Angola

China donated 1,000 tons of wheat to the people in the droughtstriken areas of the country. (XNA Dec 8, 1984)

Benin

A China-built cigarette and match factory was turned over in December 1984. It is located 40 km west of Cotonou and was completed after two years of construction. It has a capacity of 100 cartons of cigarettes and 50 cartons of matches per shift. (XNA Dec 4, 1984)

Mali

China donated 2,000 tons of maize to Mali. (XNA Dec 12, 1984) China agreed to help in the construction of a hospital. (XNA Dec 12, 1984 China presented 84 trunks of medicine and medical instruments. They are worth about 295,000 U.S.dollars.

A net-weaving factory and a fishing-boat engine repair factory will be built in Mogadishu by the Zhejiang International Economic and Technical Co-operation Corporation and the coastal development project of the Somali Fisheries Ministry. This is the first time that China and Somalia have agreed to go into joint ventures. To see if the projects are feasible, two Chinese trawlers will be sent to fish in Somali territorial waters on a trial basis for one year. When the two joint ventures prove successful, the two sides will explore the possibility of joint undertakings in cold storage, canning, processing and marketing. (XNA Nov 24, 1984)

Tanzania

China decided to donate a consignment of medicine, medical instruments and surgical dressings worth about 59,000 U.S.dollars. (XNA Dec 22, 1984)

Togo
