Rice and Vegetable Station

The Chinese-aided rice and vegetable station at Laniera was constructed between 1976 and December 1979 (1)

Bamboo Workshop

Between 1976 and 1977 Chinese experts expanded a bamboo workshop in Tananarive. After completion of this project instead of the former 14 workers over 500 worked in six new workshops, mainly engaged in making furniture, bamboo ware, straw baskets and textiles (1).

Machine Repair and Assembly Plant Construction of this plant started in March 1976 and was completed in June 1977. This "Toly" state farm machine repair and assembly plant is situated at Andrenomena on the outskirts of Tulear in southern Madagascar. After completion it produced ploughs, hoes and harrows for the local peasants. At that time it was envisaged to make spare-parts for tractors and trucks in near future (1). In 1981 this plant had become the "Toly Enterprise" which at that time had seven factories throughout the country. The machines for repairing farm machinery were imported from China and financed with loans from China (2).

Tractor Training Classes

From April until May 1976 Chinese hand-guided tractor service groups trained several classes in experimental ploughing (1).

Farm Machinery Plant

A Chinese-aided farm machinery plant at Farafangana was handed over in October 1982. It makes rice-mills, maize shellers, pumps and parts for motorvehicles and tractors (1).

Sericulture Training Class

Four Chinese sericulture experts invited by the FAO worked since 1982 to pass on their experiences. The first sericulture training class opened in October 1983 in the Agricultural Professional Training Center in Tananarive. This class, jointly sponsored by the Malagasy government and Food and Agricultural Organisation of the United Nations, lasted five weeks. 34 chosen men and women peasants attended the class and were taught by Chinese sericulture experts (1).

The 4th Chinese medical team left the country while the 5th arrived. (XNA Jul 17, 1984)

The "4 August Stadium" sports complex was completed and handed over. Its construction started in July, 1981. The modern sports complex has 35,000 staired seats, a lawn football field in the center surrounded by plastic tracks. It also has special rooms for table tennis, gymnastics, weightlifting training. There are also open-air volleyball and basketball courts. The stadium is the biggest so far in the country. (XNA Jul 29, 1984)

Besides this loan, the PRC will donate industrial products and consumer goods valued 5,000,000 yuan or about 2,000,000 dollars. PRC has also donated The 2,000 t of maize to Mozambique. It is noted with regard to these donations that the sea freight will also be paid to the PCR.


