AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Ivory Coast (Mar 01)

Joint Communiqué on the establishment of diplomatic relations (XNA Mar 2, 1983)

German Democratic Republic

(Mar 02)

Agreement on goods exchange and payments for 1983. Under the agreement, the amount of goods to be exchanged between the two countries in 1983 will top that in 1982 by 25 percent. Chinese exports to G.D.R. include rice, canned vegetables and fruit, textiles, chemicals and machine tools. G.D.R. exports to China include scientific instruments, printing machines, trucks and chemical fertilizer. XNA, Mar 2, 1983

The agreement provides, among other things, for East German deliveries of potash fertilizer and engineering products -including lorries, agricultural machinery and textile machinery. A broad range of scientific equipment is to be supplied by the Carl Zeiss Jena combine. Medical equipment and x-ray film, laboratory equipment and various other products will be supplied by the Robotron combine. China will supply tungsten ore and other non-ferrous metal products, and various animal and vegetable products -including gut, bristles, essential oils and resin, and also rice dried fruits, cotton textiles and other light industry products. China and East Germany are to increase their trade in 1983 by 25% compared with the previous year, under an agreement signed in Peking. China exports to East Germany mainly rice, food preserves, textiles, chemicals and machinery parts; East Berlin exports scientific equipment, printing machines, lorries and chemical products. DPA, Mar 2, 1983

Hungary (Mar 04)

Agreement on goods exchange and payments. XNA, Mar 4, 1983

Syria (Mar 10)

Executive plan for cultural cooperation 1982-1984. The plan covers exchanges in the fields of education, higher education, culture, art and journalism. XNA, Mar 7, 1983

Soviet Union (Mar 10)

Goods exchange and payments agreement for 1983. According to the agreement, the Soviet Union supplies China with steel products, non-ferrous metal, timber, chemical fertilizer, cement, plate glass, chemical products and machinery, while China provides the Soviet Union with mineral products, meat and meat products, cooking oil and oil-bearing seeds, silks and satins, cotton, textiles and garments,

products of light industry, tea and livestock products. XNA, Mar 10, 1983

Yugoslavia (Mar 17)

Protocol on economic, scientific and technical cooperation. The protocol states that the two sides had fruitful talks on the basis of equality and mutual benefit. They have agreed to take measures to develop industrial cooperation, expand trade contacts and further cooperation in the fields of agriculture, food industry and science and technology. XNA, Mar 17, 1983

Poland (Mar 18)

Protocol on the 33rd Session of the Managing Board of the Chinese-Polish Joint-stock Shipping Company. XNA, Mar 18, 1983

France (Mar 18)

Protocol for sports exchange in 1983. According to the protocol, France will send to China this year teams in gymnastics, football, plane gliding, track and field, and a mountaineering expert. In return China will dispatch teams of basketball, swimming with flippers, gymnastics, and a study group for France's sports museum. The two countries will exchange documents on physical culture education and technical data on sports. XNA, Mar 18, 1983

Soviet Union (Mar 21?)

Minutes of the 25th regular meeting of the Sino-Soviet Joint Commission for Navigation on the Boundary Rivers. The two sides discussed at the meeting issues concerning navigation and channels on the Sino-Soviet boundary rivers of Heilong River, Wusuli River and Ergun River. They reached agreements on most of the issues discussed and signed minutes relevant to the agreement. XNA, Mar 22, 1983

Sweden (Mar 22)

Summary of talks on cultural cooperation and exchange between the Chinese Ministry of Culture and the Swedish Institute. XNA, Mar 22

Poland (Mar 25)

A. Agreement on a long-term interest-free loan under which China will supply Poland with pork.
B. Agreement on a commodity credit. XNA, Mar 25, 1983

According to the two agreements Poland will receive Chinese foodstuffs for the exchange of Polish sugar and metallurgical products for Chinese agricultural goods and raw materials. Poland's imports from China this year will amount to 127,000,000 Swiss francs. Warsaw Radio, Mar 31, 1983; cit. SWB, 7299

Algeria (Mar 28)

Summary of talks under which China and Algeria encourage exchange and cooperation between the higher learning institutions of the two countries. They agreed to exchange scholarship students, teachers and scholars and to start contacts in publication, sports and other fields. XNA, Mar 28, 1983

Pakistan (Apr 02)

Protocol of the Joint Economic Committee. During the first session of the committee, both sides agreed to establish three sub-committees on trade, industry and joint ventures, and science and technology to take stock of the existing relations in these fields and also to identify new avenues of cooperation. XNA, Apr 2, 1983

Pakistan (Apr 04)

Minutes of the first session of the China-Pakistan Joint Committee on Economic, Trade, Scientific and Technical Cooperation and three protocols. Under the agreed arrangements, China and Pakistan will collaborate in technically upgrading of three China-aid projects. The committee also agreed that the two sides will soon discuss and conclude an agreement on joint venture for the manufacture of "Tai Shah 25" tractors. According to the protocol on scientific and technical cooperation, the Pakistan side will undertake ten items requested by the Chinese side for the year 1983-84 while the Chinese side will undertake 15 items for the same year. XNA, Apr 4, 1983

Singapore (Apr 05)

A contract for jointly running a helicopter service for oil exploitation and development in the South China Sea by the South China Sea Branch of the China Offshore Helicopter Service Corporation (COHSC) and the Singapore Airtrust Group of Companies. Under the 10-year contract, the two companies will provide helicopter service through the Yuehing Helicopter Service Company Ltd., which is run jointly by both firms. XNA, Apr 5, 1983

Malta (Apr 06?)

