#### AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

##### Hungary (Oct 05)

Executive program on scientific, educational and cultural cooperation for 1985 and 1986.  
(XNA, Oct 6, 1984)

##### Mozambique (Oct 05)

Arrangement of accounting procedures in implementation of the economic and technical cooperation agreement of July 1984. According to the arrangement which comes into effect as of Oct 5, 1984, a loan of 30 million renminbi yuan (about 11.6 million US\$) should be provided to Mozambique within five years starting from 1 August, 1984. The money shall be repaid by Mozambique within ten years starting from 1 August, 1984 with Mozambican export commodities or convertible currency as agreed on by the two governments, in ten annual instalments each of which should be equal to one tenth of the total amount actually used.

##### Italy (Oct 06)

Two-year program of cooperation in nuclear energy.  
(XNA, Oct 7, 1984)

##### Sweden (Oct 08)

Protocol on the 5th Session of the Joint Industrial, Scientific and Technical Cooperation Commission. The two sides agreed to set up a working group to study a proposal for cooperation in special steel production, and a short-term protocol was signed on scientific and technical cooperation.

##### U.S.A. (Oct 09)

Cooperative program for high energy physics for 1984-85. The Chinese side will send scientists to the U.S. to study the manufacture and testing of relevant parts of accelerators and detectors as well as to purchase components and elements concerned. The American side will dispatch experts to China to help solve the technical problems arising from the construction of the Beijing electron-positron collider.

##### Brazil (Oct 11)

Agreement on cooperation in the peaceful use of nuclear energy. It stipulates that the two sides will cooperate in the peaceful use of nuclear energy on the basis of mutual respect for each other's sovereignty, non-interference in each other's internal affairs and equality and mutual benefit.

Article 1: The two parties shall cooperate in the areas of peaceful use of nuclear energy in keeping with the terms of this accord and on the basis of mutual respect for each other's sovereignty, non-interference in each other's respective domestic affairs, equality and mutual benefit.

Article 2: Under this accord, the two parties may cooperate in the following fields:

- a) Basic research into the peaceful uses of nuclear energy;
- b) Research, design, construction, and operation of nuclear plants and research reactors;
- c) Prospecting for and processing of minerals and uranium;
- d) Production of fuel rods;
- e) Research on nuclear safety regulations;
- f) Production and application of radioactive isotopes;
- g) Other fields of mutual interest.

Bilateral cooperation may be undertaken through any of the following activities:

- a) Exchange and training of scientists and technicians;
- b) Organisation of symposia and seminars;
- c) Rendering of consulting and technical services;
- d) Exchange of scientific and technical information and reference material;
- e) Other cooperation activities deemed appropriate by the two parties.

Article 3: The cooperation referred to in this accord shall be undertaken by the governments of the two parties or by the competent agencies designated by each government. The specific contents, the scope and other details of the cooperation will be established in specific agreements to be formulated by the two parties.

Article 4: The two parties shall be entitled to freely use the in-

formation exchanged under the terms of this accord, except for information for which the supplying party has established conditions or reservations in connection with its use and dissemination.

Article 5: The two parties shall be entitled to transfer to each other, in keeping with the terms of this accord, nuclear material and equipment necessary for the implementation of their respective programmes or joint programmes on peaceful use of nuclear energy. However, the parties shall not be entitled to transfer such nuclear material and equipment outside the territory or jurisdiction of the recipient, unless they have agreed to do so.

Article 6: All material or equipment supplied by one of the parties to the other under this accord, and the material obtained as a result of the use of the transferred material or equipment, and the materials used in equipment supplied under the terms of this accord shall be used only for peaceful purposes and shall not be used for the production or development of nuclear weapons or for any military objective. The two parties agree to ask the International Atomic Energy Agency to apply safeguards on the nuclear material or equipment transferred under the terms of this accord, or on the special fissionable material obtained from the use of the abovementioned material and equipment.

Article 7: Each party shall adopt the necessary measures to provide proper physical protection within its own territory to the nuclear material and equipment, in keeping with the terms of this accord.

Article 8: The two parties shall make all necessary efforts to support and promote scientific and technical cooperation among the different agencies and institutions of each country, in the area of the peaceful use of nuclear energy.

Article 9: The two parties shall adopt the necessary measures to facilitate the effective implementation of the present accord. At the request of any one of them, the two parties shall hold consultations on the implementation of the present accord, on the development of bilateral cooperation, and on other matters of mutual interest in connection with international cooperation in the area of peaceful uses of nuclear energy.

Article 10: (1) This accord shall come into force on the date of the

second notification by the parties that all the respective formalities and legal steps necessary for its enforcement have been complied with, and shall remain in force over a period of 15 years. Subsequently, it will be automatically renewed each five years except in case one of the parties notifies the other in writing of its desire to terminate the accord one year before it expires.

