Bourkina-fasso

The 4th Chinese medical team left the country while the 5th arrived.

The "4 August Stadium" sports complex was completed and handed over. Its construction started in July, 1981. The modern sports complex has 35,000 staired seats, a lawn football field in the center surrounded by plastic tracks. It also has special rooms for table tennis, gymnastics, weightlifting training. There are also open-air volleyball and basketball courts. The stadium is the biggest so far in the country.

Under an agreement of economic and technical cooperation
(XNA Jul 20, 1984) China granted a loan valued at 30,000,000 yuan, or about 13,000,000 dollars. This loan is made without interest or other conditions for a period of five years from 1st August 1984 to 31st July 1989. Of this amount 5,000,000 yuan, or about 2,000,000 dollars will be used to supply consumer goods to Mozambique. Besides this loan, the PRC will donate industrial products and consumer goods valued 5,000,000 yuan or about 2,000,000 dollars. The PRC has also donated 2,000 t of maize to Mozambique. It is noted with regard to these donations that the sea freight will also be paid to the PCR.
