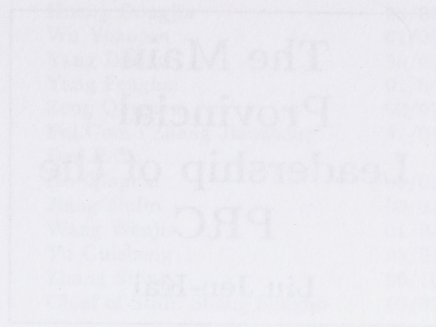

Australia (Apr 19)

The memorandum of the understanding on Sino-Australian educational cooperation programme kicked off a new stage for China to improve its overseas study service, said an official with the Ministry of Education (MOE), in Beijing on 19 April. At the signing ceremony of the memorandum with the International Education Development Project (IDP) of Australia, Cao Guoxing, director of the International Department of the MOE said China's education system, despite rapid progress in recent years, still cannot satisfy the tremendous needs of the Chinese people. Therefore, the Chinese government is opening up new channels to seek credible partners abroad, and in the meantime support local educational organizations to carry out international cooperation. Cao pointed out the China and Australia plan to carry out a series of cooperative programmes, including giving preparatory lessons recognized by Australian universities, and setting up lessons that enable Chinese students to transfer to any Australian universities at any stage of their education. Training

for government officials and company management staff will also be a major part of the cooperative programme, Cao said. According to MOE, IDP is a well-known international education organization consisting of all 83 Australian universities and colleges. With more than 90 agencies worldwide, IDP enrolls more than 20,000 overseas students on behalf of the Australian universities. (XNA, 19 Apr 04)

Canada (Apr 29)

China and Canada signed two project agreements in Beijing to further agricultural cooperation. Under the Sustainable Agricultural Development Project (Phase II), the Canadian International Development Agency (CIDA) will provide expertise and training to develop sustainable land-use practices in northwest China. Under the Livestock Health Extension Services Project, the CIDA will provide expertise and training to assist poor farming households in western China by improving their access to technical services and information needed for raising livestock. The two agreements were signed by Canadian Ambassador to China Joseph Caron and Assistant Minister of Commerce of China Yi Xiaozhun. The assistance will sum up to 39.7m Canadian dollars (about 29.85m US\$). Since China and Canada started the development cooperation programme in 1982, the Canadian government has provided 200m US\$ worth of assistance in the last two decades, involving agriculture, energy, traffic, education, communication and environmental protection. Cambodia (Apr 20)

Following the meeting between Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Cambodian Prime Minister Hun Sen, China and Cambodia signed the "People's Republic of China-Kingdom of Cambodia Agreement on Economic and Technical Cooperation" and nine other documents on bilateral cooperation. (Xinhua, 20 Apr 04, in BBC PF, 21 Apr 04)

Cook Islands (Apr 28)

After the talks between Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Prime Minister Robert Woonton of the Cook Islands, the two sides signed an economic and technological cooperation agreement. (XNA, 28 Apr 04)

Iceland (Apr 12)

China and Iceland signed in Beijing the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on visa and related issues for group Chinese tourists to travel to Iceland. Experts cited the signing of MOU as a crucial measure to enlarge Chinese citizens' group travel to European destinations, which will further promote bilateral exchanges of people's visits and also signifies that China is becoming increasingly open in outbound tourism market. The exact date for Chinese travel agencies to allow organized groups to travel to Europe is yet to be finalized. Currently, China and European nations which already signed MOU are busy exchanging travel agency namelists and preparing for business contracts. When all these preparations are ready, group tourism can be launched. Up to now, China has approved a total of 57 nations for group Chinese tourists, with 41 nations signed MOU and 26 already in operation. (XNA, 12 Apr 04)

Latvia (Apr 15)

After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Latvian President Vaira Vike-Freiberga, the two sides signed six documents including an agreement on visa exemption between the Macau SAR and Latvia. (XNA, 15 Apr 04)

