China has named Liu Peng as new director to replace Yuan Weimin to head the State General Administration of Sports ... The decision was announced in a congress attended by State Councillor Chen Zhili who praised Yuan for his 47-year efforts in the sport circle with great successes. "Yuan is stepping down from the sports leadership due to his age, but his contribution will be put into the great history of Chinese sport," Chen said, explaining that the personnel replacement is a normal reshuffle. The 65-year-old Yuan, a former volleyball player for the Chinese national team, has coached the Chinese women to reap all grand titles in the volleyball world during the 80s. He was appointed deputy director in 1998 and became director of State General Administration of Sport in 2000. [Newsreader] The Democratic Party has a new chairman. He is veteran lawmaker and the vice-chairman of the party Lee Wing-tat [Li Yongda]. Mr. Lee defeated Chan King-ming [Chen Jingming], who heads the party's organization branch.

As Clara Lai reports, it is the first time in the party's decade-long history that the post of chairman was being contested. In the past, candidates were returned unopposed.

[Lai] Party members have confirmed that Mr. Lee will succeed Dr. Yeung Sum [Yang Sen], who did not run for a second term to assume responsibility for the party's unsatisfactory performance in September's Legislative

Council poll. Mr. Lee has yet to speak to the press, but he said earlier that he would stand firm on democracy. He also pledged to improve communications with party members and to enhance the party's position in the pro-democracy camp. Mr. Lee's running mate, Albert Ho [He Junren], was re-elected a vice-chairman of the party. Chan King-ming, who was defeated by Mr. Lee, was also elected a vice-chairman. Antigua and Barbuda (Nov 17)

After the talks between Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Prime Minister of Antigua and Barbuda Baldwin Spencer, Wen and Spencer attended the signing ceremony of two documents between their governments, including one concerning bilateral economic and technological cooperation. (XNA, 17 Nov 04; RMRB, 18 Nov 04)

Argentina, Brazil, Chile (Nov 19)

Brazil, Argentina and Chile have been approved by the Chinese government as Chinese group travellers destinations, according to the latest news from China National Tourism Administration (CNTA). Cuba was approved as a Chinese travellers destination last year. With no direct flights between China and South America, package prices to the three nations will be quite high. The current price to Cuba within seven days cost more than 20,000 yuan (2,000 US dollars) in local travel agencies. Brazil's rainforest and Samba dance, Chile's volcanoes and Easter Island and Argentina's Moreno Glacier are expected to attract Chinese travellers. Chinese travel agencies will organize groups only after CNTA reaches a consensus with those three nations in visa procedure and local

guide issues. Travellers can fly there via Europe or North America. According to the World Tourism Organization (WTO), China is among the top ten overseas tourist consumption markets. Last year, more than 20 million Chinese travellers went abroad, passing Japan to rank first in Asia for the first time. The WTO has predicted China will become the world's fourth biggest tourism source nation by 2020. (XNA, 19 Nov 04)

Argentina (Nov 16)

After the talks between visiting Chinese President Hu Jintao and Argentine President Nestor Kirchner, the two heads of state attended a ceremony for signing a framework agreement on technology cooperation between China and Argentina in the peaceful use of outer space, a memorandum of understanding [MOU] on an implementation plan for Chinese tourist delegations to Argentina, a MOU on cooperation in railway projects, a MOU on strengthening exchanges and cooperation in education, and other documents on bilateral cooperation. (Xinhua, 17 Nov 04, in BBC PF, 18 Nov 04; RMRB, 18 Nov 04)

China and Argentina signed five agreements that will allow them to expand cooperation in the areas of trade, space, education, tourism and railways. Chinese and Argentine ministers signed the agreements after visiting Chinese President Hu Jintao held talks with Argentine President Nestor Kirchner. ... The two sides agreed to expand cooperation in the areas of agriculture and animal husbandry, mineral resources, energy, transportation and telecommunications. ... President Kirchner said China has become Argentina's fourth largest trading partner and "best goods buyer" in Asia. Two-way trade reached 3.2bn US\$ last year, up 122 percent from the year before, according to Chinese figures. China mainly imported soybean, bean oil, crude oil, leather and steel from Argentina, and exported computer, life science products, bulb and motorcycles, according to China's Ministry of Commerce. President Kirchner visited China earlier this year, during which the two sides signed a number of cooperation documents in the areas of civil aviation, public health, culture, invest-

ment and agriculture. China and Argentina established full diplomatic relations in 1972. (XNA, 17 Nov 04)

