Chairmen and vice-chairmen of autonomous regional governments are equivalent to governors and vice-governors of provinces and to mayors and vice-mayors of Beijing, Chongqing, Shanghai and Tianjin. Year and month behind a name indicate the date the person assumed the post or was identified in this position.

China National Petroleum Corp (CNPC), the largest oil producer in the country, has formed an offshore oil engineering subsidiary, signifying a fresh move to exploit oil in its waters. Traditionally, offshore oil production was dominated by China's National Offshore Oil Corp (CNOOC), China's third largest oil producer. Although CNPC and China's largest oil refiner Sinopec have repeatedly voiced their aspiration of "going offshore", the set-up of the new firm was the country's first-ever actual move in this regard. The new subsidiary, named the China National Petroleum Offshore Engineering Co. Ltd. (CNPOEC, *Zhongguo shiyou jitan haiyang gongcheng youxian gongsi*), was established on 3 November 2004 by streamlining the drilling, construction, engineering assets and design institutions of its two subsidiaries - Liaohe Oil Exploration Bureau and Dagang Petroleum Group. The engineering firm will mainly do offshore well-drilling, engineering, design and maintenance of offshore oil production platform. At present, CNPC turns out about 1 million tons of oil in shallow waters in Bohai Bay, less than one percent of its total production. With more substantial effort throwing into offshore exploration, CNPC plans to pump out 4 million tons of crude in Chinese waters by the year 2010. "The setup of CNPOEC is a strategic step for CNPC to speed up offshore oil exploration," said Liu Haisheng, chairman of CNPOEC, at the launching ceremony. The company has already made "surprisingly encouraging" discoveries in Liaohe, Dagang and Jidong oilfields in the Bohai Bay area recently. Shi Lin, general manager of CNPOEC, said the launch of his company is also significant for CNPC anchor in its drive for overseas expansion. CNPC is negotiating to tap offshore oil in foreign countries. And the potential reserves could be "much larger" than the CNPC's domestic offshore oil production, added Shi. CNOOC appears calm to CNPOEC's potential threat to its dominance in offshore oil production, saying that "competition could promote sound development of the oil industry". The company also expressed its resolve to speed up development of onshore oil exploration and oil products. Shi acknowledged that there was enough market for both companies. "It is not a problem of competition, but a problem of too large a market," he said. "We cannot finish our current work for at least the next three or five years." China's offshore oil has been less exploited compared to onshore exploration. More than 80 percent of offshore oil reserves, predicted to be 27.53 billion tons, has not been identified yet. Algeria (Oct 13)

Representatives of the enterprises from China's southern province of Guangdong and Algeria signed eight cooperation agreements worth 196m US\$ in Algiers. The agreements involve bilateral cooperation in investment, project contract, and import-export trade. Zhang Dejiang, member of the CCP CC Politburo and secretary of CCP Guangdong Provincial Committee, attended the signing ceremony. China and Algeria have witnessed rapid growth in their economic and trade relations in recent years. The two-way trade volume totalled 740m US\$ in 2003. In the first half of this year, bilateral trade hit a record high of 530m US\$, up 63 per cent from the same period last year. (XNA, 14 Oct 04)

Azerbaijan (Oct 23)

Azerbaijani Economic Development Minister Farhad Aliyev and visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing have signed an agreement to allocate 1.2m US\$ to Azerbaijan. ... This amount will be spent on developing businesses in Azerbaijan and constructing a business centre to be used as an exhibition of Azerbaijani goods. ... (ANS TV, Baku, 23 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 24 Oct 04)

France (Oct 09)

China and France signed 20 agreements during French President Jacques Chirac's five-day state visit to China, concerning environmental protection, railway, aviation, agriculture, telecommunication and finance. The agreements include:

- Agreement between China and France for the promotion of the clean development mechanism under Article 12 of the Kyoto Protocol;
- Agreement between China and France for the prevention and control of emergent infectious maladies;
- Agreement between China and France for the cooperation in the domain of information technology;
- Agreement for cooperation between Chinese Ministry of Railways and French Ministry of Equipment, Transport, Territory Management, Tourism and Maritime Affairs;
- Agreement for movie cooperation between Chinese State Administration of Radio, Film and Television and French Ministry of Culture and Communication;
- Framework agreement between the French Development Agency and Chinese Ministry of Finance;
- Procurement contract of railway electric multiple units with velocity of 200 kph;
- MOU between China and France on wheat trade and technology cooperation;
- Notification of contract awarding the project for the purchasing high power AC electric transmission locomotives and importing the relative technologies;
- Cooperation framework agreement on advanced medium utility helicopter programme between China Aviation Industry Corporation and Eurocopter;
- Agreement on TCL Group and Alcatel Group's joint-venture on handset business;
- MOU between Chinese Wangxiang Group and French Dassault Group in electronic vehicle;
- Qingdao Sino-French Hairun Water Supply Co Ltd contract amendment and supplement;
- Amendment No 1 to the A319 purchase agreement;
- A330 purchase agreement between China Eastern Airlines Corporation Limited and Airbus SAS;
- Protocol for development of industrial cooperation between China Avia-

tion Industry Corporation and Airbus SAS;

- MOU on business terms sheet between Chinese Lenovo Group Ltd and a French partner;
- Outline of China Telecom and France Telecom strategic partnership-cooperation;
- MOU between Alstom and Dongfang Electric Corporation; and
- Letter of Intent among Bank of China Group Insurance Company Ltd, Dongfeng Peugeot Citroen Automobiles Company Ltd, PSA Finance Netherlands Bank and PSA Finance Bank of China Ltd. (XNA, 10 Oct 04; RMRB, 11 Oct 04)

A total of 20 agreements and contracts were signed in the presence of the French and Chinese heads of state in Beijing on 9 October, including six on the part of the government and 14 on the part of industrial firms.

At around 1.4bn euros, Alstom has won the biggest contracts on the occasion of Jacques Chirac's visit to China, which is markedly economic in tone. The group, headed by Patrick Kron, is selling 60 Emu locomotive trains, 51 of them to be built on-site by its Chinese partner, Changchun Railways, at a cost of 620m euros. It will also deliver 180 freight locomotives (costing 380m euros), and in the energy sector it has signed two contracts to supply hydroelectric equipment to three Chinese provinces (at a cost of 357m euros).

Airbus, which did not sell any A380 aircraft, despite French hopes, is to deliver six A319 planes [to Air China] and has signed an industrial cooperation agreement, which will double the volume of business passed on to Chinese sub-contractors between 2007 and 2010. The aircraft manufacturer also secured confirmation of an order for 20 A330-200 aircraft from China Eastern Airlines.

Eurocopter, a subsidiary of the EADS group, has signed an agreement for the joint development of a medium tonnage helicopter with the state-owned company, Avic 2.

Suez has won a contract to build and run a drinking water plant in the town of Qingdao (eastern China).

The computing company, Bull, will market its Novascale servers through the Chinese computer manufacturer, Lenovo, while the Dassault firm has

reached an agreement with the parts manufacturer, Wanxiang, to build electric cars.

In the field of cereal production, a letter of intent has been signed, setting out Chinese purchasing objectives for the 2004/2005 period, while France Telecom has formalized a cooperation agreement concerning the area of research and development with China Telecom.

Finally, PSA Peugeot Citroen has signed a letter of intent concerning cooperation in the sector of motor finance with the Bank of China, a field in which things are moving slowly, in the opinion of French motor manufacturer Jean-Martin Folz.