Mozambique (Apr 05)

After the talks between Chinese President Hu Jintao and visiting Mozambican President Joaquim Alberto Chissano, Hu and Chissano attended a signing ceremony of two official documents on trade and economic cooperation. (XNA, 5 Apr 04)

Pakistan (Apr 08)

After the talks between Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and visiting Pakistani Foreign Minister Mian Khurshid Mahmood Kasuri, Li and Kasuri signed an cooperative accord between Chinese and Pakistani foreign ministries. (XNA, 8 Apr 04)

Saudi Arabia (Apr 03)

Saudi Arabia and China inked a final bilateral agreement on commodity price and service lists in Riyadh as part of its effort to join the World Trade Organization (WTO). The deal was signed by Deputy Minister of Saudi Trade and Industry Fawaz al-Alamy and Chinese Assistant Minis-

ter of Commerce Yi Xiaozhun. Both sides agreed that Saudi Arabia's WTO membership will be beneficial to both countries as well as other WTO members. Addressing the signing ceremony, the Chinese official said the deal is a major event in Chinese-Saudi economic and trade relations, emphasizing that it will greatly contribute to pushing forward bilateral economic and trade cooperation. In 2003, trade exchange between the two nations hit 7.34b US\$, he said, adding that China's crude imports from Saudi Arabia reached 15.18 million tons. For his part, the Saudi official said his country appreciates China's support for its bid to join the WTO, stressing that the significant deal would help reinforce economic and trade relations between the two nations. Saudi Arabia has so far concluded some 31 agreements with WTO member countries, and another four final bilateral deals are expected to be signed in weeks, Al-Alamy said. (XNA, 4 Apr 04)

United Arab Emirates (Apr 21)

China and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) signed an agreement on judiciary assistance in civil and business fields. The judiciary agreement is expected to play an important role in enhancing bilateral relations, maintaining social order and regular trade of the two countries, said Chinese Minister of Justice Zhang Fusen at the signing ceremony. China and the UAE have seen a rapid progress in politics and trade exchanges since the establishment of diplomatic ties, and conducted sound cooperation in various fields, said Zhang. China is willing to join hands with the UAE to push forward the long-term, stable and healthy Sino-UAE cooperation. Zhang said based on the agreement on extradition signed in May 2002 between the two countries and the agreement signed on 21 April, China pledges to further expand judiciary cooperation with UAE, notably cooperation in the criminal sector. As two developing countries, China and the UAE are working to promote judiciary reform in a bid to safeguard citizens' legitimate rights and economic and social order, said Zhang. (XNA, 21 Apr 04)

United States (Apr 06)

The General Administration of Civil Aviation of China (CAAC) and

US Trade and Development Agency (TDA) signed in Beijing the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on aviation cooperation programme. According to the MOU, the TDA will coordinate US aviation enterprises to provide aid to China-US aviation cooperation projects, which will be used in personnel training of flight standard supervisors, accident investigators and air traffic control specialists. CAAC Director Yang Yuanyuan said China's civil aviation industry should learn from its American counterparts. The signing of the MOU is a good chance for both sides, which will be beneficial to exchanges. TDA director Thelma J. Askey said the TDA hoped to establish long-term mutual beneficial cooperative relations with the CAAC, in order to choose the best solution for China's civil aviation construction. The signing of the MOU is one of the achievements of US Administrator of Federal Aviation Administration Marion C. Blakey, who paid a visit here in February. She and Yang Yuanyuan signed an agreement on further strengthening aviation cooperation. (XNA, 6 Apr 04)

Uruguay (Apr 15)

Uruguay's capital Montevideo and China's Qingdao City became sister cities after representatives from the two cities signed an agreement in Montevideo. The establishment of sister city ties will help boost mutual understanding and friendship between peoples of the two countries, said the agreement. Under the principle of mutual benefit, the two sides will carry out cooperation in the fields of economy, trade, science and technology, culture, education, sports and personnel exchanges. Montevideo, a city with a history of some 300 years, is Uruguay's center of politics, economy, trade, finance and culture while Qingdao is an important port city in Shandong Province, East China. (XNA, 16 Apr 04)