Belgium (Nov 23)

China's economic hub Shanghai and Belgium's port city of Antwerp signed an agreement in Shanghai, vowing to strengthen cooperation. The agreement was reached during Belgian Prince Philippe's visit to Shanghai. According to the agreement, the future cooperation between the two cities will cover the fields of port construction, education and personnel training. Prince Philippe brought with him a 500-member delegation to China, consisting of representatives from the financial sector, ports and airports, universities, industrial and service companies and government officials. ... In the first nine months of this year, China-Belgium trade hit 6.6bn US\$, up 36 per cent year-on-year and was close to the total bilateral trade volume last year. ... (XNA, 23 Nov 04)

Brazil (Nov 12)

After the talks between visiting Chinese President Hu Jintao and his Brazilian counterpart Luis Inacio Lula da Silva, the two sides signed a series of cooperation documents. (XNA, 12 Nov 04; RMRB, 13 Nov 04)

Cuba (Nov 22)

Chinese President Hu Jintao and Fidel Castro, president of the Cuban Council of State, agreed in Havana to expand bilateral cooperation in political, economic and other areas. ... Following their conversation, China and Cuba signed a number of agreements on their cooperation in plant quarantine, bio-technology, education and economy. ... Hu proposed that China and Cuba increase exchange of visits by leaders of the government, the parliament, political parties, and non-governmental institutions. China and Cuba can also expand cooperation in areas of tourism, aquatic products and bio-technology, Hu said. In addition, China and Cuba can strengthen cooperation in international arenas to safeguard the interests of the developing nations and world peace, said the Chinese president. Two-way trade between China and Cuba has been about 400m US\$ annually over the past three years. The trade volume reached 401m US\$ from January to

September this year, up 36.7 per cent. China mainly imports sugar and nickel from Cuba and exports machinery and electronic products to Cuba. ... Castro said he agreed with Hu's proposals. He said Cuba hopes to purchase about one million more colour TV sets from China as the 1.3m sets Cuba previously imported from China were "very good" in quality. ... (XNA, 23 Nov 04; RMRB, 24 Nov 04)

Ethiopia (Nov 02)

After the talks between Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and visiting Ethiopian Prime Minister Meles Zenawi, Wen and Meles attended the signing ceremony of two agreements between the two countries, including the agreement on economic and technological cooperation and the agreement on educational exchanges and cooperation. (XNA, 2 Nov 04; RMRB, 3 Nov 04)

Germany (Nov 29)

In an agreement signed in Beijing with China's Ministry of Finance, the German government promised to donate seven million euros to be used for AIDS prevention and treatment in China's economically less-advantaged western areas, a ministry spokesman said. An additional 42.35m euros will be made available by Germany as government loans to support the construction of hospitals and disease control centres in west China. The spokesman said the Chinese government has enhanced its capability of fighting against AIDS thanks to cooperation with other countries. China has absorbed preferential funds and advanced medical technology and management from overseas, he said. The German government has so far either donated or loaned a total of 176.7m euros for China's medical and health care work, he said. (XNA, 29 Nov 04)

Indonesia (Nov 05)

The government of the PRC agreed to grant 3.6m US\$ and provide 400m US\$ as a soft loan to the Indonesian government. The 3.6m US\$ assistance brought the total Chinese grant to Indonesia to 27.5m US\$, Indonesian Foreign Minister Hasan Wirayudha said in a joint press briefing along with visiting Chinese presidential Special Envoy and State Councillor Tang Jiaxuan. The grant is to

be used for enhancing economic cooperation between the two countries and the soft loan to finance the electrical and gas power plant at the Labuhan Angin, the building of a 158 km double-track railway between Cirebon and Kroya, and the construction of the Surabaya-Madura island bridge, Wirayudha said. Wirayudha and Tang Jiaxuan also witnessed the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding on the two types of assistance. The Chinese government also promised to provide other soft loan assistance to Indonesia if needed, Hasan said. (XNA, 6 Nov 04)

