**Great Britain (May 15)**

A Agreement which calls for

Britain to supply goods and services for Chinese development projects. This loan is worth 300 million Pounds sterling. Projects the loan will cover include a coal-fired power station in Hunan province, a telecommunications center for the Shanghai area, a seamless steel tube mill at Daye, Hubei province, and renovation of Luoyang No.1

tractor factory.

B Investment promotion and protection accord, which provides safeguards for investors and is designed to encourage business confidence and the flow of investments.

**Barbados (May 16)**

Agreement on China to construct a 2,500-seat gymnasium

(XNA, May 16)

**Great Britain (May 16)**

Program on cultural cooperation for 1986/04-1988/03. The two countries will specially encourage cooperation between learned societies, universities and other academic institutions. China and Britain are to reciprocate more art exhibitions and performances during the period.

**U.S.A. (May 16)**

A Protocol on cooperation in telecommunications

B Work program for industrial and technological cooperation in the machine building industry

C Two agreements on U.S. provision of funds for 2 feasibility study projects in China involving the treatment of toxic waste and conversion from oil to coal for boilers of power stations.

**Poland (May 17)**

Scientific and technological cooperation program for 1986-90. It stipulates that, as the first step, Poland and China should formulate and implement major scientific-technical cooperation projects of mutual interest, in the fields of mining, power, machine-building, electronics, metallurgy, chemistry, telecommunications, transport, marine economics, shipbuilding, agriculture and food-processing industry, and China's "sparkling plan" a blueprint made by the Chinese State Science and Technology Commission. The "sparkling plan," covering 24 major fields, is designed to apply advanced technologies to the development of local economies.

**Grenada (May 20)**

Agreement on a Chinese donation. Under it, the Chinese government is to provide the Grenadian government with a donation to be used for covering the technical assistance by China to Grenada as may be agreed upon between the two sides.

**Cyprus (May 21)**

Agreement on cooperation in tourism

(XNA, May 21, 1986)

**Australia (May 22)**

Agreement on building a wool storehouse. Under it, the Australian side will provide structural components, equipment and a computer system, and the Chinese side will provide the site, buildings and transportation. To be built near Nanjing's Xinchengxu port, which opened to foreign ships recently, the storehouse will be used by the Chinese side after completion.

**Luxembourg (May 22)**

Executive plan 1986-87 on cultural cooperation

(XNA, May 22, 1986)

**German Democratic Republic (May 22)**

Agreement between the Academies of Sciences on the cooperation in the field of natural sciences and technology sciences between the two academies, and a 1986-1988 program on scientific cooperation. According to the agreement, both sides will exchange scientists to make field studies, pay visits, do research work, attend academic activities, exchange information of research achievements, and also hold bilateral academic symposiums.

**Germany Democratic Republic (May 23)**

Ten-year scientific and technological cooperation agreement.

It provides for exchange of visits between specialists, joint training programs and research projects and exchange of scientific and technological information.

**Antigua and Barbuda (May 23)**

Protocol on the using of the second Chinese donation. The donation will be used to continue the implementation of an agricultural program under the first donation offered by China in 1983, apart from realizing a workers' low-cost housing project, according to the protocol.

**France (May 23)**

A Four-year scientific and technological cooperation accord on agronomic research. The accord proposes exchanges in the fields of soil microbiology, vegetable planting, rural economy and improvement of wheat quality.

B Letter of intent on the evaluations of nuclear safety in a nuclear power plant in Guangdong Province.

(XNA, May 23, 1986)

**Federal Republic of Germany (May 24)**

A Agreement to train Chinese doctoral students. Under it, a doctoral candidate in technological and scientific disciplines will



study for about four years, doing basic course work in China, followed by one or two years of research work in Federal Germany. The doctoral dissertation will be guided and appraised by tutors from both countries. The student will defend his dissertation in China, where he will be accorded the degree. The five universities to cooperate are China's Qinghua and Zhejiang Universities, and Federal Germany's Aachen, Munich and Berlin Technical Universities. The first Chinese doctoral candidates are to arrive in Federal Germany late next year.

**B** Minutes of talks on the 4th Meeting of the Development and Policy Cooperation Mixed Commission. Under it, the Federal Republic of Germany will provide China with 70 million DM in financial aid and 38.6 million DM in technical aid in 1986.

#### **Soviet Union (May 26)**

Agreement on cultural cooperation for 1986-87. It covers personnel exchanges and cooperation in science, education, arts, film, journalism, publication, sports, health, television and broadcasting.

#### **Poland (May 27)**

Cooperation agreement between Xinhua News Agency and the Press Agency of Poland (pap).

(XNA, May 27, 1986)

#### **Soviet Union (May 28?)**

Agreement on shipping cooperation. Under it, the Soviet Ocean Shipping Company will set up a representation office in Shanghai, and China's Navigation Company an office in Odessa.