Vietnam (Apr 14)

The ministries of public securities of China and Vietnam signed in Hanoi a memorandum of understanding (MOU) on dealing with crimes and ensuring security in the two countries' border areas. The MOU was inked at the first meeting on the issues, which concluded on 14 April with the participation of the Chinese delegation led by

Zhao Yongji, deputy minister of public security of China, and Vietnamese delegation led by Nguyen Khanh Toan, deputy minister of public security of Vietnam. Under the MOU, the two public security delegations to the one-day meeting agreed to take practical measures to prevent trafficking of women, children, drugs and counterfeit money, and crimes relating to weapons and explosives via the borders. The two sides also reached consensus on tightening management over entry-exit activities to prevent illegal immigration, and holding meetings on a regular basis at both central and local levels. They agreed that the two ministries will take turns to hold a meeting on fighting crimes and ensuring security and social order on a biannual basis. Besides, police of bordering provinces and autonomous regions of China and Vietnam are to meet annually, and police of bordering districts and towns are to gather regularly and irregularly according to their work. Specifically, the two ministries agreed that the next meeting will be held in China's Beijing in 2006. (XNA, 14 Apr 04)

Vietnam (Apr 29)

The Complementary Protocol on the China-Vietnam Agreement on Fishery Cooperation (AFC) in Beibu Bay was signed in Beijing. The protocol detailed the range and management of waters in transitional arrangement which was defined in the AFC. The AFC was signed in December 2000 and is expected to take effect before 30 June 2004. The two countries began negotiation on demarcation problems in Beibu Bay since 1993. To solve the fishery problems following the demarcation, the two parties began negotiation on fishery cooperation since 2000. Experts noted that the signing of AFC will help minimize the influence of the two agreements on current fishing situations in the region, as it sets a common fishery zone, waters in transitional arrangement and buffer zone for small-sized fishing boats. It will also help promote the protection of fishery resources in the region and make positive contribution to the development of a friendly relationship between the two countries. (XNA, 29 Apr 04)

International Agreements

Transport vehicles of China, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan and Pakistan will be allowed to pass through the territories of the other three, beginning 15 May this year. The four nations signed an agreement on transit transportation in Urumqi, capital of Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region, on 13 April. The agreement agrees on permits for transit shipping vehicles, unifying vehicle standards, taxation on transit transport and time for operation of transit transportation. The four countries agreed that Pakistan would be responsible for printing the permits for transit transport vehicles and the other three countries would provide stamps of the permits to Pakistan. Each of the four countries will get 200 permits for this year before 30 April, according to the agreement. The four sides also agreed that the size of transport vehicle will not be longer than 20 metres, no more than 2.55 metres wide and no more than four metres high, with a dead weight of no more than 38 tons. Special permits will be issued for transporting huge items that can not be disassembled. Transit vehicles will be exempted from fees for passing through the territory of other countries, and fees for road maintenance. Other fees, such as those charged for passing bridges and tunnels, will be charged according to the practice of each of the four countries. ... The four countries first reached an agreement on transit transportation in 1995. (XNA, 14 Apr 04)

China joined the South Pacific Tourism Organization (SPTO) on 20 April, becoming the organization's first member from outside the region. Officials attending the ceremony held in Suva, capital of South Pacific island state of Fiji, said China's presence in the organization will help boost the regional tourism and enhance the understanding between China and the island countries. Reports quoted Chinese Ambassador to Fiji Cai Jinbiao as telling the ceremony that China attaches great importance to developing relations with South Pacific countries. As the world's most important tourist market, China is willing to share with South Pacific countries the experience and the profits in the development of tourism, he said. On behalf of SPTO, the CEO of Fiji's Tourism Ministry