On the government side, the six agreements concern the fight against the greenhouse effect, emerging contagious diseases, cooperation in information technology, the railways sector, the film industry and development. (AFP news agency, 9 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 10 Oct 04)

Germany (Oct 19)

Germany will offer China assistance worth 43.17m euros for 19 programmes concerning new energy utilization, economic restructuring, training and employment promotion, legal cooperation and environmental protection, according to an agreement on technological cooperation signed in Beijing. ... China, as Germany's biggest aid recipient country, has received economic assistance gratis worth of 768.5m euros from Germany up to September this year... (XNA, 19 Oct 04)

Guinea (Oct 26)

After the talks between Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and visiting Foreign Minister of Guinea Mamady Conde, the two foreign ministers signed an agreement on economic and technological cooperation. (XNA, 26 Oct 04; RMRB, 27 Oct 04)

Portugal (Oct 28)

China and Portugal have signed a memorandum of understanding on cooperation in supervision of securities and futures markets, China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC) said on 28 October. The document was signed on 28 October by Shang Fulin, CSRC chairman, and his Portuguese counterpart Fernando T.D. Santos at an executive meeting of the Interna-

tional Organization of Securities Commissions, according to a press release issued by the commission. The meeting was held in Montreal, Canada. Shang said the cooperation between the two countries will facilitate the healthy development of their capital markets. So far, China has signed such memos with the securities and futures supervision authorities of 25 countries and regions. These countries and regions include the United States, the Republic of Korea, Japan and several countries in Europe and South-east Asia. (XNA, 28 Oct 04)

Russia (Oct 14)

Thirteen documents have been signed following the Russian-Chinese summit talks in Beijing. In particular, Russian President Vladimir Putin and Chinese President Hu Jintao signed a joint declaration.

The following were also signed: an additional agreement relating to the eastern part of the Russian-Chinese border, a protocol between the Russian and Chinese governments on Russian and Chinese vessels sailing in waters around and adjacent to the islands of Tarabarov and Bolshoy Usuriyskiy, a protocol between Russia and China on completing talks on access to market goods and services markets, an agreement on establishing a Russian consulate general in Guangzhou and a Chinese consulate general in Yekaterinburg, an agreement between the Russian Federal Service for Controlling the Trade in Drugs and Psychotropic Substances and the Chinese Ministry of Public Security on cooperation in the fight against the illegal trade in narcotics and mind-altering substances. (Interfax news agency, Moscow, 14 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 15 Oct 04)

After the talks, the two leaders signed a "Joint Statement of the People's Republic of China and the Russian Federation" and sanctioned the "Implementation Outline for 'Sino-Russian Good-Neighbourly Treaty of Friendship and Cooperation'." They also attended a ceremony for the signing of 12 documents on bilateral cooperation.

At the signing ceremony, Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov signed the "Supplementary Agreement between the PRC and the Russian Feder-

ation on the Eastern Section of China-Russia Boundary Line." This marks the complete settlement of the China-Russia border issue and the 4,300-kilometre-long China-Russia common boundary line will hence become a line of peace, friendship, cooperation, and development between the two peoples. Chinese Commerce Minister Bo Xilai and Russian Economic Development and Trade Minister German Gref signed an "Agreement between the PRC and the Russian Federation on Russia's Market Access to the World Trade Organization." The signing of this agreement will further raise the level of Sino-Russian economic and trade cooperation. (Xinhua, 14 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 16 Oct 04; XNA, 14 Oct 04; RMRB, 15 Oct 04)

Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov signed the "Supplementary Agreement on the Eastern Section of the Boundary Line Between China and Russia" on 14 October. Together with the "Agreement on the Eastern Section of the Boundary Line Between China and the [former] Soviet Union" and the "Agreement on the Western Section of the Boundary Line Between China and Russia", this agreement marks the complete delimitation of the 4,300 km-long China-Russia boundary line.

After many years of negotiations using the relevant border treaties as a basis and acting in accordance with established principles of international law and in the spirit of equal negotiation and mutual understanding and concession, China and Russia signed the "Agreement on the Eastern Section of the Boundary Line Between China and the [former] Soviet Union" and the "Agreement on the Western Section of the Boundary Line between China and Russia" in 1991 and 1994 respectively, and ascertained the delimitation of 98 per cent of the China-Russia boundary line. Now, both sides have reached agreement on the boundary issue concerning the two areas of the Heixiazhi Island in the middle reaches of the Heilongjiang River and the Abagaitu Islet in the upper reaches of the Eerguna River. By engaging in peaceful dialogue, both sides have successfully resolved the complex and sensitive boundary issue between the two countries and removed a major hidden

danger in the comprehensive development of China-Russia ties in various fields.