#### **Japan (May 28)**

Exchange of notes agreeing that the Japanese government will loan China 80.6 billion yen (about 470 million US\$) for 1986. According to the notes, the repayment period will be for 20 years following a 10 year grace period, at an annual interest rate of 3.5 percent. The money will be used for seven major construction projects. These projects are: the No.3 and No.4 docks in Qinhuangdao port (planned to be completed in 1988), second phase of construction of Miaoling dock at Lianyung port (planned to be completed in 1990), construction of Qianwangang area of Qingdao port (planned to be completed in 1990), construction of electric railway between Hengyang and Guangzhou (planned to be completed in 1988), electric railways between Zheng-

zhou and Baoji (planned to be completed in 1988), expansion of telephone lines in Tianjin, Shanghai and Guangzhou cities (planned to be completed in 1989) and Tianshengqiao (Basuo) hydropower station (planned to be completed in 1991).

#### **Belgium (May 29)**

Agreement aimed at promoting exchanges and cooperation for the development of science and nuclear technology for peaceful purposes.

#### **German Democratic Republic (May 29)**

Protocol to increase cooperation between publishers. The protocol says that each side will recommend to the other novels, short prose, poetry and youth literature for publication. The German Democratic Republic will publish a collection of poems by Ai Qing, a well-known Chinese poet, and works by other contemporary Chinese writers. China will translate and publish literature of Democratic Germany including works by its best-known woman writer Anna Seghers and novelist Hermann Kant.

Protocol on the increase of exchanges of handicraft personnel and experiences.

#### **German Democratic Republic (May 31)**

**A** Consular treaty. This treaty, to come into force after an exchange of ratifications, will replace the previous one concluded in 1959.

**B** Plan on cooperation between the foreign ministries.

#### **Czechoslovakia (May 31)**

**A** Protocol on cooperation in science and technology.

Elected chairman of the People's Government of Tibet Autonomous Region (XNA, Jun 1, 1986).

Doje, a Tibetan and born in 1938, has been the government's acting chairman before.

#### **Guo Zhenqian 郭振乾**

Elected governor of Hubei Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

Guo has been vice-governor since Apr 1983 and acting governor of Hubei since Jan 1986.

#### **Huang Zhengxia 黄正夏**

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress of Hubei Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

Huang is a newcomer.

#### **Huang Zhizhen 黄知真**

Elected chairman of the People's Congress of Hubei Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

Huang, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1977, has been governor of Hubei from Apr 1983 until Jan 1986. (Huang took care of Deng Xiaoping in Jiangxi Province after the fall of Lin Biao, when he held the post of secretary of Jiangxi Province CP)

#### **Jia Zhijie 贾志杰**

Elected governor of Gansu Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

Jia graduated from a college in the USSR and later worked for 20 years in a local machine-building factory until he was elected deputy secretary of Gansu CP in Mar 1983.

#### **Li Fusheng**

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress of Gansu Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

Li is a newcomer.

#### **Li Peiji 李培基**

Identified as director of the Joint Tactical Training Center of the PLA (in Nanjing?) (XNA, Apr 22, 1986).



Li was a newcomer when elected deputy for the PLA to the 5th NPC in Feb 1978.

### Li Ye 李 晔

Elected vice-governor of Shandong Province (Hongkong Zhongguo Xinwen She, May 19, 1986; cit. SWB, May 23, 1986).

Li was elected deputy for Shandong for the 6th NPC in May 1983 and could be identified as secretary of the Party Committee of Shengli oil-field in Feb 1984.

### Liu Bing 刘 冰

Elected chairman of the People's Congress of Gansu Province (XNA, May 17, 1986).

A vice-president of Qinghua University before the Cultural Revolution he was reactivated in 1979 and became president of Lanzhou University in 1980 and deputy secretary of Gansu CP in 1982.

### Ma Zhongchen 马 忠臣

Elected vice-governor of Shandong Province (Hongkong Zhongguo Xinwen She, May 19, 1986; cit. SWB, May 23, 1986).

Since 1982 Ma has been an alternate member of the CCP 12th Central Committee.

### Song Shuhua 宋 叔华

Elected vice-governor of Hebei Province (XNA, May 5, 1986).

Song is a newcomer.

### Tan Qinglian 谭 庆琏

Elected vice-governor of Shandong Province (Hongkong Zhongguo Xinwen She, May 19, 1986; cit. SWB, May 23, 1986).

Tan is a newcomer.

### Tian Ying 田 英

Wang was a newcomer when elected member of the Standing Committee of Hubei CP in Mar 1983.

From 1984 until Dec 1985 Wen had been vice-minister of Geology and Mineral Resources.