Ratu Napolioni Masirewa welcomed China to be the organization's 13th member state. He pointed out that China, with her great market potentials, will not only bring in economic benefits, but serve to encourage more powers from outside the region to join the SPTO. The SPTO, established in 1986 and based in Suva, is a regional inter-governmental organization for the joint promotion of the region as a tourist destination. Besides China, the SPTO has 12 other member countries or regions: the Cook Islands, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiritati, New Caledonia, Niue, Papua New Guinea, Samoa, the Solomon Islands, Tanga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. (XNA, 20 Apr 04)

A total of 23 countries signed a historic agreement in Shanghai on 26 April to connect their highways into a cross-Asia network. China, Japan, Mongolia, Kazakhstan, Pakistan, the Republic of Korea, Turkey and others signed the Intergovernmental Agreement on the Asian Highway Network at the Ministerial Segment of the 60th Session of the United Nations Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific (ESCAP). The total length of the highway network is 140,000 km, connecting capitals, major ports, commercial and industrial centres and tourist sites of the signatory nations. This agreement is the ESCAP's first intergovernmental agreement since the organization was founded 57 years ago. It is regarded as a significant step for promoting regional integration and cooperation. After completion of the network by the year 2010, vehicles from Tokyo can travel directly to Istanbul. Even island countries like Japan, the Philippines and Sri Lanka, will be linked through ferries to mainland countries. "It means that many landlocked countries like Mongolia and Kazakhstan can have access to the sea by joining the Asian Highway network, and more sub-regions can be connected together," said Barry Cable, chief of the Transport and Tourism Division of the ESCAP. Indonesia, Iran and Vietnam were among the other countries which signed the agreement. Chinese Minister of Communications Zhang Chunxian signed the agreement on behalf of his government. As a crucial part of the Asia Highway Network, China has

a total of 26,000-km highways within the network, accounting for 19 per cent of the network's total length. Besides the existing 11,000 km of highway, China will build another 15,000 km of new road for the network, which will be completed by 2010. Zhang told Xinhua that the Asian Highway Network might help China to expand further cooperation with the neighbouring southeast and central Asian nations over border-crossing transport, and accelerate regional integration and economic cooperation. "It will also create opportunities for China's western areas to do more trade with the neighbouring countries," said Zhang. The convenient transport conditions may also help boost China's international tourism, especially with the neighbouring countries. According to the ESCAP, signing the agreement on the Asian Highway Network does not mean a real "free" cross-border transport along the enrolled routes. A series of follow-up work has to be done after the member countries signed the agreement, said Cable, adding that more efforts are still needed in bilateral or multilateral negotiations on border-crossing issues during trade and transport. The plan of an Asian Highway Network was initiated in the year 1959 and, in 2003, representatives of 32 ESCAP member countries adopted the Intergovernmental Agreement on the Asian Highway Network in Bangkok, Thailand. Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Singapore (Apr 01)

Hong Kong and Singapore signed a memorandum of understanding to foster active bilateral cultural and arts exchanges. The memorandum, signed by Hong Kong Secretary for Home Affairs Patrick Ho and Singaporean Minister for Information, Communications & Arts Lee Boon Yang, is another milestone in the warm relations between the two places. Ho said the move will help inspire innovative ideas and bring long-term benefits to both places. ... (XNA, 1 Apr 04)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Kuwait (Apr 07)

Hong Kong Secretary for Economic Development and Labor Stephen Ip signed on 7 April an Air Services

Agreement on behalf of the government of the HKSAR with the government of the State of Kuwait in Kuwait. According to a government press release Wednesday, representing the government of the State of Kuwait at the signing ceremony was Al-Sabah, minister of telecommunications, minister of planning and state minister for administrative development. ... The Air Services Agreement with Kuwait is Hong Kong's 51st air services agreement with foreign aviation partners. (XNA, 7 Apr 04)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the PRC (Apr 07)

