AGREEMENTS WITH FOREIGN COUNTRIES

Cameroon (Jun 02)

Cultural exchange program June 1983 until May 1984. It provides for exchanges in culture, arts, education, sports and mass media.

Guinea (Jun 02)

Trade protocol for 1983 to 1984

Central African Republic (Jun 04)

Minutes of talks for sports exchanges. Under it Chinese and Central African sports teams will exchange visits in 1984. China agreed to send volleyball and table tennis coaches to the Central African Republic for a year, and to present the republic with sports gear.

Tunisia (Jun 06)

Minutes on sports cooperation. According to the minutes of talks, China will send to Tunisia gymnastics and table tennis coaches and men's volley-ball, men's basket-ball, gymnastics, table tennis and football teams. A Tunisian sports delegation will visit China and Tunisians will be sent to China for training receiving in gymnastics.

U.S.A. (Jun 08)

Chinese Ambassador Zhang Wenjin presented a letter to the U.S. Secretary of State informing him that the People's Republic of China has decided to accede to the Antarctic Treaty.

Japan (Jun 08)

Loan agreement. The Japanese government decided to provide China with a loan package of 69 billion yen for fiscal 1983. The decision was made in accordance with an agreement reached here at a working-level conference on Japan-China Economic Cooperation for 1983. Part of the loan, about 49.9 billion yen, will be used to construct China's port of Shijiusuo, the Yanzhou-Shijiusuo railway and an expansion project of the Beijing-Qinhuangdao railway line. The remaining 19.1 billion yen will be loaned to China in the form of goods.

Malta (Jun 08?)

Minute on medical cooperation. It is related to setting up a Chinese center in Malta which gives priority to acupuncture.

Gambia (Jun 08)

Protocol on sending China's fourth medical team to Gambia. Under the protocol, the Chinese medical team will be based in the Bansang Hospital and its personnel will increase from 16 to 25. Part of the medicines and medical instruments needed by the team will be loaned by China.

France (Jun 10?)

Agreement on scientific and technical cooperation for 1983-84. New areas of cooperation outlined in the agreement include rational energy usage, in applied nuclear research and aeronautics. Other fields cited for increased activity primarily included petroleum operations, geology, telecommunications and agriculture.

Australia (Jun 10?)

Agreement on technical aid. It is for two projects and it is part of a continuing technical assistance programme costing about 10,000,000 dollars. One project involves more than 1,000,000 dollars for work on a hydroelectric scheme in Yunnan.

Japan (Jun 13)

Memorandum on implementation of a pilot project on family planning, maternity and child health and parasite control in China. According to the memorandum, the China Family Planning Association will select two rural areas with the total population of at least around 100,000 to implement the project. The JOICFP and the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) will consider combined funding for the project promotion by the CFPA. The fund will be used mainly for training and exchange of personnel, purchase of transportation vehicles and medical equipment, and other necessary commodities. The first stage of the pilot project will run for three years, starting January 1984.

Poland (Jun 13)

Contract on exchange visits by tourist groups between the China International Travel Service and the Polish Orbis Travel Enterprise.

Japan (Jun 13)

Notes exchange for Japan's grant to China for helping the China National Library buy a computer system. According to the notes, the Japanese government will extend to the Chinese government a grant of up to 50 million yen for the purchase of an electronic computer system.

Papua New Guinea (Jun 14)

Agreement on technical cooperation. It includes the exchange of specialists, technical personnel and trainees to provide services, sharing of technical expertise, and training.

Iraq (Jun 14)

Protocol on the 1st Session of the Iraq-Chinese Committee of Trade Exchange and Technical and Economic Cooperation. Under it, the two sides agreed to cooperate in the fields of agriculture, irrigation, light industry, petroleum, technology and personnel training and would exchange experts. The two countries agreed on a trade plan for 1982 and 1984. They also agreed on new formulae for the participation of Chinese companies in new Iraqi projects.

Philippines (Jun 17?)

The Chinese Petroleum Corporation (CPC) and the Philippine National Oil Company Exploration Corporation (PNOCEC) have agreed to invest more than 8,000,000 pesos in an onshore oil-drilling project in Gapan, Nueva Ecija. The project, which started on 13th June, is an offshoot of the CPC PNOCEC seismic survey last year, covering 220 km lines over central Luzon. Under a geophysical contract signed by PNOCEC and CEC with a bid last year, the project calls for the drilling of one well. CPC intends to drill a depth of 2,500 m, and if the well is found to have oil potential, the company has the option to convert its geophysical contract into a service contract, which means drilling more wells.

