Chairmen and vice-chairmen of autonomous regional governments are equivalent to governors and vice-governors of provinces and to mayors and vice-mayors of Beijing, Chongqing, Shanghai and Tianjin. Year and month behind a name indicate the date the person assumed the post or was identified in this position.

A Central Coordinating Group for Hong Kong and Macau Work (*zhongyang Gang Ao gongzuo xietiao xiaozu*) was established after the "July 1 Protest March" in Hong Kong with Zeng Qinghong, Standing Committee member of the CCP CC Politburo and vice-president of the PRC, as its head. (JB, 2003/11, p.41)

The Work Safety Committee of the State Council held its 1st plenary session on 13 November in Beijing. Vice-Premier Huang Ju, director of the committee and member of the Standing Committee of the CCP CC Politburo, called for more efforts and attention to work safety. The committee is a national work safety watchdog, aiming to enhance national leadership and coordination in work safety. (XNA, 13 Nov 03)

China National Chemicals Import and Export Corporation (Sinochem) officially became Sinochem Corporation on 5 October 2003, in a move to show that China's traditional foreign trading giants were prepared to develop with international competition. Sinochem is the first national foreign trading enterprise to change its name with the approval of the Commission for Supervision and Management of State-owned Properties under the State Council. "The old name could not tell the company's business scope, market orientation and market value, let alone its future development direction," said its president Liu Deshu. "As Sinochem no longer merely deals with imports and exports, it is gradually building its own value chain and supporting industries for core businesses." The petrochemical giant has mainly engaged in the international and domestic trade of petroleum, fertilizers, chemicals and industrial investment. It has also in recent years expanded in finance, insurance, logistics and high-tech investment. Ranked in the Fortune Global 500 for 14 consecutive years from 1989 to 2002, Sinochem boasts 30 million tonnes of crude oil in import and entrepot trade and an industrial chain incorporating oil drilling, refining, trading and distributing. The giant group will keep the shortened forms of its Chinese and English names and logo unchanged as they are name brands and well-known in the global petrochemical industry. (XNA, 5 Nov 03)

Huang called for government departments to make feasible regulations to promote the enforcement of safety law. ment of a supervision system on work safety and the establishment of a national emergency rescue mechanism to enhance the country's ability to deal with serious accidents. The vice-premier also encouraged better supervision by the public and the media. Hui Liangyu,

member of the CCP CC Politburo and vice-premier of the State Council, was identified as chairman of the National Work Committee on Aging. (Xinhua, 20 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 24 Oct 03) He was also identified as head of the National Leading Group for the Work of Supporting the Army, Giving Preferential Treatment to the Families of Armymen and Martyrs, Supporting the Government and Cherishing the People (Double Support Leading Group). Mongolia (Oct 20)

China and Mongolia signed an agreement on tourism cooperation to strengthen friendly relations and to further develop cooperation in tourism. The agreement was signed

in Beijing by He Guangwei, director of China National Tourism Administration and Byambyn Jigjid, minister of infrastructure of Mongolia. ... This agreement came into force on 20 October, and will last for three years. (XNA, 20 Oct 03)

New Zealand (Oct 26)

Visiting Chinese President Hu Jintao and New Zealand Prime Minister Helen Elizabeth Clark attended the signing of three agreements between China and New Zealand, including one on consular affairs and another on scientific and technological cooperation. (XNA, 27 Oct 03)

Sweden (Sep 15)

Jia Chunwang, chief procurator of the Supreme People's Procuratorate and Klas Bergenstrand, prosecutor-general of Sweden's Office of the Prosecutor-General, signed the "Memorandum of Cooperation and Understanding between the Supreme People's Procuratorate of the People's Republic of China and the Office of the Prosecutor-General of the Kingdom of Sweden", deciding to further strengthen cooperation between the two country's prosecutorial organs. (Xinhua, 15 Sep 03, in BBC PF, 24 Oct 03)

Sweden (Oct 23)

Shanghai, China's commercial and financial hub, and Goteborg, the second largest city in Sweden signed an agreement to become sister cities. Shanghai Mayor Han Zheng and Goteborg Mayor Goran Johansson attended the signing ceremony in Shanghai. Goteborg is the 51st foreign sister city of Shanghai. Since establishing friendly ties in 1986, Shanghai and Goteborg have conducted exchanges and co-operation in urban public transport, sewage treatment, and environmental protection. (XNA, 24 Oct 03)

