### Completed Projects

#### Road I

Under protocols of January 1958 (1) and January 1959 (2) the Sanaa-Hodeida road was constructed with Chinese aid between December 1958 (3) and December 1961 (4). This 231-km road (5) has 55 bridges and 489 drainage canals (6). It cost 15 million US dollars (7).

#### Textile Mill

Under protocols of January 1959 (1) and March 1965 (2), the mill was set up with Chinese assistance in Sanaa. Construction started in September 1964 (3) and was completed in March 1967 (4). The mill has 10,000 spindles and 360 looms (5) and an annual capacity of seven million meters of cotton cloth. After being put into operation it produced 30 varieties of cloth, including gabardine and dyed poplin (4). In 1972 it employed 1,500 workers and staff, since 1970 working on a 3-shift system (5). The mill works up one third of the country's cotton production which in 1967 was between 3,000 and 4,000 tons annually (4). Parts of the mill were destroyed and several Chinese experts wounded on 25th July, 1968, when royalist forces bombarded it (6). The costs of the mill were estimated at 2.5 million US dollars (7). In December 1979 a protocol on the transformation and expansion of the mill was signed (8). By the beginning of 1984, no further news had been heard of the mill.

#### Road II

Construction of the Sanaa-Sada road started in September 1967 (1). It was opened to traffic in June 1977 (2), while its Huth-Sada section was handed over in September 1977 (3). The road is 244 km long, is asphalted and links the capital of Sanaa with the important city of Sada in the north (2). Most of it goes up to heights of more than 2,000 m above sea-level (4). Its costs were estimated at 28 million US dollars (5).

#### Technical School

Under a protocol of July 1969 (1) the foundation stone for a secondary industrial technical school in Sanaa was laid in July 1969 (2). The inauguration was in September of the following year (3). This school is a present of the Chinese to the Yemeni government (4). It has four classes specializing in auto maintenance, electrical machinery maintenance, house construction as well as road and bridge construction (5). A Chinese teaching group worked at the school at least between 1974 and 1976 (6).

#### Agricultural Station

In December 1971 a Chinese agricultural investigation group came to Yemen to study the feasibility of an agricultural project (1). Their work led to the construction of an agricultural technique experiment and popularization station at Batina in the north of Sanaa Province (2) which was handed over in the fall of 1976 (3). The station cultivates sorghum, maize, wheat, cotton, sweet potatoes and vegetables and also produces small farm implements (4).

#### Hospital I

Under a protocol of March 1972 (1) a Chinese hospital investigation group stayed in Yemen from September 1971 until March 1972 (2). Their study led to the construction of a hospital in Taiz which started in September 1973 (3) and was handed over in April 1976 (4). It has 220 beds and a capacity to receive more than 500 out patients

per day (3).

#### Oil-pressing Mill I

A Chinese mission concerned with the building of a cotton ginnyery and an oil press stayed in Sanaa in 1973 (1). Their investigation led to the construction of an oil-pressing mill connected with the Sanaa textile mill. This oil-pressing mill processes the cotton seeds supplied by the ginning workshop of the textile mill (2).

Construction of the Amran-Hajja road started in September 1974 (1) and was completed in September 1982. It is 76 km long and reduces the distance of transportation between western Saudi Arabia and Sanaa by over 200 km (2).

#### Office Building

The office building of the Yemeni radio and television general administration constructed by the China Construction Engineering Corporation was officially put to use today. The construction of the 1,000-squaremeter building in the northern suburb of Sanaa was completed on June 30 in accordance with the contract. This is one of the largest projects which have been constructed by the Chinese corporation in this country (1).

#### Road IV

Construction of the Mokha-Mufrack road started in September 1980 and was completed in November 1981. The 44-kilometer-long highway starts from the southern part of Mokha and, running eastward inland, links up with the Taiz-Hodeida highway. It cuts 140 kilometers by car from Taiz, the main city in the south, to port Mokha off the Red Sea, and is thus of strategic and economic significance (1).

#### Furniture Factory

The Fujian Furniture Manufacturing Company of China and the Ramah Company of the Arab Republic of Yemen signed a contract in October 1980 for the Yemen-China Joint Furniture Enterprising Co., Ltd. to be set up with investments from China and North Yemen. The contract stipulates that this company, the first of its kind, will have a furniture factory equipped with production equipment provided by China. It will manufacture furniture suites in steel and wood. This factory was expected to be completed by March, 1981 (1).

#### Cotton Ginning and Oil-Pressing Plant II

A Chinese technical team in 1978 worked a study for the construction of this project (1). The plant is located in an eastern suburb of Hodeida, 18 kilometers from the city, covering an area of 11 hectares. After completion it was to gin 11,980 tons of cotton and turn out 1,990 tons of oil every year. The foundation stone for this project was laid in May 1979 (2). Although nothing further was heard on it its completion may be assumed.

Liberia

Under an agreement of March 23, China will dispatch a 14-men medical team to work in the government hospital in Tubmanburg, Bomi County, some 70 km, northwest of Monrovia.

Libya

A total of 350,000 breeding freshwater fish left Hangzhou on 20th February by air for Tripoli in Libya. Various species of carp, bred by the Zhejiang provincial freshwater aquatic products experimental farm, were being exported under a contract signed by the China International Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Fishery Engineering Corporation and Libyan authorities.

Nepal

China agreed to construct a leather gloves and aprons manufacturing project within the Bansbari leather and shoe factory, which was constructed with Chinese aid. Under the agreement, the Chinese government will provide technical and financial assistance for the construction and initial commissioning of the project, which will have a capacity of 200 pairs of gloves and 100 aprons a day.

A set of living quarters of a sugar mill and sugar cane farm complex, which was constructed with China's assistance was handed over.

The living quarters, with a total construction floor space of 13,000 square meters, was launched on October 1982 under a contract signed between the two countries on May 26, 1981, and completed on March 6 this year, six months ahead of schedule.

Somalia

Chinese technicians were engaged in the construction of the Institute of Political Science. The

project, officially started in July 1983, will be completed by the end of 1985. Up to now, the lecture building and office building have been basically completed and their inside installation work is going on. Four dormitory buildings, the foundation for the auditorium and four professor houses have been put up. The construction of a dining room, a clinic, a foot-ball ground and other installations is also underway.

With the assistance of Chinese technicians the Malwanagama farm in Talawa, about 200 km east of Colombo, was completed. With the assistance of Chinese specialists, the construction of the farm began in August 1982 under an agreement signed between the two governments earlier. Its aim is to introduce through demonstration Chinese agricultural techniques and cultivate improved varieties of grains for the development of Sri Lanka agriculture.