Li Zhaoxing said: By solving the China-Russia boundary issue, both sides have enhanced their mutual political trust and enriched the content of China-Russia strategic partnership of cooperation. The move has provided a reliable guarantee for generations after generations of friendship and good-neighbourly cooperation between the peoples of the two countries. It has established a successful example for various countries in the world to peacefully settle border disputes through negotiations. From now onward, the China-Russia boundary line will become a link of peace, friendship, cooperation and development between the peoples of the two countries. He stressed: The experiences of long-term negotiation between China and Russia show that the correct and effective way in solving complex and sensitive inter-state issues is using the principles of fairness, equal consultation, mutual understanding and concession and balance in interests of each side. Russian Foreign Minister Lavrov said: The negotiations and hard work on the Russia-China boundary issue over the past 40 years have finally come to an end today. For the first time in the more than 300 years of history of bilateral relations, both sides have completely delimited the boundary line and reached full consensus on the boundary line issue, making this a breakthrough. Turkmenistan (Oct 20)

At the meeting between visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and Turkmen President Saparmyrat Nyazov, also attended by top Turkmen officials, Nyazov and Li Zhaoxing signed a number of documents on cooperation in oil, gas, textiles, transport and other sectors of the economy. "They [Chinese] are giving us a total of 128m dollars' credit at a very low rate of interest. My deputy, Orazberdi [Hudayberdiyew], who is in charge of the transport sector, will sign the relevant papers right here," Nyazov said. "Their railway carriages and locomotives are high quality and they sell them at cheap prices," Nyazov added. He also passed on an invitation to the Chinese leader, Hu Jintao,

to visit Turkmenistan. (Turkmen TV first channel, Ashgabat, 20 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 21 Oct 04)

Visiting Chinese Foreign Minister Li Zhaoxing and his Turkmen counterpart Rashid Meredov in Turkmen capital Ashgabat ... attended a signing ceremony of bilateral agreements on economic cooperation. (XNA, 20 Oct 04; RMRB, 21 Oct 04)

Vietnam (Oct 07)

Eight important pacts on economic, trade and technical cooperation between Vietnam and China were signed in Hanoi. The signing ceremony was witnessed by Vietnamese Prime Minister Phan Van Khai and visiting Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao ... The pacts included an agreement on economic and technical cooperation between the two governments; a memorandum of understanding on the establishment of the Vietnam-China expert group for economic and commercial cooperation; a note of exchange on Vietnam's inapplication of three disadvantageous terms that China accepted for its WTO entry. The two countries also signed an agreement on cooperation in the inspection, quarantine and hygienic supervision of imported maritime products; a protocol on quarantine of Vietnamese rice exported to China, and another on amendments and supplements to the agreement on border medical checks; a MOU on joint construction of a plant to produce nitrogenous fertilizer from coal in northern Ninh Binh Province of Vietnam; and a cooperation agreement on the construction of a pilot urban railway route from Hanoi to Ha Dong town of neighbouring Ha Tay Province. Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Chongqing Municipality (Oct 19)

Hong Kong and southwest China's Chongqing Municipality signed in Hong Kong 41 economic cooperation contracts valued at 33bn RMBY (3.97bn US\$). The 41 projects cover infrastructure, industry, agriculture, property and tourism sectors. Chongqing Mayor Wang Hongju said the contracts were signed under the framework of Chinese mainland/Hong Kong Closer Economic Partnership

