Chairmen and vice-chairmen of autonomous regional governments are equivalent to governors and vice-governors of provinces and to mayors and vice-mayors of Beijing, Chongqing, Shanghai and Tianjin. Year and month behind a name indicate the date the person assumed the post or was identified in this position.

The State Asset Management Commission should be better defined as an organization directly under the State Council with special status (*guowuyuan zhishu teshe jigou*) instead of an ad hoc organization directly under the State Council, because it is established as a permanent organ. The "special status" lies in its complex role as owner and regulator of state enterprises.

The Central Work Committee for Enterprises (*zhongyang qiye gongzuo weiyuanhui*) and the Central Financial Work Committee (*zhongyang jinrong gongzuo weiyuanhui*), which were established in 1998, have been abolished in March 2003. Personnel and responsibility of the Financial Work Committee were allocated to the banking, securities and insurance regulatory commissions. The Work Committee for Enterprises was incorporated in the State Asset Management Commission. Wei Liucheng

According to a decision of the CCP CC, the former president of the China National Offshore Oil Corporation (CNOOC) is appointed as a member, Standing Committee member and deputy secretary of CCP Hainan Provincial Committee; Wei Liucheng is also nominated as a candidate for governor of Hainan Province; Wang Xiaofeng is nominated chairman of the Standing Committee of Hainan Provincial People's Congress, and will no longer hold the post of governor.

Wei Liucheng was born in Qinyang, Henan Province, in 1946, and graduated with a degree in logging from the Department of Prospecting at the Beijing Petroleum Institute [now the University of Petroleum, China (UPC)]. He has over three decades of experience in the Chinese petroleum industry. In 1982 he entered CNOOC. He successively held the posts of person in charge of the Yinggehai Office, chief representative of the CNOOC Nanhai West Corporation BP Cooperation Zone, and vice-president of the Nanhai West Corporation, and was appointed in 1991 as president of the Nanhai West Corporation. From 1993 to 1998 he held the post of vice-president of CNOOC. Starting in November 1999, he held the post of president and concurrently secretary of the Party organization of CNOOC. In September 1999, he was appointed as chairman and CEO of CNOOC Ltd. In 2001, he was chosen as a CCTV 2001 economics personage, and he was elected as an alternate member of the 16th CCP CC in 2002. During his term as president of CNOOC Ltd, Wei Liucheng accomplished its listing on the New York and Hong Kong stock exchanges, and it has become the stock that has increased in value the fastest and the most among China's overseas listed stock. The said corporation has invested over 10b RMBY in Hainan to construct oil projects in the South Sea. (ZXS, 8 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 11 Oct 03) See C.a., 1999/1, p.76/16.

The Chinese State Council decided on 18 September to appoint **Tong Hin-ming** as Commissioner of the Customs and Excise Department of the HKSAR Government, according to a notice issued in Beijing on 19 September. Meanwhile, **Chan Yin-tat** was removed from the post of Auditor-General of the Office of the Director of Audit of the Hong Kong SAR Government. (XNA, 19 Sep 03; RMRB, 20 Sep 03)

The HKSAR government announced on 19 September that the Central People's Government has, on the nomination and recommendation of Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa, approved the appointment of **Timothy Tong Hin-ming** (Tang Xianming), deputy secretary for security, as commissioner of Customs and Excise. Tong will take up the post with effect from 29 September 2003, succeeding Raymond Wong Hung-chiu who took up the post of Commissioner of Independent Commission against Corruption on 25 August 2003.

Aged 54, Tong joined the Hong Kong Government in November 1972, serving initially in the Executive Officer Grade and later in the Trade Officer Grade. He joined the Administrative Service in April 1992 and rose to his present rank of Administrative Officer Staff Grade B1 in July 2002. Tong has served in various bureaux and departments including the former Trade Department, former Security Branch, former Urban Services Department, former Education and Manpower Branch, former City and New Territories Administration, the Home Affairs Department and Geneva Office of the then Trade and Industry Branch. He became Deputy Secretary

for Security in January 1999, and has been doubling-up the post of Permanent Secretary for Security since July 1, 2002.