Uzbekistan (Oct 22)

The Chinese Ministry of Public Security has signed an agreement with the Uzbek Ministry of Internal Affairs at a ceremony held in Beijing to give the latter drug research equipment. Yang Huanning, the vice-minister of public security, and Nosirzhon Yusupov, the Uzbek ambassador to China, signed the deal. Under the agreement, China gives laboratory equipment worth 1.12m RMBY [135,487 US\$] to the Uzbek counterparts with

no strings attached. Chinese experts will install it and train specialists in how to use it. Yang Huanning hoped for greater cooperation in bilaterally implementing the Shanghai Convention on the Fight Against Terrorism, Separatism and Extremism outside as well as within the SCO [Shanghai Co-operation Organization]. (Khalq Sozi, Tashkent, 22 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 23 Oct 03)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Norway (Sep 16)

Hong Kong and Norway signed an agreement to avoid double taxation. Secretary for Economic Development and Labour Stephen Ip signed the Avoidance of Double Taxation Agreement on shipping on behalf of the government of the Hong Kong SAR. Representing the Kingdom of Norway at the signing ceremony was the State Secretary to the Ministry of Trade and Industry Helle Hammer. "The agreement is beneficial to both Hong Kong and Norway ship owners as it exempts Hong Kong ship owners from paying tax levied on cargo loaded in Norway, and vice versa. It also strengthens Hong Kong's status as an international shipping centre," said Ip at the signing ceremony. Hong Kong already has similar double taxation relief arrangements on shipping income with major trading partners, including the Chinese mainland, the United States, the United Kingdom, the Netherlands, New Zealand, the Republic of Korea and Germany. "Similar agreements are under discussion with other tax administrations, including Greece, India and Belgium," Ip added. (XNA, 16 Sep 03)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Macau (Oct 13)

The Air Services Arrangement between Hong Kong SAR and Macau SAR came into effect immediately after the signing. The arrangement provides a framework for air service between the two regions. The Secretary for Transport and Public Works Ao Man Long signed the arrangement on behalf of the Macau SAR Government while the Secretary for Economic Development and Labour Stephen Ip represented the Hong Kong SAR Government. ... Under the arrangement, airlines on both sides will enjoy equal

opportunity to operate scheduled services, including helicopter services, between Hong Kong and Macau. (Macau Government Information Bureau web site, www.gcs.gov.mo, XNA, 14 Oct 03)

Macau SAR Agreement with Iceland (Oct 09)

The Civil Aviation Authority of Macau SAR (AACM) and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Iceland and the Icelandic Civil Aviation Administration held a two-day meeting in Macau for the discussion of the Air Services Agreement between the two places. On 9 October, the two sides initialed the Air Services Agreement and signed the respective Memorandum of Understanding. The signatories were Chan Weng Hong, Acting President of AACM and Ólafur Egilsson, Ambassador, Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Iceland. The Agreement established the framework for the scheduled air services between both sides and enhanced the relationship between Macau and Iceland. Macau has initialed 42 Air Services Agreements with other foreign countries, including this present one. Out of these Agreements, 33 have been officially signed. (Macau Government Information Bureau web site, www.gcs.gov.mo, 9 Oct 03)

International Agreements

The United Nations main cultural body UNESCO and the Chinese government signed a memorandum of understanding on 1 October to enhance their partnership in the field of education. In the memorandum, China expressed its willingness to contribute to the development of education worldwide, in particular for developing countries. The Chinese government agreed to host and arrange short-term research and study visits to China for international rural education experts and visiting scholars. China will also launch an inter-regional cooperation project on rural education in Sub-Saharan Africa within the framework of UNESCO's Regional Medium-Term Strategy. The projects will be organized through the International Research and Training Centre for Rural Education (INRULED). UNESCO agreed to keep supporting the Chinese

efforts in education for rural development, education in remote and minority areas, higher education and job-oriented technical and vocational education. UNESCO will also promote the Chinese flagship Project on Environment and Population Education for Development (EDP) within the framework of UNESCO's programme on Education for Sustainable Development. China attaches strategic priority to the development of education and UNESCO projects have made significant progress in China, said Chinese Minister of Education Zhou Ji, who signed the memorandum with UNESCO Director-General Koichiro Matsuura. Zhou is leading the Chinese delegation at the ongoing 32nd general conference of the UNESCO. (XNA, 1 Oct 03)

