Standing Committee, which closed on 15 June. (*Anhui Ribao*, 16 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.118)

Sun Qian (14), appointed deputy procurator-general of the Supreme People's Procuratorate last June. See C.a., 2003/6, p.782/36.

Tang Xianqiang (15)

Identified as deputy secretary of CCP Jilin Provincial Committee. (*Jilin Ribao*, 9 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.116) Tang had served as Standing Committee member of CCP Jilin Provincial Committee since August 2001. He concurrently serves as director of its Organization Department. Tang, born in October 1947, is a native of Sishui, Shandong Province. He once served as secretary of CYL Heilongjiang Provincial Com-

mittee, Standing Committee member of Heilongjiang Provincial Committee, deputy director of its Organization Department, and secretary of its Commission for Politics and Law.

Teng Wensheng

Identified as member of the newly established Central Leading Group for Constitutional Amendment. (*Wen Wei Po*, 8 June 2003, in FBIS, 10 June 03) He concurrently serves as director of the Central Party Literature Research Center, and as member of the Central Leading Group for Publicity, News, Radio and Television, and Publication Work. Teng is a member of the 16th CCP CC. For his vita see C.a., 1998/5, p.560/28.

Wang Huning,

deputy director of the Central Policy Research Center, was identified as the center's director. (RMRB, 27 May 03) He was also identified as member of the newly established Central Leading Group for Constitutional Amendment. (*Wen Wei Po*, 8 June 2003, in FBIS, 10 June 03) Wang is a member of the 16th CCP CC. See C.a., 1998/12, p.1355/19.

Wang Yongqing (16)

Appointed deputy director of the State Council's Legislative Affairs Office. (RMRB, 27 June 03)

Wu Bangguo,

Standing Committee member of the CCP CC Politburo and chairman of the 10th NPC Standing Committee, was identified as head of the newly established Central Leading Group for Constitutional Amendment. (*Wen Wei Po*, 8 June 2003, in FBIS, 10 June 03) For his vita see C.a., 2003/3, p.375/37.

Xu Chengyun (17)

Identified as chief of staff of Anhui Military District. (*Anhui Ribao*, 19 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.120)

Zhang Ping,

vice-governor of Anhui Province, was identified as deputy secretary of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee. (*Anhui Ribao*, 2 June 03, in ZGYJ, 2003/7, p.116) He had served as Standing Committee member of CCP Anhui Provincial Committee before. Zhang is an alternate member of the 16th CCP CC. See C.a., 1996/12, p.1205/13.

Zhang Qiong

Appointed deputy director of the State Council's Legislative Affairs Office. (RMRB, 27 June 03) He was removed from his position as deputy procurator-general of the Supreme People's Procuratorate last June. See C.a., 1995/10, p.963/11, and 2003/6, p.784/38.

Hong Kong

The Chinese government on 18 July appointed **Yang Wenchang** as commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the Hong Kong SAR, replacing Ji Peiding. (XNA, 18 July 03; RMRB, 19 July 03) Yang no longer serves as vice-minister of foreign affairs. See entry above.

Yang Wenchang, newly appointed commissioner of China's Ministry of Foreign Affairs in the HKSAR, arrived in Hong Kong on 10 August to take up his post. Yang, aged 59 and graduated from Beijing Foreign Languages Institute, is a native of Shandong Province. He served as ambassador to Singapore between 1993 and 1995 and was appointed vice-minister of foreign affairs in 1998. (XNA, 10 Aug 03) See C.a., 1998/8, p.861/15.