At the same time, the government also announced the following senior appointments:

- **Carrie Lam Cheng Yuet-ngor**, director of social welfare, will take up the post of permanent secretary for housing, planning and lands (planning and lands) on 1 November 2003 to replace John Tsang Chun-wah who took up appointment as secretary for commerce, industry and technology on 5 August 2003.

- **Stanley Ying Yiu-hong**, deputy secretary for financial services and the treasury, will take up the post of permanent secretary for security on 13 October 2003.

- **Paul Tang Kwok-wai**, deputy secretary for the environment, transport and works, will take up the post of director of social welfare on 1 November 2003, replacing Carrie Lam. (XNA, 20 Sep 03)

The HKSAR Government announced on 19 September that **Johnsman Au Chung-man**, Deputy Director of Audit, will act in the post of Director of Audit on a temporary basis. Au is to replace Dominic Chan Yin-tat, who is proceeding on pre-retirement leave with effect from 19 September. (XNA, 19 Sep 03)

Selina Chow Liang Shuk-Yee, chairwoman of the Hong Kong Tourism Board, has been appointed a member of the Executive Council, Chief Executive Tung Chee-hwa announced on 22 September. ... Responding to media questions, Tung said the appointment will improve the working relationship between Legislative Council and the Executive Council. He said the Executive Council's new set-up had only been in place for a year and should be given more time for implementation, adding that after the Legislative Council election next year, he would reconsider the Executive Council from an overall perspective. (XNA, 22 Sep 03)

The chief executive, Tung Chee-hwa, has appointed **Selina Chow** to the Executive Council [Exco, i.e. cabinet]. The vice-chairman of the Liberal Party replaces party head James Tien, who resigned following the mass rally

against the National Security Bill on 1 July. ... The Liberal Party chairman, James Tien, confirmed that Tung approached him prior to Selina Chow's appointment to the Executive Council to discuss the vacancy. Tien himself had earlier resigned the cabinet because his party could not support the Article 23 legislation as it then stood. But Tien said that after the bill was withdrawn in response to the 1 July demonstration, it was no longer an issue. He said Tung wanted to know if the party was interested in rejoining the government. (RTHK Radio 3 audio web site, 22 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 23 Sep 03)

The HKSAR government said on 6 October that **Li Li Ka-lai** will succeed Shum Man-to as Director of Accounting Services with effect from Oct. 7 when Shum proceeds on pre-retirement leave on the same day. ... Li, aged 49, first joined the government as an Accounting Officer II in December 1976. She was appointed as a Treasury Accountant in April 1980 and promoted to Deputy Director of Accounting Services in June 2001. (XNA, 6 Oct 03)

Bulgaria (Sep 08)

A cooperation agreement was signed between the defence ministries of the two countries. Visiting Defence Minister Nikolay Svinarov and Col-Gen Cao Gangchuan, defence minister and member of the State Council, signed the document. (BGNES web site, Sofia, 8 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 10 Sep 03)

Bulgaria (Sep 23)

Bulgarian students in China and Chinese students in Bulgaria will not have to pay education fees under a bilateral agreement on educational cooperation for the 2004-2007 period. The document was signed by Bulgarian Education and Science Minister Igor Damyanov and Chinese Vice Minister for Education Yuan Guiren during the latter's three-day visit to Bulgaria. The agreement envisages training of 25 full-time and part-time post-graduate students, university students and doctoral candidates on a reciprocal basis. Fellowships will also be granted to cover student accommodation expenses and the two sides will exchange Bulgarian and Chinese language lecturers. (XNA, 24 Sep 03)

Cameroon (Sep 22)

Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Cameroon President Paul Biya attended a signing ceremony for three cooperation agreements including one on economic and technological cooperation. (XNA, 22 Sep 03; RMRB, 23 Sep 03)

South Korea (Sep 08)

Zibo, an east China city in Shandong Province, and Gwang Ju, a city in the Republic of Korea (ROK), signed an agreement to seal the friendship between them. Zibo is one of the 50 largest industrial cities of the country and is known for its ceramic products. Shandong is one of the major attractions for ROK investment, and so far, there are over 30 ROK-funded companies in Zibo. (XNA, 8 Sep 03)