Arrangement (CEPA), indicating a more extensive scale of the bilateral cooperation. He said Chongqing is a financial, trade and industry center along the upper reaches of the Yangtze River, the longest river in the Chinese mainland and it can play an important role in the economic development of the western part of the Chinese mainland. Wang said Hong Kong is a major source of Chongqing's overseas investment. By the end of April this year, there is 1,624 Hong Kong funded ventures in Chongqing, accounting for 45.8 percent of all the overseas funded ventures in the municipality. The mayor said in the first eight months of this year, Chongqing has registered 55 Hong Kong invested projects, with 158m US\$ of contracted funds. The Hong Kong funded ventures mainly cover infrastructure, property development and management as well as auto parts manufacturing industries. In the past few years, the service sector attracted more Hong Kong investments. (XNA, 19 Oct 04)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Croatia (Oct 18)

Croatia's Minister of Culture Bozo Biskupic and Hong Kong Secretary for Home Affairs Patrick Ho signed a memorandum of understanding on cultural cooperation. Both sides agreed to promote and strengthen cooperation in culture, arts and education, which they believe will further mutual awareness, respect, understanding, harmony and friendship between their people. To start, there will be exchange of exhibition catalogues on contemporary art between major museums and exchange of information on major performers. Other proposed exchange activities include music exchange programs in Hong Kong for visiting youth music groups from Croatia. (XNA, 18 Oct 04)

Macau SAR Agreement with Mainland China (Oct 29)

The Chinese Central People's Government and the Macau Special Administrative Region (SAR) government signed in Macau a supplemental agreement of the Mainland/Macau Closer Economic Partnership Arrangement (CEPA). Chinese Vice Minister of Commerce An Min and Secretary for Economy and Finance of the Macau

SAR government Francis Tam Pak Yuen signed the supplemental agreement and three annexes at the signing ceremony attended by Chief Executive of the Macau SAR Edmund Ho Hau Wah. An official press release of the Macau SAR government said that the supplemental agreement is aimed to further promote trade and economic cooperation between the Chinese mainland and the Macau SAR. According to the supplemental agreement of the trade pact, an additional package of 190 products made in Macau will enjoy zero tariffs for entering the mainland market starting on January 1 of 2005. By that time, the total number of Macau's zero-tariff products will reach 501. Meanwhile, Macau companies will enjoy more favorable policies for entering 11 of the 18 service sectors in China's mainland, which have already been opened up for companies from the Macau SAR under CEPA, said the supplemental agreement, adding that eight more service sectors, including airport management, information technology and cultural and entertainment services, will be open for Macau firms. In addition, individuals from the Macau SAR, who can currently run their companies in Guangdong Province according to CEPA, will be permitted to develop their private enterprises around the country. PRC Laws and Regulations

Circular of the CCP [Chinese Communist Party] Central Committee on the distribution of **Regulations on the Protection of the Rights of CCP Members**

Party committees of all provinces, autonomous regions, and municipalities, party committees of all major military regions, departments and committees under the CCP Central Committee, party groups (party committees) of all ministries and commissions under the government, party committees of all the headquarters under the Central Military Commission and party committees of all services and arms, and party groups of all mass bodies:

We are now distributing to you "Regulations on the Protection of the Rights of CCP Members" (hereinafter referred to as "Regulations on the Protection of the Rights of Party Members"), and it is hoped that you can carry out the regulations conscientiously.

"Regulations on the Protection of the Rights of Party Members" is a very important inner-party law of our party concerning the protection of the rights of party members. The promulgation and implementation of this law is an important measure for developing inner-party democracy, improving and perfecting the inner-party life, and strengthening the party's governing ability; and is of great significance to bringing into better play the enthusiasm, the initiative, and the creativity of party members and to enhancing the creative ability, the unifying power, and the combat effectiveness of the party. The whole party is required to conscientiously study, extensively propagate, and strictly abide itself by the regulations.

It is hoped that all localities and departments promptly report to the

party Central Committee should they have any problems and suggestions during their implementation of "Regulations on the Protection of the Rights of Party Members".