Textile contract worth 3.5 million Swiss-franc.

Germany, Federal Republic (Jun 19)

Agreement with the Thyssen Company for opening up a colliery at Kailuan, a coal-producing center in North China.

Germany, Democratic Republic (Jun 22)

Protocol on journalists cooperation during 1984-87. Under it, both sides will exchange visits every two years for exchanging their professional experiences, seeking ways of strengthening their friendly cooperation and promoting friendly relations between peoples of the two countries.

Germany, Democratic Republic (Jun 23)

Agreement on posts and telecommunications cooperation. Under it, the two countries will take measures to further expand and improve the relations of posts and telecommunications between them.
(XNA, Jun 23, 1983)

Greece (Jun 25)

Agreement on economic and technical cooperation. It stipulates that guided by the principles of equality and mutual benefit, the two sides will promote economic and technical cooperation in agriculture, animal husbandry, fishery, light and textile industries,

and other economic sectors.

Germany, Federal Republic

(Jun 28)
1983-84 executive plan for the public health cooperation agreement. Under it, China and the F.R.G. will exchange doctors, scientists and other specialists, in order to promote the development of public health, as well as medical and pharmacological studies of the two countries.

Volunteers in Technical Assistance (Jun 28)

The U.S.-based international organization - Volunteers in Technical Assistance (V.I.T.A.) and two Chinese organizations have signed a series of agreements on exchanges of technical experts and information. Under the agreements V.I.T.A. will help China identify foreign manufacturers who have an interest in joint ventures, licensing agreements, co-production and export of equipment. It will also work with U.S. businesses to develop investment and trade opportunities with China. V.I.T.A. will organize exchanges of technical specialists, arrange technical symposia and seminars, supervise testing of different technologies and provide instruction in information processing. In addition, it will help China exchange useful data and experiences with other developing countries.

Gambia

Under a protocol signed on 8th June China will send its 4th medical team. It will increase from 16 to 25 and China will loan Gambia some of the team's medicines and medical instruments

The former Politburo and Central Committee member is now given a new field of action.

Han Xianchu 韩先楚

Elected vice-chairman, Standing Committee of the 6th NPC (XNA, Jun 18, 1983)

Han, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1969 and its alternate before (since 1956) is a PLA colonel-general and mostly held military posts: Commander of Fuzhou Military Region from 1960 until 1973 and of Lanzhou Military Region from 1974 until 1979.

He Kang 何康

Appointed minister of agriculture, animal husbandry and fishery (XNA, Jun 20, 1983)

He has been a vice-minister of this ministry before. Since Sep 1982 he is a member of the CCP 12th Central Committee.

Hong Xuezhi 洪学智

Elected member of the Central Military Commission (XNA, Jun 20, 1983)

Hong, a member of the CCP Central Committee since 1979, is a PLA colonel-general and heads the PLA General Logistics Department since 1980. Since Oct 1982 he also holds the position of a deputy secretary-general of the CCP Military Commission.

Hu Yuzhi 胡愈之

Elected vice-chairman of the 6th NPC (XNA, Jun 18, 1983)

Hu has been a member of the NPC's Standing Committee before.

Huang Hua 黄华

Huang was elected member of the CCP Central Committee in 1973. He served in the diplomatic service for a long time and had been foreign minister from 1976 until Nov 1982.

Jiang has been vice-minister before.

Jiang Zemin 江泽民

Li is a member of the CCP 12th Central Committee. He had been minister of powere industry from 1981 until 1982 and has been vice-minister of water conservancy and power since then.

Li Xiannian 李先念

Elected president of the PR China (XNA, Jun 18, 1983)

Liao Chengzhi 廖承志

Deceased Jun 10, 1983 (XNA, Jun 11, 1983)

Liao Hansheng 廖汉生

Elected vice-chairman of the 6th NPC (XNA, Jun 18, 1983)

An alternate member of the CCP 8th Central Committee and a member of the 11th and 12th. Liao is a PLA lieutenant-general and mostly held military positions, his last being 1st political commissar of Shenyang Military Region.

Ling Yun 凌云

Appointed minister of state security (XNA, Jun 20, 1983)

Ling has been a vice-minister of public security before and after the Cultural Revolution. It is remarkable that the minister of this new important ministry does not belong to the CCP Central Committee.
