Iran (Mar 03)

Protocol on setting up a ministerial joint committee for cooperation in economy, trade, science and technology.
(XNA, Mar 3, 1985)

India (Mar 05)

Trade agreement. Under it, the two organizations will exchange information and materials concerning economic, technological and foreign trade policies and development in their respective countries. Each organization will also help its own economic organizations and enterprises to establish ties and develop exchanges with those of the other country.

Tanzania (Mar 05)

Agreement for cultural programs in 1985-86. Under it the two countries will promote exchanges of fine arts and crafts and books, and sponsor visits by musicians and writers. Scholarships will also be made available to students.

Yugoslavia (Mar 05)

Agreement on financial and banking cooperation. It stipulates that the two sides will give impetus to appropriate forms of financial and banking cooperation and encourage regular payments for goods which are traded, the financing of export-oriented production, business and technical cooperation.

Nepal (Mar 06)

Border memorandum related to tourist traffic. According to it, crossing will take place between the Tibetan town of Zham and Kodari in Nepal. Only simple immigration and customs procedures will be required. Tourists agencies from both China and Nepal will be able to organise cross-border trips after the memorandum is officially approved by the two governments.

Turkey (Mar 07)

Minutes of the 3rd meeting of the

Chinese-Turkish Economic and Trade Committee. According to it, China and Turkey agreed to increase their trade volume to 100 million dollars in 1985. Turkey will import from China goods including wheat, rice, soybean, raw silk, steam coal, crude oil, machinery and equipment, while China will buy goods from Turkey such as tobacco, cement, chrome ore, fertilizers and cotton.

Protocol on scientific and technical cooperation. According to it, 16 projects, 9 in the Philippines and 7 in China, will be implemented in 1985. The Chinese projects include the study of salt production, the processing technology of bamboo furniture and silk cocoons into fabric, the design and maximum utilisation of small-scale water impounding projects and the use of herbal medicine, as well as provision by China of selected plant material, a study of ecological agriculture, integrated utilisation of tropical forests and woods, the technique of high yield of tilapia (a kind of fish) and sea farming, road construction and its maintenance, integrated management of grains, livestock and poultry, and management of public health, disease control and immunisation.

Agreement on fishery terms. The agreement spells out in the Chinese waters two areas of protection and five areas where Japanese fishermen are required to observe a seasoning fishing halt, ranging from 1.5 to three months, to protect fishery resources there. It is based on a review of implementation last year of the Sino-Japanese fishery agreement signed in 1975 and on a study of fishery resources in the Chinese waters. Pending ratification by both governments, it also limits the maximum number of 74 fishing vessels from the two countries operating at the same time in the areas.

B Agreement on the establishment of a joint committee on economic cooperation. This committee at ministerial level is to be set up to review progress made in trade and investment cooperation. The setting up of this committee is a clear indication of the importance the two countries attach to the promotion and intensification of economic cooperation between them.

UNICEF will provide 50 million U.S. dollars in assistance, while the Chinese government will cover local expenditures. The Chinese Ministry of foreign economic relations and trade will coordinate the work of various Chinese organizations involved in the projects.

Botswana

A new Chinese medical team arrived in March 1985. It is the third one sent by China. The second will leave the country on April 1. (XNA, Mar 15, 1985) China decided to provide 500 tons

of maize to alleviate the country's food shortage. (XNA, Mar 29, 1985)

Burma

With Chinese assistance the construction of the No.1 National Gymnasium is under way. Covering 9,000 square meters of land and rising to some 30 meters in height, the building has been designed in Burma's national architectural style. The building and surrounding grounds will embrace a total of 17 acres of land with a total building space of over 26,000 square meters. Upon completion the gymnasium will seat 10,800 and be suited for a wide range of sports activities including various kinds of ball games, gymnastics, judo, boxing, weightlifting as well as cultural performances. China decided to present a theatre to Burma. It will be set up in Rangoon and will have a seating of capacity of 1,000 people. (XNA, Mar 5, 1985)

Ethiopia

China donated 5,000 tons of maize and 1,000 blankets. She also decided to give Ethiopia 15,000 tons of grain in all and 72,000 farm implements. (XNA, Mar 16, 1985)

Congo

The foundation stone was laid for the Military Academy of Marien Nguabi, to be built with Chinese assistance. It is situated 22 km north of Brazzaville and will accommodate 300 students. (XNA, Mar 19, 1985)

Guinea

Iraq

Under a contract of Mar 14, China will construct three residential buildings in Baghdad. (XNA, Mar 15, 1985)

Luo was a newcomer when he was appointed member of the National Agricultural Zoning Committee in September 1983.

Ma Zhenduo 马振铎

Appointed vice-chairman of the People's Government of Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region (Hohhot

Radio, Mar 6, 1983; cit. SWB, Mar 12, 1985).
Ma, a Mongol, was a newcomer when he was elected member of the Standing Committee of the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region CP in December 1984.