Russia (Sep 24)

Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Russian Prime Minister Mikhail Kasyanov signed the "Communique of the 8 th Periodic Meeting of the Chinese and Russian Premiers," and attended the ceremony for the signing of five documents. (RMRB, 25 Sep 03)

Tajikistan (Sep 02)

Agreements were signed at a ceremony between the Tajik and Chinese governments on border crossing checkpoints on the Tajik-Chinese state border and the regime of their work; an agreement between the Republic of Tajikistan and the People's Republic of China on cooperation against terrorism, separatism and extremism, as well as an exchange of certificates on the ratification of an additional agreement between the Republic of Tajikistan and the People's Republic of China on the Tajik-Chinese state border. The documents were signed by Tajik Foreign Minister Talbak Nazarov from the Tajik side and Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing from the Chinese side. (Tajik Television first channel, Dushanbe, 2 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 3 Sep 03; RMRB, 3 Sep 03)

Uganda (Sep 08)

Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Prime Minister Apollo Robin Nsibambi attended a signing ceremony for the agreement on the economic and technological cooperation between China and Uganda. (XNA, 8 Sep 03; RMRB, 9 Sep 03)

Uzbekistan (Sep 04)

Uzbek Foreign Minister Sodiq Safoyev and his Chinese counterpart, Li Zhaoxing, signed an agreement in Tashkent on cooperation in fighting international terrorism, separatism and extremism. (Uzbek Radio first programme, Tashkent, 4 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 5 Sep 03; RMRB, 5 Sep 03)

Vietnam (Sep 18)

Zhou Yongkang, member of the CCP CC Politburo and the CCP CC Secretariat, state councillor, and minister of public security, and Le Hong Anh, member of the Politburo of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of Vietnam, and Minister of Vietnamese Public Security, signed an agreement on establishing cooperation mechanism between the two ministries in Beijing. (Xinhua, 18 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 20 Sep 03; RMRB, 19 Sep 03)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Burkina Faso (Sep 13)

The HKSAR government announced on 13 September that confirmation had been received from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Regional Cooperation of Burkina Faso that the government of Burkina Faso has agreed to grant visa-free access to HKSAR passport holders for a stay up to 14 days with immediate effect. The availability of visa-free access to Burkina Faso has brought to 126 the total number of countries or territories agreeing to grant visa-free access to HKSAR passport holders. Currently, nationals of Burkina Faso may visit Hong Kong visa-free for a stay up to 14 days. (XNA, 13 Sep 03)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Chile (Sep 30)

Chilean National Chamber of Commerce, Services and Tourism and the Hong Kong Trade Development Council (HKTDC) signed an agreement in Santiago on the promotion of trade. The agreement, built on the consensus between Chile and Hong Kong reached last July, is designed to promote exchange of products and services, and to make support programs facilitating frequent contacts between companies of the two economies. The Chile-Hong Kong agreement was reached on the sidelines of a seminar, organized by the HKTDC and the ProChile or-

ganization, on increasing business opportunities in China's mainland and its Hong Kong Special Administrative Region. Both sides agreed to share information concerning the development of their respective economic and trade policies, exchange commercial applications, administer business contacts and provide assistance for the commercial missions. Hong Kong represents an economy whose gross domestic product reached 162.6b US\$ in 2001, with a per capita income of 25,000 US\$. (XNA, 1 Oct 03)

International Agreements

Wang Guangya, Chinese permanent representative to the UN, presented to the UN Secretary-General Kofi Annan on 23 September the instrument of ratification on China's joining the "UN Convention against Transnational Organized Crime". Wang Guangya told reporters after the presentation of the instrument of ratification that China's ratification of the convention would be conducive to enhancing cooperation with relevant countries to crack down on transnational organized crime as well as to China's further improving relevant measures on cracking down on crimes. He said China's submission of the instrument of ratification of the "UN Convention against Transnational Organized Crime" to Annan on the first day of the "UN Treaty Week" fully shows that the Chinese government attaches high importance to the issue of cracking down on transnational organized crime. The "UN Convention against Transnational Organized Crime" defines the purpose of conducting more effective crack-down against transnational organized crime through international cooperation, thereby providing a legal basis for various countries to carry out cooperation in cracking down on transnational organized crime. The convention obligates signatory countries to adopt necessary legal and other measures to treat acts involving organized crime, money laundering, corruption, and obstruction of justice as crimes. The United Nations set 23-26 September 2003 as "UN Treaty Week" so that various countries can take actions of joining various international treaties