Hong Kong SAR Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa on 16 July accepted the resignations of Finance Secretary **Anthony Leung Kam-chung** and Secretary for Security **Regina Ip**. Tung said in his statement that he respected their decisions and has suggested the central government dismiss them from their posts according to the Basic Law. He had thought highly of the performance of Leung and Ip and expressed his gratitude to them in the statement. He said Leung had contributed much to the recovery of the Hong Kong economy, especially dealing with the fiscal deficit, tightening the economic ties between Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland as well as rebuilding Hong Kong after the SARS outbreak. Tung said he was very sorry to see Ip's resignation and praised her for her ability in solving thorny problems and for her outstanding performance and enthusiasm. (XNA, 17 July 03)

China's State Council appointed new principal officials of the HKSAR on 2 August according to the Basic

Law of the HKSAR and the suggestion and nomination of Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa. **Tang Ying-yen** was appointed as Financial Secretary, and **Lee Siu-Kwong** as Secretary for Security. **Tsang Chun-wah** was appointed as Secretary for Commerce, Industry and Technology, replacing Tang Ying-yen. **Wong Hung-chiu** was appointed Commissioner of the Independent Commission Against Corruption, replacing Lee Siu-Kwong, and was removed from the post of Commissioner of Customs and Excise. (XNA, 4 Aug 03; RMRB, 5 Aug 03)

Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa announced on 4 August the appointment of four principal government officials. Tung announced at a news conference that according to relevant provisions of the Basic Law of the HKSAR and his nominations and suggestions, the State Council, or the central government, has appointed Tang Ying-yen as financial secretary of the SAR government, Lee Siu-kwong as secretary for security, Tsang Chun-wah as secretary for commerce, industry and technology, and Wong Hung-chiu as commissioner of the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC). "I think the public know every one of them well. They all have excellent leadership skills and a wealth of experience," Tung said. Tang Ying-yen came from the business sector. Before joining the government, Tang served in various public service posts. The chief executive said that after working in the government for more than a year, Tang has gained a good grasp of its structure and operation. "Tang is also very familiar with the operation of the market. He is the best choice for the financial secretary's post," Tung added. The other three officials have been serving the government for years and have in-depth understanding of the government and how the policy process works, said Tung, adding that he is confident that "they will do an excellent job." "I am also confident that the financial secretary and the three other principal officials will help us move towards a more open, progressive and efficient government, to work for the interests of the people of Hong Kong and do their utmost to serve the public," Tung said. "I hope they can count on the support of the community as we work together for the de-

velopment of Hong Kong," said Tung. (XNA, 4 Aug 03)

Backgrounder: Newly-appointed Financial Secretary **Henry Tang Ying-yen** (Tang Yingnian). - Tang Ying-yen was appointed as financial secretary of the HKSAR government by the State Council, or the central government of China. Tang had served as Secretary for Commerce, Industry and Technology since July 2002 to deal with policies in relation to information technology, telecommunications, broadcasting, film services, innovation and technology, external commercial relations, industry and business support, intellectual property protection and inward investment promotion. Tang has a long record of public service. He has been a member of the Executive Council since 1997. He served as a member of the Legislative Council for seven years from 1991 to 1998. Tang has also served extensively on various government boards and public bodies, including the Trade Development Council, Town Planning Board, University Grants Committee, Council of the City University of Hong Kong and Services Promotion Strategy Group in the Electronics and Textile industries. Before joining the government, Tang was a leading industrialist in Hong Kong. He received the Young Industrialist Awards of Hong Kong in 1989 and was selected as a Global Leader for Tomorrow by the World Economic Forum in 1993. He served as chairman of the Federation of Hong Kong Industries between 1995 and 2001. He was also a Committee Member of the Hong Kong General Chamber of Commerce and a Steward of the Hong Kong Jockey Club. In 2000, he received the Gold Bauhinia Star Award of the HKSAR. Tang was born in Hong Kong in 1952. He holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree from the University of Michigan. He is married and has four children. (XNA, 4 Aug 03)

