to Tribeni Ghat. Thence it proceeds in a northwesterly direction, following the right bank of Marsyandi Khora river to Chyanglingtar where it turns westward to Khairani and then again northwest, following the left bank of the Seti river to the Pokhara valley (2). Its total length is 176 kilometers (3). A 125-meter suspension bridge crosses the Trisuli river at Munglingtar (4). The number of bridges in the course of the 176 km road totals 41, the longest being (a) the one across the Trisuli river at Munglingtar and (b) the one across the Madi river at Damauli which is 370 m long and 7.5 m wide (5). The Chinese technicians engaged in this project had previously constructed the Kathmandu-Kodari road (6).

3. Kathmandu - Bhaktapur

The surveying of this road commenced in October 1968 (1). It was completed in 1970 (2). It has a length of 16 kilometers. The Bagmati bridge on its course has a length of 87 and a width of 20 meters with two sidewalks having a width of three meters each (3).

4. Kathmandu Ring Road

The construction started in March 1974 (1) and was completed in April 1977 (2). It has a total length of 27.2 kilometers and nine bridges and 108 culverts. The total volume of rocks and earth excavated amounted to 1.5 million cubic meters (1). The road links an industrial district in northwestern Kathmandu with another in the southeast, and the residential quarters with government buildings. It also passes historic sites and beauty-spots (2).

5. Pokhara - Surkhet

A Chinese survey team arrived in May 1973 to start work on a survey for a road connecting Pokhara with the far western region (1). Under an agreement signed in February 1975 China agreed to provide free financial grants and technical aid to Nepal for construction of the 407 km road (2). There is no further reference to this project up till 1983.

6. Gorkha - Narayanghat

Construction of the road started in February 1978 (1) and was completed in November 1981. It has a length of 61 kilometers (2) and a width of normally 7.5 m but in difficult mountain regions only 6.5 m with a black-topping of 5.5 m (3). The road has brought Nepal's renowned ancient capital of Gorkha, cut off from the outside world for centuries, within reach to the rest of the Kingdom, linking it with its arteries, the Mahendra high-

way and the Prithvi highway (1).

C Electrification Projects

1. Sunkosi Hydroelectric Station

The station is located at the Sunkosi river, at the Kathmandu-Kodari road (1), about 80 km from Kathmandu (2). The construction started in the fall of 1968 (3) and was completed in November 1972 (4). The station has an installed capacity of 10,000 kW (5). In December 1973 Nepal had an installed power of 55,000 kW of which hydroelectric power production accounts for more than 33,000 kW (6). Work on this project was directed by 60 Chinese technicians (7). In 1973 and 1974 the station generated 90 million kWh of electricity for Kathmandu and trained large numbers of Nepalese electricians. In 1975 it was managed by more than 100 Nepalese technicians and workers (8). In August 1976 the 40 m-long inlet channel from the Sunkosi river was destroyed by floods after torrential rain. This damage was restored in a month's time (9).

2. Overhead Transmission Line I

Its course is from Sunkosi to Kathmandu (1). Construction started at the end of 1968 (2).

3. Overhead Transmission Line II

A protocol relating to this line was signed in December 1970. Its course should have been from Sunkosi to Chantara and Barabise (1). There was no further mention of this project in the Chinese press.

4. Dam on Seti River

Under a contract signed in December 1976, a dam was to be constructed on the Seti river for the generation of 1,000 kW of power. Construction of the dam was expected to be completed in the 1978/79 fiscal year (1). There was no mention of this project in the Chinese press.

D Agricultural Projects

1. Pokhara Water Control and Irrigation Project

A protocol relating to this project was signed in July 1976 (1). Construction started in November 1981. The project is composed of two parts - an irrigation system including an 80 metre-long and 4 metre-high dam, a 7.8 kilometre-long canal, 26 branch canals and a

number of aqueducts and sluices; and a small power station with a generating capacity of 1500 kW. Upon its completion, the project can provide irrigation for 750 hectares of farmland and electricity for Pokhara - a fast tourism-developing city in the country (2). On completion of the project, 1,200 ha of land in the suburbs of Pokhara will be irrigated. This project is expected to help the tourist industry, create employment opportunities, and develop small industries in the area, in addition to increasing agricultural production. The project is expected to cost 50 million Nepalese rupees (3).

2. Sunsari - Morang Irrigation Project

A contract relating to this project was signed in December 1982. Located in the border district of Morang, south-east of Nepal, the project is a comparatively large one to be undertaken by China in the form of tender. The initial-stage construction, with a designed irrigated area of 11,200 hectares of land, will cost some 14.5 million US\$. China has participated in the international tenders for Nepal's various projects since early this year. Before this, China entered into two other bonds with Nepal in the same mode of tender for providing Nepal with equipment for five small hydropower stations and for undertaking the power transmission project for the construction of the Marsyandi hydropower station (1). The project, expected to be completed in 1986, is at the contract price of 14.5 million US\$ to be financed from a loan from the World Bank. The project was initially completed by India in the early 1970s, but later it became ineffective due to serious silting and blockage in the irrigation channels and lack of maintenance of the structures (2).