Decision of the NPC Standing Committee on Revising the "PRC Electoral Law for the NPC and the Local People's Congresses at Various Levels", approved at the 12th meeting of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 27 October 2004. (Presidential Decree No. 29, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 October 2004) (RMRB, 28 Oct 04; full text of the law: RMRB, 6 Nov 04)

The 12th meeting of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC decided to make the following revisions of the "PRC Electoral Law for the NPC and the Local People's Congresses at All Levels":

1. Item 1 in Clause 1 of Article 9 is revised as: "(1) The base number of deputies to the people's congress of a province, an autonomous region, and a municipality directly under the central government is 350. A province and an autonomous region may increase the base number of deputies by one per 150,000 people, and a municipality directly under the central government may increase the base number by one per 25,000 people; however, the total number of deputies of any province, autonomous region, and municipality shall not exceed 1,000."

2. Clause 1 of Article 31 is revised as: "Candidates to become deputies to people's congresses elected directly by the voters shall be nominated by the voters and by various political parties and people's organizations in various constituencies. The electoral committee shall collect and publish, 15 days prior to the date of election, the list of nominees for deputies for discussion and consultation by the respective constituency voter groups and shall decide on a formal list of candidates. If the number of candidates exceeds the maximum proportion for competitive election as provided by Article 30 of this law, the electoral

committee shall submit the list of candidates to the respective constituency voter groups for discussion and consultation and shall decide on a formal list of candidates in accordance with the opinion of the majority of the voters. When consensus cannot be reached on the formal list of candidates, a preliminary election shall be held, and a formal list of candidates shall be determined by the order of the number of votes that the nominees have obtained in the preliminary election. A formal list of candidates shall be made public five days before the election date."

3. Article 33 is revised as: "The electoral committee or the presidium of the people's congress shall brief the voters or deputies on the personal circumstances of candidates for deputies. The political parties, people's organizations, and voters or deputies who recommend candidates may brief group meetings of voters or deputies about the candidates they are recommending. The electoral committee may organize the candidates for deputies to meet with voters and answer their questions. However, these briefing activities about candidates shall stop on the day of the election."

4. Clause 1 of Article 44 is revised as: "A request to remove a deputy to the people's congress at the county level may be submitted jointly by 50 or more voters, and a request to remove a deputy to the people's congress at the township level may be submitted jointly by 30 or more voters, from the constituency from which the deputy is elected by means of a written statement to the county people's congress Standing Committee."

5. Article 52 is revised as: "In order to safeguard the freedom of voters and deputies to exercise their electoral rights and the right to stand for election, administrative penalties for public security shall be taken, in accordance with law, against persons who commit any of the following acts to disrupt the election and violate the regulations on public security management; and those whose act constitute a crime shall be held criminally accountable in accordance with law:

"(1) Using money or other property to bribe voters or deputies and prevent them from freely exercising their right to vote and right to stand for election; "(2) Resorting to violence, intimidation, deception, and other illegal

means to prevent voters or deputies from freely exercising their right to vote and right to stand for election;

"(3) Fabricating electoral documents, making false reports on the number of ballots, or committing other breaches of the law;

"(4) Suppressing or taking reprisals against those who register complaints or reports on breaches of the law or against those who demand the removal of a deputy.

"Administrative penalties shall also be taken, in accordance with law, against the state functionaries who commit the aforementioned acts.

"With regard to a deputy who is elected by means of the illegal act prescribed in Clause 1 of this article, his election shall be made invalid."

This decision takes effect on the day it is published.

The "PRC Electoral Law for the NPC and the Local People's Congresses at All Levels" will be republished after it is revised on the basis of this decision. (Xinhua, 27 Oct 04, in BBC PF, 5 Nov 04)

Decision of the NPC Standing Committee on Revising the "Organic Law of the Local People's Congresses and Governments at Various Levels", approved at the 12th meeting of the Standing Committee of the 10th NPC on 27 October 2004. (Presidential Decree No. 30, signed by State President Hu Jintao on 27 October 2004) (RMRB, 28 Oct 04; full text of the law: RMRB, 10 Nov 04)

Regulations of the People's Republic of China on the Implementation of Customs Administrative Punishments, adopted at the State Council's 62nd executive meeting on 1 September 2004. These regulations will come into force on 1 November 2004. (Decree No. 420 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 19 September 2004) (Full text: RMRB, 20 Oct 04) These regulations consist of six chapters with 68 articles.