Backgrounder: Hong Kong's new secretary for commerce, industry and technology **John Tsang Chun-wah** (Zeng Junhua). - Tsang Chun-wah was appointed as the new secretary for commerce, industry and technology by the State Council. Tsang, 52, joined the Hong Kong civil service in November 1982. From 1987 to 1991, he served as the administrative assistant to the

financial secretary. He was assistant director-general of trade from 1991 to early 1995 and private secretary to the Hong Kong governor from 1995 to June 1997. Tsang became director-general of the London Economic and Trade Office from July 1997 to February 1999, commissioner of customs and excise from March 1999 to July 2001 and secretary for planning and lands from July 2001 to June 2002. He was appointed as permanent secretary for housing, planning and lands (planning and lands) on July 1, 2002. (XNA, 4 Aug 03)

Backgrounder: Hong Kong's new secretary for security **Ambrose Lee Siu-kwong** (Li Shaoguang). - China's State Council appointed Lee Siu-Kwong as secretary for security. Lee Siu-Kwong, 54, became director of immigration of the first HKSAR government in October 1998 and was appointed as commissioner of the Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC) of the 2nd HKSAR government on June 2002 by the State Council. Lee graduated with a bachelor of science degree from the University of Hong Kong. He also received professional training in Beijing-based Tsinghua (Qinghua) University, London-based Oxford University, and Harvard University of the United States. As the ICAC commissioner, Lee believed that Hong Kong should better crack down on corruption, improve law enforcement and prevention of crimes, and that the ICAC should strengthen ties with its Chinese mainland and international counterparts in its future work. (XNA, 4 Aug 03)

Backgrounder: Hong Kong's new commissioner of Independent Commission Against Corruption **Raymond Wong Hung-chiu** (Huang Hongchao). - Raymond Wong Hung-chiu was appointed by the State Council as the new commissioner of the Independent Commission Against Corruption. Wong, 46, joined the Hong Kong civil service in August 1980 and rose to his present rank of Administrative Officer Staff Grade A in July 2002. He had served in various bureaus and departments, including the Social Welfare Department, Home Affairs Branch, Health and Welfare Branch, the former City and New Territories Administration, the former Office of Unofficial Members of Executive and

Legislative Councils, the former Legal Department and the former New Airport Projects Co-ordination Office. He was commissioner for narcotics in the Security Branch from January to December 1996, served as deputy director of the Handover Ceremony Co-ordination Office of the Chief Secretary's Office from January to July 1997 and was deputy secretary for security from August 1997 to July 2001. Wong was appointed to the position of commissioner of customs and excise in July 2001. As the commissioner of customs and excise, Wong committed himself to the fight against smuggling, piracy and other illegal activities. He attaches importance to strengthening cooperation with the customs on the Chinese mainland, and increasing the efficiency of passing customs to meet the demand of personnel exchange and logistics distribution between the two sides. (XNA, 4 Aug 03)

Former Vice-Premier and Defence Minister **Zhang Aiping** died on 5 July 2003 at the age of 93 in Beijing. (RMRB, 7 July 03; XNA, 12 July 03)

Cuba (July 23)

China and Cuba signed a memorandum of understanding (MOU) in Beijing, allowing Chinese travel groups to visit the Caribbean country. Cuba is the first nation in the Western Hemisphere to gain Approved Destination Status (ADS) from the Chinese government. So far, China has signed 28 MOUs with different nations and regions. Chinese group travellers can go to 24 nations and regions altogether. In recent years, the number of Chinese travellers going abroad has risen, surpassing 16 million last year. The World Tourism Organization predicts China will become the fourth largest tourist source nation by 2020. (XNA, 23 July 03)

South Korea (July 07)

Relevant departments of China and South Korea signed three cooperation documents in Beijing. Chinese State President Hu Jintao and South Korean President Roh Moo-hyun attended the signing ceremony. The three cooperation agreements were: A treaty between the two countries on judicial assistance in civilian and commercial matters; a cooperation ar-

angement between China's General Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection, and Quarantine and South Korea's Ministry of Commerce, Industry, and Energy on standardization and qualifications assessment; and a memorandum of understanding between the two countries' engineering academies on engineering science and technology cooperation. (Xinhua, 7 July 03, in BBC PF, 9 July 03)

Zimbabwe (July 14)