China and the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) signed on 6 October a **memorandum of understanding on cooperation in information and communications technology (ICT)** in Bali, Indonesia, the venue of the forthcoming 9th ASEAN summit. The document was signed by Chinese Minister of Information and Technology Wang Xudong and ASEAN Secretary-General Ong Keng Yong. It covers various fields of common interest including human resource development; information infrastructure development; technology development; ICT application development; e-ASEAN projects implementation; exchange of information on ICT best practices; compatibility, integrity and security of ICT systems and an annual ASEAN-China ICT seminar. (XNA, 6 Oct 03; full text: ASEAN Secretariat web site, Jakarta, 6 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 8 Oct 03)

China formally joined the **Treaty of Amity and Cooperation in Southeast Asia (TAC)** on 8 October after foreign ministers of China and 10 ASEAN members signed a document on China's accession to the treaty. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and ASEAN leaders witnessed the signing by Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and ASEAN foreign ministers on the document. ASEAN has expressed its hope that China joins the treaty as a non-Southeast Asian country in recent years, according to a press release from the Chinese delegation, which is attending a series

of ASEAN-related meetings. In June 2003, the Chinese National People's Congress approved the country's accession to the treaty. Principles and purpose of the TAC conform to the five principles of peaceful co-existence upheld by China, the press release said. China's accession to the TAC is conducive to the long-term stability and development of relations between China and ASEAN as well as the maintaining of the region's peace and stability, it added. (XNA, 8 Oct 03)

China, Japan and the Republic of Korea (ROK) signed on 7 October a historical document in Bali to promote their tripartite cooperation in regional and international affairs in the new century. The document, **Joint Declaration on the Promotion of Tripartite Cooperation among the People's Republic of China, Japan and the Republic of Korea**, was signed by Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao, Japanese Prime Minister Koizumi Junichiro and ROK President Roh Moo-hyun. "We were convinced that advancing and deepening the tripartite cooperation will not only serve to further promote the stable development of bilateral relations" but also contribute to peace, stability and prosperity throughout East Asia, the document said. PRC Laws and Regulations

Road Traffic Safety Law of the People's Republic of China, passed on 28 October 2003 at the 5th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee. This law will take effect on 1 May 2004. (Presidential Decree No. 8, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 28 October 2003.) This law, which has been deliberated by the NPC Standing Committee four times, consists of eight chapters with 124 articles. (XNA, 28 Oct 03; full text: RMRB, 1 Nov 03)

Security Investment Funds Law of the People's Republic of China, passed on 28 October 2003 at the 5th session of the 10th NPC Standing Committee. This law will take effect on 1 June 2004. (Presidential Decree No. 9, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 28 October 2003.) This law, which has been deliberated by the NPC Standing Committee three times, consists of 12 chapters with 103 articles. (XNA, 28 Oct 03; full text: RMRB, 4 Nov 03)

Regulations on Defence Mobilization of Civil Transportation. The Regulations will come into force on 1 January 2004. (Decree No. 391 of the State Council and the Central Military Commission [CMC] of the PRC, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao and CMC Chairman Jiang Zemin on 11 September 2003) (Full text: RMRB, 16 Oct 03) The regulations consist of seven chapters with 53 articles. (Xinhua, 9 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 13 Oct 03; RMRB web site, 10 Oct 03, in BBC PF, 18 Oct 03)

Rules governing auto financing companies. China has promulgated a set of administrative rules governing auto financing companies (AFCs) as part of its commitments to fulfilling the country's WTO entry obliga-

tions. The rules were issued on 3 October by the China Banking Regulatory Commission (CBRC), with approval from the State Council. Upon its entry into the WTO in December, 2001, China was committed to allowing the establishment of a non-bank financial institution to provide auto financing services. ... The AFCs provide loans for vehicle sales and engage in other financial activities. Containing five chapters with 42 articles, the new rules set forth an AFC's functions, conditions for an AFC's incorporation, change and termination, the business lines permitted to an AFC, and penalties on non-compliance activities of an AFC. ... Consistent with the promulgation of the rules, a set of corresponding implementation rules formulated by the CBRC will be promulgated soon, according to a CBRC source. (XNA, 5 Oct 03; full text: RMRB, 5 Oct 03)