Macedonia (Nov 04)

Macedonia and China signed in Skopje an agreement over media cooperation. The agreement was signed by visiting Chinese Deputy Director of the State Administration of Radio, Film and Television Tian Jin and the Director of the Macedonian Agency of Information Vele Mitankovski. ... The Republic of Macedonia and the PRC established diplomatic relations in October 1993, after China recognized the country under its constitutional name. (XNA, 5 Nov 04; MIA news agency, Skopje, 4 Nov 04, in BBC PF, 5 Nov 04)

International Agreements

China and the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) signed a project paper in Beijing on 17 November to set up the China-Africa Business Council (CABC). The CABC will be a joint programme the two sides would use to further boost Sino-African trade cooperation especially in private sectors. And it is believed to be the first public-private partnership initiative between China and Africa under the South-South Cooperation Framework, said Khalid Malik, UN resident coordinator in China. He said at the signing ceremony that China has been the anchor for South-South cooperation and its government is committed to upgrading China's ties with Africa politically and economically. China is striving to find new ways to boost bilateral trade and investment links. There exists a huge potential for increased trade and investment between China and Africa, Malik said, noting that the economic cooperation between China and Africa

impacts African countries in the development of capacity-building and skills development, and promotes the role of the private sector as a key player in contributing to growth in trade, investment and national development. Malik cited the project as a key initiative to help strengthen China-Africa economic link through promotion of public-private partnerships and said it will become a new economic mechanism to help facilitate information sharing and access, thereby deepening the Sino-Africa trade and investment in a concrete way, Malik acknowledged. According to the project, the CABC will provide practical support to the private sector to help conduct trade and investment activities in Cameroon, Ghana, Mozambique, Nigeria, South Africa, and Tanzania. The project will also establish a network of linkages with a wide variety of players both nationally and internally across the China-Africa business spectrum. (XNA, 17 Nov 04)

A new era of Sino-ASEAN relations dawned in Vientiane on 29 November as China and the Association of South East Asian Nations signed a wide-ranging raft of agreements on trade, communications, transportation and dispute-solving mechanisms. Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and his ASEAN counterparts signed the agreements at the eighth summit between the ASEAN and China presided over by Laotian Prime Minister Bounngang Volachit. Wen said China pursues a policy of building good-neighbourly relations and partnership with its neighbours and securing an amicable, tranquil and prosperous neighbourhood. "The ASEAN countries are China's close neighbours," said the Chinese leader. "To consolidate the strategic partnership for peace and prosperity with ASEAN and promote mutually beneficial and all-dimensional cooperation will remain a basic foreign policy of China in the long run." Wen made a proposal on furthering Sino-ASEAN relations, including increasing high-level exchanges, implementing in real earnest the agreements signed on 29 November, and putting in place a ministerial dialogue mechanism on energy between the two sides. China will further contribute 5m US\$ to the Sino-ASEAN Cooperation Fund, said

Wen, adding, "The Chinese Government will set up a special Asia Cooperation Fund totalling 15m US\$ to support the participation of relevant Chinese agencies in regional cooperation, especially that with the ASEAN." All ASEAN leaders spoke highly of China's efforts to push forward the strategic partnership with the ASEAN, to realize regional peace, stability and development, and to help the under-developed countries to improve construction capacity. They welcomed Wen's proposal, and agreed China is a responsible and reliable country, and its development has been in the interest of the ASEAN and also brings the opportunity. They hoped the two sides would implement the signed agreements, and expand the cooperation on trade, investment, agriculture and security fields, as well as on the regional and international affairs. During the meeting, the leaders issued a plan of action to implement the joint declaration on ASEAN-China strategic partnership for peace and prosperity. The plan of action detailed the items of the political and security cooperation, as well as the economic and trade cooperative projects. It also includes the cooperation of culture, education, personnel exchanges and other fields. China and the five countries around the Mekong River, including Cambodia, Vietnam, Laos, Thailand and Myanmar, signed a memorandum of understanding on building up the information highway. ASEAN groups Brunei, Myanmar, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand and Vietnam. (RMRB, XNA, 30 Nov 04)