Aviation officials from Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland signed a cooperation arrangement on aircraft accident investigation and search and rescue. Under the arrangement, Chinese mainland assistance will be sought for search and rescue and wreckage salvage if an aircraft accident or serious incident occurs in Hong Kong's Flight Information Region, an area of 276,000 square kilometers extending over the South China Sea, according to a government release. Both Hong Kong and the Chinese mainland will also be responsible for ensuring that an investigation into the incident is organized, and acting as a "Rescue Coordination Center" depending on the location and the aircraft's state or place of registry. Hong Kong Civil Aviation Director-General Albert Lam and Wang Suifa, director-general of the Office of Aviation Safety of the General Administration of Civil Aviation of China, signed the arrangement. ... (XNA, 7 Apr 04)

Macau SAR Agreement with Latvia (Apr 15)

With the authorization from the Central Government, Macau signed an agreement on mutual visa exemption with Latvia at the People's Hall in Beijing. Under the witness of President Hu Jintao and the President of the Republic of Latvia Vaira Vike-Freiberga, the Secretary for Administration and Justice of Macau SAR Florinda Chan and the State Secretary of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Sr. Maris Riekstins signed the agreement on behalf of the two governments. Latvia is the 46th country granted visa-free access to holders

of the Macau SAR passport. In addition, Macau SAR Passport holders may also enter 12 other regions visa-free. (Macau Government Information Bureau web site, www.gcs.gov.mo, 15 Apr 04; XNA, 15 Apr 04)

Macau SAR Agreement with the PRC (Apr 16)

Two agreements on product origin requirements and quarantine cooperation were signed under the framework of the Mainland/Macau Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement (CEPA) in Macau. The two agreements, signed by the State Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine and the Macau SAR government, aim to intensify customs cooperation in facilitating logistic flow of Macau's zero-tariff products to the mainland as well as quarantine inspection and food safety. CEPA, which took effect on 1 January this year, sets the legal framework for the endeavours to phase out tariffs and non-tariff goods trade barriers, phase in liberalization of services trade, and promote trade and investment facilitation for common development. Under the product origin agreements, the two sides pledged to set up three joint teams responsible for assessing product origin, evaluating household appliances and textile products which would allow a smooth flow of Macau's CEPA products to enter the mainland market while ensuring product quality and safety. The food safety agreement will see to a closer cooperation on the control of product quality and food safety through intelligence exchanges, share of laboratory resources and facilitation of legal and administrative procedures. Macau SAR Agreement with the PRC (Apr 26-30)

During his stay in Beijing, he witnessed the signing of two cooperation agreements between Macau and the Mainland on the areas of harmful waste control and sea vessels classification respectively. PRC Laws and Regulations

Foreign Trade Law of the People's Republic of China, amended and adopted at the 8th session of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 6 April 2004, and the amended "Foreign Trade Law of the People's Republic of China" is hereby promulgated and will come into force with effect from 1 July 2004. (Presidential Decree No. 15, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 6 April 2004) The law consists of 11 chapters with 70 articles. (Xinhua, 6 Apr 04, in BBC PF, 8 Apr 04; full text: RMRB, 10 Apr 04) China amended its 10-year-old trade law to further gear to the rules of the WTO and promote trade growth. The amended trade law, passed by the NPC Standing Committee, met the needs for further progress in trade, the market economy, the implementation of its promise to the WTO and the acceleration of rule of law, said Yu Guangzhou, vice-minister of commerce. The new law modified some items to fit WTO rules and China's commitments upon accession, such as foreign trade rights for all companies and individuals. It also highlighted China's rights as WTO member, such as investigating foreign trade partners and trade relief for enterprises, and the protection of intellectual property rights, including a whole chapter on the protection of trade-related aspects of intellectual property rights (TRIPS). The Ministry of Commerce will formulate follow-up regulations and rules to better implement the revised law and facilitate trade, Yu said. With a booming economy, China's foreign trade witnessed remarkable growth in the past decade. Total foreign trade exceeded 850b US\$ last year, which makes China the fourth largest trade partner in the

world, compared to the 11th largest 10 years ago. The amended law will be effective as of 1 July this year. (XNA, 6 Apr 04)