3. Farming Research

The Parbanipur agricultural station, a multiple-agricultural research institution situated over 160 km south of Kathmandu, introduced a fine strain of lemon from China. Under the care of this station, fine-strain lemons have grown and multiplied on Nepalese soil and become acclimatized to local conditions and resistant to diseases. In 1976, the station was also popularizing Beijing ducks, which have become acclimatized to the Nepalese environment and fattened rapidly (1).

E Other Projects

1. Warehouse I

A warehouse with a floor space of 7,000 square meters was built in Kathmandu. Construction started in October 1965 (1) and was completed in September 1967 (2).

Another warehouse with a floor space of 7,000 square meters was built in Birgunj. Construction started in 1965 and was completed in March 1967 (1).

4. Trolley-bus Project

Under a protocol of March 1972 (1) the construction of the Kathmandu-Bhaktapur trolley-bus project started in December 1973 (2) and was inaugurated in December 1975. The project consists of more than 20 items including a transformation station and a repair shop (3). The Kathmandu-Bhaktapur line, along with a dozen of trolley buses carry some 7,000 passengers a day. The Chinese workers and technicians left Nepal in 1977 (4).

5. Border Bridge

A bridge on the Sino-Nepalese border at Rasuwa was completed in 1979. It is a 86 meter-long and 2.5 meter-wide single main span bridge. The construction took only three months (1).

At the request of the Nepalese government China agreed in 1971 to send two survey teams to conduct surveys on iron, phosphorite, coal, and petroleum deposits (1). There has been no further mention of this project.

rate of 3% represent the last portion of Japan's five-year, 300,000 million yen (1,300 million dollars) loans programme for China starting in 1979. The project loans consist of 5,200 million yen (22,000,000 dollars) for construction of a port at Shijiusuo in Shandong Province, 11,500 million yen (45,000,000 dollars) for construction of a railway between Shijiusuo and Yanzhou in the same province, and 33,200 million yen (138,000,000 dollars) for expansion of a railway between Beijing and Qinhuangdao in Hebei Province.

Loan agreement. According to it, the Belgian government will provide the Chinese government with a long-term and interest-free loan of 300 million bf in 1983. It will be used to cover part of the expenses for equipment and labor services provided by Belgian enterprises and to improve China's telephone exchange system. According to one contract signed between the China National Postal and Telecommunications Industry Corporation and the Bell Telephone Manufacturing Company S.A. and Belgian Funds voor Ontwikkelingssamenwerking, a joint venture will be set up in Shanghai to manufacture s1240 stored control digital telephone switching system and special integrated circuits needed for the system. The joint venture will sell its products on both the Chinese and world markets. The term of the contract is set at 15 years. The s1240 stored control digital telephone exchange equipment is used in urban telephone exchange system to ease the tense situation involved in the use of urban telephones, improve the service and ensure the telephone's fidelity, thus helping digitalize future telecommunication networks. According to the other contract for the direct supply of s1240 stored control digital telephone exchange equipment, the Belgian side

will provide to China 52,000 lines of local telephone exchange equipment and 400 international trunks for gateway exchange equipment. During the period covered by the contract, the Bell Telephone Manufacturing Company S.A. will send engineers and technicians to China to help install, test and check equipment, in addition to training Chinese personnel. The Chinese side will also send technical personnel to study at the Bell Telephone Manufacturing Company S.A. (XNA, Jul 30, 1983)

Comoros

The cornerstone was laid on July 15th on a three-hectare government meeting hall to be built with Chinese aid. Named "People's Palace", it will be completed within two years. (XNA, Jul 15, 1983)

Gambia

The "Independence Stadium" built with Chinese aid in the northern suburbs of Banjul has been handed over. Its construction started in Feb 1983. (XNA, Jul 4, 1983)

Mauritania

The Nouakchott Olympic Stadium built with Chinese aid, was handed over on July 5th. Construction began in Jan 1980. The stadium, with one 10,000-seat competition field and several training fields and living quarters for athletes, covers an area of 18 hectares. (XNA, Jul 5, 1983)

Morocco

The Rabat sports complex built with Chinese aid was opened on 8th July. It consists of a 60,000-seat stadium and an 8,000-seat gymnasium. (XNA, Jul 8, 1983)

Philippines

Another mini-hydro power station built with the help of China was inaugurated on July 4th in an mountainous area near the town of Natividad, Pangasinan province. The first one, the Balongbong power station, began operating eight days ago. The mini-hydro power station has three hydraulic synchronous alternators with a total power output of 750 kW. It was one of the 54 mini-hydro power stations to be built under a supply agreement signed by China and the Philippines in 1980, which provides for a seller's credit of 30 million U.S.dollars from China to finance the purchase of approximately 100,000 kilowatts of mini-hydro power plants.

Rwanda

The foundation stone laying ceremony for the Chinese-aided multi-purpose sports complex took place on July 22th in Kigali. (XNA, Jul 29, 1983)

Western Samoa