during this period. The main emphasis of this activity is to enable more countries to sign and ratify the "UN Convention against Transnational Organized Crime." So far, some 40 countries have signed this convention; it will take effect on 29 September. (Xinhua, 23 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 2 Oct 03; RMRB, 25 Sep 03)

China and the **European Union (EU)** kicked off a joint training programme on global navigational satellite systems on the basis of the Galileo Project, a European alternative to America's global positioning system (GPS). Initiated by the European Union, the Galileo Project is aimed at civilian use of satellite navigation services, including transport, telecommunication, agriculture and fisheries. An official from China's Ministry of Science and Technology said that the ministry and the EU on 18 September signed a **cooperative agreement on the Galileo Project**, which was subject to authorization of the Chinese government and the European Commission respectively. Under the agreement, the two sides might join in developing satellite navigation and timing, satellite manufacturing and launching, laboratory activities on radio transmission, standardization of receivers and applications research. The agreement also opens a way for China to take a substantial financial part in the programme through a stockholding in the Galileo Joint Undertaking, the body established to manage the programme. (XNA, 19 Sep 03; RMRB, 20 Sep 03)

Prime ministers of the **Shanghai Cooperation Organization (SCO)** members signed six documents in Beijing on 23 September. The six documents cover multilateral economic and trade cooperation among SCO members, SCO budget for the year 2004, rules and regulations on salary guarantee and allowances for staff members of the SCO permanent body, local anti-terrorism institution [in Tashkent, Uzbekistan] and personnel arrangement, technical initiation of the SCO permanent body, and a joint communique of the consultation. The SCO groups China, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Russia, Tajikistan and Uzbekistan. (XNA, 23 Sep 03; RMRB, 24 Sep 03)

PRC Laws and Regulations

Provisional Measures of the PRC on Customs Supervision of Export Processing Zones, adopted by the State Council on 27 April 2000, Order No. 81 of the General Administration of Customs issued on 24 May 2000, revised on 21 June 2002, and revised according to the "Decision of the State Council on amending the 'Provisional Measures of the PRC on Customs Supervision of Export Processing Zones'" on 2 September 2003. These measures will go into effect as of 1 November 2003. (Decree No. 389 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 2 September 2003) (Full text of the measures and the decision: RMRB, 20 Sep 03) The measures consist of seven chapters with 44 articles.

PRC Certification and Approval Regulations, passed on 20 August 2003 by the 18th executive meeting of the State Council. The regulations will go into effect as of 1 November 2003. (Decree No. 390 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 3 September 2003) (Xinhua, 9 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 17 Sep 03; full text: RMRB, 10 Sep 03) The regulations consist of seven chapters with 78 articles.

China on 30 September published a **regulation on determining workshop injuries**, which will be effective on 1 January of 2004. Under the regulation issued by the Ministry of Labour and Social Security, the employers of the employee injured on duty should apply to the local labour and social security department for confirmation of workshop injuries on the same day the workshop incident happens, while the time limit for those diagnosed with occupational diseases is within 30 days of the diagnosis. But the valid time limit for the application

will be one year if the applicants are the employees with factory injuries, or trade union organizations, according to the regulation. Labour and social security departments should send at least two public servants to investigate the application, and determine within 60 days upon receiving the application, it said. The applicants may apply to the labour department for reappraisal or sue them if they do not agree with the decisions made by the departments, it stipulates. (XNA, 30 Sep 03)

The Ministry of Public Security recently promulgated the **Regulations Governing the Procedures for Public Security Organizations To Handle Administrative Cases**. These regulations comprise a total of 205 articles in 15 sections. Together with the "Regulations Governing the Procedures for Public Security Organizations To Handle Criminal Cases and Administrative Reconsideration Cases", they will constitute a complete system of procedures for public security organizations to handle law-enforcement cases, and give public security organizations a uniform code of practice for the law-enforcement process.