Regulations on Internal Security Protection Within Enterprises and Institutions, adopted by the 64th State Council executive meeting on 13 September 2004. The regulations will come into force with effect from 1 December 2004. (Decree

No. 421 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 27 September 2004) (Full text: RMRB, 9 Nov 04) These regulations consist of 23 articles.

China has issued **rules on the approval procedures for Chinese investment abroad**, the press office of the Chinese Ministry of Commerce (MOC) said on 11 October. The regulation clarified the procedures and documents required for such authorization and confirmed that the MOC will utilize electronic governance measures to simplify the progress and facilitate Chinese overseas investment. The rules help reform the investment mechanism to be market-oriented and will facilitate Chinese investment abroad, said an official with the MOC. The rules will also serve to create sound condition for management on Chinese overseas investment, he said. Chinese investment abroad totalled at 3.32b US\$ in 2003, scattering in over 160 countries and regions, according to the MOC. Chinese government has been encouraging enterprises to "go abroad" in recent years. (XNA, 11 Oct 04)

China eases controls on foreign market surveys. Foreign companies and individuals can now launch market surveys without examination, but social surveys still need approval of the government, according to the regulation newly issued by the State Statistical Bureau (SSB). According to the former regulation issued in 1999, foreign organizations, individuals and China-based foreign organizations cannot launch any kind of surveys in China without approval of the government. The new regulation issued by SSB on 13 October lifted several restrictions in China's survey management, especially market surveys. However, only Chinese institutions with permission by statistical department of provincial or higher government have the right to conduct the market surveys under the care of foreign organizations, said the policy. Meanwhile, social surveys entrusted by foreign units still need pre-examination and approval of statistical department of provincial or higher government. Those surveys across provinces, autonomous regions or provincial-level municipalities need direct examination and approval of

the SSB. According to the new regulation, the results of the approved foreign social surveys can be free of direct examination, but survey institutions should build up records of all such surveys to meet possible government inspection. Chinese enterprises with foreign investment have more free rights to launch both market surveys and social surveys without government's examination and approval, according to the policy. "We made the change to raise the efficiency of government without harm to national security," said an official of SSB. He promised to strengthen the supervision and inspection on the illegal surveys across the country in line with the new regulation. (XNA, 20 Oct 04)

China introduced two regulations aimed to bolster its sluggish capital market by making it easier for securities firms to raise money from the market ... The People's Bank of China, the country's central bank, on 18 October issued the **Regulation on Short-Term Financing by Securities Firms** in cooperation with the country's stock and banking regulators. The bank described the new regulation as a move designed to expand the channels for securities firms to find financing, and as part of its effort to implement the central government's strategy of pushing forward the opening up and reform of China's young but bearish capital markets.

On the same day, China Securities Regulatory Commission (CSRC), the country's top regulator of securities markets, made public its **revised Interim Rules on the Management of Bonds of Securities Companies**. The commission said the revised regulation drastically lowered the threshold for securities firms to issue bonds to raise capital. ... The national Chinese-language newspaper *Economic Daily* has predicted that 2004 will be a year of elimination of Chinese securities firms with poor performance. Chinese securities firms have suffered heavy financial losses due to falling stock prices since 2000, estimated at 220bn RMBY (26.8bn US\$) by the *Economic Information Daily* (published by Xinhua). A group of medium-sized and small securities firms have been closed down or de-registered due to heavy losses and irregularities during the past several

years. But larger firms are not immune to heavy losses and irregularities. Earlier this year, CSRC and Shenzhen Municipal Government took over China Southern Securities Co., which had been charged with "serious business irregularities." The company was one of the first three securities firms on the Chinese mainland. More than half of the country's 40 securities firms reported financial losses. ... (XNA, 21 Oct 04)

