Macedonia (June 24) Deputy foreign ministers of Republic of Macedonia and People's Republic of China, Fuad Hasanovic and Zhang Yesui, signed an agreement for granting non-repayable assistance consisted of equipment, intended for the Macedonian Foreign Ministry, in total value of 500,000 euros -> 2005-04 S. 32-35/DS