The Ministry of Public Security has issued the regulations to bring police activities under stricter control, in order to stop illegal practices such as torture, threats and deception to secure confessions or investigate offences. The new regulations, which go into force on 1 January 2004, also decree that police officers should respect the dignity of suspects when conducting investigations; must not dish out on-the-spot fines in prostitution cases; and do not exercise administrative detention of people suffering from infectious diseases. Police officers will not be permitted to interview suspects for more than 12 hours at a stretch, but may extend to 24 hours with special permission. Police may not confiscate money and goods of suspects for more than 15 days. People will be permitted to refuse to pay a fine if the police decline to give receipts, which must be printed and issued by financial departments at the provincial level or above. (Xinhua, 8 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 9 Sep 03; XNA, 9 Sep 03; RMRB web site, 9 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 14 Sep 03)

China will ease its control over the foreign exchange purchases of individuals beginning 1 October, according to sources with the China State Administration of Foreign Exchange (SAFE). The new regulation noted that each Chinese resident may purchase foreign exchange worth 3,000 US\$ for each trip abroad, much higher than the original limit of 2,000 US\$, or 1,000 US\$ for those heading for Hong Kong and Macao. The amount for those who will stay abroad for half a year or even longer is 5,000 US\$. Domestic forex payment, including paying membership dues for international organizations and sending money to help overseas relatives, will have a per capita limit of 3,000 US\$ each time. If the amount of foreign exchange purchased domestically does not cover their expenses abroad, the customers can get the amount of foreign exchange they need abroad and make up the amount on their return to China. The foreign exchange purchase service for those who study abroad at their own expense will extend from only college and preparatory college students to all kinds of students. All those who go abroad for study or training at their own expense could purchase enough foreign exchange to cover their school fees and life expenditures. For this group of people, the bank is required to sell the foreign exchange directly to customers if the required purchase is lower than 20,000 US\$ and the customers provide corresponding materials to prove the use of the money. If the required amount is higher than 20,000 US\$, the purchase should be audited by the Foreign Exchange Administration. When travelling abroad, Chinese residents can buy foreign exchange in the bank with their passport, visa and identity card or residence permanent card, the procedure of which is much easier than before. The new regulation also gives Chinese tourists access to bigger foreign exchange purchase as their limit no longer includes fees to travel agencies. For residents travelling to neighbouring countries, the limit for each person every day is 100 US\$ and purchases could not be higher than 500 US\$ each time. SAFE has also adjusted the policy for Chinese citizens to take foreign exchange when going abroad. Chinese citizens can take foreign exchange worth 5,000 US\$ start-

ing from Sept. 1, much higher than the original 2,000 US\$. The government has expanded the service of foreign exchange purchase in a bid to meet its citizens' growing forex demands and prevent illegal trade of forex, said experts. (XNA, 3 Sep 03)

China has put into force a **law giving private schools equal status with state-owned schools** ["Law of the PRC on the Promotion of Privately-Run Educational Institutions", see C.a., 2002/12, p.1475/41, and 2003/2, p.250/26] in what the *Economic Daily* called a marker of the great changes that have taken place in the educational system in the country. The promotion law on non-state educational sectors was put into effect on 1 September at a forum on the development of private educational sector held in the Great Hall of the People, the newspaper reported on 2 September. According to the law, non-state educational sectors can enjoy national and other preferential treatment in running schools. The law also regulates both the government's and investors' activities to safeguard the legal rights and interests of the schools, students and the teaching and administrative staff. Like the state-owned sectors, the private sectors shoulder high responsibilities for senior middle schools, vocational schools, and colleges to train qualified personnel. To date, there are more than 1,300 non-governmental colleges, with a total of three million students. Such colleges, without any investment from the government, have created a value of 300b RMBY (36.1b US\$) for the country over the past decade, said Ding Zuyi, president of the Xian Translations Institute. "In fact, the colleges annually save 30bn RMBY (over 3.6b US\$) in expenses for the country as the annual cost to train and cultivate a college student is about 10,000 RMBY (1,204 US\$)," he said.