China and the ASEAN agreed in Phnom Penh on 24 November to further strengthen their comprehensive cooperation on transport to promote the establishment of ASEAN-China free trade area. The agreement was reached at the Third ASEAN-China Transport Ministers Meeting, which was co-chaired by Chinese Communication Minister Zhang Chunxian and Cambodian Public Works and Transport Minister Sun Chanthol. ... In a joint statement, the ministers admitted the significant potential of ASEAN-China strategic partnership in transport and offered its crucial support for the ASEAN-China

free trade area initiative. They also adopted the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) on Transport Cooperation between the members of ASEAN and the government of China, which will be signed by the ASEAN secretary-general and the communications minister of China on the sidelines of the ASEAN-China Summit in Vientiane, Laos on 27 November. Under the MOU, the two sides agreed to further strengthen cooperation in such areas as transport infrastructure construction; transport facilities; maritime safety and security; air transport; and human resources development. Moreover, the ASEAN Senior Transport Officials Meeting (STOM) and China Maritime Consultative Group will be established as the cooperative platform to work out and recommend the details of the initiative. China will host the first ASEAN-China Maritime Consultative Group meeting in early 2005. In order to develop the international ocean shipping industry and air services liberalization in the region, ministers agreed to work towards developing and signing an ASEAN-China regional maritime transport cooperation framework agreement as well as concluding an ASEAN-China regional passenger and cargo air services arrangement. China and ASEAN, engaged in building a strategic partnership oriented towards peace and prosperity, have grown into one of the regions with the fastest growing economy and huge potential in the world. And by the time the Free Trade Area is established, it will be the most populous Free Trade Area in the world, with a population of 1.7bn consumers and a potential trade volume of 1.2 trillion US\$ to be generated. The ministers agreed to hold the fourth ASEAN and China Transport Ministers meeting in Laos in 2005. Besides the 3rd ASEAN-China Transport Ministers meeting, a series of transport meetings were also held from 21 to 24 November in Phnom Penh, including the Senior Official Meetings between ASEAN and China and Japan; the 10th ASEAN Transport Ministers meeting and the Second ASEAN and Japan Transport Ministers meeting. (XNA, 24 Nov 04; RMRB, 25 Nov 04)

The 10-member ASEAN signed the Memorandum of Understanding

(MOU) on Transport Cooperation with China in Vientiane on 27 November. China's Minister of Communications Zhang Chunxian and ASEAN signed the MOU. Zhang said in an interview with Xinhua after the signing ceremony that with the signing, ASEAN and China will have a legally based medium-to-long-term cooperation partnership. He said that the MOU covers ASEAN-China transport cooperation on infrastructure, transport facilitating, marine transport and marine affairs, capacity building and information sharing. The minister said he believed that the MOU is a breakthrough for ASEAN-China transport cooperation as it not only lays down a legal base for launching future cooperative projects, but has a strong guiding role and high operationability. He said, "The fundamental objective of the cooperation is to accelerate infrastructure linkages and enhance cross-border movement of goods and people, which in turn reinforces the establishment of an ASEAN-China free trade area as well as the synergy in seeking common prosperity for nearly 1.8bn population with 1.2 trillion US\$ annual trade volume in the ASEAN countries and China." He said, "We feel so much assured that the ASEAN-China transport cooperation is becoming more consolidated with every step forward and has constituted an essential part in building a partnership of mutual trust and practical cooperation between ASEAN and China." The minister said it is the strong aspirations of the people of ASEAN and China in seeking cooperation for a win-win result. He said China has over 100 land and river ports at different levels bordering with the ASEAN countries. The potential for further promoting transport cooperation is great. Zhang said that the ASEAN-China cooperation has been fruitful in the past months. He said the construction of Lao section of Kunming-Bangkok Highway started in April this year, with 30m US\$ of investment from China. He added that the Intergovernmental Agreement on Asian Highway Network covering 32 countries was concluded in Shanghai in April this year, to which some of the ASEAN countries have become parties. The minister added that China's linkage with this road network accumulates a mileage of 26,000 kilo-

metres, accounting for 20 per cent of the total lengthen of the network. He added that China is also stepping up the construction of highways to connect with this network. The minister said China has provided 1m US\$ financial assistance for the pre-feasibility study of the missing link of the Trans-Asian Railway inside Cambodia. He believed that with the stable long-term cooperation framework and practical cooperative operations, ASEAN and China would surely have a great prospect for the future. (XNA, 27 Nov 04; RMRB, 28 Nov 04)