Agreement on a long-term credit of Malta to China. According to the agreement, Malta will participate in the development of coal mining in China.

Italy and UNDP (Apr 07)

Cooperative project document on the exploration, development and utilization of geothermal resources in China between China, Italy, and the UN Development Program. The objective of the project is to provide the Chinese government with technical assistance in the development of its geothermal resources. The Italian government will share the major portion of external input for the project. The United Nations Department of Technical Cooperation for Development will assist the Chinese government for the implemen-

tation of the project.

Soviet Union (Apr 10)

A. Minutes of the border trade talks between China's Heilongjiang Province and the Far East Region of the USSR
B. Agreement on commodity import and export between the same

The two parties have agreed that this year, Heilongjiang Province will export to the Far East region of the Soviet Union light industrial products, knitwear, textiles and foods, and will import from the Far East region of the Soviet Union timber, cement, plate glass, aquatic and marine products and some consumer goods. Yesterday evening, Xie Yunqing, deputy provincial governor, received and hosted a banquet for the delegation of the Far East Foreign Trade Company of the Soviet Union.

Egypt (Apr 18)

Document on bordering cultural exchanges. The document on the implementation of the 1983-85 cultural cooperation plan stipulates mutual exchanges in education, culture, art, broadcast, television, news reporting, health, youth and sports.

Australia (Apr 19)

Memorandum on scientific and technical cooperation in geological sciences. The memorandum records the understandings reached between the Chinese Ministry of Geology and Mineral Resources and the Australian Department of Resources and Energy in relation to the joint conduct of geoscientific research, scientific exchanges and beneficial cooperation on subjects of mutual interest. Under this memorandum, the two sides will promote cooperation on the basis of equality, mutual benefit and reciprocity, and in accordance with the laws and regulations of their respective countries. According to the memorandum, cooperation will be conducted in 10 areas including mineral and energy resources.

Japan (Apr 20)

Agreement on economic cooperation between the China International Trust and Investment Corporation and the Japan-China Association on Economy and Trade.

Poland (Apr 22)

Summary of talks between the Chinese Coal Industry Ministry and the Polish Ministry of Mining and Power, under the minutes, Poland will help develop and transform the Chinese coal industry under conditions agreed by both countries and will design for China within 1983 a large coal washery and provide it with whole set of machineries; provide China with shaft security

monitoring apparatus and transfer the technology to China; provide China with am-50 tunnelers, pass the technology to China and co-produce them after fulfilling due procedures; strengthen cooperation with China in the scientific research on Coal Conversion, gas, among others.

Minutes of talks on the cooperation in the fields of films, literature and art, personnel training and cultural relics protection.

The two countries also agreed to exchange books, periodicals, scientific and cultural documents. China will also accept 13 Guinean students to pursue their study in China.

Barbados

China and Barbados signed a contract to set up a vegetable cultivation experimental centre in Barbados. The centre covers an area of 3 acres. China will send a working team of eight technicians to work at the centre and provide gratis the necessary machinery, equipment, pesticides and vegetable seeds.

Central African Republic

The construction to expand the China-aided Bimbo Radio Station started on April 16. A contract on the extension of the radio station was signed by China and Central Africa on August 31 last year. Under the contract, China will provide Central Africa with two China-made transmitters with a capacity of 50 kilowatts.

Congo

China and Congo signed a contract on agricultural technological cooperation. Under the contract, China will send agricultural experts to help Congolese peasants improve the production of rice, maize, beans, potatoes and tomatoes. The Chinese experts will also train Congolese farmers and offer advice to the country's agricultural organizations in their reforms.

Liberia

A Ground-breaking ceremony of the 311-mile Granta-Harper highway took place on April 21. The highway will link up the counties of Nimba, Grand Gedeh and Maryland. The project, estimated at 56 million U.S. dollars, is expected to be completed in two years.

Nepal

Reconstruction of the Sunsari-Morang irrigation project was initiated on April 12. The project includes, at its first stage, improvement of the existing secondary distributary irrigation system covering an irrigation area of 12,200 hectares of land, and rebuilding of some structures. The project, expected to be completed in three years, is at the contract price of 14.5 million U.S. dollars to be financed from a loan from the World Bank. The project was initially completed by India in the early 1970s, but later it became ineffective due to serious silting and blockage in the irrigation canals and lack of maintenance of the structures.

Sri Lanka

The Sri Lanka Cabinet on 23rd February approved the construction of the Nelamba Oya hydropower project with Chinese assistance. The project will have a capacity of 3,200 kW when completed.

Uganda

The first Chinese medical team arrived in Kampala on April 26. The medical team will be based in Jinja, the country's second largest city 80 kilometers east of Kampala. A three-man advance group of the team arrived here last January to make preparations.

Zambia

Under construction is the Samfya-Manisa highway. It is part of the 249-kilometre Serenje-Samfya Road which links Luapula Province in the northern region with the Central Province. Once completed, it will help tap the great potentials of agriculture and fishery in the two provinces. The Mulingushi Textile is one of the biggest mills in Zambia, construction of which began in early 1979. It will be formerly transferred to the Zambian government and put into operation later this year.
