It stipulates that, as the first step, Poland and China should formulate and implement major scientifictechnical cooperation projects of mutual interest, in the fields of mining, power, machine-building, electronics, metallurgy, chemistry, telecommunications, transport, marine economics, shipbuilding, agriculture and food-processing industry, and China's "sparking plan" a blueprint made by the Chinese State Science and Technology Commission. The "sparking plan," covering 24 major fields, is designed to apply advanced technologies to the development of local economies.

A Agreement to train Chinese doctoral students. Under it, a doctoral candidate in technological and scientific disciplines will

The doctoral dissertation will be guided and appraised by tutors from both countries. The student will defend his dissertation in China, where he will be accorded the degree. The five universities to cooperate are China's Qinghua and Zhejiang Universities, and Federal Germany's Aachen, Munich and Berlin Technical Universities. The first Chinese doctoral candidates are to arrive in Federal Germany late next year.