Anti-dumping Regulations of the People's Republic of China. (Decree No. 328 of the State Council, made public on 26 November 2001, and revised according to the "Decision of the State Council on amending the 'Anti-dumping Regulations of the PRC'" on 31 March 2004) (Decree No. 401 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 31 March 2004) The regulations consist of six chapters with 59 articles. (Full text of the decision and the regulations: RMRB, 19 Apr 04)

China made public its revised edition of anti-dumping regulations on 15 April, which will go into effect on 1 June. The amendment allows the Ministry of Commerce to suspend or terminate anti-dumping investigations and not impose temporary anti-dumping measures or tariffs if the company involved agrees to raise its prices to a level that does not harm the general public. The ministry may continue its investigation at the request of the exporter after suspending or terminating an anti-dumping investigation according to law. The ministry may impose anti-dumping tariffs on products if the ruling of its final judgment is in favour of the dumping charges, and the dumping hurts local industry. The regulation is comprised of 59 articles in six chapters, including general rules, dumping and damage, anti-dumping investigation, anti-dumping measures, anti-dumping tariffs, and period and reviews of price undertaking, and supplementary articles. China promulgated its first regulations on anti-dumping in 1997. (XNA, 15 Apr 04)

Anti-subsidy Regulations of the People's Republic of China. (Decree No. 329 of the State Council, made public on 26 November 2001, and revised according to the "Decision of the State Council on amending the 'Anti-subsidy Regulations of the PRC'" on 31 March 2004) (Decree No. 402 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 31 March 2004) The regulations consist of six chapters with 58 articles. (Full text of the decision and the regulations: RMRB, 24 Apr 04)

China made public its revised edition of anti-subsidy regulations on 16 April, which will go into effect on 1 June. One of the major changes to China's anti-subsidy statute is a regulation stipulating that imposing anti-subsidy tariffs should be in compliance with the public interest. Item I of Article 34 has been changed to "the Ministry of Commerce may decide on suspending or terminating anti-subsidy investigations and not impose temporary anti-subsidy measures or tariffs if it deems that the undertaking (offered by the party involved) is acceptable and in the public interest." The name of the Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation (MOFTEC), which was abolished and became part of the Ministry of Commerce, has been substituted by the latter in the revised statute. The name of another abolished government department, the State Economic and Trade Commission was eliminated in the new regulations. ... China promulgated its first anti-subsidy regulations in 2001, which became valid from 1 January, 2002. (XNA, 16 Apr 04)

Decision of the State Council on amending the "Regulations of the People's Republic of China on Safeguard Measures", which will take effect on 1 June 2004. (Decree No. 330 of the State Council, made public on 26 November 2001, and revised according to the "Decision of the State Council on amending the 'Regulations of the PRC on Safeguard Measures'" on 31 March 2004) (Decree No. 403 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 31 March 2004) The law consists of five chapters with 34 articles. (Full text of the law and the decision: RMRB, 8 May 04)

The China Banking Regulatory Commission (CBRC) on 6 April promulgated **rules governing transactions between commercial banks and affiliated parties**, reported the *China Daily* on 7 April. The new rules, to be effective as of 1 May, will tighten supervision of Chinese banking institutions, many of which are undergoing restructuring. The rules give a detailed definition of "affiliated transactions" and list the different types of transactions. Affiliated parties typically include shareholders and senior bank management. "Huge risks are hidden in unfair affiliated transactions

between commercial banks and their affiliated parties, which seriously undermine the safe and stable functioning of commercial banks," a CBRC spokesperson was quoted as saying. (XNA, 7 Apr 04)

