Agro-technical Station

An agro-technical station was set up with Chinese assistance at Kikwit in the Bandundu Region. It cultivates rice and vegetables on more than 4,000 ha and has a rice-huskings shop and an agricultural machine repair shop (1).

Cattle Taming

Under the guidance of Chinese agro-technicians local peasants on the Ruzizi Plain in the Kivu Region for the first time learnt to tame cattle to till. Situated in east Zaire, the Ruzizi Plain has over 25,000 hectares of farmland, but with only 23,000 farm labourers. There are more than 20.000 head of cattle on the plain, but they have never been tamed to till the land. Until 1976 53 cattle had been tamed. A dozen of local peasants learned the cattle-taming technique and were ready to teach it (1).

Chinese technicians set up a farm tool factory in Kinshasa (1). It is Zaire's first farm implement

40 million dollars of the IDA credit will go to increasing production of high quality seeds or major food and cash crops. Special priority will be given to improve operation of the national seed corporation, the agency responsible for developing a comprehensive seed quality and control system. The project will serve as a model for the construction of more than 300 advanced seed centers throughout China over the next two decades. Each center will be made up of several seed companies and certified seed farms. Under the project, which will cost in total 86.8 million dollars, processing plants, warehouses and research laboratories will be constructed. Facilities at 18 seed production and distribution centers in 12 provinces and two autonomous regions will be modernized as well

as new equipment provided. Improvements will also be made to about 28,000 hectares of seed farmland. The modifications will include construction or upgrading of some 480 kilometers of rural roads, and the construction of 1,500 kilometers of irrigation canals and drains, and about 165 wells. Both interest-free IDA loans are for 50 years and include 10-year grace periods.
