Under a protocol of December 1970 (1), China's medical aid to Sudan started in 1971 (2).

Friendship Hall

In 1971 a group of Chinese experts in Khartoum engaged in design work for a friendship hall (1). Construction of this project started in January 1973 (2) and was completed in May 1976. The

hall consists of a friendship international conference hall with simultaneous interpretation equipment for eight languages; a medium-sized conference room and a number of small meeting rooms, a banquet hall, a modern theatre, an exhibition hall and other attached buildings and equipments. The total area of the friendship hall is 50,000 square metres, among which all buildings cover 1,000 square metres with their floor space amounting to 24,000 square metres and in addition, a square, a car park and afforested zones. The main building is 40 metres high. The wall behind the rostrum of the conference hall is made of Chinese granite (3). The friendship hall is situated at the confluence of the two Niles (4) in downtown Khartoum (5). From 1976 until 1978 a group of Chinese experts stayed in the friendship hall to give technical direction on its maintenance (6).

Rice Station

This station was set up with Chinese assistance in the Gezira Region (1). In 1972 and 1973, with help of the Chinese rice-planting technique popularization group, the Gezira farmers succeeded in the trial planting of paddy rice on small plots. They planted rice over an area of ten thousand feddan and again they succeeded. The average output per feddan reached over one ton and the best over two tons. In the past two years, the Chinese rice planting group held five training courses on ploughing, sowing, fertilizer application, irrigation, prevention of insect pests and plant diseases, farm management, harvesting and seed-selection. The courses were attended by leading officials of the Gezira and agricultural techniboard cians.

Road

The Wad Medani-Gedaref road, constructed with Chinese aid, is the longest asphalt road of Sudan (1). It is particularly important because it traverses the agricultural regions of central and east Sudan (2). The road cuts through the Blue Nile valley, with a bridge at Wad Medani (3) which is 507 m long (650 m if including the

length of the two approaches on both ends) and 20 m wide, connecting the country's main cotton-producing area of Gezira with the main sorghum-producing area of Gedaref (4). Construction of this 227-km road started in March 1973 (5) and was completed in March 1976 (6). The project for surfacing the road with bituminous concrete was started in May 1981 and was to be completed in October 1983 (7). The road and the Wad Medani bridge over the Blue Nile were expected to cost about 40 million U.S.dollars (8). The bituminous concrete overlay project was formally handed over in December 1983 (9).

Geological Prospecting

A Chinese geological experts team of about 100 persons (1) explored for chrome ore in the Ingessana mountains with a circumference of 2,000 square kilometers in the southeastern Blue Nile Province from 1974 (2) to mid of 1977. After finishing their survey they submitted a report to the Sudan Ministry of Energy and Mining. Studies made will help the Chinese experts establish a chrome industry in the region (3).

Fishery Project

Under a protocol of October 1975 China agreed to send experts and the necessary equipment for exploiting fishery resources in the Nuba lake (1). The project was to include the establishment of a deep-freezing system in Old Halfa, Atbara and Halfa (2), a factory at Wad Halfa, workshops for the maintenance of boats and fishing nets, and cold-storage depots for salting fish (3). Construction of this fishery project started in 1976 and was completed in June 1979. It has a daily output of five tons of refrigerated fish and is the biggest one in Sudan (4). After completion a new protocol was signed where China was to provide Sudan with experts for training Sudanese workers for this project (5). Three tons of first-class fish in 1979 were airlifted every week to meet the market demands

Textile Mill

In June 1973 Chinese experts started the preparatory work with this textile mill, situated at Hassaheisa (1) in Gezira Province. Its construction started in January 1974 (2) and was completed in Febraury 1978 (3). The spinning and weaving sections of the mill were put into production in May 1976. With the commissioning of the printing and dyeing sections in 1978 the entire mill was completed. It is the first state-owned textile mill in Sudan and had 1,700 workers in 1978 (2). It has an annual productive capacity of 14 million meters of cotton cloth (4).

Clothing Factory

In mid-1978 a Chinese survey team for the construction of a ready-made clothing factory stayed in Sudan (1). In November that year a protocol was signed where China was to build a factory to produce ready-made clothing with an annual output of 200,000 garments; China agreed to provide equipment, spares and staff training (2). Nothing further was heard on this project.

Vocational Training Center

Under a protocol of December 1983, Chinese architects will undertake the designing of a vocational training center and Chinese workers will build it. The project named "Omdurman Friendship Vocational Training Center of the Sudan" will have a floor space of 8,000 square meters and can accomodate 500 students. It will provide training in civil engineering, mechanical and electrical engineering, and auto-repair (1).

CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID

General.

China has decided to donate 3 million U.S.dollars worth of food to African countries for easing food scarcity on that continent. (XNA, Jun 14, 1984)

Congo

China and Congo signed a contract on technical cooperation. Under it the Chinese side, as of August 1, this year, will send 20 experts to Congo to do technical work for the functioning and maintaining of the facilities of the people's palace built with Chinese assistance, train the Congolese personnel working at the palace and offer suggestions for the palace's management. (XNA, Jun 27, 1984)

Ethiopia

China donated an exhibition hall built with the aid of Chinese technicians. It was built at the trade fair center in Addis Abeba for the Chinese export commodities exhibition which was held in May (XNA, Jun 11, 1984)

Liberia

China and Liberia signed a certification on transferring the Kpatawee agricultural cooperation project to Liberia and a new contract of technical cooperation on the project. The Kpatawee project located 200 kilometers northeast of the capital started two years ago under a contract signed by the China National Complete Plant Export Corporation and the Ministry of Agriculture of Liberia. Through their joint efforts 432 acres of farmland have been renovated, office buildings, living quarters, storages, piggery and chicken farms constructed, and 46 Liberian technicians and skilled workers trained. Under the new contract, China agrees to send six technical and managerial personnel to the farm for two years. (XNA, Jun 16, 1984)

The 4th Chinese medical team completed its mission while the fifth arrived.

The Analaiva-Morondava sugar refinery constructed with Chinese aid was inaugurated on June 24, 1984. Its construction started in June 1980. It covers an area of 11,4 hectars and has a floor space of 15,115 square meters. It can process 1,000 tons of sugar daily. (XNA, Jun 30, 1984)

Nepal

A water conservancy and irrigation project is under way in Pokhara. Construction on the dam, situated in Pokhara, a city in central Nepal, began in November, 1981. After over two years of work the Chinese experts and the Nepalese workers have completed 80 per cent of the earthworks of the project, half a year ahead of their construction schedule. After completion, the project will supply water to irrigate more than 1,000 hectares of land and to drive a power generating plant. To test the quality of the workmanship so far, Chinese experts drew off water from the overflow dam on May 24 while thousands of local people gathered to watch. The smooth progress of the project and good quality of the construction work have won praise from both the Nepalese officials and people. (XNA, Jun 12, 1984)