China and ASEAN started their process for building a free trade area with the signing of the "Agreement on Trading in Goods of the Framework Agreement on Comprehensive Economic Cooperation between ASEAN and China." Witnessed by Chinese Premier Wen Jiabao and leaders of the 10-member ASEAN, Chinese Minister of Commerce Bo Xilai signed the agreement with 10 economic ministers of the ASEAN countries on 29 November. According to the agreement, starting from July 1, 2005, China and ASEAN countries will start their tariff-reducing process. The two sides will gradually reduce or cancel tariff on 7,000 kinds of products. Under the agreement, China and six of "old" ASEAN members will complete the building of the free trade area by the year of 2010 while the other four "new" members will enjoy another five years of "transitional period" and complete the building of the free trade area in 2015. ASEAN recognizes China's market economy status in the agreement. A China-ASEAN agreement on dispute solving mechanism was also signed on 29 November. A high ranking official of the Ministry of Commerce said in an exclusive interview with Xinhua that the signing of the agreement is a milestone for the development of the China-ASEAN relations and is expected to create a win-win situation, as China and ASEAN countries are complementary in goods production. With the official implementation of the newly signed agreement, the bilateral goods, service trade and investment between China and ASEAN countries will increase by a big margin, the official said. He said that closer economic and trade ties between China and

ASEAN countries will not only benefit the economic development of China and ASEAN countries, but also play a positive role in the economic development of Asia and the rest of the world. The "old" ASEAN members are Brunei, Indonesia, Malaysia, the Philippines, Singapore and Thailand, while the "new" ASEAN members are Cambodia, Laos, Myanmar and Vietnam. A tariff expert who had attended the 17 rounds of formal China-ASEAN talks and two special meetings for reaching the agreement told Xinhua that the new agreement is a pioneer in forging economic and trade relations between a country and a group. China-ASEAN's "early harvest" mode has been widely accepted in the international community and is followed by quite a number of countries. "Early harvest" indicates that if the two cooperative partners agree with a certain kind of tariff reducing product among many other products, tariff-reducing agreement on the product could be implemented first. China has already signed a zero-tariff agreement on fruits with Thailand and the agreement is implemented this year. China has recorded trade deficits with the ASEAN countries in the past few years. Jing Lingbo, expert on Asian-Pacific studies at the China Institute of International Studies, predicted that China and ASEAN may sign agreements in service and investment following the signing of the agreement on trade. Ong Keng Yong, ASEAN secretary general, said at a press conference on 29 November that the trade volume between China and ASEAN reached 84.6bn US\$ in the first 10 months this year, up 35 percent year-on-year. He expected that the bilateral trade volume may reach 100bn US\$ next year. Commenting on the new China-ASEAN agreement, he said free trade negotiations between ASEAN and China are good and "we are happy with the process." (XNA, 30 Nov 04)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with the Mainland (Nov 26)

The insurance regulatory authorities of the Chinese mainland and the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region have joined hands to fight illegal insurance policies, according to a senior Chinese insurance official. Li Kemu,

vice-chairman of the China Insurance Regulatory Commission, signed an insurance regulatory cooperative agreement in Beijing with Richard Yuen, Hong Kong's Commissioner of Insurance. Li said that the agreement marks a new stage of cooperation between the mainland and Hong Kong in the insurance industry. The agreement covers broad areas of insurance regulation that will effectively promote mutual understanding of regulatory practices, exchange regulatory experience and timely sharing of regulatory information. China's insurance industry has been developing fairly rapidly over the past few years. At the end of last month, the country's total insurance assets amounted to 1.15 trillion RMBY (about 138.6bn US\$), up 37.8 per cent from last year. (XNA, 26 Nov 04)