AFCs are ready to compete with commercial banks for the Chinese auto finance market following new regulations that allow domestic and foreign firms to provide auto loans to customers. Under the rules ... companies with total assets over 4b RMBY (480m US\$) and registered capital over 500m RMBY (60m US\$) are eligible to set up business. Unlike commercial banks that mainly deal with loans, AFCs set up by large auto groups are capable of offering "one-stop" services, including extending loans or providing guarantees for such loans, purchasing cars and after-sales service like car maintenance. AFCs can also reduce their loan rates to zero to attract car buyers, though it is still not possible under present tight controls on interest rates. ... Foreign auto giants are closely watching the market as the rules, part of China's WTO commitments, have removed their final market barrier. Germany's Volkswagen and US-based General Motors and Ford have made preparations for car finance businesses in China and begun to apply for operating licenses. ... Although car loans to individuals had increased sharply since 1998, less than 20 percent of car buyers purchase with credit, against 70 percent in developed countries. Car manufacturers predict that with the move to boost the auto market, car sales will rise by 20 percent while the average price drops by 5 percent. (XNA, 18 Oct 03)

The Chinese central bank has issued a regulation on the management of foreign exchange agencies, which will take effect on 1 November. The regulation only allows foreign exchange agencies to change the convertible foreign currencies in cash or travel notes to Renminbi, but forbids foreign exchange purchase with Renminbi. Domestic residents and Chinese nationals living abroad on Chinese passport should buy foreign exchange they need from the concerned banks with Renminbi when heading abroad. Non-domestic residents, foreigners or residents from Hong Kong, Macau and Taiwan, should go to the banks specified by the foreign exchange agency if they want to change the Renminbi they got from the foreign exchange agency back to foreign currency. The amount of exchange should be no higher than the original foreign exchange and the business should be performed within six months after the last foreign exchange transaction. Foreign exchange agencies refer to those domestic corporations authorized by the qualified domestic banks to have foreign exchange business by contract. According to the regulation, all corporations registered in China could apply to banks with foreign exchange business for authorization of the business and concerned banks could authorize any domestic corporations the rights to start this business. Those foreign exchange agencies set up before the regulation should make up the application procedure within two months after the regulation takes effect. If they fail to make up the application, they will not be allowed to have the foreign exchange business again. (XNA, 18 Oct 03; RMRB, 20 Oct 03)

China's courts at all levels will improve the efficiency and quality of judges by no longer allowing the position to be taken by clerks who work their way up, according to a news conference held on 27 October by the Supreme People's Court. Earlier this month, the **Provisional Measures on Clerk Administration in the People's Court** were jointly issued by the CCP CC Organization Department, the Personnel Ministry and the Supreme Court. The clerks, to be employed in the courts, are defined by the new measures as assistant person-

nel for judiciary affairs, such as taking notes, and they can not become judges any longer despite holding the post for a long time. Since New China was founded half of century ago, the clerks in the courts have been regarded as administrative cadres as well as the judges and they were promoted under the model from clerks to assistant judges to judges. Becoming a clerk was considered training for future work as a judge. As a result, the number of judges has been growing while the ratio of judges to clerks has been badly disproportionate, bringing a negative influence to the trials. Statistics show there were more than 300,000 personnel in the courts at all levels by the end of last year with nearly two thirds of them judges and only about 40,000 clerks in a reverse-pyramid construction. ... Instability and shortage of clerks in many courts forced the judges to do such jobs as taking notes and filing documents, which were not their own business, resulting in low efficiency in judgments. ... However, clerks were required to be professionals with a high educational level even in the beginning, and some were masters or doctors, which caused a waste of professional resources. ... According to the director of the Political Department in the Supreme Court, the Supreme Court is considering establishing the system of selecting judges from the lower level courts for the higher level ones and selecting them from legal professionals. (XNA, 27 Oct 03; RMRB, 28 Oct 03)
