Cultural exchange program for 1989-91.

A Trade agreement (the first of its kind since 1961). It points out that the both sides pledge to take all possible measures to develop their trade and will accord each other most-favoured-nation treatment as to tariff and other costs of import, export and transit goods and import and export procedures

Soviet Union (Dec 28)

Barter agreement that will allow for laying of a railway track from Wusu in the Xinjiang Uighur Autonomous Region of China to the Ala pass on the Chinese-Soviet border. The agreement stipulates that the Soviet Union will provide China with rails, spare parts, timber, trucks, diesel oil and consumer goods in 1989-90, and that China in turn will repay the loan with Chinese goods, including wheat, corn, cotton and beef, as well as light industrial products and textiles from 1992-2001.

U.S.A. (Dec 15)

Agreement on maritime transportation. Under it, China allows U.S. shipping companies to open offices in China. Sealand shipping company of the U.S. will open two offices in China, a Chinese shipping official told Xinhua today. In addition, U.S. shipping companies will be able to open Feeder Line Services linking Hong Kong and some 40 listed Chinese ports. U.S. vessels may enter these Chinese ports upon 24 hour notice. A Chinese official said that, as China is deepening its economic structural reform and giving more independence to its enterprises, many Chinese businesses now use U.S. vessels to transport their goods to other countries and U.S. shipping companies now enjoy booming business in China.

A Agreement to "fully safeguard" U.S. national security interests and allow China to enter the international commercial satellite launching market. Under it, China will launch no more than nine communications satellites for international customers over the next six years. The agreement, which will take effect as soon as the U.S. issues a satellite export license for China, is the last of three agreements required by an administration decision taken September 9 on the issuance of export licenses for the Chinese launch of three U.S.-made communications satellites.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

Bangladesh

The China-aided Meghna textile factory in the northern part of Dhaka was inaugurated in Dec 1988. China provided a loan of about 1,17 Mio.US\$ for the construction of the textile factory which has an annual production of about 4,361 million meters of cloth and provided jobs to about 400 people. Ghana

Under an agreement of Dec 28, 1988, China agrees to construct 3 rice mills at Afife, about 160 km east of Accra. According to it, the Chinese side will help Ghana construct the 3 small rice-mills in the Afife reclamation area at a total cost of 742,800 Renminbi Yuan (about 200,000 U.S.\$). The Afife project, a Chinese assisted project, includes an irrigation plant and a rice farm of 860 hectares. The project was handed over to the Ghanaian government by the Chinese government in September 1983. The rice farm reaped a bumper harvest this year with a total output of 3,682.9 tons. Madagascar

The No.35 national road built by China was handed over in Dec 1988 at Mahabo, some 650 km west of Antananarivo. The 108-km-long road, that links Malaimbandy and Mahabo was completed in 25 months. (XNA, Dec 7, 1988)

Niger

The Seyni Kountche omni-sport stadium constructed with Chinese aid in Niamey was inaugurated in Dec 1988. The stadium, covering an area of 27 hectares with a capacity of 30,000 seats, comprises a football field, a sports ground and an administration of 89 offices. The construction of this stadium started in October 1985 and completed in June with a cost of some 20 Mio.US\$. (XNA, Dec 18, 1988)

Uganda

Under a protocol of Dec 13, 1988, China will construct a national stadium at Kireka, 6 km east of Kampala. The sports complex, which will accommodate up to 400,000 spectators, will be constructed under an interest-free loan of 80 million Chinese Yuan (21 Mio.US\$) offered by the Chinese government. Yemen Arab Republic

Under a contract of Dec 14, 1988, China agreed to construct a 107 km road stretching from Heghana, 30 km southeast of Sanaa to Mareb City. Under it, China will extend Arab Yemen a long-term, interest-free loan of 40.32 Mio.US\$, most of which will be used in the road project. (XNA, Dec 14, 1988)