China and Zimbabwe in Harare signed an agreement worth 4.5m US\$ to help Zimbabwe in developmental programmes in the economic and technical areas. Visiting Chinese Assistant Foreign Affairs Minister Lu Guozeng signed the agreement with Zimbabwean Foreign Affairs Minister Stan Mudenge soon after Lu met Zimbabwean President Robert Mugabe. Before travelling to Zimbabwe, the assistant minister attended the Africa Union summit held on 10-12 July in Mozambique as a special envoy of the Chinese government. Relations between China and Zimbabwe started in the days of the liberation struggle in the African country when China aided liberation fighters in various ways. Zimbabwe imports goods such as machinery, textiles, grain, clothing, light industry goods and electronic gadgets from China. (XNA, 15 July 03)

Hong Kong (June 29)

The "Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement" (CEPA) between the Chinese mainland and the Hong Kong SAR was signed in Hong Kong. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and Chief Executive of the HKSAR Tung Chee-hwa attended the signing ceremony. (Full text: RMRB, 30 June 2003)

CEPA covers three areas of trade in goods, trade in services and trade and investment facilitation and its basic objective is to phase out tariffs and non-tariff barriers on trade in goods, phase in liberalization of trade in services and promote trade and investment facilitation in an effort to bring about common development by upgrading the economic partnership between the Mainland and Hong Kong. The centrepiece in trade in goods is the early start of zero tariffs. As of 1 January, 2004, goods of Hong Kong origin under 273 tariff items that are

important to its economy will enjoy zero tariff treatment when coming into the Mainland. And zero tariffs will apply to other goods of Hong Kong origin no later than 1 January, 2006. On trade in services, effective 1 January, 2004, the Mainland will implement some of the commitment it made to World Trade Organization (WTO) members ahead of schedule for the benefit of Hong Kong. In addition, restrictions on equity ratio will be lifted, thresholds on registered capital and technical qualifications lowered and limitations on geographic location and business scope eased for Hong Kong-funded ventures in certain sectors and industries. Incidentally, CEPA covers 17 areas of the service sector. On trade and investment facilitation, the Mainland is committed to simplifying procedures in seven areas, namely, trade and investment promotion, customs clearance, transparency of laws and regulations, e-commerce, commodities quarantine, inspection and quality certification, cooperation among small and medium-sized enterprises and traditional Chinese medicine development cooperation. (XNA, 29 June 03)

The **Regulations on Legal Aid**, approved at the 15th executive meeting of the State Council on 16 July 2003, will come into force on 1 September 2003. (Decree No. 385 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 21 July 2003) (Xinhua, 31 July 03, in BBC PF, 2 Aug 03; full text: RMRB, 1 Aug 03) The regulations consist of six chapters with 31 articles.

Rules of Implementation of Management Procedures for the Provision of Help to Urban Vagrant and Mendicant Individuals Having No Means of Livelihood. These rules will become effective as of 1 August 2003. (Order No. 24 of the Ministry of Civil Affairs, signed by Minister Li Xueju on 21 July 03.) These rules consist of 24 articles. (Full text and translation: RMRB, 23 July 2003; Xinhua, 21 July 03, in BBC PF, 25 July 03)

Measures for supervision and examination of the work of promoting and appointing leading party and government cadres (for trial purposes) were recently distributed by the CCP CC General Office with the aim of gearing up the supervision and examination of this work from beginning to end, guarding against and correcting the unhealthy practice in selecting and using personnel, and ensuring the all-round and proper implementation of the party's line, principle, and policy with regard to cadres. The new set of measures is made up of seven chapters, consisting of 30 articles. The seven chapters are General Principles, Targets and Details of Supervision and Examination, Methods of Examination, Regular Supervision, Verification Through Investigation, Discipline and Responsibilities,

and Supplementary Provisions. This set of measures became effective on the date of promulgation. (Xinhua, 13 July 03, in BBC PF, 15 July 03; full text: RMRB, 14 July 03)
