CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

General

China has established cooperative relations with developing countries over the past 30 years. In addition to sending 400,000 engineers and technicians, China has trained 35,000 technicians and 3,000 students in 70 countries. Since 1979, China signed 3,000 project and labor service contracts involving 170,000 Chinese workers in 88 countries. Since 1963, it has sent 8,000 medical personnel to 40 countries and regions, treated 70 million patients and trained 10 million medical workers in those countries. Cooperating with the United Nations Development Program, China has set up regional research and training centers to provide services to developing countries. (XNA, Nov 11, 1986)

Bangladesh

Construction of a bridge over the Buriganga river started on Oct 18, 1986. The bridge will be over 874 meters long and 17.6 meters wide, with 21 spans, and horizontal and vertical clearances of 76 meters and 12,2 meters respectively for easy navigation. It will have an underpass at the Dhaka end to ease out traffic congestion. (XNA, Nov 18, 1986)

Bolivia

Under a contract for agricultural research, China will help Bolivia build an experimental station for soybean and peanut crops, another for rice and vegetable crops as well as a tea planting and processing project.

Cameroon

The Lagdo hydro-electric power station was completed with Chinese assistance. The plant, situated on the upper reaches of the Benue river, will greatly enhance agricultural and industrial development in northern Cameroon. (XNA, Nov 30, 1986)

Chinese experts constructed three Chinese-type pilot biogas centres and trained 17 local technicians to master the biogas technology. During their two-month stay, the Chinese experts established two biogas centres in Mwanze region and one in Mara region. The three centres have started producing gas for lighting and cooking after completion of the construction.


