Antigua and Barbuda

In 1983 China pledged 740,000 U.S. dollars in development aid to Antigua and Barbuda, most of which will be for the agricultural sector. (XNA Apr 3, 1984; cit. SWB 18.4.84)

Ethiopia

Under a protocol of april 19th, China agreed to help Ethiopia build a thread factory, a pencil factory, a matches factory and well-drilling projects in rural areas. (XNA Apr 19, 1984)

Madagascar

The Chinese Red Cross donated 20,000 U.S. dollars to aid hurricane victims (XNA Apr 5, 1984)

Sierra Leone

A housing project was handed over in April 1984. It consists of living quarters for the Magbass sugar mill. (XNA Apr 17, 1984)

Somalia

In April 1984 a gravity irrigation project was inaugurated which is located on the bank of the Shabeelle river, at a farm 110 km north-west of Mogadishu. The project was completed in four and a half months at a cost 680,000 shillings less than the 2.680 million allocated by the Somali government. It consists of a sluice gate to stop the sand, a sluice gate for gravity flowing, a terminal flood-gate, a canal and a flood-control dam. (XNA Apr 6, 1984)

The China Hydrailic-Engineering Corporation will soon start a flood-relief project some 30 km from the Shabeelle irrigation project. (XNA Apr 6, 1984)

Bulgaria (Apr 02)

Minutes on technical cooperation related to producing fork-lifts, wines, beer, soft drinks and processing fruit. (XNA Apr 3, 1984)

Mauritius (Apr 03)

Agreement for sports exchange and cooperation 1984-85 (XNA Apr 3, 1984)

Minutes for cooperation in science and technology (XNA Apr 4, 1984)

Tunisia (Apr 04)

Information cooperation program, which establishes cooperation between the Tunisian Ministry of Information and China's Xinhua News agency and Ministry of Radio and Television to promote news reporting of each other's political, economic, social and cultural life. (XNA Apr 5, 1984)

Japan (Apr 10)

Summary on scientific and technical cooperation. According to it, the two countries will: send four study groups from each side on academic visits; continue the joint research begun in 1981 on forecasting and estimating crop dis-eases and insect pests. The summary notes that agro-biological scientific and technical forums will be held in China in 1985 and Japan in 1986. The two sides will exchange seeds and seedlings as well as publications on agriculture, forestry and fishery. (XNA Apr 11, 1984)

Agreements on joint development of an open-cast coal mine with a designed annual capacity of 15,000,000 t between the China National Coal Development Corp. and Occidental Petroleum Corp. of the U.S.A.

The Antaibao project, the largest joint venture ever undertaken between China and any foreign firm, calls for a total investment of 600,000,000 US dollars, with 58% coming from the US side and 42% from the Chinese side... The Antaibao coal mine is located in

the pingshuo mining area of Shanxi Province, China's leading coal producer. Construction of the mine, located about 500 km west of Peking, is scheduled to start in 1985. The coal mine will be the biggest in China upon completion by 1988. About 8,700,000 t of dressed coal will be for export and 3,200,000 t of middlings and peat will be used for power station built near the mine. The co-operation area at the Antaibao mine, which covers 17.07 sq km, has estimated coal reserves of 452,530,000 tons. The term of contract is for 30 years. Each partner will have a 50% share of the products before the investment is recovered. After that, the ratio will be 60% for the Chinese side and 40% for the US side. Under the agreement, each partner will appoint three persons to make up the joint administrative committee, the highest administration at the mine, while the posts of general manager and deputy general manager will be taken by the two sides in turn.