Hong Kong SAR Agreement with Hainan Province (Nov 16)

Hong Kong SAR and Hainan Province signed a memorandum of cooperation in Hong Kong, according to a government press release. Denise Yue, Hong Kong's permanent secretary for commerce, industry and technology, and Peng Rui Lin, director of the commerce department of the Hainan Provincial Government, signed the memorandum on behalf of each side. On the basis of enhancing complementary, mutual benefits, and closer cooperation, and with a view to promoting the prosperity and development of Hong Kong and Hainan Province, both sides agreed to enhance collaboration in trade and investment between Hong Kong and Hainan, facilitate the exchange of information, and promote business opportunities of the two places. Hainan-Hong Kong cooperation has achieved remarkable success over the past 16 years. Hong Kong becomes the largest investment source and the most important trading partner of Hainan. The accumulative real investments made in Hainan by Hong Kong enterprises have exceeded 4bn US\$, accounting for 60 percent of the total foreign investments introduced into the province, and the Hainan-Hong Kong trade volume has taken up over 80 percent of Hainan's total volume of foreign trade. PRC Laws and Regulations

Liu Jen-Kai

Labour Protection Supervisory Regulations, adopted at the 68th executive meeting of the State Council on 26 October 2004. The regulations will be put into force on 1 December 2004. (Decree No. 423 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 1 November 2004) (Full text: RMRB, 15 Nov 04)

The regulations have 36 articles in five chapters, including the general provisions, responsibilities of labour protection supervision, implementation of labour protection supervision, legal responsibilities, and supplementary provisions. The regulations are enacted to carry out laws, rules and regulations regarding the protection of labour and social security (henceforth referred to as labour protection), to standardize the work of labour protection supervision, and to safeguard the legitimate rights and interests of workers. The regulations clearly stipulate that labour protection supervision should be based on the principle of fairness, openness, efficiency, and making things easier for people. A combination of education and punishment is the way to carry out labour protection supervision. In carrying out this work, it is necessary to accept supervision by the public. Any organization or individual is entitled to file complaints with the departments concerned about the violations of these laws, rules and regulations. The regulations stipulate that employers should abide by laws, rules and regulations regarding labour protection. They should accept and coordinate with labour protection supervision. Trade unions at all levels should safeguard the legitimate rights and interests of workers in accordance with law. Trade unions at all levels should exercise supervision over employers to

make sure that they abide by these laws, rules and regulations. The regulations clearly stipulate that labour protection supervision should be carried out in the forms of routine inspection, examination of written reports submitted by employers, and acceptance of complaints. At least two labour protection supervisors are required in carrying out an investigation or inspection. In addition, they should wear the insignia of labour protection supervisors and show their credentials. The regulations also clearly stipulate the duties of the labour protection supervision department, its authority in carrying out investigations and inspections as well as in dealing with the violations of these laws, rules and regulations. In addition, the regulations stipulate that the labour protection supervision department should compile and maintain files on employers. If employers commit serious violations of these laws, rules and regulations, the department concerned should reveal their names to the public. (Xinhua, 14 Nov 04, in BBC PF, 16 Nov 04)

The Chinese government has issued rules to protect the rights and interests of labourers. The regulations go into effect as from 1 December of 2004. According to the rules, labour and social security departments of the government have the authority to punish and order employers to correct infringements. The rules forbid assigning women to hazardous posts, such as working in mine shafts, working in high places during their menstrual period and assigning night shift to women who are more than seven months pregnant. The rules order employers to make compensations to their employees for defaulting on wage payment in addition to paying the wages in full. The rules forbid employers to obstruct the establishment and normal operation of trade unions. The rules encourage reporting violations of labour rights and interests to departments of labour and social security, noting informers of major cases shall be rewarded. (XNA, 10 Nov 04)

Regulations on the Management of Biosafety in Pathogenic Microorganism Laboratories, adopted at the 69th executive meeting of the State Council on 5 November 2004. The regulations will be put into

force on the day of promulgation. (Decree No. 424 of the State Council, signed by Premier Wen Jiabao on 12 November 2004) (Full text: RMRB, 1 Dec 04) The regulations consist of seven chapters with 72 articles.