(2) The specific agreements referred to in Article 3 of this accord shall not be affected by the termination of the accord. In the case of this accord being terminated, the terms of Articles 5, 6 and 7 shall remain in force while any material or equipment transferred under the terms of this accord remain in the territory or under the jurisdiction of the recipient country.

(3) The two parties shall be entitled to amend this accord at any time through bilateral consultations. Any amendment shall come into force on the date of the second notification that the respective legal requirements have been met. (XNA, Oct, 11, 1984)

**Mozambique (Oct 12)**

Agreement on cultural cooperation. Under it, Mozambique will grant licenses to four Chinese fishing vessels and China will provide Mozambique with technical and material assistance for the development of its fisheries. (XNA, Oct 12, 1984)

Executive plan under the cultural agreement for the next two years. (XNA, Oct 12, 1984)

**Mozambique (Oct 13)**

Fisheries protocol. According to it, both sides agree to develop the exchange and cooperation between the two countries in the fields of culture, education, science, public health, sports, publication, cinema and radio broadcast on the basis of equality and mutual benefit. (XNA, Oct 19, 1984)

**Sweden (Oct 14)**

A Agreement on trade in textiles and textile products. Under it, Sweden will import Chinese textiles and textile products made of cotton, wool and artificial fibres.

Sports exchange agreement for 1985-86. Under it, China will send gymnastics, table tennis and volleyball teams, while Egyptian teams will tour China. (XNA, Oct 22, 1984)

**Tunisia (Oct 23)**

Agreement on economic and technical cooperation. (XNA, Oct 23, 1984)

**Japan (Oct 25)**

Exchanges of notes on loans from the Japanese government to the Chinese government in 1984. (XNA, Oct 26, 1984)

**German Democratic Republic (Oct 25)**

Agreement on broadcasting cooperation. Under it, the two countries will exchange broadcasting programmes and contributions which reflect their respective countries' politics, economy, society, culture, sports and music, and exchange staff, delegations and reporters to deepen mutual understanding and friendship and promote socialist construction. (XNA, Oct 26, 1984)

**Japan (Oct 26)**

Agreement on loans from the Japanese government to the Chinese government for the year 1984. Under it, the Japanese government will provide the Chinese government with 71.5 billion yen, for seven major Chinese projects. (XNA, Oct 26, 1984)

**CHINA'S ECONOMIC AID**

**Benin**

The Chinese government will give Benin a second batch of medicine and medical equipment this year valued at 190,000 RMB (about 70,000 US\$). (XNA, Oct 27, 1984)

**Bourkina-Fasso (ex-Upper Volta)**

The Chinese Red Cross presented in batch of BCG vaccine and meningococcus vaccine for 900,000 people for its inoculation campaign in November 1984. (XNA, Oct 9, 1984)

**Ethiopia**

China donated 1,000 t of maize to aid Ethiopia's drought relief work. The food has been distributed in the Northern part of the country. (XNA, Oct 31, 1984)

**Lesotho**

Aided by Chinese agrotechnicia a vegetable farm is under construction 7 km southeast of the town center of Maseru. Construction started in October 1983. The farm covers an area of 20 hectares. (XNA, Oct 10, 1984)

The Chinese government has decided to grant 75,000 US\$ in cash as emergency assistance to the Lesotho government to purchase food for the people in the drought-stricken area. (XNA, Oct 16, 1984)

**Mauritania**

The Chinese Red Cross donated 100,000 French francs to aid flood victims. (XNA, Oct 19, 1984)

**Tanzania**

The Dodoma dormitories project was handed over. Its construction started in July 1982. It consists of 28 buildings with a total floor

space of 14,647 square meters. (XNA, Oct 22, 1984) The Tazara railway begins making profits. According to statistics, in the 1983 fiscal year, the railway's freight volume reached 970,000 tons, 8.1 percent above the plan and the highest since 1979. The passengers it transported numbered 1,180,000, more than doubling that of the previous fiscal year. As a result, the railway's income in the 1983 fiscal year increased by 26.6 percent over the previous fiscal year, making a profit of 4,690,000 US\$. (XNA, Oct 24, 1984)

**Zambia**  
President Kaunda on 24th October laid the foundation stone for the United National Independence Party headquarters which will be constructed with Chinese assistance. (XNA, Oct 24, 1984)

**Zimbabwe**  
Prime minister Mugabe on October 12th laid the foundation stone for the Chinese-aided national sports stadium. It is situated at Warren Hills, west suburbs of Harare and covers over 50,000 square meters with 60,000 seats and several auxiliary buildings. (XNA, Oct 13, 1984)
