AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Oman (May 01)

Cultural exchange plan under which a Chinese culture and arts exhibition will be held in Muscat and a Chinese youth and young artists delegation will visit Oman this winter. On Omani archaeology team will visit China this month and an "Omani culture week" will be held in China next year. (XNA, May 1, 1983)

Morocco (May 03)

Protocol on medical cooperation. Under it China will send to Morocco some medical teams and specialists' groups to join their Moroccan colleagues in medical services and help train Moroccan medical personnel. (XNA, May 3, 1983)

Oman (May 03)

Civil air transport agreement (XNA, May 3, 1983)

Kuwait (May 04)

Kuwait agreed to grant a loan of 45.8 million U.S.dollars to help finance an Urumqi fertilizer plant project in the Xinjiang Uygur autonomous region of China. The project is expected to be completed in 1985. It includes the construction of an ammonia plant with a daily capacity of 1,000 tons, a urea plant and a power generator with a capacity of nine megawatts. (XNA, May 4, 1983)

Senegal (May 05)

Executive program 1983-1984 for cultural cooperation. Under it China will provide stipends for a six-month training of Senegalese coaches of table tennis and track and field. The two countries will also exchange visits of personnel in such fields as culture, art, education, sports and mass media. (XNA, May 5, 1983)

France (May 05)

A. Memorandum related to cooperation in building nuclear power stations. According to the document, China and France held discussions in Beijing May 4 on the building of nuclear power stations in China. Through consultation, the countries have made positive progress in questions related to provision of equipment and transfer of technology by France for the reactors of the nuclear power stations China plans to build in Guangdong province and in east China.

B. Protocol on radio and television cooperation. Under it the Ministry of Radio and Television has decided to run a program teaching French, sponsored by the central television station beginning from October, 1984. The french government has decided to provide the Chinese Mi-

nistry of Radio and Television with technical equipment for a small television studio and some material for the teaching program and also help to train professional workers. (XNA, May 5, 1983)

United Nations Food and Agricultural Organization

(May 09)

The UNFAO will aid China with equipment for dairy production. The equipment will be installed in four creameries in the Chinese capital. After the equipment is operating, Beijing will be able to produce 50,000 more kilograms of fresh milk every day and improve the quality of dairy products. (XNA, May 9, 1983)

U.S.A. (May 11, 1983)

Report of the 3rd Meeting of the Sino-U.S. Joint Commission on Scientific and Technological Cooperation. Memorandum of understanding on cooperation in the basic biomedical sciences and three protocols on cooperation in the fields of nuclear physics and magnetic fusion research, on cooperation in aeronautical science and technology, on cooperation in science and technology of transportation. (XNA, May 11, 1983)

Hungary (May 12, 1983)

Agreement on sports cooperation. Under the agreement, China will send fencing, weightlifting, track and field, and water polo teams to visit Hungary in 1984 and in return, Hungary will send to China gymnastics, track and field, women basketball, table tennis and soccer teams in the same year. A Hungarian sports delegation will tour China in 1985 to work out an exchange program for the year between the two countries. (XNA, May 12, 1983)

Japan (May 23)

Loans agreement involving loans of 231 billion yen (about one billion U.S.dollars). The loans are being used mainly for construction of two berths designed for 50,000-ton class vessels at a coal wharf in Qinhuangdao Harbor in North China, a 300-kilometer-long electrified double-track railway line between Beijing and Qinhuangdao, a 100,000-ton class berth and a coal harbor for berthing 25,000-ton class vessels at Shijiu Harbor in East China, a 300-kilometer-long railway line between Yanzhou and Shijiusuo in Coastal Shandong province, as well as phase one project for the Baoshan Iron and Steel Complex in Shanghai. By the end of March China used loans of 100.2 billion yen, of which 96 billion yen were used last year alone. Construction in these projects is now under way. About 70,000 people take part in the four harbor and railway projects which will undertake the shipment of coal exported to Japan, and other countries in Southeast Asia and Europe. Among his former positions are: Deputy for Xinjiang to the 1st NPC; vice-president of the Xinjiang Branch of the People's Bank, commander of the public security brigade of Xinjiang, and commander of Ürümqi Garrison.

Elected vice-chairman of the People's Congress, Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region (XNA, Apr 30, 1983) A. belongs to the Mongolian minority. Before the Cultural Revolution he was a member of the Communist Youth League's Central Committee and secretary of its Inner Mongolia Branch.

Elected vice-governor of Heilongjiang Province (XNA, Apr 22, 1983) An has been chief engineer of the No.2 Light Industry Bureau of Harbin City.