The Chinese Ministry of Commerce issued a **new regulation on commercial enterprises with foreign investment** on 16 April, reducing restrictions on these enterprises. The new regulation will take effect June 1, when the regulation on experiments of commercial enterprises with foreign investment jointly issued by the former State Economic and Trade Commission and former Ministry of Foreign Trade and Economic Cooperation in 1999 will be abolished. There are two major changes in the new regulation from the old one. One is that the concept "experiments" has been abandoned, and the other is that restrictions on the number, stock holdings and business scope of these enterprises have been reduced. The ministry said the new law added the commitments that China made in its access to the World Trade Organization. With the new regulation, it becomes easier for enterprises to enter the market and examining and approving procedures are also simplified. According to the new regulation, after December 11, commercial enterprises with foreign investment engaged in wholesale can do business relating to medicine and agricultural chemicals and plastic films. Besides these products, commercial enterprises with foreign investment engaged in retail can also do business related to refined oil. After 11 February 2006, commercial enterprises with foreign investment engaged in wholesale can do business related to chemical fertilizer, refined oil and raw oil. Commercial enterprises with foreign investment engaged in retail can do business related to chemical fertilizer after 11 December 2006. The regulation still does not permit these enterprises to engage in tobacco business. According to the new regulation, commercial enterprises completely foreign invested will be permitted to be set up from 11 December. And also from this day, commercial enterprises with foreign investment engaged in retail will no longer be limited in provincial capital. According to statistics from the ministry, China's commercial field has

used foreign funds of more than 3b US\$ since it established experiments of commercial enterprises with foreign investment. Up to now, there are more than 270 such enterprises and more than 2,200 branches. (XNA, 16 Apr 04)

Regulation allows private-management of urban utilities.

After a year of experimenting, China has decided its policy on the private sector's entry into urban utilities once monopolized by the government. A regulation made public on 21 April says that private investors could run water, gas and heat supply, public transportation, and water and trash treatment if they win public bids and get the franchise from the government. However, they can only run for 30 years at most, and their companies would be taken over if the government believed after a due procedure that they threatened the public security. "We started the pilot in 2003, and discovered some local governments have given the investors over-long franchise terms or promised fixed rates of return," said Li Dongxu, a Construction Ministry official responsible for urban infrastructure. While giving the government more power, the regulation also protects investors from government's abuse of power, said Li. The regulation states that the government, when breaching contracts, must pay for losses of investors and compensate those who bear losses for abiding by its order for public good. "Our purpose is to establish a good surveillance system and a good rule to play the game at the same time. Only in this way, can the market of urban utilities be smoothly opened," said Li. (XNA, 21 Apr 04)

The Chinese government will foot the bill for those who voluntarily receive HIV/AIDS tests and consultations, said the Ministry of Health on 14 April. According to a regulation made public by the Ministry of Health and the Ministry of Finance, the Chinese people can receive free of charge, if they want, the ELISA and PNA HIV tests, two preliminary tests for detecting HIV, and related consultations. According to the regulation, the central government pay for the tests in the AIDS-stricken areas while the local governments in other areas pay themselves. "This is to identify the

most possible positive individuals, and thus control the spread of the disease," said a ministry official. The Health Ministry estimates that China has 840,000 people infected with HIV. However, only 7.4 per cent of them are registered and thus can be monitored. With shared syringes remaining the number one killer, sexual transmission cases have soared in recent years. According to Chinese Vice-Premier Wu Yi, the disease has reached the turning point from high-risk population infection to universal epidemic. (XNA, 14 Apr 04)

The State Council published the **Provisions on Animal Pharmacy** on 30 April, in an effort to bring the manufacturing and sales of animal drugs under better control. The statute, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao, contains 75 articles in nine chapters. Animal medicine will be divided into two categories – those that have to be sold in accordance with veterinarian's prescription and others that do not need the prescription, the statute says. The government will reserve animal medicine that will be used when there occurs any major spreading of animal diseases, according to the provisions. The related authorities will monitor the safety of animal drugs, it says. The statute goes into force on November 1, 2004. (XNA, 30 Apr 04)
