Protocol on cooperation between the leading scientific and technological bodies of China and Hungary. The document envisages an increase in the exchanges of technology and closer cooperation in joint research and design work. The protocol also provides for a regular exchange of information on science and technology.

It was reported that the two sides have already begun feasibility studies and the first commercial flight of the MPC-75, a 85-120 seat regional passenger plane capable of flying a distance of 2,800 km, could take place in 1995 if design and development work proceeded well as expected.
MBB and CATIC also agreed to set up a joint office in Hamburg to coordinate their work and establish contacts with potential customers.

Loan agreement under which Japan will provide China with a loan of 80.6 billion Yen (about 472 million U.S.-Dollars in 1986). The loan carries a 3,5% interest rate and a payment period of 30 years with a grace period of 10 years. It will be used to help China build 7 key projects. The funds are part of an 854 million Dollar aid package aid that prime minister Yasuhiro Nakasone promised during his visit to China in March 1984. So far Japan has provided about 3.09 billion Dollars in total loans to China.

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

General

In 1986 China will undertake 252 foreign-aid projects in 65 countries. Altogether 174 projects in agriculture, industry, public service and geological prospecting were completed over the past 5 years. A total of over 30,000 Chinese people were sent abroad to undertake the projects. By the end of 1985, more than 1,200 Chinese medical workers were working in 42 countries and regions. In addition, the total volume of contracted projects and labor service signed between China and foreign countries increased by an average of 60% a year from 1981 to 1985. More than 170,000 Chinese were sent abroad to undertake such projects during this period.