China unveiled on 24 October regulations that, for the first time, allow insurance companies to invest in its stock markets, a move apparently designed to liberalize and boost its capital market. The China Insurance Regulatory Commission (CIRC) and China Securities Regulatory (CSRC) Commission made public their **provisional regulations on the management of insurers' investment in stocks**, giving a green light to the direct investment of insurance companies as institutional investors in the stock markets. Before the regulations were issued, insurance funds in China were permitted to invest only indirectly in stock markets through securities investment firms. Under the new regulations, the annual investment of an insurer still cannot exceed 5 per cent of the total assets it reports at the end of the previous year. That means nearly 60bn RMBY (7.2bn US\$) from the sector will be allowed to be invested in the stock markets as China's insurance industry recorded 1 trillion RMBY (about 120bn US\$) in outstanding insurance funds at the end of August this year. The Chinese central government published a package of strategies last February to promote the reform and opening up of its capital markets and prop up its stock markets, which have been bearish in spite of the country's fast-growing economic growth over the past two decades. According to the strategy, China will help cultivate an unspecified number of professional institutional investors, support the direct investment of insurance funds in capital markets, so that institutional investors, mostly fund management and insurance firms, will be the leading force in the capital markets. China did not open its capital markets to its National Social Securities Fund and qualified foreign institutional investors

(QFIIs) until last year. A total of 27 QFIIs, including Deutsche Bank, Nomura Securities, and Citigroup Global Markets Limited, have been allowed to engage in the securities business on the A-share market, China's domestic securities market, since the middle of last year. Securities regulatory officials said the entry of growing number of institutional investors in the capital markets will help avoid frequent drastic fluctuation of stock prices through reduced speculation. Chinese fledging stock markets have been plagued by speculative operations by private and institutional investors. Zuo Xiaolei, chief researcher with Chinastock Co., said that market performances by the QFIIs indicate most of them are rational investors that value blue-chips and base their investment strategies on the vast potential of the Chinese economy, which has grown by 9 per cent annually over the past two decades. Liu Jingde, a senior analyst with Beijing Securities Research and Development Centre, said a group of domestic securities firms and funds, influenced by the QFIIs, are paying more attention to the listed firms and their potentials themselves. According to media reports, China is expected to issue more licenses to QFIIs soon to put an end to the experiment of QFIIs on the markets for more overseas institutional investors, and the quotas of their investment may be increased to 5bn US\$, about 20bn RMBY (2.4bn US\$) more than the current quotas. An official with CSRC said last week that China would improve its investment environment for various forms of institutional investors and diversify their sources of investment in the coming five years. Ma Delun, deputy director of the State Administration of Foreign Exchange, disclosed last month that China is considering the feasibility of creating a system of qualified domestic institutional investors in the future. China is also exploring ways to allow foreign organizations and firms to raise money on Chinese markets through issuance of RMB-denominated bonds, Ma added. At the end of August, China had 71m investors and 1,380 listed firms on its domestic market on the Chinese mainland. The market value of their stocks totalled 3.9 trillion RMBY (475.9bn US\$). The country's first stock was issued in 1984. (XNA, 25 Oct 04)

China issued a **set of compulsory fuel efficiency standards for passenger vehicles** on 28 October. The standards, issued by the State Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine and the State Commission for Administration of Standardization, will be phased in starting 1 July 2005. In the first stage, which lasts until 1 January 2008, Chinese passenger vehicles are required to meet the current average level of Chinese-made passenger vehicles. In the second stage, vehicle's fuel consumption must drop by 10 per cent from the first stage level. Models under production are granted a one-year grace period to meet the standards. According to an official with the State Administration of Quality Supervision, Inspection and Quarantine, China will also issue standards on fuel efficiency of other types of vehicles in the future. The aim is to promote efficient use of fuel and control sky rocketing energy consumption. As the number of automobiles in China increases rapidly, the demand for fuel is also rising very fast. Currently, automobile fuel consumption accounts for one-third of China's crude oil imports. (XNA, 28 Oct 04)
